FINANCIAL UPDATE

DIRECTOR OF TECHNOLOGY POSITION

Initially a planned reduction due as a part of the <u>Financial Recovery Plan</u>, the Director of Technology position was reinstated by the Board. The funds for this change were made available for the 2024-25 school year by choosing not to fill the open Assistant Superintendent role.

SUPPLEMENTAL POSITIONS

Thanks to generous support from the AW Athletic Boosters, many supplemental positions that were remain to unfilled for 2024-25 have been reinstated.

OPERATIONAL LEVY

While we are thankful that these unexpected situations have lessened the financial burden somewhat for the 2024-25, school year --- the District still needs operational funding for FY26 and beyond. The District is pursuing a 5-year, 2.42-mill operational levy in November. If passed, the District will receive \$3.3M each year. If the issue fails, the District is once again facing significant cuts.



SALES TAX HOLIDAY

Ohio's annual Sales Tax Holiday is July 30 - August 8. It's a great time to stock up on school supplies or refresh your work wardrobe.

NEW THIS YEAR: The sales tax break extends to other purchases under \$500 (with some exceptions).
