Pastoral Letter - Rev^d David Bickersteth

'The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light'

There is no doubting our troubled times – a horrifying conflict in the Bible Lands of Gaza, Lebanon and Israel, the uncertainty of the conflict in the Ukraine under the Trump administration and the rise of nationalism in parts of Europe. How will the new American leadership take part or obstruct the need for climate change? We have seen the devastating Hurricanes in the US and the floods in Spain, making the end of 2024 seem as gloomy as our short misty days.

Yet it has ever been so. I've recently done some reading on the reign of kings in England from the Saxon period to the settlement with Scotland. They were brutal times marked by many 'civil wars' as families battled out for control of the crown and nation – and indeed control of France.

The question must be asked, why a nation – any nation – with faith in God, can behave so abysmally? A question asked not long ago, when we had to come to terms with the rise of Hitler in Christian Germany. We must acknowledge the power of persuasion and the fickleness of the voter.

Jesus was born into a troubled nation, controlled by a ruthless empire under the guise of a quisling puppet ruler, who massacred infants to protect his dynasty. The infant Jesus would one day be tried and condemned by the ruling powers and declare 'My kingdom is not of this world' (john 18:36). Yet Jesus taught about the values of God's Kingdom – a kingdom of love, truth and justice. He echoes and fulfils the expectation of Jewish prophecy. So why do we see such evil in the world? The Apostle Paul, another victim of the tyranny of the powers – wrote that our battle is against the rulers of darkness – against spiritual wickedness in high places (Ephesians 6:12).

The child of Bethlehem came to confront the darkness – apparent defeat on the cross became the victory over such powers. Sin and death have been given a terminal wound, but the disease of evil still battles to the last – like Hitler from his bunker, defeated yet belligerent to the last, costing huge losses to Germany and the Allies.

Whatever we feel about world leaders – we are told to pray for them, and to pray for peace (1 Timothy 2:1-4). We are to recognise that we battle against spiritual powers in the high (heavenly) places. The story of a baby's birth finishes not in the resurrection but in the promise of a New Heaven and Earth where war, death, pain, shall be no more. (Revelation chapter 21).

'in him was life, and that light was the light of mankind. The light shines in the darkness and darkness has not overcome it' - John 1:4, the Christmas Gospel.

Spoof emails appearing to be from us

There has been a spate recently of emails to various people in the community appearing to come from one of our "conistonandcrakechurches" email addresses. If you are not familiar with these type of scams, it can be a little alarming but unfortunately because our email addresses are available, and need to be so, on our website this may continue to happen.

If you get an unexpected email from the Vicar or one of the other email addresses listed at the front of the magazine, do take a minute to consider whether it's likely to be genuine. Telltale signs of a spoof email can be your name in the subject line or requests to deal with something urgently. If you hover your mouse or finger over the sender's address you will see a completely different email address come up that is nothing to do with us. As long as you do not reply, never click on any link in the text and delete the email there will be no consequences.

If you are in any doubt whether an email from one of us might be genuine, please do call me or the Vicarage.

I have personally had a few scam *text messages* recently along similar lines - these purport to be from a courier such as EVRI regarding a parcel they are trying to deliver to me and wanting me to follow links to a website to enter my address details. Just another thing to watch out for!

If you use a stair lift, or you are on oxygen, or you need to keep medication in the fridge, this can be essential. 


