Where did the United States' time zones come from?



When you run a railroad, you need to maintain a schedule. That works a whole lot better when everyone agrees on what time it is - including stations in far-flung locations and, crucially, other railroad companies that are making schedules for trains on the same tracks you're using. That's why railroads led the charge when Britain got its towns and cities on the same clock by the 1840s, and it's why the same thing happened in the United States about 40 years later. U.S. railroads got together in the 1880s and came up with a plan to divide the county into time zones and synchronize

official clocks according to those divisions. The plan created the Eastern, Central, Mountain, and Pacific time zones that we still have today. It went into effect on November 18, 1883, with assistance from the U.S. Navv in syncing up clocks across the nation using a telegraph system. However, Congress didn't get around to codifying these railroad time zones into law until decades later, in 1918, when the time zone system was recognized in official legislation. Boundaries have changed significantly in some places (Detroit and Florida were both once on Central Time), but the basic concept is the same. (History.com)

THE MOST COMMON SHADE IS A FLUORESCENT HUE KNOWN AS OPTIC YELLOW OR HIGH-VISIBILITY YELLOW MANY PEOPLE HAVE ARGUED THAT IT'S MORE OF A NEON GREEN, BUT "YELLOW" IS THE OFFICIAL DESIGNATION FROM THE ITF. Last month's question:

What does an ECG check?

Answer: (B) The heart

An electrocardiogram, also known as an ECG or EKG, checks and records the electrical signals in your heart. These electrical signals register as types of waves — a P wave, a QRS complex, and a T wave — each of which measures a different aspect of the heart's rhythm. Doctors can use an ECG to detect potential issues, such as whether the electrical activity of a patient's heartbeat is fast or irregular, or whether there are structural problems within the chambers of the heart. Although it may sound scary, it's a painless and noninvasive test. Sticky electrodes that act as sensors are placed on specific areas of an individual's chest or limbs. These electrodes then record the electrical signals and display them as waves on a monitor or printout. In most cases, the test takes just a few minutes. (The Mayo Clinic - March 18, 2020)

Twinkies' filling was originally ... BANANA!

Twinkies, as we know them now, are simple: yellow cake filled with vanilla cream frosting. But when the sweet snacks first appeared in 1930, the tasty filling was bananaflavored, not vanilla. Twinkie inventor James Alexander Dewar, then a baker for the Continental Baking Company, came up with the treat when he was looking for a way to utilize the bakery's strawberry shortcake machine when strawberries were out of season. He substituted banana cream, and the Twinkie was born. Unfortunately, with the advent of World War II, bananas were rationed, forcing Hostess to switch to vanilla cream filling. The change proved to be so popular with customers that the filling was never switched back to banana once the war ended. Hostess has since revived the original flavor for limited-edition Twinkies on a few occasions - such as to promote the DVD release of the 2006 movie "King Kong" - but today, the main flavor is still vanilla. Other varieties include chocolate cake, fudge-covered and strawberry. (New York Times)
