### TIDBITS® TAKES **PENICILLIN**


Before penicillin, there was no effective treatment for infections. Hospitals were full of people dying from infections. Come along with Tidbits as we celebrate the discovery and development of penicillin!

#### AN ACCIDENTAL DISCOVERY

- Alexander Fleming was a Scottish medical researcher working for St. Mary's Hospital in London. His project was to grow as much Staphylococcal microbes as possible, so that experiments could be run on how to kill staphylococcus infections. Fleming was growing the infectious microbe using a seaweed extract called agar in petri dishes.
- In 1928, he left for a long weekend trip. When he returned to his lab, he found that one of the petri dishes had been knocked askew so the lid was partially open. This had allowed mold spores floating in the air to descend upon the agar, contaminating his staphylococcus culture. He was surprised to see that the invading mold had killed the staphylococcus culture wherever it grew. Examining it, he found it was a common strain of mold from the genus Penicillium.
- Flemming isolated the mold, grew more of it, then experimented to see how many other species of bacteria it could kill. The answer was LOTS.

- Fleming wrote a paper about his accidental discovery in 1929 and distributed samples of the Penicillium mold widely to other researchers, hoping someone could take this discovery further. The problem was that extracting the anti-microbial substances from the mold was very difficult.
- A few years later, researcher Earnest Chain at Oxford, England, happened upon Fleming's paper and began his own experiments with the penicillin mold. His boss, a biochemist named Howard Florey, helped him refine techniques to extract tiny amounts of penicillin from the mold. Their colleague, biochemist Norman Heatley, discovered better ways of purifying penicillin.
- On May 25, 1939, the team injected 8 mice with a virulent strain of Streptococcus. Four of the mice were then injected with a dose of penicillin while the other four were not. The following day, all four control mice were dead, while all four treated mice were alive. Chain declared this to be "a miracle," which was true.
- An article in "The Lancet" published in August of 1940 described their process and the results.
- By 1941, they had enough penicillin to treat one person. It needed to be a person who would otherwise die, because they had no idea if large doses of penicillin would kill a human or not. A British policeman named Albert Alexander had a raging infection that was spreading quickly. He was delirious and close to death. The effects of the first dose of penicillin was miraculous; he was soon nearly back to normal. Unfortunately, the limited supply of penicillin ran out on the fourth day. Albert's infection roared back to life, killing him. Still, the experiment proved the effectiveness of penicillin as an antidote to infection. (cont)



- Sometimes dry erase markers and permanent markers look the same in a hurry. Ever grabbed a marker to write a note on a dry erase white board and found that it wouldn't wipe off? 




#### PENICILLIN (cont)

- With World War II raging, penicillin was needed more than ever. Britain was so preoccupied with the war that there were few facilities to conduct research. Instead, efforts were shifted to the U.S. where Peoria, Illinois, had one of the nation's largest facilities to ferment molds.
- Florey and Heatley went to Illinois in June of 1941 with samples of the penicillin mold. Fearing their cultures could be lost, stolen, or confiscated, they secretly covered their coats with mold spores so they could grow new mold if their samples disappeared. With the help of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, huge vats soon nourished the flourishing growth of the penicillin mold.
- There are many members of the Penicillin family, and researchers hoped to find a strain that would yield a greater amount of the bacteria-killing substance. They asked the government to have soil samples sent in from every place in the world where U.S. soldiers were stationed. All of these new penicillin strains were tested, but none proved worthy. Then a lab assistant brought in a cantaloupe she'd found at the local market right there in Peoria. It had a golden mold growing on it and she wondered if it would be helpful. After scraping off the mold, the people in the lab ate the melon, and then tested the mold. To their astonishment, it yielded 200 times more penicillin than other strains had. To this day, every bit of penicillin ever administered has sprung from that moldy cantaloupe.
- On March 14, 1942, the first American patient was successfully cured with penicillin, provided by the U.S. pharmaceutical company Merck. Half of the total available supply was used to cure Anne Miller of Connecticut of sepsis. By June of 1942, there was enough penicillin in the U.S. to treat ten patients. (cont)


#### PENICILLIN (cont)

- After much experimentation, an injectable, mass-produced form of penicillin was soon ready. American pharmaceutical companies were churning out massive amounts of penicillin within a year.
- The speed at which penicillin became widely available was amazing. In 1941, the U.S. did not have enough to treat a single person. At the end of 1942, enough penicillin was available to treat almost 100 patients. By September of 1943, there was enough to distribute among the Allied Armed Forces worldwide, including 2.3 million doses delivered in time for the invasion of Normandy in the spring of 1944.
- Bacterial pneumonia killed 18% of fallen soldiers in World War I, but in World War II, it killed less than 1% of soldiers.
- Production of the drug in the U.S. jumped from 21 billion units in 1943, to 1,663 billion units in 1944, to over 6.8 trillion units in 1945. Manufacturing techniques improved, leaping from one-liter flasks with less than 1% yield to 10,000-gallon tanks at 80-90% yield between 1938 and 1945.
- By 1949, the price had dropped from \$20 per 100,000 units in 1943 to less than ten cents.
- After the war, the American government removed all restrictions on its use, and as of March 15, 1945, penicillin was available to any American who needed it.
- Alexander Fleming received 189 honors during his lifetime for his accidental discovery and even has a crater on the Moon named after him. In 1945 he shared the Nobel Prize along with Ernst Chain and Howard Florey. In his acceptance speech, Fleming warned that overuse of this new antibiotic might have dangerous implications if microbes developed resistance. This prediction came true far more quickly than Fleming could ever have imagined.



### Halloween Art Style

Happy Halloween from Kovels! Or, in the words of this



The art style is characteristic of the early 1900s, and the postmark on the reverse dates it to 1911. So does its one-cent stamp. You would have to spend considerably more on a postcard like this today: It sold for \$100 at a Matthew Bullock auction.

**Q:** I have 16 Dunbar Sweet Ada line bar glasses hand-painted with two men that say what I just said on them. I can find similar items, but cannot find these anywhere. I would appreciate knowing what they might be worth.

A: Dunbar Glass operated in Dunbar, West Virginia, from 1913 to 1953. They are known for their drinking glasses, pitchers and cocktail

shakers. We have seen some sellers attribute the same Sweet Ada-Line design to the Wheeling Decorating Company, another West Virginia company that was in operation about the same time. Wheeling decorated glass that was made and marked by other factories. Your set of glasses is probably worth about \$100. Large sets of decorated glassware do not often sell for high prices.

TIP: Put a piece of plastic jewelry under hot water and, when warm, smell it. Bakelite smells like formaldehyde, celluloid smells like camphor (mothballs) and Galalith, a 1920s plastic, smells like burnt milk. Lucite does not smell.



I want to fill my truck and trailer with pet food and drive it to where it's most needed, but I'm not sure where to go. Do you have any advice? -- Maggie in upstate New York

**DEAR MAGGIE:** It is heartwarming knowing that you and other pet owners want to do something positive for people and their pets in these areas that have been so hard hit.

As I write this, organizations from across the country are getting in place, setting up in strategic locations so that they can distribute aid, assist with rescues and help recover those lost to this storm. With many major highways cut, travel is nearly impossible in North Carolina, and very difficult elsewhere.

The best thing that you can do right now is to stay put. Instead of driving supplies to disaster areas, start a fundraising drive and donate cash to an organization that is actively helping pets and their owners.

For example, the ASPCA is working with the Humane Society in Charlotte, North Carolina, to evacuate rescue and foster dogs from Asheville and surrounding areas. The Humane Society of the United States is doing likewise. Both organizations are helping owners with pet food and medical care, and providing shelter to animals without families.

Donating to these major organizations, or selecting a local shelter or rescue group in these areas to support now and in the months to come, will help immensely.



### ACUPUNCTURE TO IMPROVE FERTILITY

Acupuncture to improve fertility and the chance of having a healthy baby is not new. It is one of the oldest fertility treatments ever. It has been practiced for thousands of years. It still is, because it works.

Infertility is not simple. There are many reasons why you can't conceive, and although conventional doctors look at several of the reasons, there are many that are difficult to delineate via lab tests or exploratory surgery. That's where acupuncture and naturopathy come in. Generally, when the person has gone through substantial emotional and financial investments towards medicalized fertility treatments, and finds they are not working, is when they start looking around for other answers.

But the right questions have to be asked. Beyond the physical and hormonal aspects of fertility, what are other causes?

This question extends to the inability to keep a pregnancy as miscarriages can be just as emotionally crushing as well.

Many times the answer is multi-faceted. Acupuncturists look at fertility, or the lack thereof, with different eyes. We look at the tongue, details about the color and flow of blood during the menstrual cycle (and not just the usual suspects!), the pulse and other physical or functional attributes. We look at biological, nourishment, environmental, and physical elements as well as lifestyle habits. Patients are listened to and treated as individuals with unique factors that contribute to infertility.

But does acupuncture alone work? Dr. Raymond

Chang, director of Meridian Medical is a medical doctor that apprenticed in China to conventional combine medicine acupuncture. He told WebMD that "acupuncture stimulates egg function without the use of fertility medications. When you compare the pregnancy rates for an egg producing drug such as Clomid to acupuncture alone, the rates are equal - 50% chance of pregnancy in three months for general patients". The nice part about acupuncture is there are not the side effects. This was acupuncture alone. When combined with nutrition and herbal medicine, the results increase exponentially.

Acupuncture can also be used in conjunction with conventional infertility therapies. A study done in Denmark found that "Acupuncture administered on the day of ET (embryo transfer) significantly improves the reproductive outcome in women undergoing IVF or ICSI treatment for infertility. The rates of positive pregnancy tests, clinical pregnancies, and ongoing pregnancy or delivery were all significantly higher than those in the control group". This is because certain neurotransmitters released are acupuncture that effect pituitary gonadotropin secretion, ovarian follicular growth, fertility, and ovulation.

By creating a healthy reproductive environment the chances of getting pregnant increase. There is no magic pill, no one time treatment, no 100% guarantee. However, addressing the multiplicity of factors involved, and using a multidimensional approach, such as acupuncture and nutritional therapy, puts the odds of successful conception back with the couple.

The national, regional and community grant recipients host a wide variety of programs, ranging from SCUBA to wheelchair basketball to archery to skiing to equine therapy and so much more.

Check out department.va.gov/veteran-sports for the highlights of some of the sports, clinics and games that will be offered. For even more info, click on the Fact Sheet link. Whether it's Golden Age games (for those over age 55, May 31 -June 5, 2025) or sports clinics, if you see something you're interested in, don't wait. Contact those who sponsor the events and find out about how to participate.

If you're hesitant to explore the possibilities for next year, keep in mind that in many cases, the clinics and training are ongoing! For competition next year, you need to start now! ### **Medicare for 2025**

Have you made your Medicare decisions yet for 2025? The period for open enrollment runs from Oct. 15 to Dec. 7, and by now you should have received your 2025 handbook "Medicare & You" if you're already signed up.

Between Oct. 15 and Dec. 7 you can make any changes to your existing plans, such as a different Part D drug plan or a new Medicare Advantage plan.

Some things to keep in mind about Medicare:

If you have a Medicare Advantage plan and

make changes, they will take effect on Jan. 1, 2025.

If you have a Medicare Advantage plan, you cannot also have a supplemental plan. Deciding between the original Medicare, an Advantage plan and a supplemental can be one of the toughest decisions about being on Medicare, and your answer will be determined by your own health status and your expectations about the coming year.

Advantage plans can give you lots of benefits you won't get from original Medicare, such as vision and dental -- but a supplemental plan will help with medical costs and pick up what Medicare doesn't. An Advantage plan will cover everything original Medicare covers, but each plan is different and you'll be limited to a network.

Supplemental plans also vary, but often pick up the 20% of the costs that original Medicare doesn't, as well as the co-pays or deductibles, and you can choose your own doctor. A plan might cost you several hundred dollars per month, and you're required to have original Medicare as well.

Confused? You're not alone. If you need help deciding between the original Medicare, a Medicare Advantage plan or a supplemental plan with original Medicare, do your homework and consider asking for advice. You can call Medicare (800-633-4227), or you can call the State Health Insurance Assistance Program (www.shiphelp.org) in your area.







### **Endometrial Biopsy Indicated** for Woman With Blood in Urine

DEAR DR. ROACH: About three months ago, I bled a bit while urinating. This was the first (and only) time in over 30 years that this happened since I went through menopause. An ultrasound was performed, and they found a mildly thickened endometrium (6.1 mm) with scattered cystic change and without focal lesion. My gynecologist is suggesting an endometrial biopsy. I am concerned because I have no symptoms other than kidney stones. I'm due to see a urologist, but even with my kidney stones, I have no symptoms. I am 80 and concerned about anesthesia. Should I go ahead with the biopsy? -- L.O.

ANSWER: A thickened endometrium is concerning for uterine cancer. The most common symptom of uterine cancer is abnormal uterine bleeding. This usually takes the form of red, pink or brown spotting. However, it sounds like you had blood in your urine, which is more concerning for kidney stones than uterine bleeding.

Your ultrasound is abnormal; 5 mm is the maximum thickness for a normal endometrium. Getting a biopsy is clearly the recommended procedure, as it gives guidance on the next steps. Still, your risk of uterine cancer is small. You do not have to proceed with the biopsy if you do not want to.

An endometrial biopsy is an in-office procedure with minimal risk. My textbooks say there is minimal pain, but my patients tell me this isn't always the case. You don't have to receive anesthesia; you can take pain medication (such as naproxen), get a local anesthetic, or do both. I've had several patients who've requested a nerve block and were very happy with their decision.

If the biopsy shows cancer of the endometrium, surgery is the preferred treatment, but radiation is also a possibility for some people.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I have always been a runner, but foot pain has kept me from running in the past few years. Now I have severe pain, even when walking. An MRI showed nothing wrong. The foot and ankle specialist I saw did X-rays and found a large bone spur. He said that surgery to remove the bone spur could get me to walk and run again.

I'm 70 and unanxious to have surgery, and the surgeon says he does many of these surgeries with a good outcome. What do you think? --E.W.

**ANSWER:** Insertional Achilles tendinopathy is a cause of foot pain where the Achilles tendon is inserted into the calcaneus, the heel bone. This problem frequently occurs with runners, especially those with tight calf muscles. The damage done to the tendon sometimes causes a reaction in the bone, causing an osteophyte (a bone spur).

Conservative management includes rest, ice and physical therapy to help with strength and flexibility. Anti-inflammatory medicines may be helpful. Splinting at nighttime, orthotics, or special shoes are also helpful for some people. Prior to considering surgery, experts will consider shockwave treatment, although it's not clear how effective this is.

If surgery is considered, there are several different techniques, and your surgeon will pick what they think is best for you and what they have the most expertise in. Patient satisfaction rates are reported to be between 86%-95% with

Given the fact that your life has already been affected, and the likelihood that your pain and decreased ability to exercise is likely to worsen, you should seek more aggressive treatment. If physical therapy and other nonoperative treatments have failed, I recommend you strongly consider surgery.
