

It is with great joy and thanks to Almighty God that I greet you on the start of this new Ecclesiastical year. This special period of the Church life comes at the end of the summer and the beginning of a new school year. Many of us have had time to spend time away with our families and time to rest, renew, and strengthen ourselves to begin once again our regular yearly program. As the Holy Scriptures write, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every activity under heaven" (Ecclesiastes 3:1). Our Holy Church is ordered in such a way as to be accessible to us in the world. She wants to be incorporated into our life so we can be incorporated into her's.

My beloved parishioners, we are the Church of the incarnation. This means that we believe that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and born in the flesh through the most Holy Lady the Theotokos, the Mother of God. The New Church year guides us through this Fall season with two major feasts of the Theotokos – her nativity on September 8 and her entrance into the temple on November 21. We are guided from the start of the new Church year towards the realization of Christ's incarnation through the power of the Holy Spirit and the willingness of His most blessed Mother. As the Archangel confessed, "And He will be named Emmanuel which means God is with us" (Matthew 1:23).

You might ask, "Father, isn't it a little too early to be talking about Christmas?" My answer would be no! Christmas, the Lord's coming into the world, is much more than a date on a calendar. Christmas is a way of life for Orthodox Christians. It is the revelation of His willingness to be accessible to us all. Christ is with us everyday, in every circumstance and in every facet of life's reality.

In our fast paced world, full of distractions and excessive pleasures, we should really begin the start of our new year with prayerful pause and sincere reflection. We should ask, "Am I allowing Christ into my life?" Do I start my day with prayerful remembrance of His presence in the world and His desire to help me in my daily struggle? Our Lord came into this world for each of us personally, and He truly wants us to accept His loving embrace no matter where we might find ourselves. As we begin this new Ecclesiastical Church Year together with all of the hustle and bustle of our responsibilities, let's make room for the Lord to share in our burden. Let's open the door more and more to His presence in our lives, the lives of our children, our homes, our places of work, and our relationships. I humbly offer these very practical ways to enriching our relationship with God in our daily lives:

# FR. ARISTIDIS GARINIS

**FAMILY WORSHIP** First and foremost, make time to worship weekly on Sunday's and the various feast days of the Church.

**PRAYER** Pray as a family at home, even for a few minutes. This can be done in the morning, on the way to work, before meals and in the evening. Prayer is not a last resort but our first resort!



**HOLY SCRIPTURE** Build a habit of reading from the Holy Bible a few minutes a day. You can begin from the New Testament. This is about quality and not quantity. Read until you absorb a lesson and try to meditate on it and apply it in your daily life.

**HOLY CONFESSION** There is nothing to fear here. There is no judgment but only God's desire to lift us up and make us new. As we read in the 50th Psalm, "God will not despise a humble and contrite heart." Building a relationship with a spiritual father can greatly help you and your family.

**FASTING** You can participate in the fasts of the Church not only by abstaining from foods but also from the things that we are addicted to most—like our phones. Be mindful of screen time, especially for the youth. Parents, don't rush to get your child a phone. Consider having one space in the home for TV and screens. This practice of self control and restrain ties into the Church's age old practice of fasting. The Lord will help us in our efforts!

As pastor of this dynamic community and parish, I urge us to encourage one another in a spirit of Christian agape. Christ is with us all! Let's continue to make efforts to open the doors of our heart's and soul's to His ever abiding presence. On behalf of Fr. Alexandros and the entire Parish council, I wish you all a blessed new Ecclesiastical Church Year.

Αγαπημένη μου Οικογένεια του Αγίου Νικολάου,

Με μεγάλη χαρά και ευχαριστίες στον Ύψιστο Θεό σας απευθύνω το χαιρετισμό μου στην αρχή του νέου Εκκλησιαστικού έτους. Αυτή η ξεχωριστή περίοδος της ζωής της Εκκλησίας έρχεται στο τέλος του καλοκαιριού και στην αρχή του νέου σχολικού έτους. Πολλοί από μας είχαμε την ευκαιρία να περάσουμε χρόνο με τις οικογένειές μας, να ξεκουραστούμε, να ανανεωθούμε και να ανακτήσουμε τις δυνάμεις μας, ώστε να αρχίσουμε ξανά το κανονικό μας ετήσιο πρόγραμμα. Όπως αναφέρεται στην Αγία Γραφή «Για όλα πάνω στη γη υπάρχει ο κατάλληλος χρόνος και ο συγκεκριμένος καιρός για κάθε δραστηριότητα. (Εκκλησιαστής 3:1). Η Αγία μας Εκκλησία είναι διατεταγμένη με τέτοιο τρόπο, ώστε να είναι προσιτή στον καθένα μας σε όλο τον κόσμο. Επιθυμεί να ενσωματώνεται στη ζωή μας, ώστε και εμείς να ενσωματωνόμαστε στη δική της ζωή.

Αγαπητοί μου ενορίτες, είμαστε η Εκκλησία της ενσαρκώσεως. Αυτό σημαίνει ότι πιστεύομε ότι ο Κύριός μας και Σωτήρ Ιησούς Χριστός ενσαρκώθηκε από το Άγιο Πνεύμα και κατά σάρκα γεννήθηκε από την Υπεραγία Θεοτόκο, τη Μητέρα του Θεού. Το Νέο Εκκλησιαστικό έτος μας οδηγεί στην Φθινοπωρινή περίοδο με δύο μεγάλες εορτές της Θεοτόκου- την Γέννησή της στις 8 Σεπτεμβρίου και τα Εισόδιά της στο ναό την 21η Νοεμβρίου-. Από την αρχή του νέου Εκκλησιαστικού έτους καθοδηγούμεθα προς τη διαπίστωση ότι ο Χριστός ενσαρκώθηκε δια της δυνάμεως του Αγίου Πνεύματος και με την προθυμία της Υπερευλογημένης Μητέρας Του. Όπως ο Αρχάγγελος ομολογεί, «Και καλέσουσιν το όνομα αυτού Εμμανουήλ , ό εστί μεθερμηνευόμενο Μεθ΄ ημών ο Θεός. (Κατά Ματθαίον 1:23).

Τσως να ρωτήσετε, «Πάτερ, δεν είναι κάπως πολύ νωρίς να μιλούμε για τα Χριστούγεννα;» Η απάντησή μου με έμφαση θα ήταν όχι! Τα Χριστούγεννα, ο ερχομός του Κυρίου στον κόσμο είναι πολύ περισσότερο από μια ημερομηνία στο ημερολόγιο. Τα Χριστούγεννα είναι τρόπος ζωής για τους Ορθοδόξους Χριστιανούς. Ο Χριστός είναι μαζί μας κάθε μέρα, σε κάθε περίπτωση, σε κάθε απογοήτευση και σε κάθε πτυχή της πραγματικότητας της ζωής μας.

Στον κόσμο μας με τους γρήγορους ρυθμούς του, στον κόσμο αυτό που είναι γεμάτος από περιττούς περισπασμούς και υπερβολικές απολαύσεις, πραγματικά θα πρέπει να ξεκινήσουμε το νέο μας έτος με προσευχητική παύση και ειλικρινή συλλογισμό και να αναρωτηθούμε

Διαβάζουμε στον 50ο Ψαλμό, «Ο Θεός δεν θα καταφρονήσει την ταπεινή και μεταμελημένη καρδιά.» Χτίζοντας μια σχέση με τον πνευματικό σας πατέρα θα βοηθήσει πάρα πολύ και εσάς και την οικογένειά σας.

ΝΗΣΤΕΙΑ Μια συμβουλή, ιδιαίτερα στους γονείς, για τους νέους :Γονείς, να είστε πιο προσεκτικοί στο θέμα του χρόνου που δαπανούν οι νέοι μπροστά στην οθόνη τους. Μη βιασθείτε να τους αγοράσετε τηλέφωνα και καλόν θα είναι να έχετε ένα συγκεκριμένο χώρο στο σπίτι για πρόσβαση στην τηλεόραση και τους ηλεκτρονικούς

υπολογιστές. Αυτή η πρακτική αυτοελέγχου και συγκράτησης συνδέεται με την παλαιά τακτική νηστείας της Εκκλησίας. Μπορούμε να συμμετέχουμε στις νηστείες της Εκκλησίας όχι μόνο απέχοντας από φαγητά αλλά πιο πολύ από πράγματα στα οποία είμαστε εθισμένοι. Ο Κύριος θα μας βοηθήσει στις προσπάθειές μας.

Ως Ιερατικώς Προιστάμενος αυτής της δυναμικής κοινότητας και ενορίας, σας παροτρύνω να ενθαρρύνετε ο ένας τον άλλο στο πνεύμα της Χριστιανικής αγάπης. Ο Χριστός είναι με όλους μας! # FR. ALEXANDROS DOUVRES



f we look around our churches and our homes, we will see the cross in countless wplaces. As clergy, even our vestments are adorned with this holy symbol. Every time we pray—before, during, and after—we seal ourselves with the sign of the cross. And for most of us, if not all of us, this precious symbol rests close to our hearts. But have we ever truly stopped to ask ourselves: What is the meaning of the Cross?

# THE CROSS MISUNDERSTOOD

So often, the things most constant in our lives are the things we take for granted. A child, for example, may not immediately recognize the depth of a parent's love, only realizing it later in life when the sacrifices become clear. In much the same way, we can overlook the love of God, even though it surrounds us

in every moment. And the greatest sign of that love is the Cross.

In the time of Christ, however, the cross was not a sign of holiness or comfort. It was a sign of terror and death. Large wooden crosses stood outside city gates as instruments of public shame, serving as grim warnings to all who entered: "This will be your fate if you break our laws." The cross was a reminder of punishment, meant to instill fear. And yet, today, we venerate

it as a symbol of life, of victory, of hope. What could possibly cause such a radical transformation in meaning?

THE CROSS TRANSFORMED

The answer lies in the act of Christ Himself. Out of His immeasurable love for humanity, He willingly embraced the cross. No one forced Him. Nothing compelled Him. As the Scriptures remind us: "... rather when He delivered Himself up for the life of the world...μᾶλλον δὲ ἑαυτὸν παρεδίδου ύπερ τῆς τοῦ κόσμου ζωῆς ..."

Through this ultimate act of self-emptying love, Christ transformed the cross of death into the Tree of Life.

He defeated the power of sin, shattered the gates of Hades, and opened for us the path to salvation. The very image that once stood for hopelessness now shines as a sign of victory.

# The Triumph of the CROSS

The feast and remembrance of the Cross remind us of this powerful truth: the victory of Good over evil, of Light over darkness. Yet in our world today, and even in our own beloved country, darkness often seems to surround us. The temptation to despair is strong. We

> communities, division in our society, and endless voices of anger rising on our screens. Sometimes, it feels easier to return hate for hate, to surrender to bitterness, or to lose hope entirely.

> But as Orthodox Christians, we know another way. The only way to overcome darkness is to keep our eyes fixed on Christ, to make Him the very center of our lives. For He Himself is "the Light that shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:5).

This does not mean we

remain passive or silent when confronted with evil. Rather, it means we respond not with the weapons of the world, but with the love of the Gospel. It means every word we speak, every action we take, every choice we make reflects Christ crucified and risen.

## OUR CALLING AS WITNESSES

Christ has already accomplished the victory. The Resurrection has happened. Death and evil have been conquered once and for all. It does not fall to us to win a battle that has already been won. Our calling is to make His victory known, to ensure that as many people as possible come to encounter His immeasurable love.

And so the responsibility of the cross becomes personal: each of us is called to be the light of Christ in our communities, to bear witness to His crucifixion and resurrection through our lives.

May we never take for granted this holy symbol, but always see in it the measureless love of God. And may we each courageously ask ourselves today:

In what way am I called, right now, to reflect the light of the Cross in my own life?

## A CLOSER LOOK

The icon of the Feast of the Precious Cross tells the story of the finding of the Cross and of its Exaltation. Patriarch Macarius is standing in the pulpit elevating the Cross for all to see and venerate. On each side of the Patriarch are deacons holding candles. The elevated Cross is surrounded and venerated by many clergy and lay people, including Saint Helen, the mother of Emperor Constantine.

In the background of the icon is a domed structure that represents the Church of the Resurrection in Jerusalem. This church was one of the churches constructed and dedicated by Emperor Constantine on the holy sites of Jerusalem.

# Agia Skepi: A Sisterhood of Hope and Growth

For over three decades, the Agia Skepi fellowship at St. Nicholas has been a beacon of support, friendship, and positive outlook for women in our community. What began as a small gathering of widowed friends seeking solace and shared understanding has blossomed into a thriving organization, officially recognized by our church.

The name, Agia Skepi, meaning "Holy Protection," was thoughtfully chosen by Father Paul Palesty 33 years ago when this unique group was formed. Prior to becoming a formal organization within St. Nicholas, the ladies met informally. often at the home of Maria Papougenis, a driving force behind the organization. This humble beginning, where a few widowed

friends shared coffee and conversation, laid the groundwork for the supportive fellowship it is today. As news of their supportive little group spread, more and more women

more women expressed interest. Recognizing their ability to help others, they decided to formalize their fellowship through the church, leading to Father Paul's selection of Agia Skepi as their official name.

Agia Skepi is a fellowship exclusively for ladies. With over 25 members, the group typically meets once a month at the church, though they occasionally enjoy their fellowship at Mythos restaurant. Members contribute \$5 a month for food from Mythos and a yearly membership fee of \$10.

Maria Papougenis emphasizes that Agia Skepi extends "an understanding hand of welcome to the newly, long-time widowed or divorced who may wish to join us." While the shared experience



background, the pain of loss through widowhood or divorce is unique to everyone. Agia Skepi offers a space where members hope to provide the same help and comfort, they themselves have received. The ladies of Agia Skepi are always eager to welcome new members, meet new friends, and share ideas to make their fellowship even more enjoyable and enriching.
