In addition to the various collaborations, the library introduced new services and technology, including new family passes, Books by Mail, a book club for underserved teens at the Marietta Regional Youth Detention Center, and an expanded community summer reading initiative.

Overall, the commitment to collaboration, equity, and accessibility, ensures that the library serves as a community hub where individuals of all backgrounds feel valued and empowered. Through collaborative efforts and innovative initiatives, the library is dedicated to enriching the library experience for every patron.



Cobb County Public Library is the 2023 Georgia Library of the Year

Cobb County Public Library (CCPL) has been recognized as The 2023 Library of the Year for its commitment to serving its community by partnering with numerous organizations within its county and statewide, and for efforts to expand access to materials and essential services to its community.

Cobb County Public Library received nomination letters from local elected officials, partnering organizations, school systems, and patrons who highlighted the library's efforts across the community.

Stepping Towards Safety with Falls Prevention

Cobb County Public Library received the Award for Outstanding Service presented by the Injury Prevention Research Center at Emory (IPRCE) for CCPL's Falls Prevention Awareness initiative for making "substantial contributions to reducing injury" in Georgia. CCPL has collaborated with Cobb Senior Services, Georgia Department of Public Health and other organizations to promote fall injury prevention since 2015.

The library partnered with the DPH and IPRCE, which is housed in the Emory School of Medicine, for the pilot launch of the Fall Prevention Nature Walk in the City of Kennesaw's Swift-Cantrell Park. DPH is promoting the Falls Walk, which consists of informational panels posted on a path, for future installations across Georgia. The Falls Walk is directly inspired by Story Walk installations organized by Cobb libraries.

EmpowerLit: A Book Club for Teens



Cobb librarians lead discussions for teens incarcerated in the Marietta Regional Youth Detention Center. The program aims to inspire young people, especially those facing difficult challenges, to think about the world around them and their place in it.



Empowering Education: Books2Keep Partnership with Cobb County School District

The Bookmobile team operates strategically, providing vital access to school learning materials throughout the year for Cobb County and Marietta City school districts. Their focus extends to children and families in areas facing challenges like transportation, internet access, and language barriers, which often isolate them from essential community support systems.



Unlocking Adventures: A Season of Literary Exploration

Cobb County residents immersed themselves in a summer of literary exploration in Cobb Library's Summer Reading Program. This captivating program not only enriched their reading experiences but also rewarded their participation with badges and offered opportunities to win grand prizes through drawings.

The Summer Reading program extended its reach to three predominantly Latino communities in Marietta, emphasizing inclusivity by providing information and resources in Spanish

Eyes on Success: Transforming Students' Futures with Vision To Learn

Cobb County Public Library partnered with Vision To Learn (VTL) for the sixth straight summer to provide eye exams and free glasses to children through mobile clinics at Cobb libraries. VTL was the recipient of a national award from the non-profit Let's Move in Libraries for its innovative collaboration with public libraries across the nation.

During summertime 2023, eight Cobb Library locations hosted VTL's trained staff who provided 694 eye exams, resulting in 484 children receiving new glasses.

Library and Literacy and Justice for All

COX Campus

Cobb library staff members engage in promoting strategies for reading improvement in the community through the local Literacy and Justice for All initiative. In collaboration with Learn4Life, metro Atlanta's education partnership, and the Rollins Center for Language & Literacy, library staff are completing the center's Cox Campus free online courses to be trained in how to support actions child-facing adults can take for better literacy outcomes for cradle to career success.

Cobb Collaborative: The Basics Cobb County & Beyond

Cobb libraries serve as an anchor for The Basics Cobb, a community-wide literacy and health initiative led by Cobb Collaborative serving children through age 5 and their families with special storytime series at libraries, sharing The Basics themes with the public and more. The child development principles of The Basics are Maximize Love, Manage Stress; Talk, Sing and Point; Count Group and Compare; Explore Through Movement and Play, and Read and Discuss Stories.



Mapping Knowledge: Harnessing GIS in Libraries

The GIS unit transforms existing data into visual representations, such as maps, to promote informed decision-making across the range of library operations, including events planning, library collection development and more.





AccessAbility Hub: Empowering Inclusivity

The (CLASS) Cobb Library Accessibility Special Services Unit provides inclusive programming to meet the needs of a range of ages and abilities. This year CLASS proudly debuted our Sensory Book Bundle, a collection of tactile board books, activities, and resources for young readers and their families, and introduced braille materials into the library collection.

Renate Elliott, Department Supervisor, was named the 2023 GLS Ambassador of The Year for her efforts to increase awareness and enrollment in Georgia Library Services for the Blind and Print Disabled. Ms. Elliott was also a finalist for the East Cobb Civitan Club's Servant's Heart Award in recognition of CCPL's commitment to serving patrons of all abilities.





Books by Mail: A Service for Homebound Library Cardholders

The free service, Books By Mail, was crafted to cater to the needs of library cardholders facing challenges in accessing physical library facilities. Tailored for individuals dealing with disabilities, illness, or transportation limitations, this innovative program ensures that no one is excluded from the joy of reading.



Preservation Place: Preserving Heritage, and Fostering Creativity

Cobb Library began offering digitization services in 2023 for the public to preserve treasured memories and historic materials at the two Preservation Place locations, The Georgia Room in Switzer Library and the Creative Studios in Sewell Mill Library and Cultural Center. Digitalization services are offered for free to library cardholders for converting analog materials from various sources, including photographs, documents, videocassettes, audiocassettes, artwork, scrapbooks and other items.



Sustaining Summers: Georgia's Nutritious Meals Initiative


Cobb Library teamed up for the fourth year with Georgia Educational Resources Inc., a Mabletonbased non-profit organization to provide summer meal service at Cobb libraries. In 2023 the program provided breakfast and lunch meals.



One Book, One City: A Community Celebration of Literature

The Powder Springs Public Library, The Book Worm Bookstore, and the City of Powder Springs partnered in 2021 to create a city-wide reading experience: One Book, One City (OBOC). This program encourages community members to engage in conversations about the themes and implications of a chosen book.

OBOC gained immense popularity within the Powder Springs community. The 2023 One Book One City event included "We Are the Light," by Matthew Quick for adults in the Spring and "Wildseed Witch," by Marti Dumas for teenagers in the Fall.






Artful Connections for Community Enrichment




Value of Cobb Library: A Closer Look at Usage



VALUE OF PROGRAMS

Each of the 15 libraries and the bookmobile offer programs suitable for all age groups. According to the graph below, most programs offered in 2023 were for young and schoolaged children. The total value of all programs offered is **\$833,982**.





The amount of passports processed in 2023 was 4,138. The total value of this service was \$144,830.

COBB LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Cobb County Public Library Board of Trustees is a nine-member volunteer board made up of local citizens appointed by the Cobb County Board of Commissioners. Each trustee serves a 3-year term and may serve successive terms. The trustees set library policy and advise on activities. The Library Board holds regular meetings at various library locations on a rotating schedule and are open to the public.


