

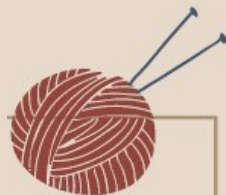

Pastoral Letter from Pam Priestley

Dear Friends,

'Remember, remember, the 5th of November, gunpowder, treason and plot'!

As a child I loved the run-up to Bonfire night almost as much as the event itself, gloating over my fireworks which had been safely encased in a tin, gently fingering the Roman candles, the Silver Fountains and the one Jumping Jack I was allowed to have! Then the excitement of the night itself, standing in the cold with the heat of the fire burning my face. It wasn't until I was older that I wondered why we celebrated the memory of a Stuart arsonist about to commit treason and blow up parliament! Remembrance, however, is part and parcel of November. On the 11th day of this month, we remember those who have given their lives in war. In the summer, Nigel and I visited the National Memorial Arboretum in Staffordshire and wandered about that beautiful, peaceful place whose whole message is about remembrance. Some would say that it glorifies war, that it promotes national pride, better forgotten but seeing the thousands and thousands of names etched on to the stone there of young people who died in war, it would be a travesty not to remember and give thanks.

Remembering is hugely important in the Bible too. The great Jewish festivals held many exhortations to remember what God had done for His people. This wasn't about wallowing in the past or looking at it with rose-coloured spectacles but the foundation of the way they were to live their life. At times in their history, when they were going through difficult times, remembering how the Lord God had led them was a source of comfort in the present and assurance for the future.

'Do this in remembrance of me' said Jesus as He broke the bread in that last meal with His disciples. Familiar words spoken week by week in the Communion service. Why are they so important for Christians? It is a reminder of the cross and the overwhelming love that lay behind that brutal event. It reminds us of the God who reaches out to each of us with His presence and nurturing strength. In this month of November, may we also take time to remember this.

Christians Together in Coniston 2022-2023

Over the past year, Christians Together in Coniston have contributed quietly to a number of Coniston-wide activities.

These include supporting the Parish Council supplying blankets to primary children (funded by the Beccansall Trust) and fostering warm spaces (such as the resurrected Lunch & Dominos) under the Love Coniston umbrella.

We have helped Chris Clark, Childrens Youth & Community worker, with clubs in both schools, support for the primary-secondary school transition, and a short but effective Easter Holiday Club (funded by the Roger Sawrey Trust) for primary children.

By working and worshipping together, the Christian community in Coniston avoids denominational issues that often cause division between churches. Rather, the increased co-operation between members of the three congregations benefits the whole village. We run Lent and Advent courses, as well as an on-going Bible Discussion Group and joint services throughout the year.

Lowick & Blawith

Lowick Parish Council

Your Council met on the 5th October. The councillor vacancy is now filled. Carly Dacre was given a warm welcome after being co-opted by all members of the Committee. Carly soon proved that she will be a great asset bringing enthusiasm, commitment and a wide range of new ideas to your team. We asked her to help with our communication to parishioners whilst she finds her feet.

Residents of Woodgate were present to report the persistent flooding between the crossroads and Gawthwaite Hill. This was first logged in 2021 and is getting worse every year. The main issue is that highways drains do not clear the accumulating water which at time reaches 10-15cm in depth. Said drains appear to have substantial blockage and repeated attempts to alleviate the problem over this long period of time have been without resolution.

Councillor Pender's report asks that all Highways issues be reported to Westmorland and Furness Council on their website: <https://westmorlandandfurness.gov.uk> and navigate to **parking, streets and transport** where you can make a report online.

The Notice Board on Lowick Green is to be replaced with a metal one sourced locally.

A THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH by Rev. David Gregg
NOVEMBER 2ND : ALL SOULS' DAY

During my time on the staff of the General Synod, there was a debate about the Calendar for the new 'Alternative Service Book'. Evangelicals have always argued that All Saints Day (November 1st) is a festival to celebrate *all* Christian believers, (i.e. that "Saints" is the N.T. word for *all* those who are 'sanctified' by the Sacrificial death of Jesus Christ) and that All Souls Day (November 2nd) is therefore surplus to requirements as "The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed".

Sure enough they had put down an amendment to remove All Souls' Day from the new calendar. (I should just tell you that the chief shrine of Anglo-Catholicism in London is *All Saints* Church, Margaret Street and the chief Evangelical mecca is (strangely!) *All Souls*, Langham Place – where, at the time, John Stott was the Rector.) For an amendment to be even *discussed* it was necessary that at least 25 Synod members stood in support of doing so when it was called by the Chairman. On this occasion, just as the amendment was called, an Anglo-Catholic rose to his feet and said, "On a point of order, Mr. Chairman, if we pass this amendment, what on earth is John Stott going to do for a patronal festival?!!" The whole Synod fell about laughing, and the "twenty-five standing" failed to materialize.

However, there is another side to all this. I registered "The fate of the wicked dead" as the theme for a 10,000-word dissertation as part of my M.A. in Theology at Bristol University. Not a very attractive topic, you may think. Neither did Professor Grayston, head of the department. But even *he* saw a "funny" side to it, in the Senior Common Room one morning. A fellow student, a very placid and humanitarian Methodist woman, was accusing me of being much more of an extremist and fundamentalist Evangelical than even *I* deserved, and I was trying to defend myself. "Look," I said, "I don't go around grabbing people by the lapels and shrieking 'You're a damned sinner and destined to roast in hell!'" As I spoke I had turned my body sideways, simulating the lapel-shaking bit in, as I thought, mid-air. There was a howl of laughter from my four fellow students, and I turned to see my clenched fists hovering millimetres away from the lapels of the Prof., who had wandered quietly into the room as I spoke, and had only heard the last part of *my* bit of the conversation. "Well, David," he said, "you're supposed to be our expert in *that*! I'll just have to take your word for it."

I was trying to explore the different possibilities concerning the Biblical view of those who do great evil in this life and die totally unrepentant. Some say that they will be annihilated, and that only the 'righteous' will remain. (This is called "Conditional Immortality".) Some say that everyone will be forgiven in the end, no matter *what* they have done, because of the love and mercy of God. (This is called "Universalism".) And some say that the wicked will suffer punishment, in a separate place called "Hell", in an unending torment. (This is called "Eternal Punishment"). My final conclusion was that a better expression of the common Hebraic post-mortem teaching would be 'a belief in *renewed eternal fellowship* with God for the righteous (= those reconciled through Christ, for the Christian; and those who observe the Law, for the Jew), and *ultimate retribution*, by exclusion from this, for the wicked'."

The apostle Paul offers an additional dimension in Chapter 1 & 2 of his Epistle to the Romans. He emphasizes *the Righteous Judgement of God*, and concludes that even those who have never heard of Christ *may* be saved, and he writes,

"When Gentiles who do not possess the law, do instinctively what the law requires, these, though not having the law, are a law to themselves. They show that what the law requires is written in their hearts, to which their own conscience also bears witness, and their conflicting thoughts will accuse or *perhaps* excuse them on the day when . . . God, through Jesus Christ, will judge the secret thoughts of all." (Romans ch. 2 vv 14,15)

There is, however, a strong universal instinct to honour the dead, especially our personal ancestors. So perhaps we should keep All Souls' Day as a time to thank God for all the *good* things we remember them for, and simply commend them to Him, of Whom Abraham said "Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?" (Genesis ch. 18 v. 25)

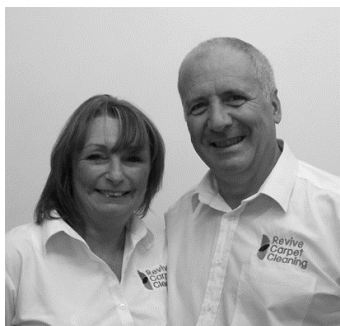
