

InsideLook Longboat Roundabout Plan Ready to Hit Broadway

The Town of Longboat Key and FDOT are undertaking a roundabout improvement project for the intersection of Gulf of Mexico Drive and Broadway Street.

The project intent is to improve pedestrian crossing safety at the Broadway Street intersection, along with incorporating a multi-use trail on the east side of the corridor, a 7-foot buffered bicycle lane within the project limits, increased resiliency, and incorporation of some of the Town's Complete Street elements.

This improvement will be the initial implementation of the Town's Complete Streets vision for the Gulf of Mexico Drive corridor, which will improve safety for all modes of mobility, resiliency, and an aesthetically pleasing roadway that maintains vehicle traffic and enhances the Town's unique sense of place.

The community meeting will be an open-house style meeting where members of the project team, the Town and FDOT will be available to answer any questions you may have regarding the project development, timeframe for construction, and implementation schedule.

The meeting will be held Thursday, May 1 from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. in the Town Commission Chambers, 501 Bay Isles Road.

Sarasota ramps up flood study as hurricane season nears

Following recent pressure to fix the flooding in and around St. Armands Circle, the Sarasota County Public Works Stormwater team was on the Circle last Friday, April 18, working ahead of the upcoming hurricane season.

Team members used equipment to view inside the stormwater pipes to see any potential issues or debris. The equipment is similar to a giant shop-vac with a pressure washer. Stormwater team members are working to ensure the pipes are free of debris and there are no structural defects. No issues were found last Friday the County reports.

These check-ups and clear-outs will continue throughout

Sarasota City Manager Search Descends into Chaos

What started as a routine city manager search unraveled into a public spectacle recently at Sarasota's City Commission.

What started as a routine city manager search unraveled into a public spectacle recently at Sarasota's City Commission. The breakdown on April 11 played out over two separate meetings—a morning workshop and an afternoon special session—where commissioners admitted to confusion, mistrust, and having no clear path forward.

Commissioners contradicted each other, the search firm hired to oversee the process struggled to provide basic materials and information, and the public was left in the dark—literally and figuratively-about how the process would move forward.

At the center of the disarray: 47 applicants for the city manager position and no coherent process for narrowing the list.

"I feel like we're floundering here," said Mayor Liz Alpert. Elected officials seemed paralyzed by indecision and embarrassed by the process unraveling in real time. "It's a terrible look," she said.

Transparency Concerns

Ringling President Thompson plans retirement

Larry Thompson, the longtime president of Ringling College of Art and Design, announced last week that he will retire at the end of the 2025–26 academic year. Thompson, who joined Ringling in 1999, is the college's sixth and longest-serving president.

Over the past 26 years, Thompson led the effort to more than double student enrollment, added new academic programs and oversaw a major campus buildout.

"It has been the greatest honor and privilege of my life to serve as president," Thompson said in a statement posted by the college. "When I began, I said my mission was to shatter the myth of the starving artist. I believe that together, we've done just that."

Ringling's Board of Trustees will conduct a national search for Thompson's successor.

the following to its scope of stormwater pipe investigation: The entirety of Madison Drive from end-to-end, and also N. Adams Drive, N Washington Drive, and John Ringling Boulevard in the area all around the St. Armands Parking Garage, the St. Armands Key Lutheran Church, and nearby pump stations.

The County was supposed to finish the work by end of last March, but the County said it suffered equipment failure. With the added pipeline request, the County says the work should be complete by mid-May. The videos will be reviewed and follow-up work orders produced as needed. The county has completed 75% of the pipeline originally scheduled, and no defects or failures have been identified to date.



The concept we gave to the FDOT Design Engineer and Traffic Operations Manager had the curbed median end at the CCS Phase IV entrance moved further south by 60-ft. to 75-ft (roughly 3 car lengths with space in between each car). Because it is a longer median and a larger neighborhood entrance, we asked for more distance and gave two examples. For all of the other, smaller curbed medians, we asked for 50-ft. (roughly 2 car lengths with space in between each car). If we asked for any more on the smaller medians, there would not be much median left and risk not getting anywhere with those medians. Because we did not get a specific direction on a certain length for the Phase IV entrance, we are going to approach the design revision with the longer 75-ft. to provide more room.

The District Design Engineer indicated that while the design change is not ideal from their perspective, they understand the concern and were agreeable to the Town proceeding down the path of a design revision. And as on all state roads, they also noted that FDOT reserves the right to alter the medians if an operational or safety issue manifests as a result in the future. This is typical on any state road after a road is constructed if an operational or safety issue arises. Please let me know if you have any questions.

Thank you for reaching out. As discussed with you briefly last week, the Town is working with our Florida Department of Transportation ("FDOT") contacts on a solution to move the curb ends further south to allow more room for vehicles to stack. We are making positive progress. As I explained, a meeting with CCS would be one of need and, more importantly, timing. If the Town and FDOT begin making progress towards a solution, a meeting with the neighborhood and the contractor or the neighborhood and FDOT could be counter-productive, particularly with the rhetoric of cancelling the project as some in the neighborhood are stating. That was new to me as of the February 20, 2025 CCS Phase IV Annual Association meeting. I would not facilitate a Town-supported CCS meeting with either the contractor nor the FDOT if the prevailing neighborhood position became one of canceling the project -- that was not my agreement nor do I support that position as that would effectively shut down our ability to negotiate a design solution with FDOT. As an FYI, the contractor himself cannot make changes without FDOT approval, and FDOT is reviewing our request and has advised on next steps with a good initial response.

The Town planned to make the first strides in those conversations from an engineering standpoint. If that was not clear, I apologize, however, I believe I made that very clear at the CCS Phase IV association meeting on February 20, 2025. As mentioned, the FDOT is currently working with the Town on our preliminary design amendment, and they have asked us to begin developing full design plan revisions and running it through their "Local Agency Program". I would be happy to discuss this with you further. I should be available all of tomorrow afternoon.

Following up on the foregoing request for records, I am writing on behalf of the Homeowners Association ("HOA") of Country Club Shores IV ("CCSIV"), to renew our request for an onsite meeting with the contractor regarding the planned improvements to Gulf of Mexico Drive.

By way of background, the President of the HOA and I met with Isaac Brownman and Charlie Mopps on November 12, 2024, to discuss CCSIV's concerns about the impending GMD project. We were promised that they would arrange a in-person meeting in February, 2025 when the contractor would be onsite. Last week, when the meeting had not been arranged, I spoke with Mr. Brownman and was informed that the Town had already met with the contractor and was awaiting a response. 

LBK Broadway Roundabout Project

To: David Novak

Not sure I understand your questions. No horses. No dead ends! This roundabout has been discussed for years as a safety issue. We had a relatively simple, inexpensive plan that FDOT approved and which we had mostly funded by FDOT and Manatee County. Then, last year, FDOT said we needed to flatten the embankment on the turn which complicated the project considerably. While FDOT said they would pay for it all, that became less true over time so that now we will face \$1.5mm +/- in costs to complete the project.

We seriously considered shelving the project when the flattening edict arrived, and again when we learned we would be facing material costs. In the end, we have decided to proceed forward cautiously because: 1. The safety issue still exists and there is no other available solution; 2. We will not need to expend further funds until 2026, during which we may be able to cut costs or attract other funding; and 3. The roundabout work and the work to the north and south of the intersection contemplated by the project will improve that area of GMD in a manner we hope will set the standard for and accelerate the design and completion of our vision for the entire length of GMD, the "complete streets". We do not believe FDOT is reliant on questionable federal funding for anything we are discussing with them now.

Turmoil in the Alcoholic Beverage Industry


The turmoil in the alcoholic beverage industry began as the Pandemic ended.

The turmoil in the alcoholic beverage industry began as the Pandemic ended and sales of domestic beer began to level off,

sales of mass market wines decreased, and sales of premium brand spirits and hard seltzer/canned mixed drinks increased. Upscaling to premium brands of alcoholic beverages in many market segments offsets some of the decreases in quantities sold. Sales of alcoholic beverages are going up or down, or both.

Quantities of craft beer sold in the USA, for instance, declined but higher prices per unit increased



brands as part of its efforts to lean more heavily into faster growing segments of the beverage market.

Global production of wine has declined in 2024 to a level not seen during the last forty years. This decline has nothing to do with tariffs on wine. In France, domestic sales of red wine have decreased dramatically, to the point that the government is helping to divert red wine outside the consumer market for wine and is subsidizing shifts of farms in some regions from wine grapes to other crops. Wine regions are adopting higher quality standards to limit production of wines labelled with the name of the region. Increasing sales of sparkling, white, and rose wines have offset some of the losses of red wine sales.

Sales of premium spirits have boosted that sector of the alcoholic beverage market. Kentucky Bourbon and craft whiskey have gained popularity in Europe and Asia. Bartenders hear frequent calls for cocktails such as Manhattans and Mint Juleps. Premium agave spirits, mostly Tequila but also Mezcal, have found an enthusiastic market among the younger patrons of bars in the USA and abroad. The Margarita and Tequila shots have enhanced sales of Tequila. We found one beverage shop that had taken Tequila bottles off the shelf and put all of them behind the counter. In other shops, we see some of the more expensive brands (say, Casamigos) locked behind glass panels. That shows a demand that shop owners could do without!


The on and off again threats of tariffs have added uncertainty and increased the turmoil in the beverage industry. Will adding a 20% tax to the price of a prestige \$300 bottle of French Bordeaux deprive a wine collector of the preferred wine? What will happen if France imposes a 30% tax on Kentucky Bourbon as well as Teslas? Mint Juleps in Nice made with Japanese whiskey?


Will the Belgium and Brazilian corporation, Anheuser Busch InBev, that owns the Budweiser Bud Light brand and the Modelo brand, but has licensed sales of Modelo in the USA to the US Constellation

Brands corporation, restore Bud Light as the top selling US beer if and when the Trump administration imposes tariffs on imports Modelo brand made in Mexico? In our era of intertwined international corporations, "Made in America" doesn't have the meaning that we thought it has, does it?

Perhaps we should be asking when Elon Musk will buy the naming rights to the Gulf of America and change the name to Gulf of X. Will Musk then sue the Dutch Heineken International corporation for a trademark violation for using the "XX" on labels of bottles of Dos Equis beer?



when Marlon Brown retired after more than three decades in government service throughout Florida, including 15 years with the City of Sarasota, the last four as city manager.

At the outset, the city hired national search firm Colin Baenziger & Associates to lead the city manager recruitment. But by last Friday's meeting, it was clear several commissioners were unsure who had controlled the process all along.

Commissioners pointed to one-on-one meetings with staff and the search firm where commissioners had privately shared ideas about what they wanted in a city manager. But that behind-the-scenes approach ultimately spilled into public view, exposing the fractures in a process that lacked structure from the start.

There was no clear agreement on evaluation criteria, no collective discussion of priorities, and no plan for incorporating public input or community participation. Commissioners openly admitted they had never clearly defined what they were looking for in a candidate—a vacuum that helped fuel the disarray.

More troubling was that commissioners submitted their preferred candidates from the pool of 47 via a spreadsheet—outside of a public meeting. A 2023 opinion from the Florida Attorney General made clear the Sunshine Law prohibits ranking candidates in an executive search outside of a publicly noticed meeting.

Christine Robinson, speaking on behalf of the Argus Foundation, put it plainly: "The public doesn't have access to the materials you're talking about today."

Robinson wasn't alone in raising concerns. Commissioner Kyle Battie echoed the concern: "We almost seem as though we don't have a clue as to what we're doing. That doesn't bode well for the public and their confidence in us."

Battie likened the events to "trying to change a tire on a bike while we're riding it."

Commissioner Jen Ahearn-Koch declared bluntly, "We did not direct any of this. This is coming at us."

Vice Mayor Debbie Trice tried to salvage the process by proposing a hybrid approach: preserve the current applicant pool but publish all materials to give the public a window into future deliberations. But even that compromise couldn't paper over the commission's lack of a coherent plan.

A suggestion that candidates submit five-minute introductory videos—aimed at humanizing resumes—was dismissed by some as potentially discriminatory, despite the fact that public interviews would eventually reveal the same information.

By the afternoon meeting, the dysfunction reached a climax. Ahearn-Koch introduced a motion to scrap the entire process and start anew— publicly, transparently, and on the Commission's own terms.

The motion failed 4-1, but not before exposing deep fractures. Commissioners admitted they didn't know which materials were public, why some candidates were recommended over others, or how five additional names landed on their list without a formal vote or directive. Basic documents such as resumes and background packets were not included in the meeting agenda and only presented after complaints from the public.

Several commissioners worried starting over would waste months and cost Sarasota its most promising candidates. Others argued the entire process was tainted by disorganization, and pushing forward would only deepen public mistrust.

"If I were a potential candidate, I would think twice about applying," said Vice Mayor Trice. She questioned why a candidate would "move to this crazy city where the commission can't make a decision."

"It was chaos," said Martin Hyde, a frequent critic of city government. "There's no consistency in the processes. The only thing that is predictable is that they take hours at every meeting to demonstrate their incompetence."

What Comes Next?

City Attorney Joe Polzak recommended the city "reboot" the search process. But in the end, the commission did not agree on a clear timeline or leadership direction. Commissioners agreed to hold a follow-up meeting where they'll begin—again—by publicly naming their top

trated with the entire process, it's unclear whether the future meeting will resolve anything or

simply repeat last Friday's display in a slightly more polished form.

"Likely, I would come up with the same list I have," said Alpert.

The number of potential candidates is likely to be less after last Friday's week's debacle. One candidate withdrew from consideration after watching the spectacle. "I can't imagine anyone who would want to work in that environment," the former candidate told the Florida Trident.


As of Thursday, April 17, city hall could not provide consistent information on the number of candidates who had dropped out. One official told the Trident in an email that none had withdrawn. Another official confirmed that four had dropped out.

UPDATE: After initial publication, Jan Thornburgh, the City's Communication Manager, stated that two additional candidates had withdrawn: Kathy Blonski and Mike Graese. Blonski was one of two candidates preferred by all 5 commissioners.
