Kameron touched the lives of many people with his quiet strength, generous heart and his unique spirit. He attended John P. Freeman Elementary and Middle School. While in Middle School, Kameron played the saxophone in the band and traveled all over the country as part of the US Chess Federation. He graduated from DeSoto Central High School in 2012. He was employed by Vanguard Soap as a Forklift Operator Team Lead, while helping his mom with her catering business on weekends. Kameron's enduring spirit touched us all in profound ways. Though words cannot fully capture his essence, we take comfort in the memories and the lasting impact he left on our lives.



At age 11, Kameron accepted Christ at Polk Chapel CME Church. He re-dedicated his life to Christ and got baptized again at the R3 (Revive, Reconnect, & Rehabilitate) Conference through Life Church. 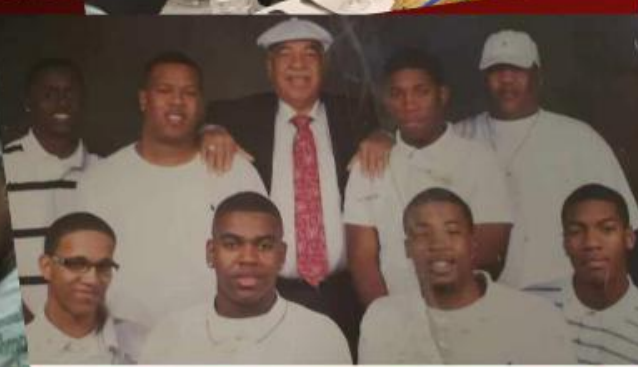

and your picture in a frame

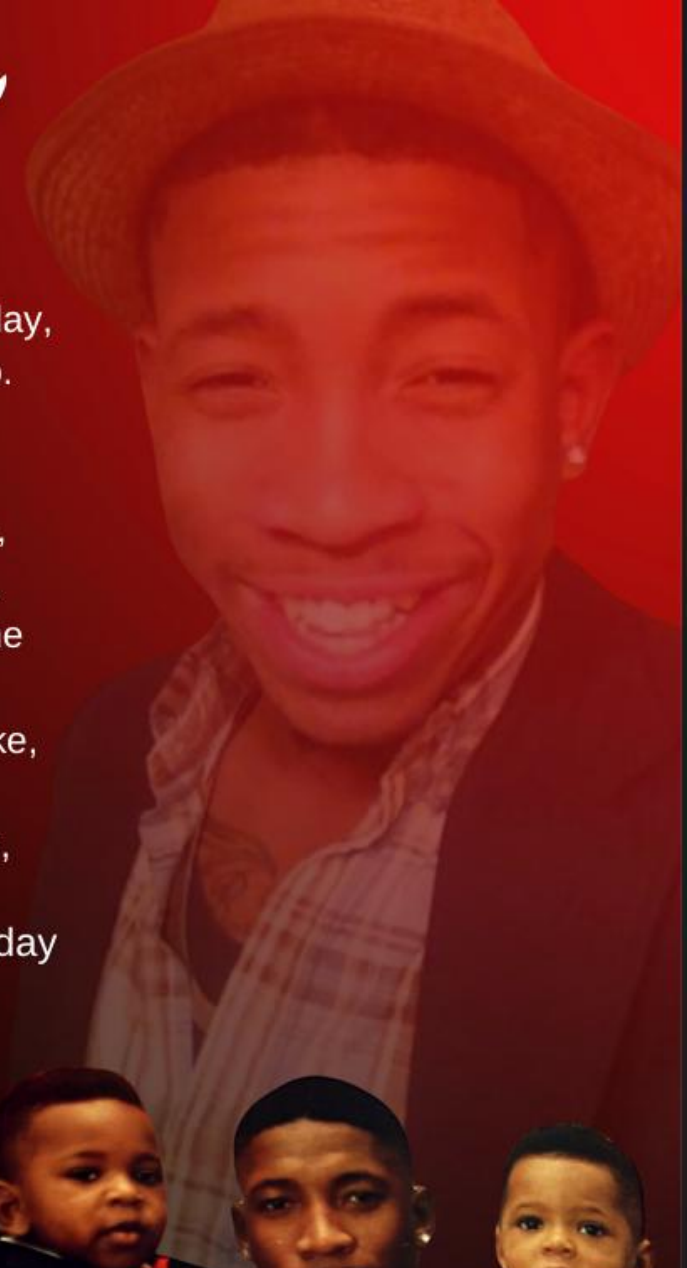
