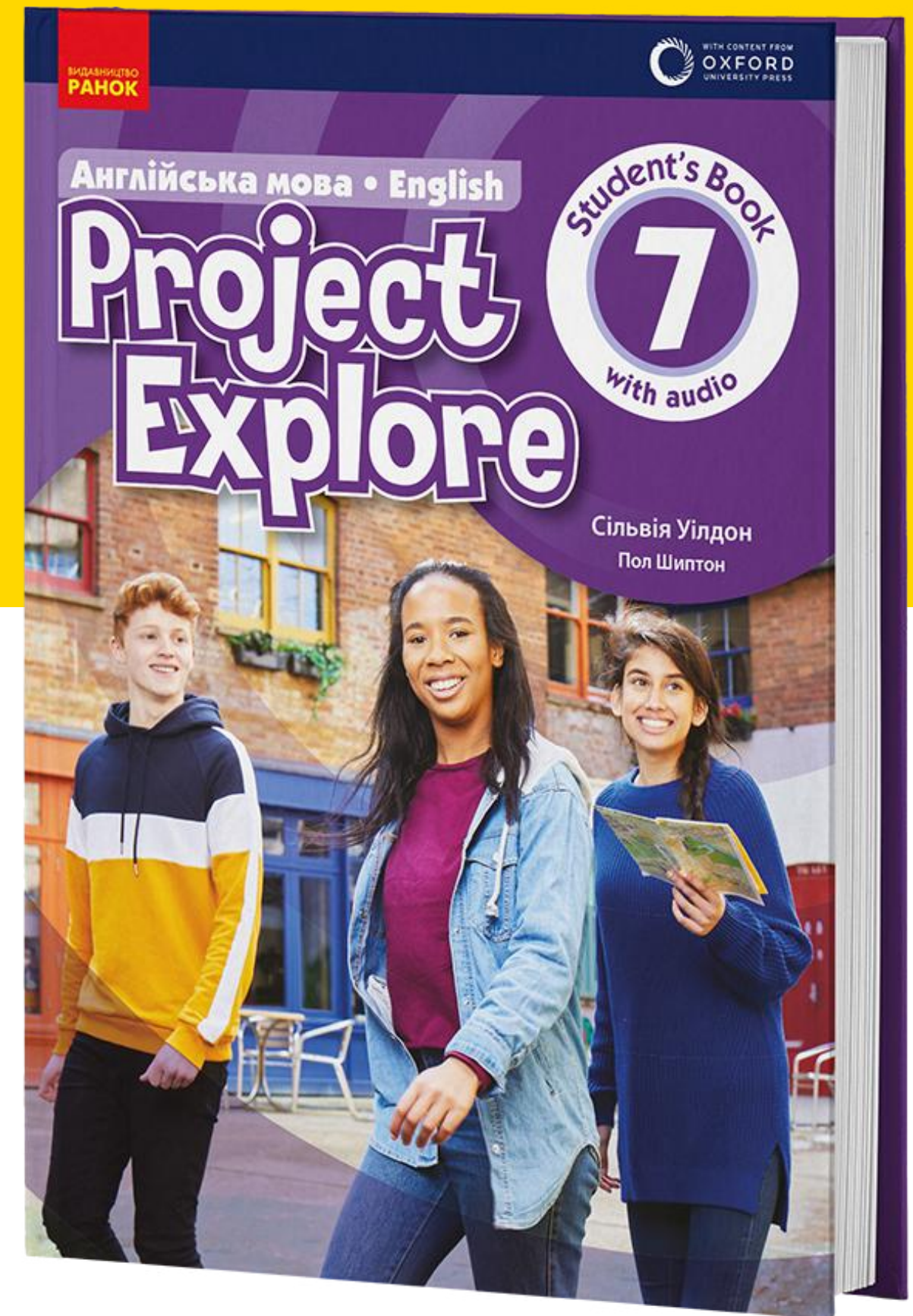

## Modal Verbs: have to



## Modal verbs:

-  don't express an action itself
-  express an attitude towards other actions
-  function under special rules



# Modal verb: HAVE TO

**expresses obligation, duty or necessity.**



- **Past tense.** Use "had to" to express obligation in the past: *Yesterday, I had to finish my project on time.*
- **Present tense.** Use "have to" for all subjects except 3rd person singular. For 3rd person singular (he, she, it), use "has to": *She has to call the doctor today.*
- **Future tense.** Use "will have to" to express obligation or necessity in the future: *We will have to work harder next year;*



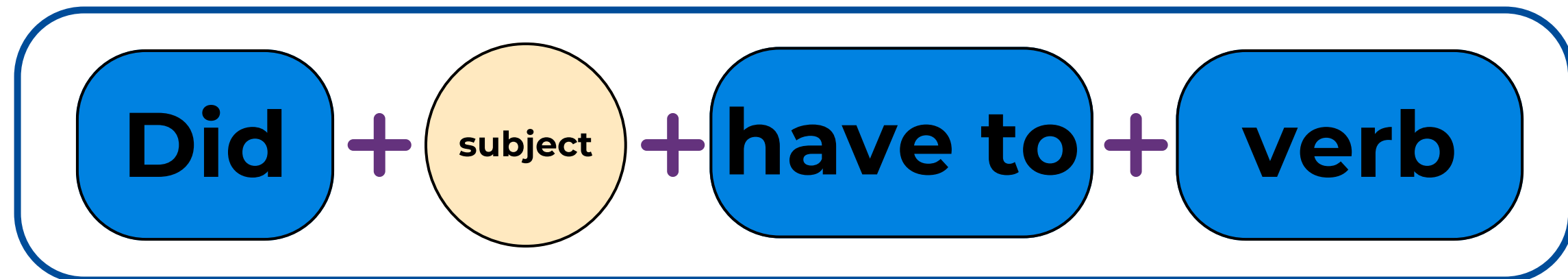
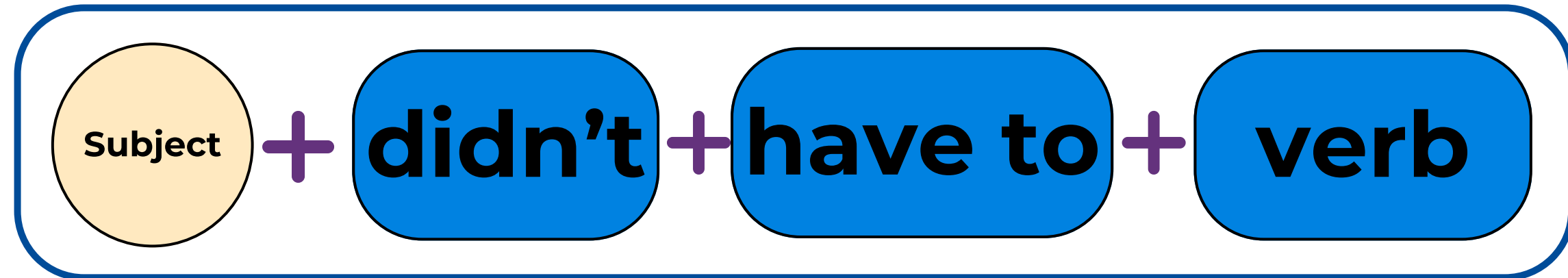
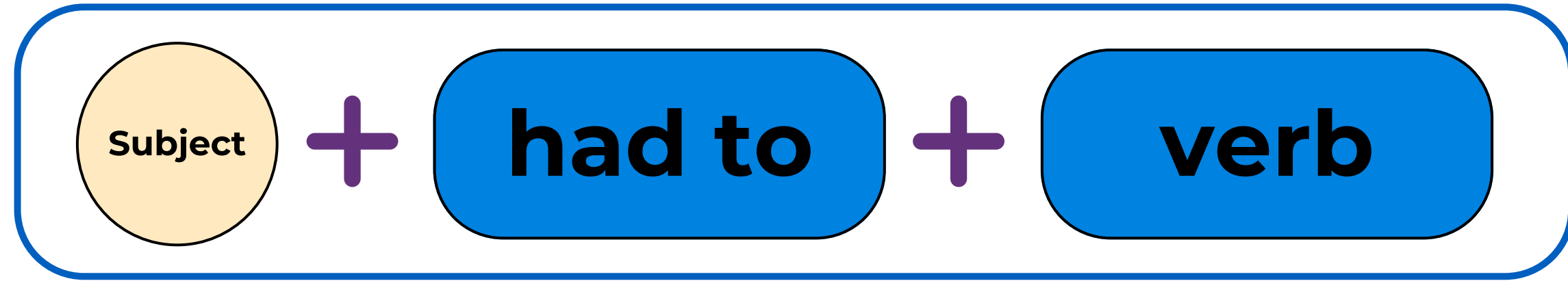
**has 3 time tense forms:**

**PAST:** had to - I had to repair the bicycle for my little brother.

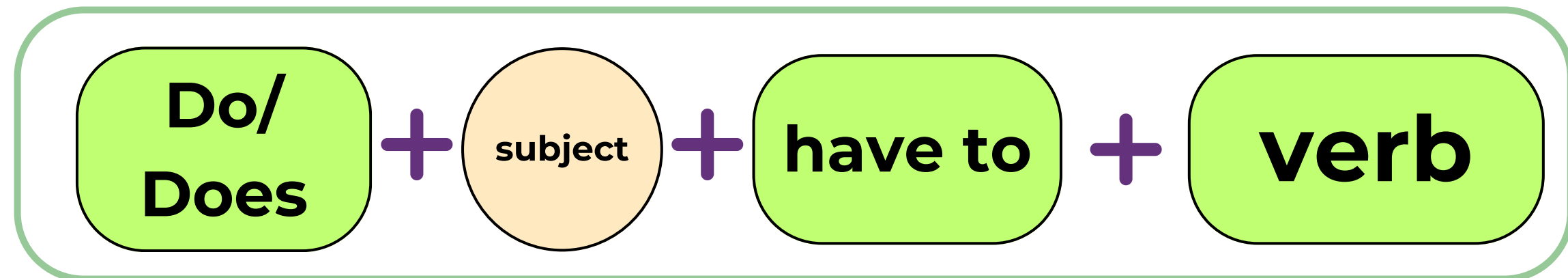
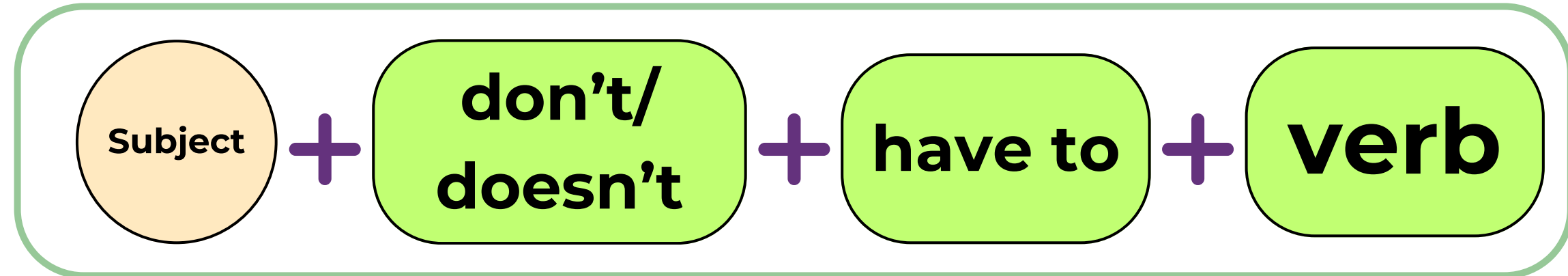
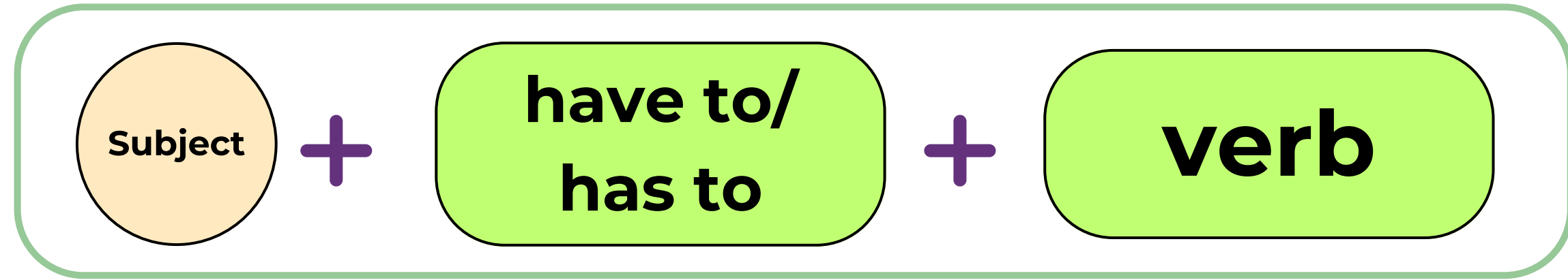
**PRESENT:** have to / has to - My father has to work till late at night on Mondays.

**FUTURE:** will have to - You will have to clean the mess.
