As we begin our new year, our renewed mission includes JA Pathways - a bold reinvention of education to empower ALL Maine students. These multiple experiences help children form good money management habits, find and prepare for a career, become innovative thinkers, and develop the skills needed to compete in a global economy.

As part of JA Pathways, we offer our **newly-developed JA Maine Connect virtual learning platform** to all district partners as an alternative, flexible, or hybrid learning option for educators and students. This is particularly important in rural districts. We will continue to utilize our enhanced digital capabilities to match student classrooms in one area with remote volunteer mentors from other Maine regions to expand students' career exploration opportunities and Maine industry awareness.

Junior Achievement's Titan Pilot Program & Competition

TITAN CHALLENGE







JA Titan is a simulation-based program in which high school students compete as business CEOs in the phone industry, experiencing firsthand how an organization evaluates alternatives, makes decisions, analyzes the outcomes of those decisions, and then strategizes what to do next.

Students have spent time learning different facets of business and leadership, watching videos from local mentors who take deeper dives into business topics, and prepping for the virtual competition.

"I've been doing the Titan Challenge for the last six years and JA has really outdone themselves with the new platform this year. The changes they've made have been outstanding and that is an understatement! My students have done the simulation this year numerous times and are really excited to compete with other schools. Anytime students are excited is a good thing! The kids enjoy it immensely and are always asking to play if we have free time. It's a great team building activity and can also be integrated into many curriculums such as math, business, accounting and even history. I cannot recommend this enough."

Junior Achievement of Maine is the first office in the nation to run a virtual competition using the new simulation and Maine high school students will be the first to compete. "I was [volunteering with] Junior Achievement for a number of years...Being in forensic accounting, I would talk to the kids about identity, financial crimes, and protecting your credit ratings. All those things that you need to do to protect yourself in this new world that we live in.

Let's fast forward a little bit. At a seminar, I was asked about myself and happened to mention that I did JA. All of a sudden I was asked, 'Wait a minute. Did you ever do JA at Winthrop High School?' I said, 'Yeah! All the time!' He goes, 'You must be the guy...there was a guy who came in and talked about identity theft, financial crimes, the whole nine. My daughter came out that day, got in the car and said I'm going to become a forensic accountant. I heard about the most amazing job. This is what I want to do!'

She's graduating right now from University of New Haven with a forensic accounting degree. It's nice to know that I was able to give somebody that interest, that quite frankly is my passion, and to hand that passion onto somebody else. It gives me goosebumps to think about that, you just never know who you're reaching out to, and it makes a difference.

To have that come full circle and somebody say 'you really made a difference in my daughter's life.' **That's what JA does.** It makes a difference, hands down."





Meet Emma

JA Alumni who found her career passion thanks to her inspiring JA learning experiences and volunteer mentors. She even wrote about it in a college admissions essay:

"I have always loved the adventure of exploring... So, at the age of six, I decided I wanted to be a scientist. Then at age nine, I decided I wanted to be a veterinarian because of my love of animals....

It wasn't until seventh grade that the thought of marine biology got into my head. I can tell you the exact moment I decided what my career was going to be.

I was in a Junior Achievement class which has business volunteers come into the classroom to help students sculpt their future by getting you to think about what you are passionate about doing...the topic for the seventh grade was 'JA: It's My Future'. [The volunteer] had put 'career cards' on each table in the classroom and told each of us to pick a card that interested us.

So naturally, I picked the veterinarian card. The card listed other related fields. Then I saw marine biology as a career option. The gut feeling I got when I thought of marine biology was hard to ignore.

All I've ever dreamed about is exploring new uncharted places and to be able to see the ocean from a whole new perspective. Ever since that day in seventh grade, I have wanted to be a marine biologist."


Emma is now in her first semester of college studying marine biology. She has a clear vision for her desired path forward **thanks to Junior Achievement experiences.**


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


