Directed by Gabriela Cowperthwaite, *The Grab* exposes the hidden global race for control over food and water resources by governments, investors, and mercenaries, threatening entire populations. Through gripping investigative journalism by Nathan Halverson and his team at The Center for Investigative Reporting, and compelling storytelling, the film reveals how this silent power shift—shaping the future of world dominance—is already fueling global crises and geopolitical conflict. 1 hr 42 min

Gabriela Cowperthwaite, Director, The Grab

Gabriela Cowperthwaite is an award-winning filmmaker and documentarian known for creating thought-provoking films that inspire dialogue on critical social and environmental issues. She gained international recognition with her groundbreaking documentary *Blackfish* (2013), which exposed the controversial practices of marine mammal

captivity at SeaWorld. The film sparked a global conversation about animal welfare and led to significant changes in the entertainment and theme park industries. Gabriela's ability to blend investigative journalism with emotional storytelling has made her a respected voice in documentary filmmaking.

In addition to *Blackfish*, Gabriela has directed and produced a range of impactful projects, including the feature film *Megan Leavey* (2017), a compelling true story of a young Marine and her bond with a military working dog. Her work demonstrates her commitment to highlighting the human condition, environmental sustainability, and animal rights. With a background in political science and filmmaking, Gabriela continues to push boundaries, bringing untold stories to the forefront of public consciousness.



Moderator: Peter Drekmeier, Policy Director for the Tuolumne River Trust

Peter serves as Policy Director for the Tuolumne River Trust, where he oversees campaigns aimed at protecting and restoring the source of our Hetch Hetchy water. After graduating from UC Berkeley, Peter returned to his hometown of Palo Alto to work on the international Earth Day 1990 campaign. He co-founded Bay Area Action (now Acterra), helped

coordinate the Devil's Slide Tunnel campaign, and served as Mayor of Palo Alto.



Nathan Halverson, Producer, Investigative Reporter

Nate Halverson is a national Emmy Award-winning senior reporter and producer at The Center for Investigative Reporting in San Francisco.

Nate has reported from around the world, including Russia, Guatemala, England, Zambia, Congo, China, and Venezuela. His investigations have ranged from financial fraud and organized crime to uncovering internal

company documents from a tech company which then paid a \$155M settlement to its users.

His award-winning work has appeared on NPR's Morning Edition, All Things Considered, Fox News, CNN, Mother Jones, Newsweek, PBS NewsHour, NYT.com, MSNBC and elsewhere. He has lectured and spoken at King's College at Cambridge University, Columbia University, New York University, Georgetown University, Johns Hopkins University, University of California-Berkeley, and now here at the Beach Break Film Festival.



TC Johnstone, Director, The Power of Small

T.C. Johnstone is a multi-award-winning impact documentary film director/producer. He has produced and directed multiple features and short documentaries including the award winning film "Rising From Ashes" executive produced by Oscar winning actor Forest Whitaker. The film won 19 film festivals, received US and international distribution and was a catalyst for the creation of the Rising From Ashes Foundation which

continues to support the work of peace and reconciliation.





COUNTED OUT

In the 21st century fueled by technology, data, and algorithms, math determines who has the power to shape our world. **Counted Out** investigates the biggest crises of our time—including political polarization, racial inequity, and climate change—through an unexpected lens: mathematics. Lisa Petrides, Ph.D., ISKME CEO and Founder





Dominic Gill, Director

Dominic Gill, a British filmmaker and adventurer, is known for his compelling documentaries that explore humanity and the environment. His debut film, *Take A Seat*, earned the Special Jury Prize at the Banff Mountain Film Festival. In *Planetwalker*, Dominic brings to life the inspiring journey of John Francis, who walked the U.S. in silence to

promote environmental awareness.



Nadia Gill, Director

Nadia Gill, a filmmaker and former attorney, co-founded Encompass Films with Dominic Gill. Her work includes the award-winning Coming to My Senses and the NBC Universal series Take A Seat. In Planetwalker, Nadia brings to life the inspiring story of John Francis, who walked the U.S. in silence to promote environmental awareness.



WALK WITH ME

Walk With Me follows filmmaker David Hodge as he transitions from a car-centric American lifestyle to the walkable culture of Stockholm, Sweden, reflecting on personal memories and societal impacts of mobility. Through thoughtful conversations and poignant observations, the 55-minute film explores how walking fosters community, improves health, and reconnects us with the world around us. 56 min



David and Hi-Jin Hodge

This marks David and Hi-Jin's (Life on Wheels, 2022) second appearance at the festival. They are a husband and wife team of filmmakers and video artists, passionate about creating stories and connecting with others. They are concerned about the world and how we live in it. They look for ways in

our art that bring connection, joy, provocation, stimulation, and inspiration.

Their pieces typically blend editorial materials and innovative uses of technology to explore complex human and social questions. Some of their work is purely a visual exploration. They have shown ocean views on the side of a 40-story office building and were the first to use video iPods in an artistic installation.

Their work poses questions that probe individual hopes and resolutions. They hear the conversation of humanity striving for the comfort of permanence, all while recognizing that everything constantly changes around them.



Gerry Tierney - AIA, LEED AP BD+C

Gerry Tierney, former Associate Principal and Director Emeritus of the Mobility Lab at Perkins & Will, studies the evolution of urban mobility and its impact on the public realm. Founder of Mobility and the City's REDCAR project, Gerry collaborates with academia on addressing multiple aspects of evolving urban mobility. He has moderated panels and

presented at UC Berkeley, MIT, the University of Oregon, USF, Trinity College Dublin, as well as at the American Society of Landscape Architects, the American Planning Association and multiple Healthy City Design International conferences. He continues his studies into the impacts of TNCs, micro-mobility and autonomous vehicles on urban design, placemaking within the public realm, augmented transit, curb demand and parking.

Geeti Silwal - Principal, Cities+Sites Practice Leader

Geeti grew up in a small, hard-working, steel township in India called Durgapur. As one of four siblings, Geeti attributes her principles of 'zero waste' to her humble family upbringing. Her parents have been her greatest inspiration in life. Studying architecture at Jadavpur University in Kolkata and spending her early design years in Delhi, Geeti discovered her

intense desire to use the power of good design to positively impact a greater number of lives and enable richer daily experiences for the common person. This discovery propelled her to pursue a master's degree in Urban Design at UC Berkeley.

She believes that urban designers and planners need to be strong advocates of healthy cities. Working to develop a vision for a community's future, Geeti deems it her fundamental responsibility to put in place a framework for a regenerative, urban environment that promotes the health of the ecosystem, the people, and the economy.



Lisa Moulton - Landscape Architect and Tracker

Zurine De Miguel - Associate Professor, Research, Teaching, Data Science, Subject in the film

Zurine is a behavioral and molecular neuroscientist and associate professor of psychology at California State University, Monterey Bay (CSUMB). Her research investigates how physical activity and stress shape brain function and mental health, with a focus on preventing disease and

promoting healthy aging. She holds a PhD in Behavioral Neuroscience from a joint program between the University of the Basque Country and the University of Colorado Boulder. She completed a master's degree in Clinical Neuropsychology from the University of Barcelona and another in Data Science from the Complutense University of Madrid. She was awarded the prestigious European Marie Curie and the Ramon y Cajal Fellowships. She spent over a decade at Stanford University as a senior scientist advancing her research on the brain-behavior connection.

Her work has been published in top-tier journals like Nature and featured in The New York Times, Science Magazine, and STAT News. Beyond research, Dr. De Miguel has taught behavioral neuroscience to students predominately from underserved communities, developed initiatives to integrate Al into education, and served as an academic senator. She is fully bilingual (Spanish and English) and is dedicated to creating healthier communities by connecting neuroscience, education, and public policy. In collaboration with the Transportation Agency for Monterey County, she leads efforts to assess the cognitive and emotional benefits of active transportation programs, such as the Walking School Bus program.



A DIVINE JOURNEY - TRILOGY

A Divine Journey Trilogy follows young changemaker, Divine Mugisha, as she rises above extreme poverty to pursue her dream of studying psychology and addressing mental health challenges in disadvantaged and refugee communities. Despite personal struggles, she founded the Supportive Pillar Organization to help youth stay in school and now embarks on a transformative mission to further her education and expand her impact. 90 min

underrepresented cultures and subjects. With her extensive expertise in film production and direction, King has contributed to the creation of numerous documentary films.





PLASTIC PEOPLE

Plastic People, acquired from the Hollywood Climate Summit, explores humanity's dependence on plastic and the alarming discovery of microplastics infiltrating our air, water, soil, and even our bodies. Guided by science journalist Ziya Tong, the documentary investigates the health impacts of these invisible invaders and issues an urgent call to rethink our relationship with plastic. 1 hr 24 min

Moderator: Valerie Dubois, Activist and Climatebase Fellow

Valerie is a former high-tech product management executive who is now applying her expertise to help create a sustainable world for both people and the planet. As a trained Climate Reality Leader and Climatebase Fellow, she collaborates with 350 Silicon Valley and Pacific Clean Energy to lead decarbonization initiatives and educational seminars throughout

San Mateo County. She recently joined the Stanford Plastics & Health working group, and volunteers with Seahugger & Pacific Beach Coalition.



Dr. Desiree LaBeaud, MD, MS, FASTMH

Professor, Pediatric Infectious Diseases, Medicine and Associate Dean of Global Health at Stanford University's School.

She received her MD from the Medical College of Wisconsin, and trained with the Rainbow Babies & Children's Hospital pediatric residency program and the pediatric infectious disease fellowship program at Case Western

Reserve University, while earning her master's degree in Clinical Research and Epidemiology. She studies the human health impacts of climate change including research focused on innovative solutions to the global plastic pollution crisis. Her current field sites include Kenya, Grenada, and Brazil. She currently heads a clinical research lab focused on better understanding the risk factors and long-term health consequences of arboviral infections and the most effective means of prevention. 


Arthur Tress, Photographer

Arthur has been taking pictures professionally for his entire adult life, from the 1960s through to the present. His work spans many genres and styles, though he is perhaps best known for his dreamlike, playful, and sometimes disturbing images in the fantasist and surrealist genres.

Arthur's work has been exhibited in museums around the world including MoMA NY, Centre Pompidou in Paris, and the SFMoMA. A major exhibition of his work was on display at The Getty Center Museum in Los Angeles in October, 2023. His photographic archive has been placed at Stanford University's Library as part of their new photography initiative.

Born in Brooklyn, NY in 1940, Arthur spent the first half of his life and career based on the East Coast. That was followed by a 30 year stint living on the Central Coast of California. He currently resides in San Francisco, CA. Continuing to take pictures nearly every day, Arthur still shoots on medium format film with his trusted Hasselblad.



ARTHUR TRESS: WATER'S EDGE

The documentary Arthur Tress: Water's Edge offers an intimate look at the life and work of renowned photographer Arthur Tress, whose evocative images capture the mysterious and surreal interplay between humanity and water. Through stunning visuals and personal reflections, the film explores Tress's unique artistic vision and enduring impact on contemporary photography. 1 hr 25 min

Preceded by the short film **THE PORTUGUESE CALÇADA KNOWS YOU** Directed by André Badalo. The Portuguese Calçada are pavements that are considered a national heritage. However, there are increasingly fewer calçada stonemason masters in the country.



Stephen B. Lewis, Director

Stephen Lewis was born in Berkeley, California, raised in Evanston, Illinois, and attended film school at USC. A short film he made was screened at the Sundance Film Festival in 1992. Stephen moved to San Francisco where he had a long career in the video game industry as an artist, animator, designer, and programmer. After a mid-life career switch he became a clinical

hypnotherapist, his current day job in San Francisco. He was recently awarded a US patent as a co-inventor of a device to help induce calm states through guided breathing.

Stephen's return to filmmaking coincided with a chance encounter with photographer Arthur Tress on a Bay Area ferry boat.



Barbara Lewis, Executive Producer

Barbara is the co-curator of the exhibition Arthur Tress – Observations at the Water's Edge. Known for her work in the arts community, she focuses on promoting photography and artistic storytelling through exhibitions and film.



Mariana Arroja, Ph. D., Singer & Songwriter, Portuguese Calçada Mariana wrote a song inspired by the Portuguese Calçada and decided to explore this topic further, meeting several calçada stonemasons, and their families and hearing their stories.



LET THE CANARY SING

Alison Ellwood's *Let the Canary Sing* delves into the life and career of pop icon Cyndi Lauper, tracing her journey from her Queens upbringing to her rise as a socially conscious music legend. Featuring candid moments, archival footage, and dynamic performances, the film celebrates Lauper's artistry and advocacy as a trailblazing feminist and champion for others. 1 hr 36 min

Preceded by the short film **FAREWELL**, **SANITY** by Student Filmmaker Milo Hoffman. After a reality-shifting breakup, an offbeat girl's inner psyche, Sanity, springs to life, leading to a journey of healing and self-discovery.



Moderator: David Oliphant, Entrepreneur

David Oliphant is the owner of Ocean Element Real Estate and the Ocean Blue Vault artist collective in Half Moon Bay. As a dedicated community leader, he serves as president of the Half Moon Bay Downtown Association, is a founding board member of CoastPride, and volunteers with Muttville senior dog rescue.



Mike Dale, Broadcaster

A veteran broadcaster and journalist who began his career in the San Francisco Bay Area at KCSM, KKUP and KZSU before migrating to San Diego, where he worked in both print and broadcasting for the San Diego Union-Tribune, Copley News Service Syndicate as well as radio stations KGB, KCBQ and KOGO. He holds a journalism degree from San Diego

State University. Mike currently hosts a local music show, Coastside Carousel, at KHMB radio in Half Moon Bay, his hometown.



Christopher Childers, Choreographer & Entrepreneur

Christopher Childers, a San Francisco Bay Area native, began dancing at age 3 and has performed professionally since 15. He has toured globally with icons like Michael Jackson, Madonna, and Cirque du Soleil, and contributed to films like Spider-Man as a movement creator. Christopher's choreography and direction credits include major productions for Cirque

du Soleil, RCCL Cruises, and Las Vegas's Le Rêve The Dream. He owns Sky-King Entertainment in Half Moon Bay and recently transitioned to filmmaking, co-creating the award-winning short Carnival of Wonders, which garnered accolades on the 2020 film festival circuit and is a semifinalist for the Cannes International Independent Film Awards.




Milo Hoffman, Editor, Farewell, Sanity

CAROL DODA TOPLESS AT THE CONDOR

Against the backdrop of the 1964 Republican Convention, a San Francisco cocktail waitress became one of the city's most popular entertainers after making her debut as America's first topless dancer. Carol Doda Topless at the Condor tells the story of the fresh-faced girl next door who defied convention and the law by gyrating atop a white baby grand piano and turning a North Beach nightclub into the city's second-most-popular tourist attraction after the Golden Gate Bridge. Meanwhile, Doda's very public use of silicone to enhance her breasts launched a new industry. Directors Marlo McKenzie and Jonathan Parker share an unprecedented look at Doda's life and legacy, as well as a behind-the-scenes tour of the vibrant, sometimes outrageous, and always entertaining world of North Beach. 1 hr 40 min

Preceded by the short film **HEART OF THE CITY** by Brenton Gieser. San Francisco, a place, as Tony Bennett famously sang, where you'll leave your heart; but in exploring our city through the eyes, the work, and the experiences of our locals, you just might find your heart, too. "Heart of the City" is a series of short films that showcases seven diverse San Francisco neighborhoods and the artists, business owners, and community leaders who keep these places thriving.



Marlo McKenzie, Director, Carol Doda Topless at the Condor

Marlo McKenzie believes that story can change the world, and to create a better world we must first be able to imagine it.

She is a writer and director originally from the Detroit area. She studied language in France, worked in theater in Germany, and co-founded a video production company that trained formerly homeless youth in

Australia. Marlo just finalized her feature-length documentary about children who invent imaginary friends and worlds for fun called MY SECRET COUNTRY.

Prior to that she collaborated with the Oscar-nominated, Emmy-winning team at Concentric Media to produce BUTTERFLY TOWN USA - still airing on PBS stations. She also worked on a four-part documentary series called STANDING ON SACRED GROUND. She holds an MFA from the University of New South Wales in Australia and a BA from Michigan State University. In her spare time she enjoys reading, meditating, visiting museums and hiking in nature.



Jonathan Parker, Director, Carol Doda Topless at the Condor

Jonathan Parker currently serves on the Board of the California Film Institute (CA FILM), which operates the Rafael Theater and produces the Mill Valley Film Festival.
