

I've always been drawn to **Porsche cars**

I can remember that, as a child, I always noticed Porsche cars. The distinct design and exhaust sound they made as they drove by on the street. Growing up I followed the Porsche model evolution via my monthly Road and Track and Car and Driver magazines.

My first car was a Mustang, which was nice, but it was not the car I really desired, the Porsche, but it was outside my price range. Then, I got married and started a family. I thought now that I was established, it was time to get my first Porsche. I went to Edmonton Porsche and found an absolutely gorgeous dark blue Porsche Turbo for sale. The dealer told me I could have it for \$75,000. I spent weeks agonizing over the

decision. My wife finally told me not to buy the Porsche because it cost more than every house in our neighbourhood.

So what did we do? We built a custom house in a gated community. Life happened, and years went by, but my desire for the Porsche never left. I owned many lesser cars over the years but could never justify the cost of the car I really wanted. Then, in the late 90's, I decided to order my dream Porsche finally, but before we could finalize the deal I

I received an unbelievable job offer that required us to move the entire family to Vancouver. The new job and life again got in the way of getting my Porsche.

Years passed by, and I retired, and I said, now is the time to get my Porsche finally. I had been following the new designs for years, and in 2015, I came across the debut of Mission E. I loved the body style and went down to Porsche Vancouver to place a deposit. Four years passed before Porsche released the new Taycan. Unfortunately, when I went online to custom order the car, it was only available with the Black sunroof, which I hated. Needless to say, I cancelled the order.

I spent the next year online every week customizing a special 911. Then, finally, for my 70th birthday, I went down to Porsche Vancouver and submitted my custom order. Five months later they delivered an absolutely gorgeous one-of-a-kind Porsche: a 2012 Carrera S with Aerokit package, sport design side skirts, wheels painted in exterior colour and more. I finally received my lifelong dream car.

I only drive the Porsche in the sun and wash it every week or two. I attend numerous Porsche events, and I just love driving the car. I get compliments on the Porsche wherever I go. I treat it like my baby since my children have grown up and moved out. I will enjoy this Porsche for the rest of my life. I can see the grandchildren already waiting to inherit the car.

Since the Porsche Club of America was formed in 1955, regions have prioritized community service and charitable contributions. In 2002, PCA decided to recognize the unique and diverse programs implemented by regions throughout PCA in support of public service.

The PCA Public Service Awards recognize the regions that have conducted the most outstanding charity or community service event or events during the year. The winning regions demonstrate the highest standards in meeting the objectives and the ideals of the PCA in providing service and support to charities and the community. Due to the importance of public service to the club and the number of PCA regions involved in public service, it was decided to present multiple awards. 

Ultimate Vancouver Island tour

In search of the best driving road.

Last April, 15 Porsches gathered three km west of the Swartz Bay ferry terminal to explore Vancouver Island's most secluded driving routes for four days. Over 1,400 km later, most could say, "I've never been on that road before," or "That was the best driving road ever." The trouble was that it seemed as if everyone had a different take on what was the best road.

The first contender came after navigating Victoria's morning rush hour. From Sooke to Jordan River, the newly upgraded and paved Highway 14 delighted us along the shores of the Strait of Juan de Fuca. With the snow-capped peaks gleaming in the morning sun, Cascades on our left and towering Douglas fir and Sitka Spruce on our right, it was the perfect appetizer for what lay ahead.

After a pub lunch on the island's west coast at Port Renfrew came 80 kilometres of upgraded logging road winding along the leafy shores of the San Juan River to Harris Creek. The route paralleled the twists and turns of these waterways over 13 single-lane Bailey bridges. From there, we ascended upwards through a mountain pass complete with two hairpin turns requiring a second gear downshift to maintain

momentum. Descending, the route straightened out somewhat, and the cars were able to get into top gear for some higher-speed cruising. Alas, the roads' surface was showing its age, meaning we needed to be on the lookout for broken pavement and potholes. It is not a concern for the Macan's and Cayenne's, but it is a bit dodgy for the 911s, Boxsters, and Caymans.

Exiting Hwy 14 on the Island's East Coast at Duncan, a reset was needed to endure the freeway traffic of the Island Highway 19 and the awful stop-and-go of the Nanaimo bypass. True to traffic's cruel form, the group got split up by the lights, with some staying on the freeway till our night's destination in Courtenay. A lucky few exited at Parksville and took the old Island Highway 19A. Like a cool-down lap at a track, the salt air, the gentle pace and the views of the Salish Sea calmed the inner soul Zen-like. Sleep came early and easily for most that night.

Day 2: At the 8 am Drivers meeting, threatening weather brought a change of plans, swapping day two's Northern sortie with day three's route. Time permitted a warm-up section up the scenic 19A to Campbell River before heading to the island's west coast on

The ups and downs, the tight corners and the long straights gave us a bit of sensory overload, though we did arrive a bit earlier than expected. Several sections of kilometres and kilometres of 30 and 50-km corners wound along the cliffs of the lakeside, moose meadows and waterfalls tumbling of snow-capped peaks soaring above. A strong contender for the best driving road, many smiles were generated there and back.

Day 3: Threatening rain, we headed north again along the seaside scenery of the old island highway 19A to the end of the freeway at Campbell River. From there, the route took us on a well-maintained two-lane road. With great visibility, many nicely banked gentle curves, and well-served handy passing lanes, it could have been a high-speed dash. The rain, heavy at times and a tanker truck that went into the trees gave us all time to get better acquainted till they cleared the wreck.

Lunch was delayed by all this, but the bright side was that lunch itself was a reward for our patience at the wreck. The Cuckoo Trattoria in Coombs, BC, was a delicious treat for the gourmands among us, as well as those of us who just enjoyed a break from pub food.

The last contender for the best driving road was cruising along the shores of Sproat Lake on the way to the Black Rock resort in Ucluelet. The sun beamed down on a pack of Porsches driving the barren black top, flat sixes at speed, singing a high note; the road dipped and rose, flowing generally downward to me. I had wings and was flying.

So, what are the characteristics of the perfect driving road?


Is it driving slowly with traffic so as to enjoy the view? Perhaps fantasizing about what it would be like to live in the house on the beach with that boat.

Or a smooth and twisty piece of blacktop at speed. Your ride is a physical extension of your body, healing and toeing your way ahead, balanced like a dancer. An adrenalin rush all the way. No time to look at the view; all eyes are up on the next corner.

I think the perfect drive is more fleeting. It's the coming together of all the great weather and scenery with the well-matched downshift as you hit all the esses apexes, then full on the gas to peak torque one redline to the next.

Repeat.

Big Horn Tour

We embarked on an epic summer adventure in the Canadian Rockies.

was an absolutely unforgettable summer adventure in the Canadian Rockies. It featured awe-inspiring landscapes with stunning geological marvels, vibrant turquoise rivers and lakes fed by glaciers, wild herds of big-horn sheep, and captivating mountainous roads.

This multi-region event brought together nearly 45 Porsche club members from CWR, the BC Interior, and the Inland Northwest Club, based in eastern Washington State. Several multi-regional events are held annually between the CWR and American clubs, demonstrating our valued cross-border friendship.

Over six days, we travelled over 1,000 km clockwise across British Columbia. We began our tour in Kelowna in the central Okanagan, then headed northeast to Banff National Park in the heart of the Canadian Rockies in Alberta. We then headed south towards the Canada—USA border and swept back up north to conclude our trip in Nelson on the west arm of Kootenay Lake.

On our first day, we woke up early because it was a travel day. We agreed to meet our fellow club members in Hope at 8:30 a.m. before embarking on a 5-hour scenic drive to Kelowna via mountain back roads. The Big Horn tour officially starts this evening in Kelowna

with a welcome reception to reconnect with old friends and make new friendships.

Our destination was the Hotel Eldorado, a Victorian-style inn in the Mission area of Kelowna on the east bank of Okanagan Lake. Upon arrival, we observed a lot of activity in the hotel parking lot. It was clear that our Porsches were the stars of the tour. Many owners had diligently cleaned their vehicles earlier, drawing admiration from locals and fellow members.

The Eldorado, originally the Eldorado Arms Hotel, was founded in 1926 by Countess Bubna, an aristocratic English woman. It was a social hub during the 1950s and 1960s, hosting British-style garden parties, dog shows, and croquet matches with the town's polit-

We found it an intimate property with 53 guest rooms, many with panoramic lake views from their balconies. Our room was spacious and had a quaint old English charm. The hotel offers several restaurants, a spa, a marina, and a short boardwalk along the lake.

On the second day, we were all invited for morning coffee at August Luxury Motorcars in Kelowna and had our tour decals installed.

We formed a single line upon arrival as we eagerly waited to enter their service building. Once inside,

we witnessed over a dozen employees installing our Big Horn tour decals on six Porsches simultaneously. This included a large tour decal on both doors, driver and co-driver names and an August Luxury Motorcars sticker on the rear of each vehicle.

Afterwards, we ventured across the street to the August Motorcars showroom, filled with over 100 used luxury, exotic, and classic cars such as Porsche, Lamborghini, Ferrari, McLaren and more. I admit I did not want to leave without taking a closer look at a red Porsche 356 coupe at the back of the showroom. Special thanks to President and CEO Matt August and his friendly staff for their generous hospitality during our visit.

Today's drive goes north along Okanagan Highway BC 97 to Radium Hot Springs. It includes twisty single-lane mountain roads with short, divided highway sections. As per the tour book, it covers 438 km in about 6 hours.

Before noon, we encountered a construction zone, which reduced traffic to an alternative single lane over a small bridge. I noticed a semi-truck with hazard lights flashing in the right lane as we approached the two-lane line-up. So, I quickly moved into the left lane and was relieved to discover that the left lane

continued to move slowly forward.

As we arrived in Revelstoke for lunch, we had not seen any other Porsches from our group that morning. We were nearly one hour behind schedule, so we figured everyone was ahead of us. After a quick lunch, we returned to the highway, continuing north into the Rockies.

With light traffic, we enjoyed a spirited drive to Radium Hot Springs and checked in at Big Meadows Resort for our two-night stay. To our surprise, we were only the second Porsche to arrive, so I used the car wash station and explored the resort grounds.

Bighorn Meadows Resort is in the Columbia Valley. surrounded by the Rockies and the Purcell Mountain ranges. The luxury suites are on a 9-acre site surrounding the lush green Springs Golf Course. That evening, we all had a casual dinner in the golf clubhouse, where we met members of the Inland Northwest Club.

On day three, we could visit the Radium Hot Springs geological thermal pool, chill at the resort or explore Banff National Park, now a UNESCO heritage site. We decided to visit the town of Banff, so we headed east for 130 km, which takes about 90 minutes one way due to the park's maximum posted speed limit of 90 km/h.

Outside of Radium Hot Springs, we discovered a herd of Bighorn Sheep along the highway. Several large Bighorn sheep were leading younger lambs alongside the rocky hillside above us; we counted over 15 sheep.

I grew up in British Columbia and have visited Banff several times. It is no longer the quiet, rustic Rocky Mountain town I remember from childhood. Today, the touristy souvenir shops along Banff Ave have been replaced by outdoor fashion stores, art galleries, and a more diverse food scene catering to international visitors. I'm delighted to discover that The Spirit of Christmas, my favourite store in Banff, is still open for business in the village.

My favourite pastime is visiting the Rundle Bar in the Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel on the edge of town. Known as the "Castle in the Rockies," it was opened in 1888 by the Canadian Pacific Railway as one of Canada's earliest grand railway hotels.

Located on the second floor, the Rundle Bar was awarded the 'Best Patio Award 2024' by Canada's 100 Best, the definitive guide to the nation's top restaurants, bars, and chefs.

It offers a breathtaking view of the snow-capped Mount Rundle, named after Reverend Robert Rundle, a Methodist who the Hudson's Bay Company invited to conduct missionary work in western Canada in the 1840s.

Due to strong winds, we chose a seat inside the bar with mountain range views. The interior design resembles a cozy living room with bespoke furniture and intimate lighting pockets, creating a unique and inviting atmosphere.

One of the greatest pleasures of the tour was spending that afternoon with fellow club members in the bar of a grand hotel. Sharing our Porsche adventures is a

memory I will cherish for a long time.

The following day began with a time-distance challenge to Nelson. Our mission was to find Tour Host Francis Chin's bright orange GT3 ahead on Highway 93 South. During the time-distance challenge, Francis made a breakfast stop and took scenic photos. Since we had already had breakfast before departing the Resort, we found him first and was about 45 minutes too early.

That morning, our route for day five would cover nearly 400 km in about 4.5 hours. It began with scenic canyon driving, almost reaching the Canada - USA border, and then swept north to Nelson towards the pristine Kootenay Lake.

Upon arrival that afternoon, we learned that Nelson is home to ancient rainforests and iconic species, including the grizzly bear and Kokanee salmon.

Our accommodations for the last two nights on tour were at the Nelson Prestige Lakeside Resort. Our room had views of the Lake and mountains and was within walking distance of downtown.

With a population of only 11,000, Nelson has more restaurants per capita than foodie landmarks such as San Francisco, Vancouver, and Manhattan. That evening, we explored the downtown district and found Marzano restaurant on Baker St. It offers a genuine Italian dining experience with delicious artisan pizza, homemade pasta, and creative desserts.


On our final day, we had more driving tour options. We chose a relaxing half-day counterclockwise loop that followed the Kootenay Lake shoreline on Highway 3 North to Kaslo, then east along Highway 31A to New Denver and returning south on Highway 6 to Nelson.

The day's highlight was our visit to the Kohan Reflection Garden in New Denver by Roy Tomomichi Sumi, a former Japanese internee at Tashme, Rosebery, and New Denver. He is a renowned master of bonsai and traditional Japanese gardens and an educator, designer, and builder. His Japanese gardens can be found throughout western Canada, and he was instrumental in creating the Nitobe Memorial Garden at UBC.

You should definitely visit the Kohan Reflection Garden in the Kootenay region. It is situated on the shores of Slocan Lake and is a remarkable living work of art. Moreover, it serves as a venue for horticultural education and a place for reflection with locals.

The highlight of our six-day tour was fully immersing ourselves in our country's rich history and actively engaging with the locals. I especially relished picturing images of the British garden parties at the elegant Hotel Eldorado and partaking in stimulating conversations with fellow club members in the illustrious Rundle Bar at the iconic Fairmont Banff Springs. We appreciate Roy Tomomichi Sumi for creating the enriching Kohan Reflection Garden.

We initially signed up for the Big Horn Tour to drive our sporty Porsches and connect with other members in the magnificent backdrop of the Canadian Rockies. However, this journey has provided us with an experience of immersion in local history, equipping us to forge stronger connections with the places and people we encounter and to create enduring travel memories.





2024 Taycan 4S

A family EV that can visit the track!

This past May long weekend, Porsche Center Richmond gave me a unique opportunity: a five-day road trip in the new 2024 Porsche Taycan 4S to the Okanagan with my family, ending at our PCA-CWR Track Day at Area 27.

While working on a club project with PCR, a conversation came up about my wife and I considering buying an EV. I have always admired the Taycan since it came out. That Long Weekend, my daughters had a competitive dance competition in Kelowna from Friday until Monday. Our club Track Day was the following Tuesday in Oliver. The question came up: what are the chances of doing the trip in a Taycan? It is a chance for my wife and I to get a real feel for an EV's performance and capability on a family road trip. PCR jumped onboard and we were off in the Taycan!

I was familiar with the Taycan prior to this trip. Being one of my favorite Porsche models, I have read a lot and driven one twice before on short promotional test drives. But after experiencing it for five days, all I can say is WOW! It is a far better car than I first imagined.

The 2024 Taycan 4S has dual electric motors that put out 522hp. There are two battery pack options. The bigger one is the Performance Package, which this car had and, in my mind, is a must! There is a chassis-adjustable air suspension with settings for Lowered, Low, Normal, and Lifted. Various drive mode settings are available for Normal, Range, Sport, and Sport Plus. It comes with 20-inch wheels and has a range of 393 km. I can now attest to that range estimation is bang on, if not better!

The curb weight of the Taycan is 5246 lbs! Wow. Heavier than the last truck I owned! But here is where the Porsche engineering comes into play. With this beast in Low or Lowered chassis setting and sport plus mode, it is every bit of a Porsche sport scar - among the best. And after having it for a few days, you could not tell me any different!

The interior is tech latent and as comfortable as a high-end lounge. The dash and console have three different displays. The driver cluster is very user-friendly (a term that relates to this vehicle in its entirety). It displays the usual useful driving information you would expect. Equipped with a toggle button on the steering wheel, you can switch between three different screens of useful information. The center dash displays whatever entertainment options or navigation you wish: apple car play, stereo, Waze, etc. Below is a small digital display with your climate control, charging information, and suspension settings.

The interior is a combination of plastic and leather. Each is appropriately positioned to give this interior the right combination of luxury, comfort and sporty. The driver seat adjusts in 18 different ways, adapting to any driver's preferences. The back seats are like a living room couch mounted in a sports car. Providing more than enough legroom for an adult with a flipdown center console. Being an EV, the Taycan provides you with a Frunk and a Trunk. Did I mention two teenage girls and a dance competition? We had room for three suitcases, costume bags, a small backpack, and makeup caboodles!

A road trip through the mountains in an EV, range

anxiety? Being a pilot, there were some serious calculations made and alternate planning. I will not lie! I picked up the Taycan from PCR midday Friday with an 88% charge. One daughter was to be on stage at 6 p.m. in Kelowna. After running a few quick errands, getting to the house and loading up, we were off!


Our first charge point was Hope prior to hitting the mountains. Porsche provided me with an introductory Electrify Canada account. These locations are available in most towns but not all. We arrived in Hope and pulled up at the Electrify Canada charging station with a 43% charge remaining. We used a 150kw charger that charged the Taycan to the recommended 90% in 22 minutes. I had calculated that we were good all the way to Kelowna from Hope. The range display shows 375 km, and the GPS shows 239 km. More than enough, right?

Now out of traffic and into the mountains, we headed up the Coquihalla in the fully loaded Taycan and my heavy right foot! Almost reaching the summit of the Coquihalla, that range had diminished to 200 km going uphill! I quickly learned a lesson on power management and regenerative charging. Going downhill, I set the cruise control to 120 km/h and let the car roll. Rolling downhill from the summit towards Merritt, we gained 12% battery, and our distance and range were making sense again. Whew!

Coming to Merritt, decision time. Charge or carry on? We turned right, and up the 97 connector, we went. Going uphill, once again my eye keenly watching that range and battery percentage drop. Reaching the Pennask Summit, the cruise control was again set. This time, it is 110km/hr. Yes, I had pickup trucks passing us in a 2024 Porsche, but I was in full fuel-saving mode like a good pilot! Or should we say Re-Gen mode! In the 63km downhill slope, the regenerative charging did just what it should do. I was impressed! Down that hill we picked up 18% battery charge and 105 km of range! We reached downtown Kelowna with 21% Battery. No problem at all! We went to the dance performance, and the day was capped off with Lauren taking home some hardware for her performance that night!

The next morning, Saturday, we had some time to kill, so I headed to Porsche Kelowna, which was a short distance from our hotel. They graciously plugged me into one of the dealership's Porsche superchargers. This charger brought the battery percentage back to 90% in 15 minutes! Saturday until Monday, the Taycan was our taxi around town, to and from the competition theatre, restaurants, and wineries. Sunday afternoon,

the girls made plans for some of the other dancers and moms to go out for dinner. In the Okanagan on a beautiful sunny Sunday afternoon/evening with a brandnew Porsche? This was music to my ears! With still more than enough juice, I took to the hillsides down Okanagan Lake. I crossed over the bridge and turned left down the west side of the lake. A road I am familiar with and loaded with views and twisties. I lowered the car and drove to Fintry, a respectful but spirited drive. Smiling ear to ear! Again, the Taycan proved to be every bit of a Porsche sports car!

Monday morning rolled around, and it was time to depart Kelowna. My wife and daughters had no interest in going to Oliver for the Track Day the next day, so they caught a ride home with some friends from the competition and left me to be with the Taycan for the next 30+ hours! The 90% charge from Saturday had lasted all weekend until Monday morning, leaving me at 27%. I hit the BC Hydro charging station in West Kelowna. Bringing the Taycan back to 90% in 32 minutes at a cost of \$17.00. It was an enjoyable sunny morning drive down to Oliver to meet up at the Coast Hotel with other PCA members for dinner before our Track Day Tuesday morning. I charged the Taycan again as I would depart from the track for the trip home.

Tuesday morning, we headed to Area 27 Motorsports Park! I know what you are thinking, "Did he get to track the dealership Taycan?!". No, but yes. The prearranged agreement with the dealership and event organizers was that I could do some media/parade laps during the lunch break. The rain started to fall just after registration, as forecasted. We were in for a wet track all day! The track staff and our club HPDE instructors did an amazing job keeping this event safe in the conditions, and everyone still had a great day on track!

During lunch break, I was up! Scott Newberry, our

track chair and HPDE instructor, and I jumped in the Taycan! We were followed by Jeff Rebiffe and HPDE instructor Mike Taylor in Jeff's 718 Boxster GTS as a chase/film car! We completed four spirited parade laps. I have to say the Taycan's weight was evident in some of the tight corners on the track, even at our respectful speed of 80km/hr. This car's Porsche DNA still shined through. With a driver who understands the car and track, the Taycan could be a track weapon! No doubt!

Around 3 pm, in the rain, I decided it was time to hit the road! With a healthy charge of 72%, I headed south towards Osoyoos and Highway 3. Planning on stopping in Princeton for dinner, the Taycan could have reached Hope. I planned to eat anyway, so I plugged in at the Chevron On the Run charger over dinner. Leaving Princeton, the sun broke out, and I had an uneventful sunny evening drive through the twisty road between Manning Park and home!

My takeaways from five days with a Taycan 4S? This car is a Porsche! The thing I kept noticing and enjoying was how effortless it is to drive for long periods of time. Zero driver fatigue. No road noise, no shifting, and more acceleration than you will ever need available in a split second! It is comfortable and stylish and an absolute pleasure to drive! I know the need to stop, and charging is a drawback for some, but road trips can be done with next to no inconvenience! Especially traveling with two teenage girls. You will be stopping for Starbucks, food, and to pee! My wife, who is always cautiously resistant to my Porsche addiction, even muttered the words, "This is a really nice car!". Is that a yes?





Porsche Penske Motorsport celebrates double victory at **Road America**

The works team Porsche Penske

Motorsport celebrated a spectacular double victory in the thrilling IMSA race at Road America. In the 2:40-hour contest, the Porsche 963 driven by Briton Nick Tandy and Frenchman Mathieu Jaminet crossed the finish line ahead of the sister car of Dane Cameron (USA) and Felipe Nasr (Brazil).

With the double triumph in the eighth round of the IMSA WeatherTech Sportscar Championship, Porsche has extended its lead in all championship standings. The two Porsche 963 cars from Proton Competition and JDC-Miller MotorSports finished in fifth and sixth positions, respectively. In the GTD-Pro class, the Porsche customer team AO Racing defended their lead in the overall standings with a fourth-place finish.

Spectators at the picturesque Road America witnessed one of the most exciting IMSA races in recent history. After five safety car phases, the decision for the win came in a final 17-minute sprint. Porsche Penske Motorsport had performed optimal strategic work leading into this shootout, manoeuvring the two Porsche 963 cars to the front. En route to Porsche's fourth win of the season, Mathieu Jaminet in the No. 6 car and Felipe Nasr in the No. 7 car kept their cool and fended off all attacks from strong competitors.

"Motorsport doesn't get much better and more exciting than this. It was once again a celebration for all sports car racing fans and a beautiful double victory for our team," exclaimed Thomas Laudenbach, Vice President Porsche Motorsport. "With the great success at Road America, we have further improved our position in the championship and are now heading into the last two races of the year in high spirits.

On the way to the fourth win of the season for the Porsche Penske Motorsport team, both Porsche 963s

experienced minor setbacks. The No. 6 car had to serve a drive-through penalty due to an early collision with a competitor, initially losing contact with the front. The sister car came in for an unscheduled pit stop shortly after the halfway mark to replace a damaged rear sec-

tion. Thanks to clever tactics, the team's strategists brought both hybrid cars to the front for the grand finale.


"We turned the tables impressively just before the end. The last few laps were not for the faint-hearted," summarises Urs Kuratle, Director Factory Motorsport LMDh. He adds: "After a disappointing qualifying on Saturday, the conditions didn't look promising. On race day, we rewarded ourselves for perfect work. The strategy was absolutely top-notch, and the drivers were incredibly fast and consistent. Overall, it was an amazing team effort!"

"I couldn't have imagined such a result in my wildest dreams," says Jonathan Diuguid, Managing Director Porsche Penske Motorsport. "It was a



wonderful day. The No. 7 car extended its lead in the championship, and Porsche's lead in the manufacturers' standings also increased. This race is a prime example of great teamwork: everyone gave their all for the overall project. Now we celebrate this fantastic success!"

In the manufacturers' championship, Porsche now leads with a margin of 89 points. The No. 7 crew of Porsche Penske Motorsport is in P1 of the team standings. The two-time season winners Felipe Nasr and Dane Cameron head into the penultimate race of the season in Indianapolis as leaders in the driver standings. The duo's margin over their second-placed brand colleagues Nick Tandy and Mathieu Jaminet is 100 points.


