CIRCUS ARTS

Our circus camps are expertly programmed by Rachel David, a seasoned circus professional and a team of highly skilled and qualified circus professionals. Each camper is supported and challenged at their own pace, based on age and abilities, in a safe, inclusive and supportive environment.

INTRO TO CIRCUS AGES 6-8

This program offers a fun and balanced mix of circus skills and traditional camp activities. Campers will spend half of their day learning exciting circus arts (including acrobatics, clowning, spinning plates and tight wire) and the other half exploring classic camp activities (including arts and crafts, active games and team-building exercises) for a well-rounded camp experience.

YOUNG CAMPERS

Campers will embark on an artistic journey that draws from their own experiences, creative visions and imaginations, culminating in their own Open House Art Show, sharing their masterpieces with fellow campers and their families.



Campers will have the chance to explore their creativity through various art mediums and techniques. Whether it is clay, printmaking or mixed media, campers will experiment with different art forms to express their ideas and bring their visions to life.

LEADERSHIP

Harbourfront Centre Camps offers youth the opportunity to build their leadership abilities while learning about citizenship, civic action and how to activate communities.

Programs range from two to four weeks in length, providing both short-term and extended opportunities for growth. Campers will engage in hands-on activities, group discussions and projects that challenge them to think critically and collaborate with peers.

Applications may be required, so be sure to check the program details when registering.

LEADERS-IN-TRAINING (LIT) AGES 13-14

In this two-week program, young leaders will gain hands-on experience shadowing counsellors in Harbourfront Centre's Young Campers programs. They will take on leadership roles, interact with younger campers and develop critical skills like teamwork and communication. The session will conclude with a cumulative project that gives back to the Harbourfront Centre community.

COUNSELLOR-IN-TRAINING (CIT) AGE 15 (BY THE END OF THE CALENDAR YEAR)

This four-week intensive program is designed for aspiring leaders who want to develop their skills and gain hands-on experience in a camp setting. CITs begin with a week of training and workshops before completing three separate week-long placements in various Harbourfront Centre camps. During each placement, they will shadow a counsellor, assist with program planning and interact with campers as emerging leaders. Space is limited.

INSTRUCTOR-IN-TRAINING (IIT) AGE 15 (BY THE END OF THE CALENDAR YEAR)

The Instructor-in-Training (IIT) Program prepares young leaders for on-water instruction within our Canoe and Kayak Camp Programs. IITs commit to four weeks of placement over the summer, working alongside experienced instructors with various camp groups. Training focuses on practical skills, camper management, and leadership to ensure IITs are wellequipped for success in their roles.

SAILING CAMPS IN PARTNERSHIP WITH TORONTO HARBOUR NAUTICAL CENTRE



Our Sailing camps take place in the beautiful Toronto Inner Harbour, providing campers with the opportunity to explore this unique setting under the guidance of experienced and well-trained instructors from Toronto Harbour Nautical Centre.

Safety is our priority. All campers in our marine programs are provided with a Personal Floatation Device (PFD), and proper use of the PFD is strictly enforced. Helmets are also available for all participants in iCANSail, Junior Seadogs and CANSail 1, and may be made mandatory at the discretion of our Sailing Camps Instructors.



This camp provides the ideal introduction to sailing and water safety for young campers! Led by certified Sail Canada instructors, the program is designed to build a strong foundation in essential skills, marking the first step in the Sail Canada accreditation journey. Campers will start their adventure aboard stable Optimist dinghies, gaining confidence through hands-on experience, they'll develop important skills like balance, boat control and boating safety.

SENIOR SEAFARERS AGES 10–15

For sailing fanatics! Senior Seafarers is a program that follows Sail Canada's Basic Cruising course syllabus. Students will work towards achieving "Crew Status," the first step in completing Sail Canada's Basic Cruising level. Seafarers will sail all day while working on refining skills such as sail trim, reefing and anchoring. Seafarers is a course for young sailors who dream of crossing an ocean, lake or pond like a pro!

PREREQUISITES: No experience is required, making it perfect for first-time sailors and graduates from the Seadogs program.

Campers will work toward earning internationally recognized certificates, — an exciting step for any budding sailor!

PREREQUISITES: iCANSail certification is recommended but not required—this program is suitable for first-time sailors.

CANSAIL 2 AGES 9-15

After your young sailor has successfully passed their CANSail 1 certification, CANSail 2 is the natural next step in their development. Under the experienced guidance of our Sail Canada Instructors, sailors can build on previously taught skills and work their way toward earning an internationally recognized certificate for this level by demonstrating skills learned in the program.

PREREQUISITES: Successful completion of CANSail 1 is required for this program.

CERTIFICATE: Successful candidates will receive a recognized CANSail certificate.

NOTE: Campers will be divided into Junior and Senior categories on the first day of camp, ensuring that each group receives ageappropriate instruction.

CANSAIL 3 & 4 AGES 11–15

For sailors who have completed CANSail 1 and CANSail 2, CANSail 3 & 4 is the next exciting step in their sailing journey. This advanced program, taught to Sail Canada's CANSail 3 and 4 standards, focuses on advanced sailing techniques, sail theory and the ability to sail in a variety of weather conditions.

NOTE: This program requires a higher level of commitment, as participants will be required to sail in varying conditions outside of camp hours and prove advanced skills to earn their CANSail 3 and 4 certificate.

REGISTRATION: Please note that this course is offered directly through the THNC Sailing School.

ICANCATCH-UP AGES 9-15

For sailors who have not yet successfully completed their CANSail certification, our partner THNC offers a catch-up week designed to provide additional instruction and support.

PREREQUISITES: Sailors must have participated in a CANSail program and have an active CANSail profile.

CERTIFICATE: Successful candidates will receive a recognized CANSail certification.

REGISTRATION: Please note that this course is offered directly through the THNC Sailing School.



SAILING INSTRUCTORS-IN-TRAINING AGE 15 (BY THE END OF THE CALENDAR YEAR)

THNC's IIT Program prepares instructors for on-water leadership. Sailing IITs will undergo Pre-Camp Training in the last week of June, focusing on practical skills, camper management, and leadership to ensure success in the summer programs.

PREREQUISITES: Sailing IITs must have CANSail 2 at minimum.



HOW TO REGISTER

Camp registrations are processed through the Harbourfront Centre Camps CampBrain portal. To sign up, click here or the "Register Now" button on any camp webpage. After selecting your camp and dates, complete the forms and payment. For assistance, contact the Camps Office.

INSTALLMENT PLAN

You can pay the camp fee in whole or installments, which are processed automatically on the first business day of each month. To pay by installments, a minimum deposit of \$100 is required. All payments must be made in full by **June 2**, **2025**.

CANCELLATION POLICY

Cancellations can be processed free of charge, upon request in writing until **March 31**, **2025**.

From **April 1**, **2025**, onwards, all cancellations will be subject to a \$100 administrative fee (per camp per camper).

No refunds will be issued for cancellations requested **less than 14** days before the program begins.
