



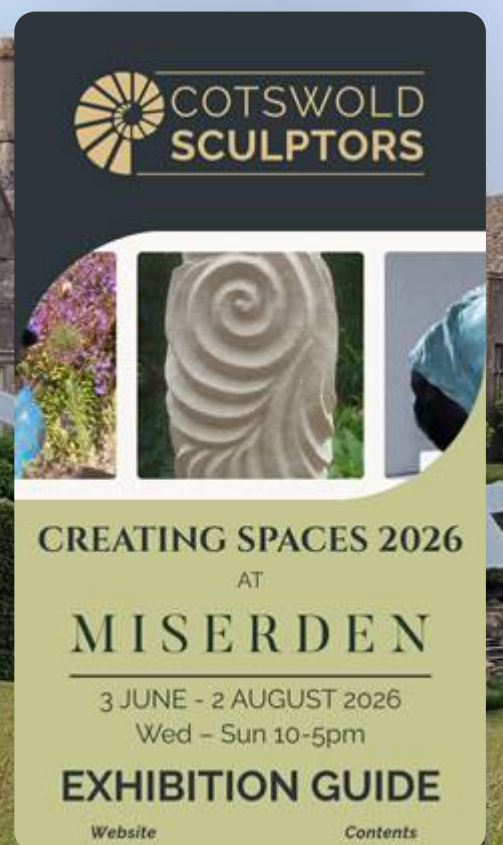

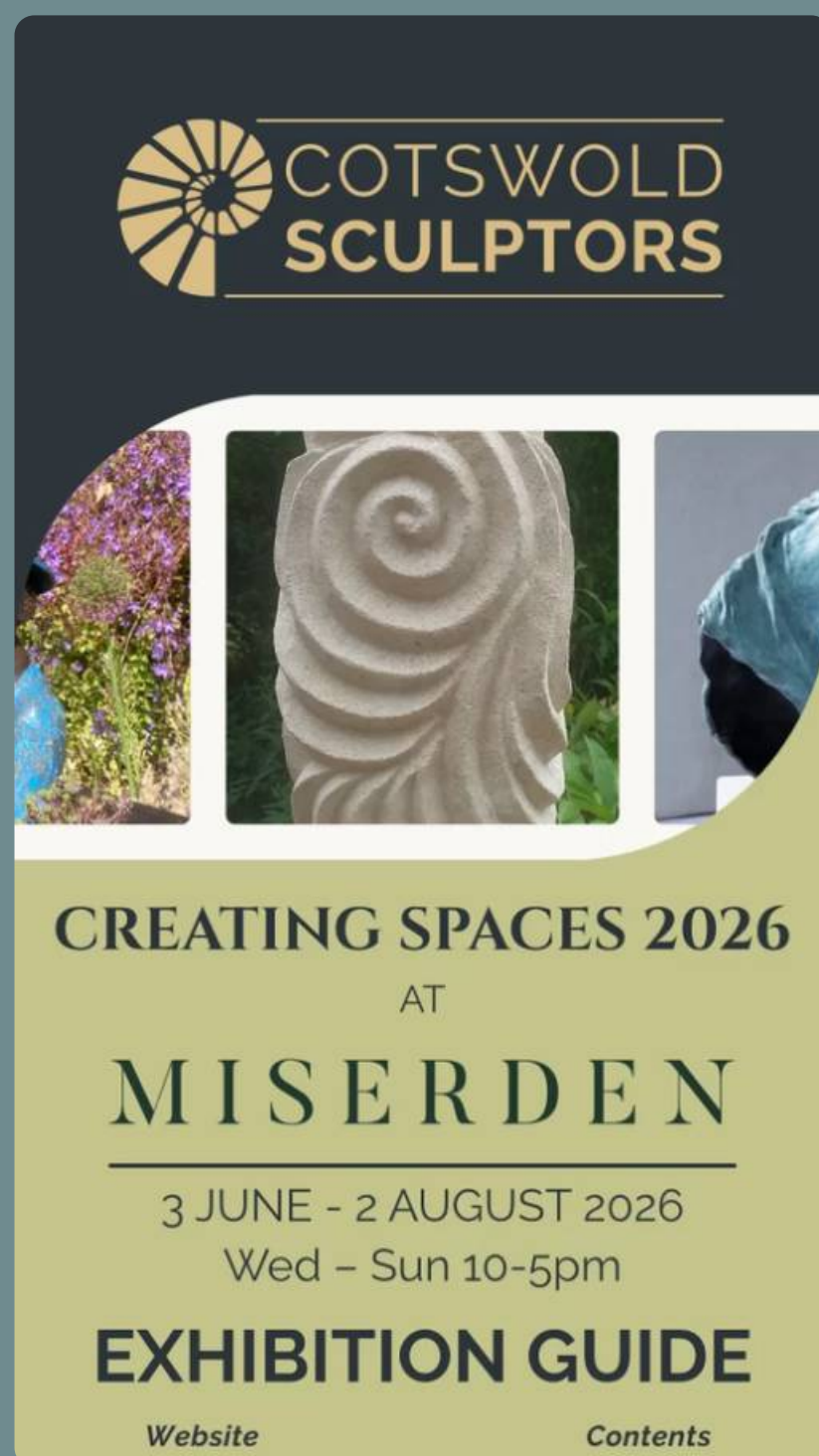

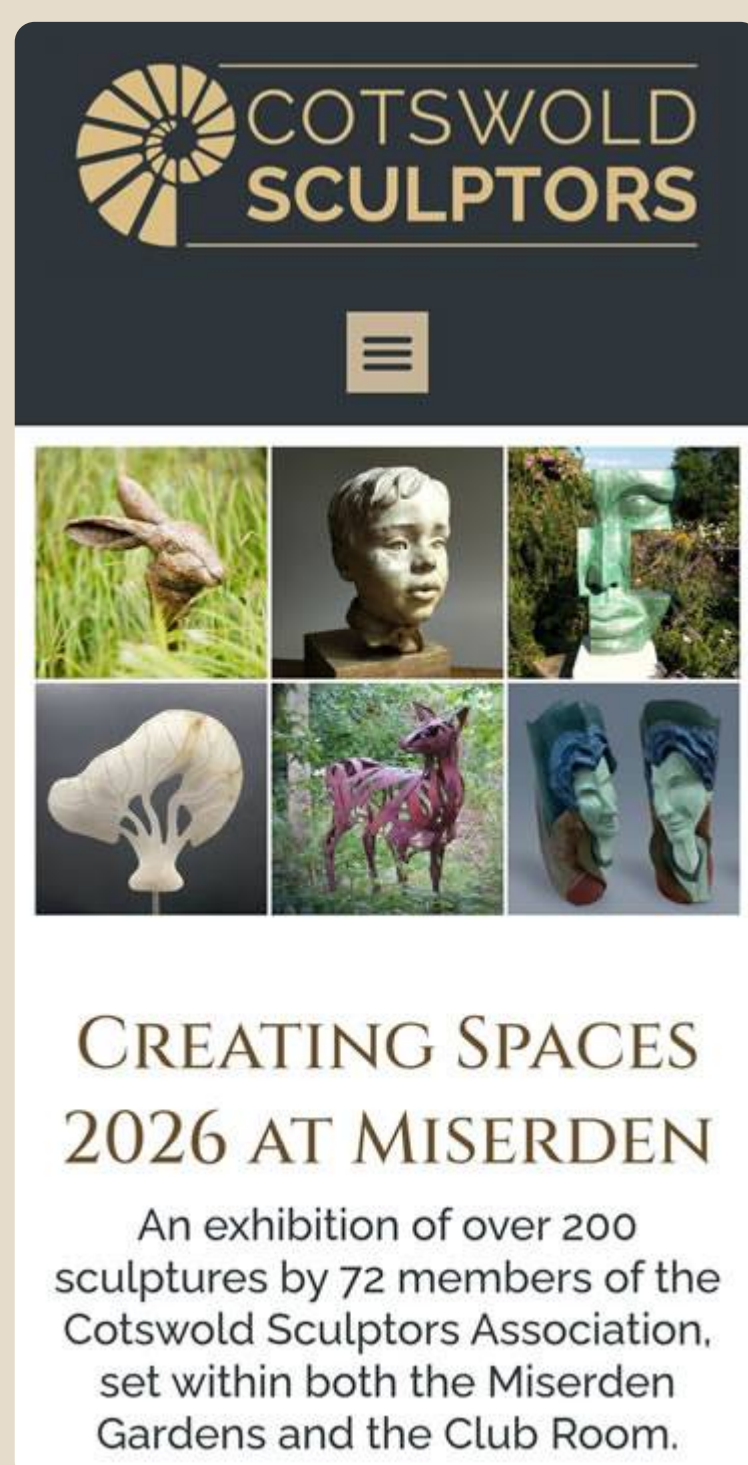

Richard Bindon



Richard Bindon is a self-taught metalwork artist based in Swindon, working under the name **Solo Metal Arts**. His work is inspired by wildlife and science fiction, alongside bespoke commissions that allow him to explore a wide range of subjects.

He has had a lifelong connection to metalworking, growing up around his father's engineering business and becoming familiar with tools and machinery from an early age. This early exposure led him to train as a toolmaker in the early 1990s, building a long career in precision engineering alongside his developing sculptural practice.

In 2015, he began creating his own work at home, initially producing science-fiction inspired pieces, including a steel model of the Millennium Falcon and a life-sized Terminator

bust. These early projects led him towards exploring wildlife forms, particularly birds such as robins, wrens, kingfishers and owls, created from welded cutlery. The work proved popular when exhibited locally.

More recently, he has been focusing on stainless steel sheet as his primary material, while still allowing occasional unexpected elements to appear in his compositions.

Jo's ceramic pieces are almost always built using the coiling method. She works intuitively, hand building in response to visual and emotional experiences, natural forms and organic subject matter, and places she's visited. Recent visits to India have deeply inspired her work.

It is true that her pieces can hold an intensity with the viewer, allowing space for individual interpretation and/or narrative.

and has 30 years' experience of teaching of 11-18 years olds. She has also collaborated with an elite shoe designer and had window installations throughout the brand's international stores.

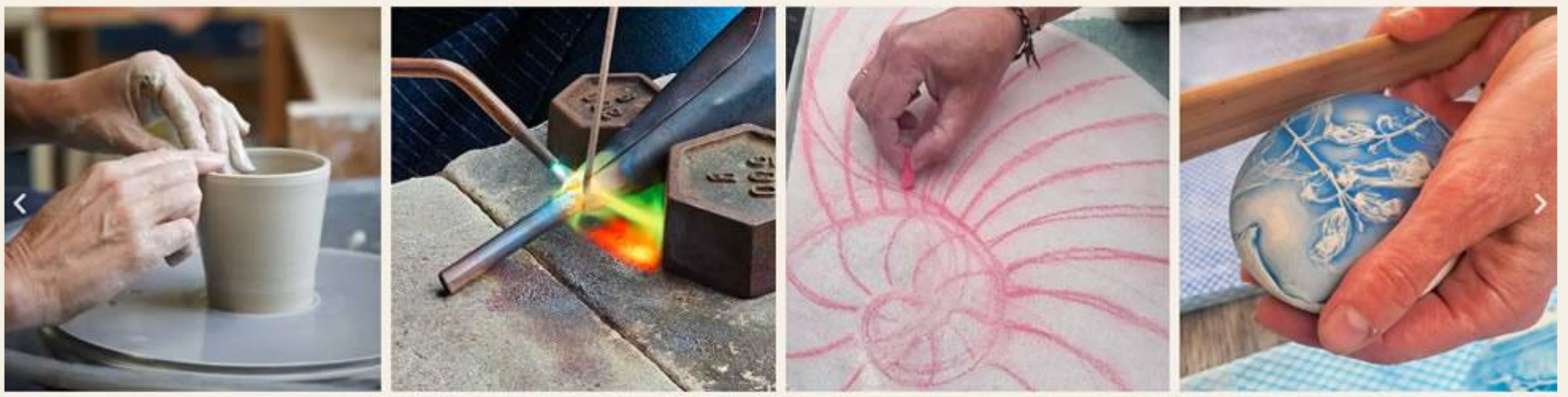

Elizabeth is originally from New Zealand where her interest in art developed through an inspirational teacher and sculptor who encouraged her to go to art school where she gained a fine arts degree.

Following career paths in music, film-making and a few 'proper jobs' Elizabeth was lucky enough to be able to jump off the treadmill, reconnect with art and the wonders of sculpture.

In 2024 she relocated from Surrey to Herefordshire where she now creates and casts limited edition sculptures in her studio near Ross-on-Wye.

Elizabeth's sculpture is mainly abstract with a sprinkle of realism – blending the angular, the curvaceous and the spaces they contain or become. She is particularly focused on giving shape to female experience; finding new ways of expressing the female form. Playful creations of cats sometimes find their way out of her studio too!

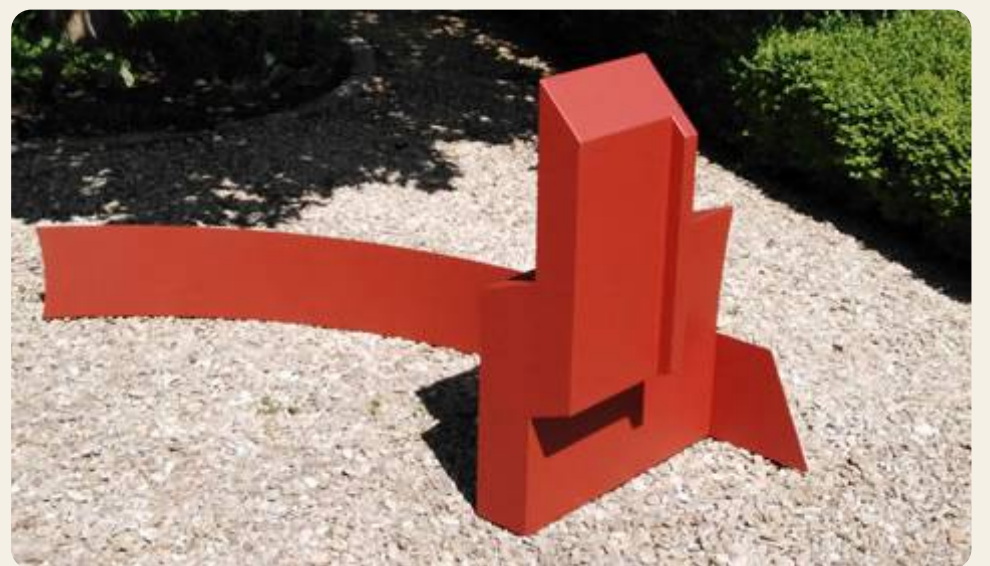

Lynn Baxter



My practice ranges from abstract sculpture to painting – sometimes exploring the interface between. Sculptural work spawns paintings, an interest in bending the picture plane, the addition of 3-D elements – and sculpture can be drawing in air.

Industrial and found elements interest me and I work mainly in metal, wood, ceramics, mixed media, from small to large scale.



SPOTLIGHT

• *Member profiles***Lynn Baxter - cont.**

A major theme informing my sculpture concerns the human aspiration to fly, its kinship with the creative impetus: "Drawing in Air"; "Towers to Fly From, Clouds to Look Down On", "Icarus". This strand embodies a fascination with early literature. My first degree encompassed Anglo Saxon and Old Norse studies.

Another theme concerns Constructionist design practice, playing with formal elements, using found materials and minimal means. The resulting artworks are constructed in wood and pigment, and are as if created from Bauhaus building blocks.

Following a career in arts management and public art commissioning I gained a first class BA (Hons) in Fine Art.

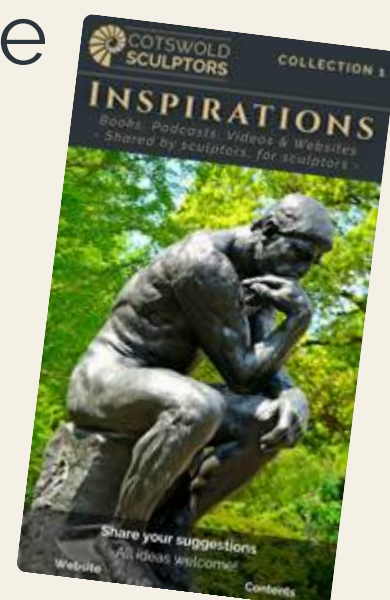

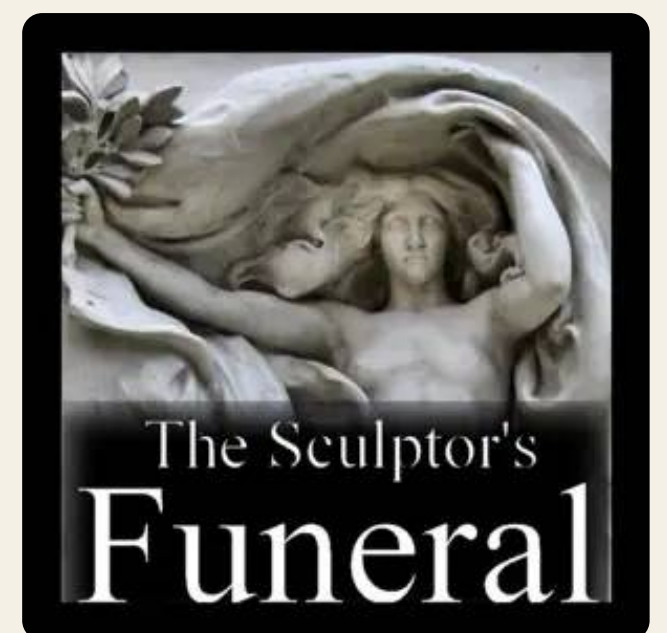

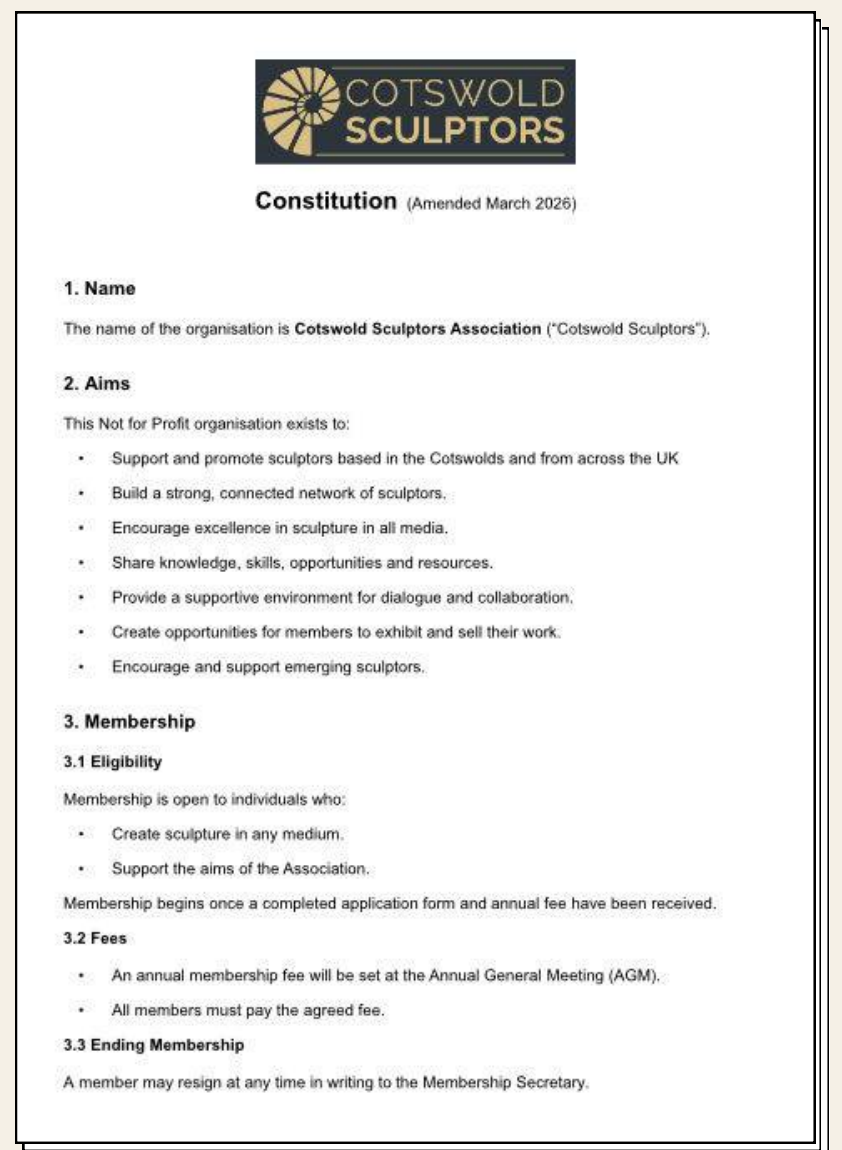
Constitution Updated

Following on from the AGM, members approved an updated Constitution for the Cotswold Sculptors Association.

The revised document modernises and clarifies the Association's governing framework while retaining the aims and values that have guided CSA since its formation.

The update includes:

- A clearer statement of CSA's status as a not-for-profit organisation.
- Simplified structure and language, making the Constitution easier to read and navigate.
- Updated provisions covering equality, inclusion and member conduct.
- Clarified committee roles, responsibilities and governance procedures.
- Recognition of secure online voting and other modern working practices.
- Strengthened financial and administrative provisions.

Importantly, the Association's core aims remain unchanged: supporting sculptors, encouraging the exchange of knowledge and opportunities, creating exhibition opportunities, and promoting the art of sculpture.

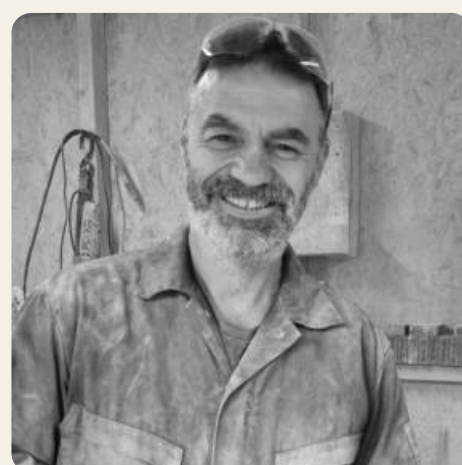
