# Nature's Spa - Tatai Waterfall by boat

One of the region's must-sees, we visit <u>Tatai Waterfall</u> every second day as a regular tour. In addition, you can ask for a private trip for your party if you are four people or more (subject to boat and guide availability).

If the waterfalls are mighty and not easy to access in the rainy season, the lower water flow makes the falls very friendly and enjoyable to explore during the dry season (Dec to May).



<u>How long</u> Departure at 10 am, 5-6 hours or as long as you are enjoying yourselves

You should bring - Sunblock, a hat or a cap, slippers and a swimming costume, your camera

<u>Includes</u> - A cruise aboard a local boat, your guide, picnic lunch, mineral water

<u>Limitations</u> - The tour can be taken all year round except in heavy rain

Some degree of fitness is necessary for enjoying this trip to the full.

Away from the tranquillity of Canvas & Orchids Retreat, the thunder of the majestic Tatai Falls reveals the river's true power as it drops six meters to the rocks below.


Depending on the tide, you leave at 10 am for a 45-minute ride to the falls.

Turning onto a tributary, you head into the heart of the Cardamom jungle, to the far-off sounds of exotic birds and secretive wildlife.

Within minutes you are at the journey's end, gazing down into the turbulent waters of the falls.

Soon it is time for lunch, a few moments of hydro-massage and a refreshing drink as you find shade for a picnic and open your senses to the sights and sounds of the jungle. We will also arrange to transport kayaks for your added fun and adventure.

After leaving the falls, we stop at the mouth of a small river where you can paddle your kayak to a traditional Cambodian farm; you will see rice fields and fruit trees depending on the season.





# Time Travel

## Lost in the mangrove

Another highlight of the area, we visit <u>the Mangrove Forest by boat</u> every second day as a regular tour. In addition, you can ask for a private trip for your party if you are four people or more (subject to boat and guide availability).



<u>How long</u> - Departure at 10 am, 6-7 hours or as long as you are enjoying yourselves

You should bring - Sunblock, a hat or a cap, slippers and a swimming costume, your camera

<u>Includes</u> - A cruise aboard a local boat, your guide, lunch, mineral water <u>Limitations</u> - The tour can be taken all year round except in heavy rain



## Prepare yourself for a full day of new experiences!

Leaving around 10 am, depending on the tide, you will cruise towards the coast, deep into the mangroves, to experience the calmness and natural beauty of this watery paradise.

Colourful birds might also be just flying over the mangroves as you navigate.

Depending on the season, your local guide may suggest some quiet "beach time" on a sand barge that surfaces upon the low tide, close to the mangrove forests.

We will serve food & drinks en route as you glide down the waterway.

You could also visit our small village of Koh Andet, located next to the Resort, where you will see our pagoda and the small school we actively support.

Heading back to Canvas & Orchids, you can ride on the boat or you can choose to paddle back on your kayaks!

# Paradise Regained - Sunset Cruise

The Sunset Cruise is our regular, daily tour, where all the guests can join. In addition, you can ask for a private trip for your party if you are four people or more (subject to boat and guide availability).



How long - Departure is at 4:30 pm, 2-3 hours or as long as you are enjoying yourselves

You should bring - Your camera Includes - A cruise aboard a local boat, your guide <u>Limitations</u> - The tour can be taken all year round except in heavy rain

<u>You should bring</u> - Your camera <u>Limitations</u> - The tour can be performed all year round except in heavy rain

Formerly a refuge from the Khmer Rouge, Koh Andet (Floating Island) is the place where we built Canvas and Orchids Retreat. Today it is a peaceful home

to a dozen farming families.

While you might be tempted to be cocooned in the comfort of your tent, we strongly encourage you to share the lives of our neighbours. You can take a walk on the trail we have prepared for you. This informal but deep experience will surely make your stay memorable.

Meeting people from different cultures is one of the best reasons to step outside your tent – the stuff of lifelong memories.

TO BE PART OF THE CONSERVATION EFFORTS in this amazing place called Tatai Wildlife Sanctuary in The Cardamom Mountains.

We invite you to join us on this meaningful adventure, where every evening, our team shares the excitement of discovering the captivating photos and videos captured by our camera traps, bringing the vibrant life of the rainforest to light.



Trekking through these beautiful rainforests is the highlight of our day, a thrilling journey into the heart of nature that we eagerly anticipate.

As we weave through the lush foliage, the air thick with the scent of damp earth and the sounds of the jungle alive around us, we meticulously check the camera traps we've installed in collaboration with Kla Trey researchers and the Ministry of Environment.

These traps, placed throughout the forest, offer us a rare glimpse into the secret lives of the wildlife that call this vibrant ecosystem home, making every trek a unique and unforgettable experience.

A few of the important data captured by our camera traps include



Feel free to ask us any time of the year if the treks are available. Even during the rainy season, there are still many days when the adventure is possible, and the rain adds a unique charm to the experience, transforming the rainforest into a vibrant, living tapestry.

Embark on our JUNGLE RECLAIMED or JUNGLE CHALLENGE treks and know that USD 15 from each trek goes directly to the fund to purchase more camera traps. These traps are crucial for our ongoing efforts to explore and protect the rich biodiversity of the rainforest.



# Rainforest Symphony - Dawn Jungle Trek

You can do the Dawn Jungle Trek together with your partner on any day of your stay in the dry season.




How long - Departure is at 7 am, 2-3 hours or as long as you are enjoying yourselves

You should bring - Hiking boots, sunblock, a hat or a cap Includes - Guide, coffee, mineral water4 <u>Limitations</u> - Minimum of two people, in the dry season, from November to April

It is your time to shine if you are a bird watcher or early riser!

Enjoy firsthand the sights and sounds of the jungle as you venture forth into the undergrowth with your camera and experience the beauty of one of the world's largest rainforests.

This trek offers a taste of the real jungle, an opportunity to observe small wildlife and the bonus of a morning exercise.







small channel right in front of Canvas & Orchids Retreat. The climb starts shortly after on a fairly steep path for about an hour. There is a short break in a clearing near the top, and you will return just in time for your breakfast.

There are snakes, scorpions and spiders on the trek; some are poisonous. However, animals are shy and avoid human contact. Respect for nature and a live and let live policy are adopted.

## Jungle Reclaimed





You can choose this <u>Jungle Hike</u> during the dry season (Nov to May) if you have a good fitness level.



<u>How long</u> - 4 to 5 hours or as long as you are enjoying yourselves; 3-4 hours of hiking

<u>You should bring</u> - Hiking boots, sunblock, a swimming costume, a hat or a cap, natural mosquito repellant

<u>Includes</u> - Your guide, picnic lunch

<u>Limitations</u> - <u>You should NOT take this tour</u> if you have known severe allergic reactions to insect bites, wasp, or bee bites.

<u>Prepare for a special day - you are on for a deep-jungle discovery.</u>

At 6.30 am, your guide will take you on a soft but challenging discovery, starting with a kayak ride to the small channel across the Resort.

Your hiking starts at a small waterfall. You can be sure that your guide will notify you at the slightest sign of wildlife trace or presence.

After a two-hour hike, you would stop by the stream to rest and have breakfast.

This waterway is where we could spot several nocturnal animals, and occasionally, we can be lucky to spot some wildlife hunting for their food in broad daylight - the Asiatic Wolf or Dhole, the Clouded Leopard or the Sun Bear.

In the '70s, after the Khmer Rouge regime, this part of The Cardamom Rainforest (Phnom Kravanh) was severely deforested and its wildlife heavily poached. For 25 years, with the rigorous efforts of committed non-government organizations (NGOs), such as Wildlife Alliance, who tirelessly worked side by side with the government body, these forests have been allowed to regrow.

Your local guide hails from a family that used to hurt these forests, and now, they find livelihood and enjoyment in protecting it. Enjoy the hike!



# Jungle Challenge

## – Deeper in The Cardamoms

This <u>full-day JUNGLE trek</u> is offered during the dry season but could be possible during the monsoon if not too much rain has fallen.

This 10-hour trek requires some hiking and trekking experience and a good level of fitness.



<u>How long</u> - 8-11 hours for the whole trip; 6-8 hours of trekking <u>Includes</u> - 15-20minutes of kayaking to the entry to the forest (and back) with a local guide, water, sodas and packed lunch.

<u>You should bring</u> - Hiking boots, sunblock, a swimming costume, a hat or a cap, natural mosquito repellant

<u>Limitations</u> - The tour can be taken in the dry season, from November to April, although sometimes, the weather allows us to do so even in the rainy season. You should not do this trek <u>if you have known severe allergic reactions</u> to insect bites or wasp and bee bites





After an early hearty breakfast, at 8 am, we start our adventure by kayaking through the small channel that leads to the entry point where our trek begins.




## It's a jungle in there!

Wild orchids, mushrooms and wild vanilla, you might see them all on the trail. You might even see and hear gibbons calling!

It is hot and humid inside these tropical rainforests, so we stop to rest, swim and have lunch.

You'll help us look out for animal traps that we will dismantle. We'll report the trap locations on our arrival back to the hotel. Wildlife Alliance's ranger station is located not too far from us.



On the way, we'll check our camera traps, see their condition, change the battery and replace the SD cards.

We are back at Canvas sometime between 4 and 7 pm. We'll watch together the camera-trap pictures before dinner.

## Kla Trey Expedition - Follow the trail of the Fishing Cat



The fishing cat (Kla Trey in Khmer) is a rare, water-loving wildcat, weighing 10-15 kg and perfectly adapted to wetlands. Once roaming Cambodia's lush wetlands, these nocturnal felines are now nearing extinction.

Being nocturnal, the best way to study them is by using motion-triggered camera traps taking photos and videos of wildlife as it passes by.



Join the Kla Trey | Cambodian Fishing Cat Project researchers on the waterways of Peam Krasop Wildlife Sanctuary. Kayak deep inside the flooded forest, wade across narrow channels and climb mangrove roots to reach dry land where cameras capture the secret life of fishing cats.



You should bring: sunblock, mosquito repellent, a hat or a cap, sandals or aqua shoes (you will get wet and muddy when we explore the mangroves!) How long: departure at 8 am, this is a day-long activity

Includes: a team of wildlife expert guides, local guides, lunch Limitations: up to 6 people per expedition, subject to the

availability of the Kla Trey team

Track and explore remote areas to find new camera sites and spot rare wildlife. Every expedition is unique, guided by the latest Project findings.

You'll team up with biodiversity researchers from the Kla Trey Project. Learn about mangrove ecosystems, native wildlife, and conservation efforts.

## Kla Trey Expedition



### Saving Cambodia's Fishing Cats

In 2016, the Kla Trey | Cambodian Fishing Cat Project was born to preserve this fascinating wildcat and its unique mangrove habitat.

The Project was founded by international researchers and graduates from the Masters in Biodiversity Conservation Programme at the Royal University of Phnom Penh and currently works in several locations around Cambodia.

### Will I see a Fishing Cat?

Fishing cats are nocturnal and elusive, so sightings are rare. However, one researcher spotted one in daylight, so stay alert for the mysterious "fishing tiger"!

### An Otter encounter?

The mangroves are home to rare species, including playful smooth-coated otters. Our camera traps reveal their favourite spots. We'll visit grooming sites and kayak along their fishing channels to try and spot them.

If we're lucky, we'll follow them quietly to avoid disruption. Along the way, you'll explore diverse habitats like dense mangrove forests, freshwater lagoons, abandoned shrimp ponds, and Melaleuca forests.

## Fishing Cats on camera

Back at Canvas & Orchids Retreat, enjoy an exclusive showcase of the photos and videos you helped retrieve.

Discover the intimate lives of wildlife in the Sanctuary: otters rolling and "dancing," civets marking territories, macaque monkeys searching for food, leopard cats on the prowl, and hopefully, new records of fishing cats!

This rare feline is nearing extinction in Southeast Asia, but you can help by joining the Kla Trey expedition!



# Biking & Sunset - The Cardamoms on two wheels

A good level of fitness is required.



<u>Must wear</u> - Sports shoes, long comfortable pants and long sleeves, a hat or a cap and sunglasses

<u>Must bring</u> - A refillable bottle for water and a small back pack <u>Included</u> - Drinking water & some fruits on the bicycle ride 2 soft drinks or beer or fresh juices and canapes on sunset



Whether you are a beginner or an experienced cyclist, prepare to witness the beautiful trail this 15-kilometer bicycle ride has to offer.

It starts as a wide trail - a road left behind by a Malaysian logging company some 25 years ago. Then it gets narrower as we enter the jungle, on the only path used by the villagers to harvest wild fruits.

You're leaving Canvas & Orchids on a local community boat @ 2 pm, to head back to mainland Tatai to take a 10-minute car ride to get to the entrance of the bicycle trail. Cycling starts here, from the top of the hill.

Crossing one or a few streams, depending on the season, you might be lucky to encounter some wildlife!

A short stop midway to rest and drink...

# Biking & Sunset



The 13th kilometre takes you to a very narrow path, with dense vegetation. You'll love the scent of the forests here!

At the end, you would arrive on the side of a mountain, with a view of the sea and mangroves!

Spend some time here to take in the beautiful view and sunset. Around 6 pm, we head back to Canvas on a local community boat.

After an hour (or so) of lazy boat ride, we arrive at Canvas and get ready for cocktails & well-deserved dinner!
