Chaplain's Corner



Chaplains Corner #33

Spiritual Maturity

Shortly after becoming Black Sheep's International Chaplain, I was asked the following question:

What is the single, number one, overarching, constant prayer for our International Board for our ministry?

This was my response - "The single most important, overarching desire of our Black Sheep ministry is to see souls saved and brought into the local church for discipleship. We want to see Black Sheep members making a difference for eternity by sharing the Gospel and leading people (HOG members, dealership employees, bikers in general and the community at large) into a greater relationship with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We see this accomplished by several key features in our lives. The first is prayer. We want to see Black Sheep gathering together in prayer, whether it's as a family, a chapter, a region or with others across the nation and world. The more time we spend on our knees uniting our hearts with each other and our God, the more effective our walk and witness will be when we enter a dealership, attend a bike night, or put on a shoe shine booth. Prayer emboldens us and empowers us. Prayer unifies our spirits with the Holy Spirit and allow Him to

work through us. The next is fellowship – being together in body and spirit. By coming together – at bike night, a dealer event, a biker breakfast, or a charity ride, we encourage and strengthen each other and enable each other to be more bold when sharing about what God has done in our lives. If we start here, the fruit will come. Remember, we don't save anyone. It is the work of the Holy Spirit. We just want Black Sheep to be ready, willing and able to be used by Him when the time comes."

As I look back on that question and the years I've served in this capacity, my answer hasn't changed. If anything, it is stronger and clearer. Within this response is the longing for spiritual maturity and growth for myself, our leaders, and our members. Spiritual maturity can be defined as "a process of growing in your relationship with God and becoming more like Jesus Christ."

The characteristics tend to be:

- Humility – considering others more important than yourself. (Phil 2:3-11)
- Service – being willing to serve others rather than seeking personal gain. (Mark 10:45)
- Honesty – being true about your own failings. (Psa. 51:6)
- Peace – in relationships and with your dependence on the Holy Spirit. (Rom. 12:17-18)
- Truth – a desire for it as found in God's word. (Psa. 119:11)
- Love – for others. (John 13:35)

Spiritual maturity is a process that begins after salvation and never ceases. It is a gradual growth where you are able to surrender to Christ and not your own desires, and it is measured by internal transformation – not external performance. Much of this can be summed up in Paul's instructions to the Corinthians – "Everything is permissible, but not everything is beneficial. 'Everything is permissible,' but not everything builds up. No one is to seek his own good, but the good of the other person." (1 Cor. 10:23-24)

We continue to pray for this growth within all of Black Sheep. It is through this process that the Lord uses us to do His work in His way to accomplish His will.

May you "grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" – 2 Pet 3:18

As members of Black Sheep MMFC, our mission is clear "To introduce Jesus Christ to the world of motorcycle riders...: But in carrying out this mission, it's easy to fall into the trap of relying on our own skills, experience, and determination. Instead, we must let Jesus, our Shepherd, lead, while we, as Black Sheep, must follow ever so closely.

It's tempting to think that we can lead our regions, chapters, and ministry (to our local dealership/riding group) on our own—relying on our strength, wisdom, and abilities. But just as a sheep that strays from the fold gets lost, vulnerable, and disconnected from the Shepherd's care, we too risk burnout, frustration, and drifting from our calling and mission when we take control instead of following Jesus, our Shepherd.

Jesus reminds us in John 15:5, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." As Black Sheep, we can do good things on our own, but if we want our ministry to truly impact lives, Jesus must be leading—and we must be following.

So what does following the Shepherd look like? It means:

We don't follow our own plans but stay in tune with Jesus through prayer and His Word (John 10:27).

Instead of relying on ourselves, we lean on Christ's power to sustain us (Philippians 4:13).

Sheep don't set the path; they follow the Shepherd's lead. We trust His timing and direction in our ministry (Proverbs 3:5-6).

Sheep are safer in the flock. We support and encourage one another in faith and mission (Hebrews 10:24-25)

It's not about status, recognition, or numbers; it's about staying faithful to Jesus and the work He's called us to do (Colossians 3:23-24).

When Jesus leads and we, as Black Sheep, follow, we aren't just another motorcycle ministry—we become a Christ and Spirit-led ministry that will do amazing things! (Ephesians 3:20).

So, as you ride, serve, and minister, ask yourself: Are you following the Shepherd, or are you trying to lead? The answer makes all the difference.

I grew up in the church, and there's never been a moment in my life when I didn't believe Jesus is exactly who He claims to be. But for about 15 years, you wouldn't have known it by watching me. My actions and choices painted a different picture—I was a mess, chasing all the wrong things. That changed when I finally surrendered to Him in my late 20s. I'd been on a collision course with a destination I couldn't even fathom, but Jesus, in His mercy, refused to leave me in the mess I'd made. He picked me up, turned me upside down, shook me more than a little—and a whole lot of junk fell away. That's a story for another day, though.

I met my wife, Lisa, at church in 1991, and we tied the knot in 1993. Together, we're the proud parents of three amazing daughters, now all grown. In my 40s, I attended a local Christian university and earned a BA in Business Management. For years, I'd felt a tugging call to minister to those the church often overlooked—or who felt overlooked by it. You know the type: rough around the edges, not exactly church-clothes material, folks who'd rarely step foot through a sanctuary door. Little did I know, God had a plan to bring that calling to life.

In the spring of 2008, I was having lunch with the pastor who'd married Lisa and me. He glanced across the street and asked if the Yamaha Midnight Special parked there was mine. I said yes, but quickly added that what I really wanted was a Harley. My neighbor was selling a 2003 Dyna Super Glide, and I'd been drooling over it. That's when he mentioned a guy from his church involved in a motorcycle ministry called Black Sheep. I wasn't just curious—I was hooked. I had to be part of it. I bought the Harley, started showing up to Black Sheep meetings, and by the end of that summer, I was patched in. What a ride it's been ever since!

Within six months of joining, I was asked to serve as Chapter Chaplain. Not long after, I was elected President of the former Western Washington Chapter. Tough circumstances eventually led to that chapter closing, and I stepped into the role of Area Contact for a time. Over the next year and a half, we built a new chapter in the Seattle area from the ground up. I was appointed the founding President



of the Lake Washington Chapter, which is still my home base. In 2019, I began serving as HOG Chaplain for Eastside HOG, where God opened a door for our entire Black Sheep chapter to share the Word and meet people's needs.

In the spring of 2022, I was asked to step up as Regional Director of the Great Northern region—a huge blessing and an even bigger challenge! Two years later, in May 2024, after months of prayer and preparation, I took on a role I'd never imagined: International Secretary on the International Board of Directors. I'm humbled and grateful every day when I think about where God has brought me from—those desert-wandering days to this. He's been so good to me. I love this ministry and the people I've gotten to connect with as we do Kingdom work together. It's no exaggeration to say the folks in this incredible ministry are some of the finest people on earth. May God continue to bless and equip you as you carry the Gospel of Jesus Christ to a lost and dying world!

The Restorative Power of God

Jessica's Testimony

Born and raised in Oregon, the military brought me to sunny San Diego for my last tour. Retiring after 20 years of service in the Navy, God has given me the opportunity to serve His Kingdom through Rock Church and Black Sheep Motorcycle Ministry.

COVID threw my marriage into a season of despair. The enemy tried to steal, kill and destroy our marriage with alcohol abuse, depression, anxiety, lust, self doubt, isolation and fear of failure. I did not have a firm foundation in Christ or a personal relationship with God and I started to believe the enemy lies over my identity. I had no self control or self worth. Hitting rock bottom we filed for divorce, BUT GOD had better plans over my life, plans to prosper and not harm me (Jeremiah 29:11). In obedience, I cried out and surrendered all my burdens to Christ. God began to soften our hearts towards one another. We forgave, we received healing,



we got sober together and canceled the divorce. We found community and support with our church family and on February 19, 2023 we got baptized. God fully restored our marriage better than before, giving us new hearts and new minds (Ezekiel 36:26). Now I serve as the Hospitality Coach, Women's Ministry Leader, Young Adult Group Leader and Pastoral Support Team Mentor.

However, God was not finished. I was carrying around over two decades of

deep pain and resentment connected to my father from childhood. I desired to restore yet another broken relationship and wanted to let go of the bitterness. God did it with my husband, I believed he could do it again with my father. His timing is always perfect. After multiple weeks of praying and fasting, God gave me the strength and courage to reach out and invite my father to my Black Sheep Motorcycle Ministry Patching Ceremony. God did not fail. My father came and God softened my heart to fully forgive my father. Today I live in complete freedom, chains are broken, I am made new, filled by the Holy Spirit and living out His purpose over my life. My father is now plugged into a church, bought a Harley Trike and maybe in the near future will join the Black Sheep family in Washington.

'Two'gether in the Fold



I started riding motorcycles at the age of nine, and almost every year since, I've had some form of bike in my life. In 2014, I parted ways with my last sport bike—a 2010 SV1000S—a decision I never imagined I'd make. It became the final sport bike I ever rode. I had reached a point in my walk with Christ where conviction struck me whenever I climbed onto that bike, as I was entertaining the flesh. The turning point came when my daughter snapped a picture of me riding down the 15 freeway on one wheel. When she showed it to me, my heart sank, overwhelmed by the disappointment of tainting my witness for God's kingdom. Within two weeks, that bike was gone.

"If your right eye makes you stumble and leads you to sin, tear it out and throw it away; for it is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to be thrown into hell." – Matthew 5:29

In 2010, I joined a local men's Bible study in Temecula Valley that aimed to do more than just hold weekly meetings. We founded a 501(c)(3) outreach ministry called No Men Left Behind Ministries. One of our initiatives was a Men's Breakfast every Thursday at 6:30 a.m. Through this event, I met some Black Sheep in 2015—Bro Newman, Marty Edwards, David Rahm, Tony Shumaker, Rico Martinez, Micah Orloff, Chris Bergman, and a few others. After countless conversations over many cups of coffee, I was captivated by their commitment to riding motorcycles to further God's kingdom within the motorcycle culture. My passion for riding reignited, but with a new purpose. I began considering a cruiser, determined to use it for God's glory.

After consulting a few cruiser riders, I set my sights on a 2016 Harley-Davidson Street Glide. Being a methodical thinker, I embarked on a journey to spend my \$25,000 budget wisely. I test-rode the Street Glide and, to my surprise, was unimpressed—likely due to my lifelong connection to sport bikes. Undeterred, I continued my search, narrowing it down to five American V-Twins. I enlisted my wife, the ultimate decision-maker, and together we visited each bike. In the end, the 2016 Victory X-1 Stealth emerged victorious, and I purchased my first cruiser.





A few weeks later, I attended my first Black Sheep breakfast in Lake Elsinore, unprepared for the reception awaiting me since my bike wasn't a Harley-Davidson. The atmosphere wasn't the warm, welcoming one I'd grown accustomed to at the No Men Left Behind breakfasts. Still, I wasn't discouraged. Compelled to join the Black Sheep and determined to be the "Black Sheep of Black Sheep," I reviewed their bylaws and found nothing disqualifying me from pursuing membership: my bike was American-made, a HOG membership was recommended but not required, I belonged to a local church, and I actively served that body. With Marty's approval, Bro Newman became my mentor, and through the process, we grew into best friends. I patched into the Lake Elsinore Chapter in 2016 and have considered it an honor ever since.

In a show of unity, the Lake Elsinore and Temecula chapters merged into the Temecula Valley Chapter. In 2020, I was nominated Chapter President. Leading through the challenges of COVID-19, I shifted our focus from outreach to in-reach, fostering connection and encouragement among members. By God's grace, we thrived.

During this time, my wife witnessed my dedication to the ministry and the fruits of our labor. God began stirring her spirit toward Black Sheep. Unbeknownst to me, in late 2020, Wendy entered mentorship with Micah and Alicia Orloff. In February 2021, at our monthly breakfast hosted at Elevation Church, I assumed we were holding a "Friends of Black

Sheep" ceremony. To my shock, my kids walked in, and Wendy made her way to the front. The surprise was revealed when Alicia presented Wendy with a vest. It was a beautiful moment, and I'm grateful God moved in my wife's life as He did. Having her as my partner in bringing the gospel to the biker culture made my Black Sheep journey even more rewarding.

Today, Wendy serves as Secretary for the Temecula Valley Chapter, while I am the Southern California Regional Director. We put God first, ride together, serve together, and cherish living life side by side. Wendy is truly my helper, and her investment in me as I pursue my commitments to Black Sheep and God's kingdom is invaluable.

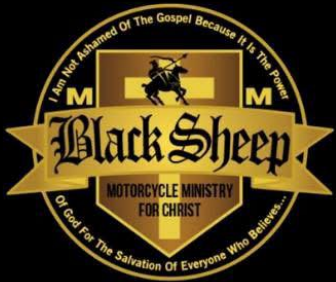

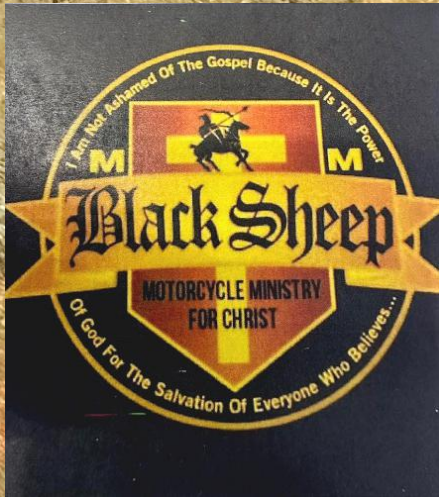

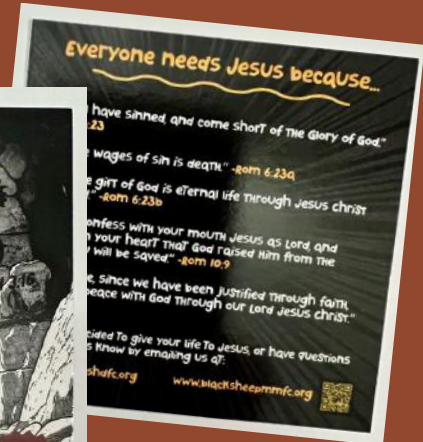
