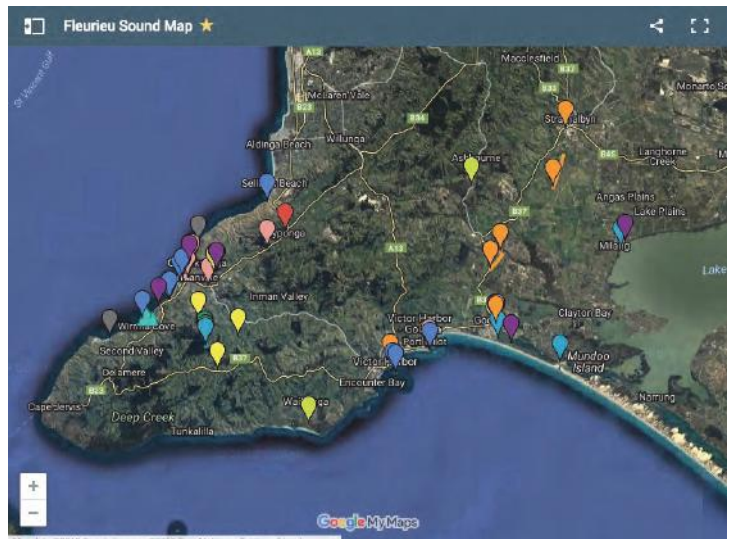
Fleurieu Sound Map Tristan Louth-Robins

Greetings! I'm Tristan Louth-Robins and since 2011 I've facilitated a sound recording project called the Fleurieu Sound Map. It consists of a website where visitors can listen to locations that I have recorded over the years with microphones and sound recording equipment. As a sound artist and composer I've been fortunate enough to be involved in a number of art projects over the years, and these activities have often involved making soundscape recordings of locations (otherwise known as the practice of *field recording*).

I spent most of my childhood and teenage years growing up in the Yankalilla region, so a great deal of inspiration for creating this project came from my local knowledge of the area. Creating the sound map has taken me

back to some familiar places, such as the Normanville township and Lady Bay; whilst it has also led me on some more curious endeavors - resulting in field recordings made at Ingalalla Falls and Granite Island; even aboard the historic Steam Ranger! The majority of the locations featured on the sound map have been recorded with conventional microphones, but in some instances I've also made recordings using underwater microphones (technically known as *hydrophones*.) Using this approach, underwater soundscapes have been captured, such as the Goolwa Barrages, Lake Alexandrina and a dam full of yabbies in Yankalilla.

Given that we live in such a visually dominated culture, it's easy to forget that we are constantly surrounded and immersed in sound. In some cases -



especially in cities - it can be simply noisy, but one of the things that I love about the Fleurieu region is its open spaces, wildlife and natural beauty. Even the townships have their own unique soundscapes, since each sound can be heard independently and clearly - be it a conversation, the chatter of birdlife or the rumble of a car engine. The sound map is updated on a semi-regular basis and recently I've begun to produce a video blog that documents site visits and explains some of the unique sonic characteristics of a given location. Although the Fleurieu region is visually beautiful in itself, I do hope that a visit to the Fleurieu Sound Map might inspire you to lend your ears to the region and explore and appreciate its unique soundscapes.

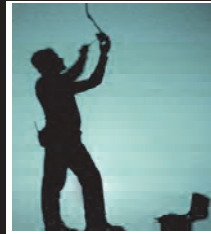

Inman Quilters' success pays off for Inman Valley CFS

In conjunction with the recent South Australian History Festival, the Inman Quilters held an event on the 22nd May 2017 at the Memorial Hall at Inman Valley.

The guest speaker on the day was International Award-winning quilter Pam Holland, who took the audience on a wonderful journey through the history of quilting. Throughout her travels in Australia and overseas, Pam has acquired an extensive collection of antique quilts,



dating from the late 1800's through to the mid 1900's. The quilts are primarily from America, although Pam does have an original Australian "wagga"! The audience was captivated by Pam's stories about the history of quilting and anyone who attended on the day could only marvel at how, in those very early days, the maker used whatever fabric was available. And whilst, due to age some of the quilts are starting to fall apart, the history they tell is too valuable to discard. Looking at the quilts on display, you wondered about the women that created them and the life they lived.

It was truly an amazing day.

Our grateful thanks to all those who purchased tickets to this "over-subscribed" event and especially to Pam Holland who generously donated of her time. As a result of this generosity, Inman Quilters have been able to make a donation of \$750.00 to the Inman Valley CFS to assist them in their on-going work for the community.

"You have to press a button to cross the road!"

Those of us who have been lucky enough to travel in Asia know the chaos of city traffic and how terrifying it can be to cross a road full of trucks, cars, taxis, scooters and the occasional cow or goat.

For a young Afghan Hazara woman familiar with this visual and auditory mayhem you may have expected it to be a breeze to conquer the streets of Adelaide. But for Zahra, her biggest surprise was that she had to "Press a Button" to cross the road. Her other shock on arrival was the absence of people. "Where is everyone?"

Zahra was responding to questions from an audience of 77 following the movie "The Staging Post" at Club Fleurieu on June 24th. Directed by Jolyon Hoff and filmed by 17-year-old Afghan Hazara, Khadim Dai, the film brought to life the enormous challenges that face people who in desperation are forced to leave their possessions, culture, close family and friends and travel to a place where they struggle with language and

also with understanding an entirely new and strange culture. Zahra and thousands like her became stranded in Cisarua, Indonesia when Australia "stopped the boats" in 2013.

The Staging Post documents the struggle of these refugees to come to terms with their predicament of temporary accommodation and uncertainty of resettlement. Processing of their refugee status by UNHCR in Indonesia was predicted to take up to 25 years. It's a must-see film. Attempting to describe the courage and resilience of the community that grew out of these frightening and depressing circumstances doesn't compare with hearing their stories.

The refugees successfully established a school (Cisarua Learning Centre) and rebuilt their lives while retaining their culture and community, but also challenging long held beliefs and customs from Afghan society. Among the changes that this Hazara community has embraced are the freedoms for women to actively participate in public events and to work with men who are not relatives outside of the home. In discussion after the film Zahra highlighted her amazement at the new freedoms she was given when she arrived in Indonesia, having been forced to live a restricted life as a woman in Afghanistan.

Zahra and her family are now settled in Adelaide. She is distinguishing herself as a teacher in training and her husband, Muzafar Ali is working as a translator while studying medicine.

Khadim is studying film making in Los Angeles.

The refugees in the film have led an education revolution in Indonesia. There are now over 1500 students learning at schools led by refugees and taught by approximately 100 volunteer refugee teachers. If

Muzafar, Khadim and Jolyon have toured with the film around the country and have been gratified to find the many new supporters for their charity, Cisarua Learning. If you'd like to know more or to make a tax deductible donation directly to the school, go to their website cisaruallearning.com or contact us at the email address below.

The film event and donations on the day raised over \$700 for Cisarua.

Another fantastic consequence from the film was that Yankalilla Area School students donated another \$500 from fundraising focussed on supporting Indonesian students! Our local school is part of the Asia Education Foundation Bridge Partnership Program. Well done Yankalilla students!

Later the same week as the screening of The Staging Post, I was fortunate to witness a Mud Day at Delamere, where children and parents from a northern Adelaide school shared the winter mud with the Rapid Bay School community.

If we had only known then what we are cursing about now, but hindsight is a wonderful thing!

Plastic bags are an everyday commodity that everyone uses, or seem to anyway. Wherever we go, whether shopping, or cleaning up around the house etc, the ultimate necessary commodity is a plastic bag!

Whether for dropping rubbish into, storing everything for want of a better container, we are all guilty of this each and every day.

This has now become like a spreading disease, force of habit has been handed down from generation to generation.

Now a revolution is gradually coming into force!

Odd scraps could be used to de orate.

The great thing here is that many volunteers may have time on their hands and could run up some cheerful, home made carry bags, result empty boxes

SA Water and Yankalilla Council seeking feedback on future of local water and sewerage services

SA Water and the District Council of Yankalilla have reached an in-principle agreement on a proposal for SA Water to take on ongoing responsibility of the drinking water supply network in Wirrina, and sewerage network servicing the whole council region.

The two parties have been working together to identify the best way to continue providing these essential services – which are currently council-owned and operated – to the local community.

SA Water's General Manager of Customer Delivery Kerry Rowlands said they're now looking to local residents and businesses to provide their view on the proposal.

"To enable us to take on operation of Wirrina's drinking water supply, an investment from new Wirrina water customers is required to fund necessary upgrades to the network. These will bring the local treatment plant in line with our operational standards," Kerry said.

"We need majority support from people currently supplied through Wirrina's mains water network, for the changeover in management to proceed."

The contribution would be in the form of a one-off payment – \$4000 per house (or vacant land) and \$2000 per apartment – to be made when ownership of the network transfers to SA Water. Business customers would also make a pro-rata contribution, the details of which SA Water is discussing with each business.

This one-off payment will increase by five per cent each year if a customer chooses to sign up after SA Water assumes management and operation of local water assets.

"Ongoing water usage charges for Wirrina water customers would move to SA Water's state-wide price – which enables most of our customers to pay the same price regardless of where they live or the actual cost of providing the service – which is lower than existing council charges," Kerry said.

"If SA Water assumes ownership of Wirrina water network, and a local resident or business owner chooses not to become an SA Water customer, they will remain a customer of the District Council of Yankalilla and will be subject to their existing charges."

A previous proposal for SA Water to assume management of both water and sewerage networks in Wirrina was put to the community in 2015 but didn't proceed due to a lack of support.

The District Council of Yankalilla's Chief Executive Officer Nigel Morris said this latest proposal is much more cost-effective and shows SA Water has listened to the feedback provided to date.

"Ensuring residents and businesses in Wirrina are provided a quality and secure drinking water supply at a cost they can afford, now and into the future, is vital," Nigel said.

"We know SA Water has the know-how, but it's also important people understand the proposal when deciding whether or not to support it. We've given our conditional support, now we want our local community members to have their say."

The in-principle agreement between SA Water and the council also involves transfer of ownership to SA Water of sewerage services across the whole council area – which includes Community Wastewater Management Systems (CWMS) for Wirrina; Normanville, Yankalilla, Carrickalinga and Links Lady Bay; Myponga Beach; and Second Valley.

There will be no additional up-front charge to existing CWMS customers when transferring to SA Water.

"In fact, under SA Water's pricing structure, most new residential sewerage customers will pay less than their existing sewerage service rates. A small number of people may experience an increase, and where this appears likely, we have contacted these

customers directly," Kerry said.

"What we're offering all new customers in the wider Yankalilla region a reliable drinking water supply and sewerage service that meet or exceed all relevant public health and other regulatory requirements; a 24/7 customer response service; access to bill payment support when necessary; and network maintenance and upgrades when required.

"We already provide water and sewerage services to more than 700,000 customers across South Australia, and we'll use our expertise and experience to manage these services in Yankalilla and the surrounding region, safely and efficiently." Once feedback on the proposal is received, SA Water and the council will look to update the Yankalilla community on the outcome. If successful, the transition of both the council district's sewerage network and water supply in Wirrina to SA Water would come into effect on 1 January 2019.

This is subject to a number of pre-conditions, including majority support from the Wirrina community, and the District Council of Yankalilla resolving minor issues with existing support infrastructure as well as retaining ownership of the Wirrina Dam.

2018 Investigator Team Sailing Nationals Wrap-up

The Investigator College sailing team qualified for this year's Nationals with a strong performance in the State Titles held in Goolwa in April 2018. This qualification, in turn, put the team in line for a position at the Australian Secondary Schools Championship held in Blairgowrie, Victoria. Eventually, weather permitting, the finals were run in awesome sailing conditions in the afternoon on the final day with our team cheering on our fellow South Australian team, Westminster, who took out the title and was deservedly crowned National Champions 2018.

Our team consisted of Alyssa Kelsey (captain/skipper Year 12), Ella Konings (skipper Year 11), Indiah Kelsey (skipper Year 10) and crews Abbey Nott, Tayla Kelsey, Isaac Lush, Isaac Konings and Nathan Lush.

The team did Investigator College and South Australia proud to finish in the top 10 in one of the College's first interstate outings. They were ably supported by coach Ben Kelsey, team manager Bruce Konings, and parents Kerry Nott and Nardine Habner. Also, the team would like to acknowledge support from Investigator College Principal Don Grimmer, Alexandrina Council, and all the supporters that made the venture possible. The Investigator College sailing team will start training again in Term 4 with new sailors encouraged to join.

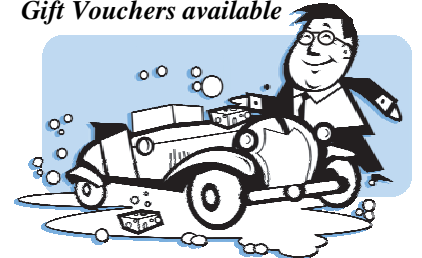

Anacotilla – an early example of innovative agriculture

In 1849, Robert Kelly and his wife Mary Ann arrived at Port Adelaide, having departed their home on the Isle of Man after their marriage. They soon acquired land in the Second Valley district and, with a combination of land purchased and leased from the Crown, developed a farm called Cornhill. While Cornhill passed from Kelly ownership in the 1890s a further property, Anacotilla, remained in the family.

Edgar married Fanny Emma Jones at Encounter Bay in 1882, and of their three children, their son Garnet, born in 1883, was keen on the land and when he was old enough began farming Anacotilla in partnership with his father, eventually buying the property and increasing its acreage. Anacotilla station once extended over several thousand acres from Lady Bay towards Second Valley.

Garnet continued to farm the property with his father. He was progressive and innovative and was early to use wire netting to control rabbits which were a serious problem. He also dammed the Anacotilla Creek for irrigation and to drive a water wheel that powered a chaff cutter and grindstone. He then planned an irrigation system for Crosers at Rapid Bay.

Walter Hume chose Garnet Kelly to assist in setting up a factory in Melbourne to manufacture pipes before Garnet, already a councillor on the Rapid Bay District Council, in March 1916 enlisted in the First World War, where he was killed in action in France in January 1917.

However, through his forward-thinking, Garnet Kelly bequeathed the sum of one hundred pounds to be invested, and the proceeds to be used 'for the planting and protection of new trees on the main or district roads or reserves within the said District Council ... this money must be used for fresh tree planting and incidental preparation of ground and protection only and not for the maintenance of or attention to trees after they have been planted.'

Anacotilla weir and irrigation system is now part of a Heritage site. A low stone wall (weir) built over the Anacotilla Creek dams back the water upstream, from which elevated irrigation piping takes the water to the lower areas downstream around the original Anacotilla homestead. Garnet Kelly built this system in the early 1900s. He was described as 'a very versatile and innovative person. He also planned an irrigation system for Crosers at Rapid Bay and was chosen by Walter Hume to assist in a factory in

Melbourne to manufacture pipes'.

Croser's unusual watering system designed by Kelly consisted of an earthen weir across the creek at the junction of two creeks, with a spillway around the contour of the hill and a brick wall across the creek to deflect water into a brick channel down to the back aqueduct with outlets at regular intervals. Croser's property was originally part of William Gerrard's Yoho station and was known as Duck's Hut. Gerard split up Yoho prior to 1878 although Gerard's stud was not dispersed until 1880. The irrigation system was supposedly based on Gerard's ideas at Yoho which could have been built around 1860s-1870s.

It has been recommended that the Anacotilla site currently registered should be extended to include the upper reaches of the irrigation system and the weir at the junction of No-where-else and Yoho Creeks. The early settlers displayed ingenuity in their quest to supply their land and persons with water – the most precious commodity in the settlement of South Australia. In addition to his innovative farming practices and his membership of the Rapid Bay Council, Garnet took an active interest in the local Methodist Church, was president of the Rapid Bay Literary Society, and secretary of the British and Foreign Bible Society branch. He also supported local OBI (Our Boys' Institute) camps, where boys enjoyed fishing and shooting. On the Sundays, Garnet would meet Mr Kirkham Evans and his boys at the foot of the [Second Valley school] hill and drive them to his father's home at Anacotilla for afternoon tea, and then afterwards to church at Normanville.

Following Garnet Kelly's death, in 1920 his parents sold Anacotilla to Charles Ness, and the property is still in the Ness family.

Since 2012, Joel, Sophie and children Asher and Annika, the owners of Yarnauwi Farm, a 19-hectare lot, once part of Anacotilla, are present-day passionate environmental innovators. Together with family, friends and volunteers, they have been restoring eroded bare paddocks and revegetating the property with indigenous

habitat, with the intention of making it a viable, sustainable and diversified permaculture-inspired small food farm.

CEO CORNER

A short update this month is on two hot topics and a nice cold one relating to Carrickalinga. I would welcome your feedback at council@yankalilla.sa.gov.au if there were other topics you would like updates on.

Carrickalinga, Gold Coast Drive house

I often get asked about the unfinished house on Gold Coast Drive. The house as it currently stands has been built above the approved height of 7.995 metres and a stop work was placed on the house to ensure it was built in accordance with the development approval. The owner of the house applied to the Development Assessment Panel to have the approved height modified to 8.375 metres but this was rejected by the panel.

The owner appealed to the ERD Court the Assessment Panel decision to reject the height increase and in July 2018 we were formally notified that rejection was not supported by the Commissioner, allowing the house to now be built to the new height of 8.375m.

With the decision now made by the Commissioner we will be encouraging the owner to complete the unfinished building after an extended period of no work and look forward to the reduction in height from what is currently there to the newly approved height by the Commissioner.

Forktree Brewery

I was privileged to take a tour of the upgrade work currently on the way to create Forktree Brewery. Located on Forktree Road, Carrickalinga (just up from our recently upgraded Carrickalinga Lookout), the brewery will be located in the old shearing shed that is currently being transformed into a brilliant venue.

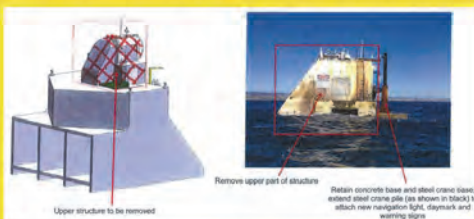
The place has magnificent views down to the ocean across the rolling hills and the team have many initiatives to play host to individuals and families. I am told I can look forward to a nice cold one post October. For those like me that can't wait to sample the produce, the beer can already be purchased through select venues.

Wave Generator

I have now been informed that in late May 2018, the Department for Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI) have received State Government Development Approval for work to be performed on the Wave Generator, currently located off Carrickalinga.

The image below shows approved works will be the removal of the steel structure on top of the concrete base, leaving the concrete structure intact below the water line and partly exposed at low tide levels (all remaining wiring etc. will be removed below the water line). The approval requires an exclusion zone to be created around the structure as a navigational hazard and a beacon light to be attached to the pole on top of the structure.

A timetable for work to be done is not currently known.

THE FIRST STEP IN THE WAR ON WASTE

All kerbside bin collections (residential and business) in the District Council of Yankalilla are now fortnightly, alternating weekly, with:

- General waste to Landfill – W and Green Organics – G collected on the same day.
- Recycling – R collected in the next week.

Calendars have been delivered to local postal addresses via Australia Post, additional copies of the calendar are available from Council or local stores. An online calendar which can be searched by street name and individual downloads of collection cycle by day are available on the FRWA website – www.frwa.com.au.

You can also download the My Local Services app, register your address and you will get reminders for your collection.

Sorting your waste where it is produced (kitchen, study and bathrooms) is the key to making most use of the extra volume of recycling and green organics.

REMEMBER

- Soft plastics such as bags, cling film,

bubble wrap **CANNOT** be recycled through your kerbside recycling bin - many supermarkets provide soft plastics recycling collection bins.

- Tissues and paper towel **CANNOT** be recycled - place small amounts in the green organics bin or larger amounts in your waste bin.

- **Foam:** polystyrene food trays, packaging and wrap **CANNOT** be recycled - please place it in your waste bin.

- **IF IT GROWS, IN IT GOES** - All types of food scraps and food waste can be placed in your green organics bin to be made into mulch, this keeps this valuable organic material out of landfill.

EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES POLICY

Large families, those households with children in nappies or with a family member living with a medical condition which produces additional waste can make application to Council to receive an extra 140l general waste bin and collection service. This service

is provided, without charge, to assist families with special needs to transition to the new fortnightly collection cycle by maintaining the same volume of general waste collected kerbside. Conditions apply.

ANNUAL ADDITIONAL WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES

Small businesses, including holiday rental accommodation (where a higher number of people may be accommodated in peak times) can apply and purchase **Annual Additional Collection Services** from FRWA. Annual Additional Collection services are limited to up to two (2) additional bins collected fortnightly in each waste stream.

WEEKLY COLLECTION OVER PEAK SUMMER SCHOOL HOLIDAYS

Kerbside collections of general waste will revert to weekly for the six (6) weeks of the peak summer school holidays – from **Monday 17 December 2018 to Friday 25 January 2019**. Recycling and Green organics collections remain fortnightly during this period.

DRAWING ON COUNTRY

The District Council of Yankalilla this year hosted, for the first time, the Country Arts SA program 'Drawing on Country'. This much loved program invites people of all ages and abilities to bring pencils, paint, camera or tablet and delve into the artist's connection to place. An artist supports the participants, discussing techniques and demonstrating ways to interpret the landscape. Participants then take home the work started to complete and can choose to submit their artwork for an exhibition at a local venue during the South Australian Living Arts Festival - SALA.

The weather was perfect for the Drawing on Country program on 6 April and the day was filled with inspiration and art. A group of 23 participants worked with Barb Pettigrew in Bungala Park, capturing the beauty of this stunning location. Throughout May and June, the group had the opportunity to meet again with Barb to review and discuss their work. During August, this

group will exhibit the outcome of this fantastic community arts program as a part of SALA.

The Drawing on Country Yankalilla Exhibition will be held from Sunday 12 – 31 August at The Centre, 181 Main South Road. The exhibition opens on 12 August from 4.00pm – 6.00pm.

An extension of this project was a collaboration with Adelaide-based glass artist Llewelyn Ash who has drawn inspiration from the work generated at Drawing on Country to create an art work to be installed on the glass of the BBQ shelters in Bungala Park. Supported by Council, this glass art work will be unveiled on Friday, 10 August at 10.00am. The community is invited to attend and share in this fantastic community art project.



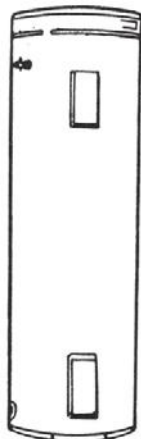

Fungi

Fungi – the good the bad and the interesting Fungi are one of the lesser understood life forms in our environment. They are not considered plants, as they have many different features – the main one being not having chlorophyll and therefore unable to get their energy from photosynthesis. Fungi rely on the absorption of nutrients from natural debris such as dead plant and/or animal material. They play an important role in ecosystems as they are nature's composters (with the help of other living organisms). The appearance of fungi usually occurs after rain – where the forest floor becomes full of colour and strange shapes – they can also be seen growing on logs or garden mulch. It is their amazing colour and shape that has won them their reputation in fairytales and as a source of mystery and fascination. Although some, such as parasitic fungi, may struggle to earn a place in a fairytale. Parasitic fungi put out airborne spores (like seeds) making their way onto a living invertebrate (insect or arthropod). They slowly paralyse their host and once it is dead, they will grow from inside of the body, sometimes out of their heads - just like in the movie Alien. Other types of fungi include the underground mycorrhiza which form symbiotic relationships with plants – whereby both organisms benefit through increased absorption of nutrients. In Australia nearly 90% of plants depend on a mycorrhiza association. Native orchids in particular are known for their special association with mycorrhiza. There are even some fungi that are specialised to grow on animal faeces!

Although fungi are a key food source for humans and animals, there are poisonous species that occur in the Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges – fungi in the wild should never be eaten and expert advice should always be sought for identification. Investigate which fungi are found in your area using our new Fungi of the Adelaide Hills identification chart.

**Weed Of The Month from
Cape Jervis Coastal
Community Group
Khaki Weed**

(Alternanthera pungens)

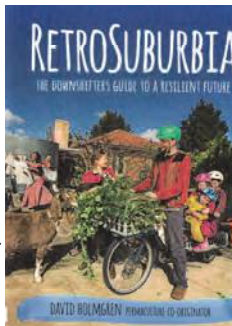
Thankfully, we have not seen this weed on our town site at Cape Jervis, but it has been spotted at Fishery Beach, and we have certainly seen it on other sites. It likes to invade lawns so keep an eye out in yours, because it is hard to get rid of! A low growing plant, it has ground-hugging runners forming a dense mat, as each runner travels up to 60cm. The stems are reddish-green and a little hairy. New roots are produced at stem nodes, meaning patches of the plant can spread out quickly. Tight clusters of greenish-yellow flowers are produced at leaf junction, as can be seen in the photo above. These are fairly inconspicuous, but as

the flowers mature into fruits, parts become really hard and you will notice them then, because you will be stepping on prickly burrs! Another thing you might notice from the photo above is that the paired leaves differ in size...one is a lot larger than the other. Each has a short stalk, a few hairs, an oval shape, and prominent veins on the underside. If you see this plant, let the Dept of Environment & Water know, as it is a **declared and notifiable weed**. Be careful you don't carry any of the burrs on your clothing...burrs (and hence seeds) are easily dispersed when caught in animal fur, on clothing or tyres.

Ross Trigg

Earlier in the day we held our normal meeting. Guest speaker was Dr Don Hopgood. He has spoken to us on many occasions and this time his subject was the poet Max Harris. Literary critic, columnist and general bon vivant Harris was born in 1921.

Max Harris was a glamorous Australian poet who made a reputation for himself as something of a rebel as editor of Angry Penguins, a cutting-edge literary magazine. Harris wanted to shake up the artistic community by exposing it to new ideas and new writers. In 1944 he thought he had found a writer worth taking under his wing. That writers name was Ern Malley.

Harris never actually met Malley. Instead he received some of Malley's poems in the mail from a woman claiming to be Malley's sister. Ern himself it seemed had died of Graves' disease and his sister said she had found the poems while going through his possessions after his death.

The poems were strange, dark, brooding and almost incomprehensible. They contained lines such as "I am still the black swan of trespass on alien waters"

Harris loved them and arranged for a special edition of Angry Penguins devoted to Malley's work. There was just one problem Ern Malley didn't exist. He was the satirical creation of two poets who were hostile to modernist poetry and wanted to see if they could get the literary world to accept deliberately concocted nonsense. They claimed to have written the poems in one day by randomly picking out nonsequential lines from the Oxford Dictionary of Quotations.

Harris's reputation and ego took a blow when the hoax was exposed. He eventually overcame this set back and made his name as a publisher and social commentator. He also with his friend founded the Mary Martin bookshop chain.

We found it a most interesting presentation by a skilled raconteur.

There has been a lot of discussion about 'family violence' in recent years and I am qualified and experienced sufficiently to be able to give you the 'facts' as distinct from something emotive and with a balanced view. If you set out to read this and think 'family violence' is not something that interests you nor impacts on you then good for you and that is the vast majority. The first premise is that all victims are children, absolute. The next premise is that it is NEVER ok for a man to hit a woman, the consequences can be diabolical, Lose - lose, especially for children. Finally family violence is perpetrated by PEOPLE that is FV is not gendered, it is perpetrated by dysfunctional people of both genders. Why they became dysfunctional is trying to justify it. The Australian Bureau of Statistics nominates these categories of Domestic Violence:

- Physical
- Verbal
- Emotional
- Sexual or psychological abuse
- Controlling money
- Stalking
- Neglect in a relationship of dependence
- Harm to an animal or property
- Restricting spiritual or cultural participation

The ABS is the primary guideline and go on to say "people of all walks of life can be affected by family and domestic violence and it includes all types of relationships such as current and past intimate relationships, cohabiting, carers and guardians, other family members including step families, those who fall within indigenous or culturally recognised groups, and is irrespective of gender or sexuality." I must make mention of the humanitarian crisis' (Guardian September 2016) that is suicide in Australia. Eight per day, six of them men (Melbourne Univ. Figures). 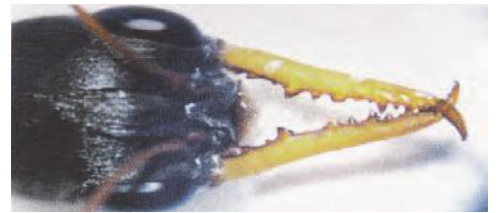
Spider Lady

MY HEALTH RECORD OPT OUT PERIOD 16TH JULY TO 15TH OCTOBER 2018

More than five million Australians already have a My Health record, which provides a summary of their health information, delivering better health outcomes for patients and their treating doctors and specialists. Every Australian will have a My Health record created for them, unless they choose not to have one during the 3 months opt out period that will run from 16th July to 15th October 2018. The My Health record system and opt out process has the full support of all state and territory governments and peak bodies who unanimously agreed to this plan in August 2017 at COAG Health Council. The protection of patient information is critical and the My Health record system has strong safeguards in place to protect the health data. It is also subject to some of the strongest legislation in the world to prevent unauthorised use.

During the opt out period individuals who do not want a record will be able to opt out by visiting the My Health record website www.myhealthrecord.gov.au or by calling **1800 723 471** for phone-based assistance. Australians can cancel their My Health record at any time after the end of the opt out period—or create one if they opted out.

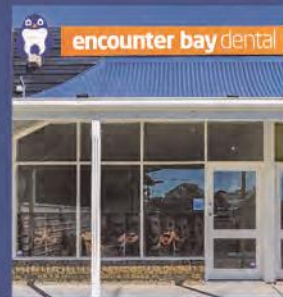

Parents Urged To Vaccinate Kids Against Flu

Parents are being urged to vaccinate their children against the flu before the peak flu season hits, following a spike in cases in children interstate.

SA Health's Acting Director of the Communicable Disease Control Branch, Dr Ann Koehler, said a child in New South Wales has sadly died from influenza A, and 18 others have recently been hospitalised.

"This is a sad reminder that the flu can be deadly, and that it's not too late to vaccinate," Dr Koehler said.

"In South Australia this year there have been 394 flu cases in children, including 156 in children under 5.

"Flu vaccinations are free for children under 5 in South Australia and I would urge parents to make an appointment with their GP to have their children vaccinated.

"More than 50,000 vaccines have been distributed since the beginning of May and we have additional stock on hand.

"Vaccinating younger children can also help protect vulnerable people in the community, including babies under six months who are too young to receive a flu vaccination."

NSW Health has reported that of those children hospitalised, 15 were eligible for the free flu vaccine, but only two had been fully vaccinated.

Of the 19 children admitted to hospital in NSW, 17 contracted influenza A (H1N1), which is the key strain currently circulating in NSW.

"The H1N1 strain was the cause of the 2009 flu pandemic and has been included in vaccines since 2010," Dr Koehler said.

"Children born since 2009 who have not had influenza vaccinations may be particularly vulnerable, and we are anticipating the influenza season to start in the next few weeks as it has already commenced interstate."

Children under 9-years-old who have never had a flu vaccination will need two doses, at least four weeks apart.

The flu vaccine is also free under the National Immunisation Program for high-risk groups including pregnant women, people aged over 65 and those with underlying medical conditions.

In South Australia, there have been 1571 notifications of flu this year to date, compared to 3812 cases reported for the same period last year.

BreastScreen SA Mobile Unit at Victor Harbor Hospital

BreastScreen SA will have a mobile unit available for local residents from mid July to late November at the car park of the Victor Harbor Hospital.

The Yankalilla Council bus which runs weekly on Thursday will drop off and pick up passengers from hospital carpark at a cost of \$10 return.

For passengers between the age of 65 and 75 there is a Council transport service available at no cost. For this service ring the council office.

Breast Approach To Screening

In a South Australian first, thousands of South Australian women will receive an innovative new invitation to have their breasts checked.

General Manager of BreastScreen SA (BSSA), Jane Burden, says 10,000 women will receive a personal message from Seven News' Jane Doyle urging them to book in for a screening.

"For the first time, BreastScreen SA is using new technology to personally remind women that they are due for an appointment," Ms Burden said.

"This new technology allows us to send an SMS to women who we know are due for a screening, personally inviting them to book in.

"The SMS is targeted at the individual, with breast cancer survivor, Jane Doyle, appearing to talk directly to the woman.

"In the SMS, Jane also shares her own experience as an example of how taking the time to make an appointment could save your life.

"The personalised videos also include practical information, including where the closest clinic is, to ensure women don't need to make any excuses."

As a BSSA ambassador, Jane Doyle lends her face and voice to the targeted videos.

"Having had my own breast cancer diagnosed in a routine screen by BSSA, I know the importance of making that appointment, even though we're all time poor," Ms Doyle said.

"I hope these videos will encourage more women to get screened to give them the best shot at early detection, which will give them the best chance at survival.

"I am living proof that having a mammogram can save your life."

BSSA has worked with Smart Video Australia to develop the personalised video with the client's name, which also shows footage of the client's nearest screening clinic.

The videos will be sent via SMS to approximately 10,000 potential new BreastScreen SA clients.

The SMS will include a URL link which, when clicked, opens their personalised video.

Mission Australia Encourages Yankalilla Community To Host Sleepout

Mission Australia is encouraging people living in Yankalilla to get some “eye-opening” sleep and host their own Mission Australia Sleepout to raise awareness and funds to help end homelessness. While a Sleepout can be hosted by anyone, anywhere and anytime, the charity is encouraging locals to organise their own Sleepout during Homelessness Week (6-12 August) of which the theme is – fittingly – ‘ending homelessness together’. This year, Mission Australia is marking 30 years since its first ever Sleepout in 1988. Over three decades, the initiative, which invites individuals to spend a night sleeping away from the comfort of their bed, has seen more than 50,000 people take part and raise over \$3 million for vital homelessness services. In asking people to rough it for a night, the charity seeks to give

individuals a brief glimpse into the reality of the lives of the four people in Yankalilla, and the 116,000 men, women and children across Australia who are homeless on any given night. Mission Australia CEO James Toomey said: “We know that most of us can’t truly understand what it’s like to be homeless, but the Sleepout experience is an opportunity for everyday Australians to comprehend the plight of people who are experiencing homelessness, which can equip them for further action and advocacy.” While it’s a significant milestone, unfortunately there aren’t many reasons to celebrate on the Sleepout’s 30th birthday. Homelessness rates in Australia are rising, which is largely due to the escalating costs of rental properties and a lack of social and affordable housing. There’s never been a more


critical time to shed light on the effects of the housing affordability crisis. “We know that rough sleeping is just the tip of the iceberg, with other forms of homelessness being less obvious to the public. Many people experience hidden homelessness - living out of a car, on a friend’s floor or in an overcrowded share house. “We want to see a national plan that commits to ending homelessness by 2030 and addresses the main drivers such as family violence, poverty and the lack of affordable housing. As part of this plan, we need clear targets at a national and local level to boost the supply of
