With 30 support programs and services currently helping over 5,000 children and family members, support is offered to all members of the family and is available throughout every step of their difficult journey.

Our Origin Story & 50 Year Legacy

Children's Cancer Center was founded in 1974. Mac and Cecile Burnett, who lost their daughter Helen to leukemia, and Dr. Janifer M. Judisch envisioned an organization that would help alleviate the stress of coping with a child's life-threatening disease. The philosophy of our original founders was that when a child is diagnosed, the entire family is really diagnosed. Therefore, our programs and services address the needs of all family members affected.

We are celebrating a momentous milestone in our journey – the 50th anniversary of the Children's Cancer Center. To honor this occasion, we are proud to unveil our anniversary theme: "Celebrating 50 Years of Community." Over the past half-century, the Children's Cancer Center has become a symbol of hope for children and families facing the unimaginable challenges of pediatric cancer. As we look back on our golden anniversary, we reflect with gratitude on the countless stories of resilience, triumphs, and unwavering support.



Ambassador Highlight

Dylan was eight years old when she was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia. Upon her diagnosis, Dylan felt an overwhelming sense of fear, as she didn't believe she was going to get through her pediatric cancer journey. She couldn't believe something like this would have ever happened to her.

Dylan shared that the hardest part of her cancer journey was when her platelets were so low, causing a blood vessel to leak in her brain, which then caused a stroke. She was admitted into the ICU and stayed in the hospital for over 200 days.

Dylan has completed treatment and says, "I'm feeling really good because I'm not on chemo!" She shared that she still has flashbacks of having a PICC line and how going back to school has been hard since her friends didn't recognize her after losing her hair. She also shared that if she could give any advice to another recently diagnosed child, she would tell them not to worry about their hair falling out, because it will grow back.

The Children's Cancer Center has been a lifeline for Dylan and her family. Being surrounded by other children going through similar experiences has helped Dylan feel more comfortable and less isolated. She has loved attending our Oncology Family Connection Group, enjoying summers at KITE Camp, and proudly serving as one of our child ambassadors!

Pediatric Cancer Statistics

- Pediatric cancer is the #1 cause of death by disease among children
- Only 4% of federal funding goes towards pediatric cancer research
- Every 3 minutes, a child in the world is diagnosed with pediatric cancer
- 2 per every 3 survivors will still develop at least one chronic health condition, including musculoskeletal problems and second cancers
- 43 kids a day are diagnosed in the US
- Pediatric cancer patients & survivors are 57% more likely to develop depression and 29% more likely to have anxiety than their peers. Other common psychiatric issues include post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), obsessive-compulsive disorder and phobias





Support for Children

Love Bundles

Our Program and Family Services team delivers custom care packages filled with comfort items, toys, and games weekly to newly diagnosed children in the hospital. These bundles are meant to offer comfort and emotional reassurance to children at the start of their treatment process. Serving as the first touchpoint with families, these love bundles are a warm introduction to the essential therapies and family support groups that we offer.

Monthly Inpatient Meal

Our Program and Family Services team arranges catered meals to be delivered on a monthly basis to the Oncology Floor at Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital. This unifying opportunity welcomes families to take a break from their hospital room and connect with others on a similar journey.

Outreach

Members of our Programs & Family Services team conduct weekly visits to the oncology floors and monthly meetings with the hospital's clinical staff. These opportunities allow us to connect further with families and identify areas of need both during their time of diagnosis and throughout their treatment plan.

Bi-Annual Social Work Appreciation Breakfast

Child Life Specialists & Social Workers, specializing in pediatric oncology & hematology, are invited for breakfast and program collaboration at the Children's Cancer Center. These hospital partnerships are an integral source of communication and vital in allowing us to meet the current and evolving needs of the families and support the hospital healthcare teams.

Hurricane Help

Provided meals to all 3 hospitals (nursing staff) on the ONC floor for the care providers who were stuck in the hospitals during the hurricane.

Program Highlights



Cyrus, Director of Smiles

We expanded to **30** programs when welcoming Cyrus Blue as a member of the Children's Cancer Center family! Cyrus' support at our programs has helped children and their families' physical, social, emotional and cognitive functioning.



Restoring Inner Strength & Energy (RISE)

The RISE program has reached over 50 families, making movement and healthy eating a fun, family-friendly experience. By combining nutrition tips with adaptive workouts, RISE helps families stay active, build confidence, and improve their overall well-being together.



White Hat Fund

\$100,000 distributed! Financial Assistance is offered to families to help offset the financial burden that surfaces during a cancer diagnosis. Essential bills such as electric, mortgage, rent, car payments and insurance are covered through the White Hat Fund program.



Holiday Adoption

706 children and their family members were adopted through the generous support of over 100 businesses, volunteer groups and members of our community. Our volunteer Elf Helpers and magic makers helped us fill entire holiday wish lists for kids at home and in hospital rooms.



Scholarships

The Panera Bread Knead for Knowledge Scholarship Program awards **\$65,000** to high school seniors or graduates who have been diagnosed with pediatric cancer before the age of 21. Those who have lost a sibling to pediatric cancer are also eligible for a scholarship. Over the past decade, the Covelli Family has gifted over **\$615,00** in college scholarships to highschool seniors and graduates.



Camp Good Days

The Children's Cancer Center sent teens on an annual adventure to 'Doing a World of Good' (DAWG) Week at Camp Good Days in upstate New York. For 14 years we have sent teens on this one-of-a-kind Summer camp experience, introducing them to other friends from around the world who are also battling pediatric cancer. Recently, our kids have made friends from countries like Italy, Germany, Spain, and the Czech Republic.



Events

Children's Cancer Center has over **5,000** children and family members battling pediatric cancer. We had another busy year of fundraising events where our community came together to make a difference in the lives of the children and families we serve!

Wine Women & Shoes

Raised a record breaking **\$1.185 million** net at our 10th Annual Wine Women & Shoes! 1,110 shoes were worn, 3,375 glasses of wine were poured and 30 programs were funded thanks to our sponsors, event attendees and all community partners involved.

Social Society of Sarasota

The first ever Social Society of Sarasota was held at the Powel Crosley Estate where over **\$65,000** net was raised for the 150 families we serve in Sarasota and Manatee County battling pediatric cancer.

I have been involved with the center since 2010. When my sister was diagnosed with Leukemia she was 7 and I was a teenager. We were referred to the center by a family friend who just finished their battle. Our first event was an Oncology Family Connection Group. I remember my parents trying their hardest to intermingle and make some connections with other parents who were in similar situations. My sister was still young and went straight to the barbie play house. However, I wasn't really sure what my purpose was there. I was the only teenager at the center that night and honestly just stuck around the food table picking away at my plate. I made my way outside and saw a few kids climbing into a wagon and began pulling them around. Little did I know that this would turn into an hour long event with several more kids coming to wait in line! Ever since that day I realized what my purpose at the center was. Whether it was volunteering at a family group, a teen group, S.A.I.L, or summer camp, I made it my purpose to seek out those kids whose childhoods weren't so much different than mine, the kids who were being robbed of their enjoyment and making it my passion to give it back.

Fifteen years have passed since I first walked through the doors of the Children's Cancer Center. Throughout those years I learned so much as a sibling of a cancer patient, the other families at the CCC, and the volunteers and staff who helped me navigate my own path to now working in my 5th year as a 6th grade history teacher. I thank the center for leading me down this path and have been lucky enough to see all of the positive changes that the Center has undergone over the past decade. Watching the center grow in numbers is both a blessing and a curse. It's hard seeing more and more children walk through the door fighting this fight, but the truth is that there will always be new children and I love that they have been given the chance to be part of such a great organization who will truly take care of the entire family. The blessing is that the center is the home that they can come back to year after year, no matter where their life takes them. Better to fight together than to struggle alone.
