These bordering properties are perched on the edge of a cliff overlooking the oldest indigenous forest in South Africa, everything here is about nature. One look at the almost unbelievable postcard view of the 3 Hogsback Mountains, with the ancient Auckland Nature Reserve (the oldest forest in South Africa) and even a waterfall all from our very own viewpoint is enough to convince you that you are in JRR Tolkien's Rivendell.

Hiking trails start at the bottom of our garden at the viewpoint / bath on the cliff, straight into the Auckland Nature





Having been the manager and caretaker @48 Main Road for just over a decade, I am excited to announce the opening of the venue @48.

The best way to describe @48 I feel is if one had to imagine Tom Sawyer & Huckleberry Finn (for us old folks familiar with these characters) being given permission to utilize a piece of land for all of their bushcraft and adventure games.

Having a young son on the mountain myself, it has become clear that a space is needed for the gathering of games and activities for both young and old.

A space where beings can connect with each other and themselves in the sober setting.

The first step is to open @48 as a picnic and game area and take it from there.

Some may remember that in 2020 before the global event, that I had some games and stalls @48 on Sundays. There was a great response from the Bold Point (BP) village and with our 'Tasks for rewards' system, all who participated could enjoy food, games & refreshments.

The rules were simple, Positive, Patient, Polite.

With my limited (near non-existent) budget, I have been able to employ one BP resident to help me clear the area and create picnic areas and trails for ambling or bicycles (depending on the energy).

We have been able to host a few soccer gatherings with the young BP children about my son's age which have been amazing.

The plan is to be able to offer enrichment programs (trades & skills) for locals (&visitors), the possibilities are endless but the beginning steps have been taken toward an NPO, so we shall follow our footfall and see what is beyond the rise.

These are our plans for the future but for now we have the space at our disposal for the enrichment of all who would get involved.

In closing, @ 48 main will be opening as a picnic area with a spectacular view of Gaaika's Kop (and one of the first places to get snow after Gaaika) with activities to be announced.

ENVIRONMENTAL & WEATHER

STAYING POSITIVE IN THE GARDEN.

Tips from Thrive.

1: LOVE COMPOST and ferment your 'weeds' Hate weeding? Aaah, that's because you are not seeing their potential.

I see some parts of my garden that is in need of food and so I go and COLLECT COMPOSTING MATERIAL (not weeding, collecting). I either make a tea, (fermented weeds in water for around 3 weeks), to spray as a foliar feed, or add them to my compost pile. Either way, I have changed the outlook of WEEDING into a much more satisfying task.

2: BUGS?

Collecting some of those annoying worms eating your garden, can end up in a pest deterring spray.

Most worms have a bacteria in their gut called "Bacillus Thuringiensis", that if multiplied by mashing up those forms and fermenting them with a bit of sugar or preferably molasses in water, produces a fantastic bug spray for your plants.

3: KEEP IT REAL.

Sometimes looking at a large potential space for a garden can be daunting and thus procrastination usually wins.

Set a daily plan, look at a 1m2 area and fully ready that area for planting, doing whatever is needed. Collecting composting material, composting, bordering, raising, etc. Once that is fully done, then move on 1m2 at a time.
