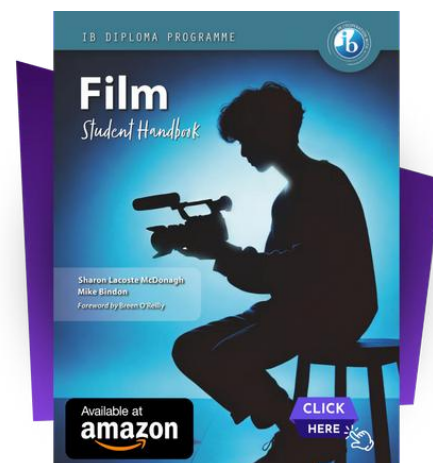

Category 1

The Category 1 DP Film workshop is designed to prepare participants to teach DP Film in a manner that supports the IB mission statement and philosophy.

This workshop is recommended for teachers of IB DP Film from schools that are applying to offer the Diploma Programme, or for new or recently appointed film teachers from IB World Schools. It also provides professional development and support for educators in schools that have decided to, or are considering, applying for IB authorisation. Educators who are new to a school with an existing IB programme or who are interested in joining an IB school are also eligible. No previous knowledge of the IB or DP Film is required.

Participants will practically examine IB Diploma Theatre and will focus on:

- Develop an understanding of the IB mission and philosophy and explore the key principles of an IB education.
- Explore the DP Film guide, syllabus, and the links between prescribed content, assessments, and marking criteria, including practice marking of student samples
- Develop strategies to design and deliver a film course that integrates authentic assessment and prepares students for the assessment tasks
- Share ideas, best practices, and resources for teaching DP Film effectively

Recommended for:

DP Film teachers new to the DP at established IB World Schools, teachers new to DP Film and film teachers from interested or candidate schools preparing for authorization.

Choose Category 1 if you are new to the IB, are in a school applying to be an IB World School or if your situation is similar to any of the following...

I am new to the faculty of a longstanding IB World School and have not taught the IB DP Film programme previously.

I am aware of the IB philosophy and programme structure but am not experienced in teaching or administering the IB.

I am familiar with the IB subject guide (including assessment procedures, moderation) and would like some guidelines on teaching and learning to build greater confidence before teaching a course.

I have inherited a course and would like to review the subject content before teaching it to suit my own style and expertise.

Category 2

This workshop is designed to provide a forum for experienced DP Film teachers to deepen their understanding of the course, enhance programme delivery, refine assessment practices, and strengthen teaching and learning approaches.

This workshop is intended for experienced Film teachers from IB World Schools. Participants must have either attended a previous Category 1 workshop in Film or have been teaching the DP Film course for more than one year. It provides a collaborative and challenging space for experienced IB educators to focus on assessment, curriculum development, and advanced teaching practice.

The workshop will address key areas of teaching and learning with a particular emphasis on assessment tasks, corresponding criteria, and strategies for preparing students for success. Authentic student samples will be analysed to deepen understanding of how assessment criteria are applied in practice.

Participants will practically examine the assessment components and collaboratively generate useful resources, strategies, and classroom activities to support students in a way that reflects the IB mission statement, the learner profile, and the broader aims of the Diploma Programme.

Recommended for:

Diploma Programme (DP) Film teachers who have prepared students for at least one DP exam session in Film.

Category 3

The Cat 3 workshop is designed to provide a forum for experienced educators to build on and enhance their professional development portfolios.

Participants will engage in an in-depth investigation into particular syllabus areas. Choose Cat 3 to dive more deeply into areas you enjoy and to deepen your understanding and mastery of an area or subject.

Please note

- Category 3 workshops are open to all teachers.
- You **do not** need to have attended Category 1 or Category 2 to attend a Category 3.
- You **do not** need to be an IB teacher to attend a Category 3 workshop.

Practical Film Production

Our Category 3 Practical Film Production workshop is designed to immerse participants in the art and practice of filmmaking and how to bring it authentically into the classroom.

In this workshop, participants engage in a wide range of hands-on activities to deepen their understanding of how to embed and facilitate practical filmmaking in a learning environment. They explore strategies for preparing students to construct a portfolio of film experiences and participate in collaborative filmmaking tasks, as well as approaches to designing and documenting both teacher-led and student-led film experiments, explorations, and complete film projects.

Practical elements include identifying and applying key film techniques and ideas, forming and managing production groups, planning and organising production workflows, and developing skills for effective screenings. The workshop also addresses methods for documenting process and performance as filmmakers, and how this documentation can be used to reflect critically on the creative journey and evaluate completed projects.

Category 3 workshops are for you if your situation is similar to any of the following...
