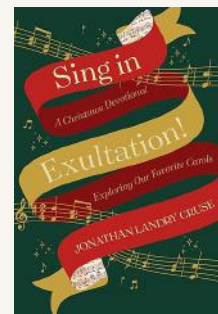
This devotional shows families how the birth and life of Jesus fulfilled God's Old Testament promises of a Savior. This "upside-down" book includes fourteen Bible stories.

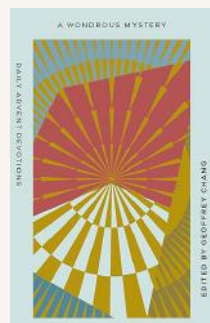

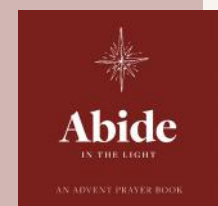
Daily Advent Devotions

FRONT ROW SEAT

Observing God's Work through Serving Others by Jane Edson, Communications Specialist with testimony from John & Ready Bateman, Diane Steele, & Bond Beams

Sitting on the front row of a sporting event gets you right in the middle of the action. Having a front row seat to what God is doing by volunteering simply requires willing hands and heart. The rewards are great when we see the Lord at work while serving others, and we are captivated by Christ up close.

We would like to share a few stories of members who have faithfully served as volunteers on Sunday mornings and in ministry programs. We hope you will be encouraged to prayerfully consider how you can serve the Lord through PCPC as an individual or a family. It's a front row seat to the hands and feet of Christ, bringing God's Word to life.

Psalm 145:4 says, "One generation shall commend Your works to another, and shall declare Your mighty acts."

Preschool Ministry, John & Ready Bateman

John and Ready started teaching preschool Sunday school at PCPC when their children were in preschool, and they never left. You can find John on Sunday mornings at 11:00 a.m. teaching a room full of 60 preschoolers that "God keeps His promises," dynamically slapping his hands and knees along with the kids chanting that "Everything the Bible says is absolutely true." Ready enjoys teaching memory verses to the children, sitting alongside them, and teaching them how to worship the Lord. The Batemans shared:



One time in our five-year-old classroom, we were discussing God's creation at the table. John asked, "Who made all things?," and all the children shouted, "God!" Then he followed up with a harder question, "How did God make all things?," and one little girl answered, "He spoke them into being!" We are always delighted by the theological knowledge of these young children. Teaching children reinforces biblical truth, which is encouraging and instructive to us as well. Finding a place to serve is the best way we've found to make the big church small. Teaching preschoolers the Bible gives us a front row seat to watch our church's youngest children grow in their faith. Whether you teach, care for the poor, or go on a mission trip, you will be blessed as you serve the Lord.

Homebound Ministry, Diane Steele

Diane Steele was attending Sunday worship at PCPC many years ago and overheard two women talking. What she overheard would later launch PCPC's homebound ministry, a program where volunteers visit elderly members in nursing homes or private homes once a month to offer encouragement, friendship, and prayer. Here's Diane's story of how it all got started:

One woman speaking in the pew behind me that day was the daughter of a previously very active woman at PCPC who had become homebound. The other lady asked her how she was doing, and the daughter made the comment that she felt like her mother had been forgotten. This was a divine appointment that I should sit in front of those two ladies. I was so convicted in my spirit that I called Jane Beasley, who was on staff with PCPC senior adult ministry. From that conversation, we began to identify other members who were homebound and to organize members who wanted to visit them. I have been doing this now for about 13 years and have developed so many sweet relationships.



Diane encourages others to take advantage of this front row seat to God's handiwork by listening to the Lord's call and responding according to Isaiah 6:8, "Here I am! Send me."

Helping Hands, Bond Beams

Bond Beams has served with PCPC Helping Hands since its beginning. Similarly, it all began with a conversation and a need. Bond said:

I began serving over 20 years ago following a discussion with a single mom about helping her and other single moms put up Christmas trees and decorations. Shortly thereafter this morphed into "Honey Do Day," where the deacons volunteered to help the single moms 3-4 times a year performing a variety of jobs needing to be addressed at their residences. Now we call it "Helping Hands," and have expanded it to include seniors and other members in need of assistance. It's a great opportunity for the congregation to serve alongside the diaconate.

Bond continues to serve today because "This ministry has provided me a front row seat to observe God's hand at work providing for the needs of His sheep. It has also served to initiate and/or develop relationships within the congregation. All of which has strengthened my faith in Him."
