PREVENT

COUNSELLING

We offer a confidential counselling service, where you can explore how you feel freely and openly in a way that is not always possible with friends and family. The counsellor is not there to judge or advise you, but to help you clarify your thoughts and feelings and become more effective at finding your own solutions and coping mechanisms.

STUDENTS' UNION & LEARNER VOICE

LEARNING TECHNOLOGY CENTRES


Our Learning Technology Centres (LTCs) host fantastic resources including desktop computers, loanable laptops, and a curated selection of course related, general interest, and fiction books.

SUPPORT

Money and finance doesn't have to be a worrying experience. We want your transition into college to be as smooth as possible. Therefore, we have plenty of information available to help you to understand what costs are involved and how you can find out if you are eligible for any financial support.

Students who are on a full-time course (funded either by the government or via a 19+ Advanced Learner Loan) and have a household income below £28,000 may be entitled to financial assistance from the college's discretionary bursary. This can help with course-related costs and travel to and from college. Bursaries are individually tailored depending on the course you are studying, where you live, and how you travel to college (see policy for full detail).

The bursary is only a contribution towards courserelated costs and travel, so will not necessarily cover the full amount.

SOME COSTS WE CAN SUPPORT WITH ARE:*

- Course contribution/course materials fee applicable to your course
- Essential books, kit, uniform, or equipment required for your course
- Free college meals (subject to meeting the criteria set by the Government)
- Travel allowance (depending on where you live and the number of days you attend college)
- Childcare costs for one child only for students aged 20 or above. Students under the age of 20 should apply to the National Care to Learn Scheme for assistance with childcare





Everyone has different needs and you may require support such as reasonable adjustments to facilities and resources, or specific support like exam access arrangements.

SUPPORT MAY BE AVAILABLE FOR STUDENTS WITH:

- Dyslexia, dyspraxia, and other specific learning difficulties
- Autistic spectrum conditions
- Speech, language and communication difficulties/disabilities
- Physical and mobility difficulties
- Medical conditions
- Moderate learning difficulties
- Social, emotional, and mental health difficulties
- Hearing impairments
- Vision impairments

If you have a learning difference/disability and you do not have an EHCP, but feel you require support, speak to your tutor or the Additional Learning Support (ALS) team at your campus. We will then arrange a confidential meeting to discuss your requirements.

EDUCATION, HEALTH AND CARE PLAN (EHCP)

If you have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP), a consultation process would have already been completed. The college will ensure your support needs are communicated to key staff working with you, so you receive the support you require.

EXAM CONCESSIONS

If you haven't spoken to us about any previous exam concessions you received, speak to your course tutor (or Maths/English teachers) as soon as possible. You will be required to provide evidence of any access arrangements you had at school.

YOUR CAMPUS

Our Dartford campus is located slightly out of the town centre on Oakfield Lane and the campus has several open green space areas for students to enjoy. Our Dartford Campus offers a FREE Shuttle Bus service from Dartford train station, which runs regularly during term time. The campus also boasts the highly



acclaimed Miskin Theatre and an industry leading, state-of-the-art facility for Creative and Performance Arts, whilst our Miskin Studios host a student led radio station and shows on-site. We offer excellent sports and fitness facilities located at the Osterberg Centre and a brilliant Learning Technology Centre, which is a wonderful resource for study. Our restaurant offers great deals on breakfast, lunch, and snacks for you throughout the day.



Our Gravesend campus is located slightly outside of the town centre and hosts a blend of courses for vocational trades and specialist careers, which give it a distinct workplace-like quality. The campus also boasts The National Maritime Training Centre. In the Construction and Engineering workshops, there are types of

of equipment and workplace practices that mirror the best employers in the industry, whilst Motor Vehicle, Catering, and Hairdressing serve customers to the standards expected by market leaders. We have a Learning Technology Centre, which is a great resource for study. Our main restaurant offers great deals on breakfast, lunch, and snacks for you throughout the day. The campus also hosts a commercial restaurant, The Gallery.

YOUR CAMPUS

Our Tonbridge Campus is located on Brook Street and is within walking distance of the local train station. This modern campus provides students with a fantastic auditorium and performing space for our Miskin Music and Applied Theatre students. There are spacious design and photography studios, a state-of-the-art



Assistive Technology suite and fully equipped gym for our students to use during their time with us. The Brook Street Restaurant and Café offer great deals on breakfast, lunch and snacks. The campus also offers a commercial restaurant called The View as well as hair and beauty salons, which are open to the public. We have a Learning Technology Centre, which is a fabulous resource for study.



Our Hadlow campus is located on Tonbridge road and is set in beautiful surroundings within a large, managed estate including: over 265 acres of prime, arable land, woodland, natural river habitats, three commercial farms, established show gardens, horticultural glasshouses, lakes and other natural habitats.

Hadlow is renowned for being Kent's only land-based and rural college offering students realistic and up-to-date educational experiences. The campus boasts a large student common room, gym, FE and HE student accommodation rooms, a Learning Technology Centre and a spacious cafeteria, which offers great deals on breakfast, lunch and snacks.
