High-quality, sustainable, relocatable buildings

All our modular units come fully staffed for the clinical speciality they are commissioned for, and with all the latest equipment and technology – our clinical staff love working in them and patient satisfaction is extraordinary.

Healthcare buildings must meet stringent quality standards to provide a safe clinical environment for patients. Our modular buildings are constructed off-site, under strictly controlled factory conditions. Beyond quality management, our modular construction methods offer numerous other benefits to NHS trusts including:

- significantly reduced disruption to patients by removing approximately 80% of the building construction activity from the site
- faster building solutions, reducing lead time by up to 70% compared to traditional builds
- environmentally friendly approach to construction and fit-out that minimises 'whole life' building costs

Our modular building systems use the same materials and follow the same standards as traditional forms of construction but in half the time. A modern modular approach to construction is also highly cost-effective compared to on-site construction.









Training

Unlike many of our competitors at Remedy we never shy away for a conversation about training trust staff. We openly encourage it. We see training as a part of the solution and we want to leave a legacy when our job is completed. We recognise that running training lists reduces list efficiency and fewer patients will be seen but ultimately it is in everyone's interests to help train more NHS staff.

A couple of examples:

Our partnership with North Cumbria Integrated Care Trust involves us running our staffed modular endoscopy unit for six days per week. On Mondays, we run a reduced patient list, training two nominated nurses from the host trust as they work towards full accreditation.

At Kings College Hospital NHS
Foundation Trust we run a
weekly training list for
transnasal endoscopy (TNE).
This is led by our Clinical
Development Director, who
having trained in Japan, is
a pioneer in TNE. The clinical
fellows being trained are
enthusiastic in their feedback.
