We take pride in offering cutting edge facilities in a truly exceptional learning environment, on modern campuses that match our national reputation for excellence. This is why we've invested over £150 million across the Newcastle and Stafford Colleges Group (NSCG) campuses since 2010.

Most recently, we've welcomed the completion of an £8 million two-storey, purpose built Technical Excellence Centre, which was driven by increased demand for places on T Level courses.

Providing both T Level and Sports learners with an innovative and flexible learning environment reflective of modern workplaces, the Centre contains highly specified technology used in architecture, engineering and construction along with a brand new 4-court sports hall.

In addition to the new indoor sports facilities, an impressive Sport England 3G pitch has been installed outside, which includes LED floodlights, perimeter fencing and spectator areas.

The facilities are used to accommodate a number of sports, and will be used primarily by the NSCG Academy of Sport and Andy Griffin Football Academy learners.

The campus also benefitted from an investment of £1.75 million over the summer of 2024, in preparation to welcome a record-breaking number of students through our doors. Other developments included investment in new classroom technology, auditorium renovations, a revamp of our student lounge, landscaping, carpet replacement and air conditioning upgrades.

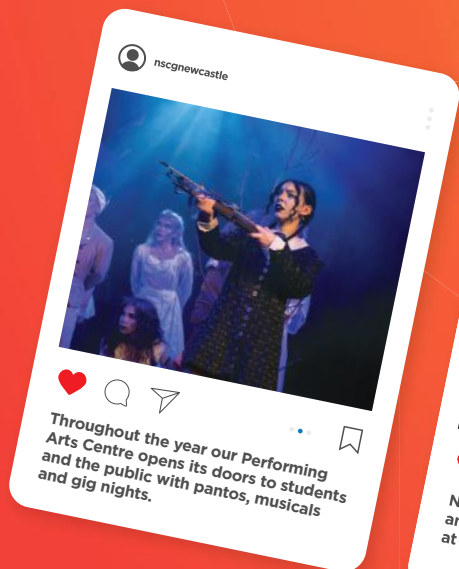
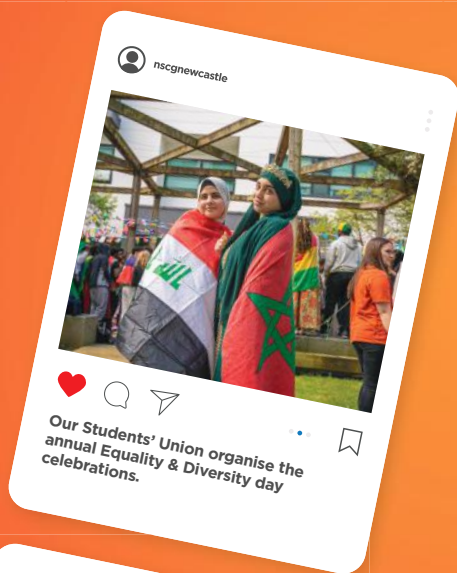

A Level 4-5 apprenticeship is equivalent to a university-level programme, such as a foundation degree or HNC/D and is an industry recognised qualification.

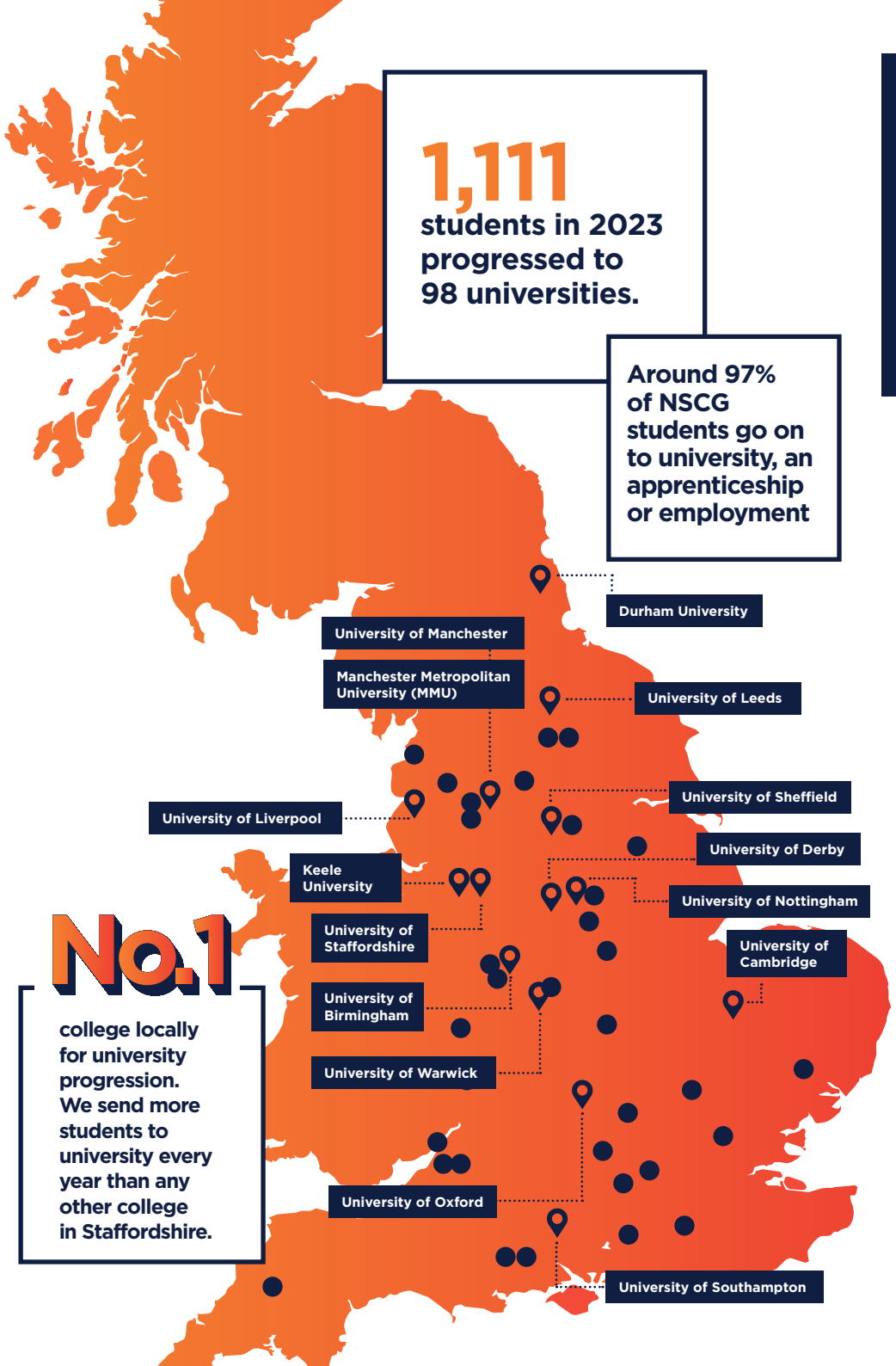

The path you start out on will depend on where you're heading.

At NSCG, we have all kinds of ways to get you there, from A Levels and A+ programmes, to T Levels, Vocational courses and Progression Pathways. The Department for Education (DfE) is currently reviewing post-16 qualifications at Level 3 and below. This review is expected to conclude by the end of 2024, the results of which may impact our course offering for September 2025.

A Level & A+ Programmes

Sixth Form Academic Route (Level 3)

Quick overview:

Typically, students choose to study three A Level subjects over two years. However, you can choose to study two A Level subjects and one A+ Programme (BTEC Extended Certificate - equivalent to one A Level) over two years.

To study, you will need:

A minimum of five GCSEs at grade 5 or above including maths and English Language in subjects relevant to your chosen course.*

What you can do next:

You can progress to university, a university level course here at NSCG, a higher apprenticeship at NSCG or to employment.

In 2024, 61% of entries achieved high grades A*- B.

T Levels

Sixth Form T Level Route (Level 3)

Quick overview:

T Levels are an industry recognised two-year course that is an alternative to A Levels and vocational programmes. They bring classroom learning and an extended industry placement (at least 45 days) together on a course designed with businesses and employers.

To study, you will need:

Typically, a minimum of five GCSEs at grade 5 or above, including maths and English Language, in subjects relevant to your chosen course.*

What you can do next:

You can progress to university, a university level course here at NSCG, an apprenticeship at NSCG or to employment.

In 2024, 88% of T Level students achieved merit grades or above.

Vocational Programmes

Sixth Form Vocational Route (Level 3)

Quick overview:

Choose from a wide-range of courses which you will study for two years.

To study, you will need:

A minimum of four or more high grades at GCSE in subjects relevant to the course you'd like to study, including maths and/or English Language at grade 4 or above.

What you can do next:

You can progress to university, a university level course here at NSCG, an apprenticeship at NSCG or to employment.

In 2024, 47.9% of Level 3 vocational programme students achieved high grades of DDD or above (equivalent to three 'A' grades at A Level).

Apprenticeships

Available at Levels 2 to 5

Quick overview:

Apprenticeships are great if you want to jump straight into the world of work, earn a wage and pick up technical and practical skills while you study for a nationally recognised qualification.

To study, you will need:

Two or more GCSEs at grade 4 or above in subjects relevant to your course. However, in some sectors, employers ask for a minimum of grade 4/5 in maths and English.

What you can do next:

You can progress to a higher level apprenticeship, full-time course at NSCG or full-time employment.

Our apprenticeship achievement rates are more than 15% above the national average.

Progression & Skills Pathways

Level 2, Level 1 & Entry Level

Quick overview:

If you're not quite ready to join a Level 3 programme, our vocational Progression Pathways allow you to study at Entry Level, Level 1 or Level 2 and will prepare you to progress onto a higher level.

Alternatively, if you want skills based training in areas such as hairdressing, beauty and construction, you'll start your journey on a Level 1 Skills Pathway, before progressing to higher levels.

GCSE Maths & English

If you haven't yet achieved grades 9-4 in these important subjects, maths and/or English sessions will be on your timetable and you'll retake qualifications alongside your main course.

Find your pathway

A Levels & A+ Programme

If you are an academic learner and want to progress to university or a higher apprenticeship, our two-year A Level or A+ Programmes could be a great option for you.

Most students study three subjects. But if you have a track record of high achievement, you might decide to study four A Level subjects, or take an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) as your fourth subject. You must be comfortable studying for, and taking, external exams because that's how most A Level subjects are assessed at the end of the two years.

An A+ Programme lets you combine A Level subjects with a BTEC Extended Certificate for a better balance of exams and coursework.

T Level Courses.

T Levels are a two-year qualification that you can study as an alternative to A Levels or vocational programmes and on completion, you'll receive an industry recognised qualification that is equivalent to three A Levels.

T Levels bring classroom learning and an extended industry placement together on a course designed with businesses.

Each T Level includes a minimum of 45 days in-depth industry placement over the duration of the course*. Students get valuable experience in the workplace and employers get early sight of the new talent in their industry.

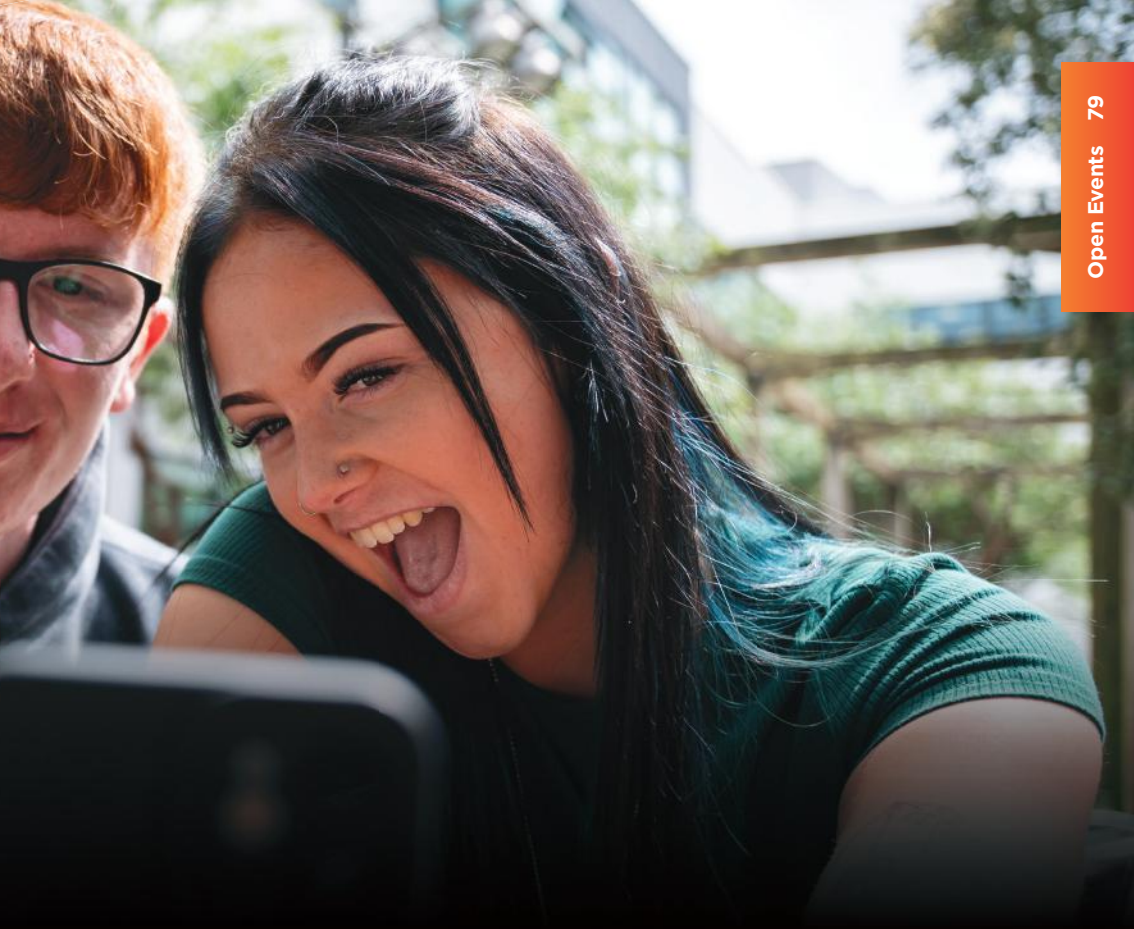
