



WE STAND IN SOLIDARITY with the Black


Orchestral Network and proudly join a community of Black musicians from more than 40 orchestras to call for equitable change and decisive action against racial injustice in the industry.

Caleb: Late night. When it's just me and my thoughts.


CR8: What motivates you to create?

BLACK VISIONARIES GRANT

The 2022 #BlackVisionaries program will provide \$650,000 in grants to Black artists, Black designers, and Black small businesses. Ten creators will receive grants during this round. This includes five Visionary Small Business Grants of \$100,000 for Black designers. The program will also award five Emerging Visionary Grants of \$30,000 for Black arts and design businesses creating experimental work. The program is only currently open to businesses based in the U.S.



MANZANAR DIVERTED VIDEO

Featuring breathtaking photography and immersive soundscapes, the film recounts more than 150 years of history, showing how this distant valley is inextricably tied to the city of Los Angeles. It reveals the forced removals of two peoples--the Nüümü (Paiute) and the Newe (Shoshone) who were marched out of the Valley in the 1860s by the US Army and the Japanese Americans who were brought here from their West Coast homes and incarcerated in a World War II concentration camp. Water lured outsiders in and continues to fuel the greed which has sucked this once lush place dry.




