I was recently watching a news story entitled, "It is the way the game is supposed to be played so, why is it such a big deal?" The story took place in June of 2016 at the Indiana State Baseball Championships, during which a player from the winning team went onto the mound to console the losing pitcher, who was laying on the ground visibly upset, rather than embarking in a celebration with his teammates.

At the end of the story, the newscaster made a point to say, "The actions of the player reflected on the coaches and the parents of the kid. Somebody is doing something very right." Adults in the player's life, leading by example.

When the newscast finished, I pondered about why the story made the news. I was happy that the actions of the boys made national headlines, but saddened that acts

of sportsmanship are not the norm. The realization that stories like this are highlighted because they are seen as something special and extraordinary was disheartening to me.

Throughout this year, the NMAA and our member schools are focusing on the importance of sportsmanship by coaches, players and spectators. When you attend a game as a spectator, remember that you too are setting an example for the kids on the court or field and for the individuals around you. Remember that it takes just one person to make a difference and the way you act can set an example for your community.

Be mindful of the example you set in whichever role you play in interscholastic athletics – as a coach, a parent, a player or a spectator. Be POSITIVE and support your team, without being negative towards opponents or contest officials. We need to all be a part of changing the culture of interscholastic athletics so that doing what is right is no longer newsworthy. Competing with Class should be the rule, not the exception.

Let us all band together and lead by example. Show the youth of today that sportsmanship matters. Show our student-athletes the proper way to win and lose. Show our "leaders of tomorrow" that their character far outweighs their performance. In New Mexico, our news story should always read, "It is the way the game is supposed to be played so, why is it such a big deal?" In New Mexico, let good sportsmanship and positive behavior always be the norm.

Legend of the Hardwood James Borrego



James Borrego worked his way up the professional basketball ladder, all the way to the NBA. He is currently the head coach of the Charlotte Hornets.

James Borrego was born and raised in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He played four years of varsity basketball at Albuquerque Academy under head coach Mike Brown and was a part of two state championship teams. After graduating from Albuquerque Academy in 1996, Borrego chose to attend Northeastern Junior College in Colorado.

"I could have gone to an Ivy League school or play Division II, but I thought I needed to grow more and get better and push myself," said Borrego. "My academic advisors were against it at the time, but I sold them on it. So, I went to junior college not knowing what the next step was going to be."

His next step turned out to be Southern California. After one year at Northeastern, Borrego transferred to the University of San Diego. He played three years with the Toreros, earning West Coast Conference All-Academic honors.

"In the transition from my junior to senior year, I knew I wasn't going to play a lot. I worked as hard as I could, but the playing time wasn't there. I thought, 'What will I do next?' That was

coaching. Coaches were a major part of my life growing up, father figures, great examples for me. I always had a real passion to help other kids like me. I knew my playing days were coming to an end. (USD head coach) Brad Holland offered me a graduate position, so I started working on my masters. I started to learn more about the game, learning about recruiting and I realized I like this. I could see myself coaching."

Borrego would begin his coaching career as an assistant at USD from 2001-2003. He would later go on to work for the San Antonio Spurs in 2003 as an assistant video coordinator and then get promoted to assistant coach. He spent seven seasons with the Spurs and went on to work as an assistant with the New Orleans Hornets from 2010-2012. In 2012, Borrego joined the Orlando Magic as their lead assistant. In February of 2015, after head coach Jacque Vaughn was fired, Borrego was named interim head coach of the Magic. The following season, Borrego would return to San Antonio as an assistant under Gregg Popovich. Borrego interviewed for the University of New Mexico head coaching position in 2017. In 2018, Borrego was named head coach of the Charlotte Hornets.

Borrego is married to his high school sweetheart, Megan. They have three kids and occasionally return to Albuquerque to see family and friends.



When did you first start playing basketball?

I was probably 7-8 years old and played at the Boys & Girls Club in Old Town (Albuquerque). I was around very good coaches growing up. John Whisenant was my AAU coach. He knew what the college game looked like and understood player development. He was a big part of pushing my career forward.

What do you remember about your high school days at Albuquerque Academy?

I think Academy is a place that changed my life. I grew up on the west side of Albuquerque, but when I got to Academy, my world changed. My mentality, everybody there, it was expected you were going to go to college. The teachers pushed you to get better every day.

It taught me how to work and grow. I remember being in a competitive environment, with basketball especially. They were winning state championships. I saw a lot of structure that I took with me to this day. It transferred with me to my professional life.

Growing up, I didn't know what I was going to do. I was raised by a single parent. My mom worked two or three jobs just to make things go for our family. I watched her work ethic just to put food on the table. I didn't know what college meant; I didn't know too many people who went to college.

What's your best basketball memory as a player?

Playing on the Pit floor always stood out to me. As you go through a high school season, you always want to get to the Pit. That's special. For me, winning a state title my sophomore year was memorable. Celebrating on the floor, in the locker room, I can still see it today. Another memory, for good or bad, was get-

ting injured on the Pit floor my junior year. I rolled my ankle and tore two ligaments in the quarterfinals. We were about to play NMMI, and Taymon Domzalski, the following night. We were sort of eyeballing each other during the season. The matchup was about to happen, then I rolled my ankle on the baseline and I didn't think I could play going into the semifinals. Dr. Ball said 'You have to show me you can hop on the ankle for 10 hops.' I did everything I could to get through it. I was not going to miss that game for anything. We won the game, I don't remember how well I played. I just remember we got to the state finals, which was a bitter memory, because we lost to Artesia (86-83).

Was it frustrating waiting to get that shot as a head coach? I think my journey, as a whole, is to try and get better every single year. I had some mentors that said, 'Put your time in and you'll get better and get your shot.' I didn't have my eyes on being a head coach someday. Things changed when I took over in Orlando as an interim head coach. He (Jacque Vaughn) took a chance on me as his top assistant. Until you're in that seat, you have no idea what it's like (being a head coach). Those 30 games taught me I could do this job. It's a lot of work, but I felt like I'm prepared for it. I tried to keep the job after that interim stint. They went with Scott Skiles, but it fueled the fire. I used it as motivation for my next opportunity. I went to San Antonio. Pop could have hired anyone in the world. I was fortunate he took a chance on me and, in those three years, I grew more and more. I started to get my mind and thought process of what would I look like in the position of head coach someday.

I interviewed in Houston and Memphis, finalist for both. I was right on the doorstep, but felt good, used it as fuel to get better. All those doors closed for a reason. It led me to Charlotte.

I interviewed with Phoenix and New York. Charlotte was my third interview and Milwaukee was scheduled to be my fourth. Charlotte came calling and one interview led to two and by the third, I was meeting with Michael Jordan for the head coaching job. I think all these doors closed for a reason, they led me here. I fit well with the organization and this is my door and this is my opportunity.

What was it like being interviewed by Michael Jordan?

I was at his home in Florida. I was interviewing to become his head coach. It was surreal, but I had to go into that meeting with the mentality I wanted to be his head coach. I had a vision and a plan and it aligned with his plan and here I am today.

Who is your coaching mentor?

They all played a part in the puzzle for me, Mike Brown at Academy, John Whisenant, they taught me how to work and be a part of a team and how to compete. Brad Holland at USD gave me the opportunity. In San Antonio, my world opened up as far as learning basketball.

I was around Pop, PJ and some really great coaches and minds that I learned under. I could also add the players to that mix, Duncan, Horry, Ginobili, Parker. Great players make coaches look better.

NMAA Hall of Fame Inductees Class of 2019



SCOTT AFFENTRANGER

Scott Affentranger's hard work and dedication have earned him a spot in the New Mexico Activities Association Hall of Fame. Affentranger has become synonymous with the success of V. Sue Cleveland High School in Rio Rancho, NM. He has been involved in education in the State of New Mexico for over 27 years as a teacher, coach and administrator. For the past 12 years, he has served as principal of Cleveland High School. In

2006, he was named the Principal of the Year by the New Mexico Association of Secondary Principals. For seven consecutive years, his school received an "A" rating as well as producing some of the highest graduation rates in the former Class 6A.

He went to high school in Oklahoma and then ran track for Oklahoma Baptist University from 1986 to 1987. Scott earned two letters before transferring to the University of New Mexico, where he joined the wrestling team and earned letterman status there as well. At UNM, he was on the academic honor roll. Scott earned his bachelor's and master's degrees from UNM. As a coach, he was a varsity assistant with the wrestling programs at Moriarty High School and Sandia High School. He also was the head track and field coach at Temple Baptist Academy. Scott has served on the NMAA Commission from 2005 to present and the NASSP National Committee on Student Contest, Program and Activities from 2011-2014.

"I'm very honored and very humbled," Scott said about his selection into the Hall of Fame. "For years I've come to the NMAA for different reasons and looked at that group (of Hall of Famers) and thought, 'Wow that's a special group of people and they must have done some pretty special things to be on that wall' and it never crossed my mind that I would have the opportunity to join that group."

"I think he'll be remembered as a guy who was all in," stated Bruce Carver. "He's all in with the athletic teams, the activities, the academic part of it; he's in that boat with everybody and it's a team."



ANTHONY CASADOS

The name Anthony Casados is well known in the northern part of New Mexico. He has not only etched his legacy into the landscape of the Chama Valley, but he is now known as a Hall of Famer in the New Mexico Activities Association. For over 30 years, Anthony Casados has been involved in the Chama Valley School District as a coach, teacher, athletic director, principal and Superintendent. A 1983 graduate of Escalante High

School, Anthony was going to pursue a career in medicine as a veterinarian. The University of New Mexico didn't offer the degree, so he decided to pursue education. He received his bachelor's degree from the University of New Mexico in 1987 and his master's degree from New Mexico Highlands.

Following graduation, Anthony headed home to begin his career in education. He took on the role of principal and athletic director at Escalante High School, where his father served as AD before retiring. Anthony enjoyed his position and school so much that he never left. He has been serving the community for more than three decades. Anthony served at Assistant Superintendent of Chama Valley Independent School District beginning in 2002 before being named Superintendent in 2010, a position he continues to hold today.

While he was in high school, Anthony played football for Escalante and was named a 1st team All-State selection at defensive tackle. He was also a member of the National Honor Society and the school's chess club. He served as basketball coach for both the boys' and girls' teams at Escalante High School and was named the 1994-95 2A District 1 Coach of the Year. Anthony has been a member of the NMAA Commission from 1997-2000 and a member of the NMAA Board of Directors since 2011, currently serving as the Board's Vice President. He was influential in improving the school's athletic facilities, including a new football stadium and track and field complex. Casados is honored to receive such recognition and would like to be remembered for making a difference in his community. "I just want to be remembered as someone who cared," he said.

"For what Anthony's done for us, it's amazing," said Escalante athletic director Dusty Giles. "He gets in there and makes things happen."

"Anthony is a bright and personable individual with the wisdom to handle every situation he encounters with class," described Stephanie Maestas.

DON GERHEART

Don Gerheart has been tantamount to the interscholastic music community in New Mexico for over five decades. It is Gerheart's commitment to music education in our state that earned him the honor of induction into the New Mexico Activities Association Class of 2019 Hall of Fame.

Don's musical background started in the 9th grade, when he began to play baritone saxophone. He says music was his primary, and only, inter-

est in high school. A graduate of Palmerton High School in Pennsylvania in 1960, Don received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Wyoming in 1964 and 1969. While attending college, Don was a member of the Wyoming marching band, wind ensemble, symphonic band, symphony orchestra and pep band from 1960-64. He was the first member of his family to receive a college degree.

Following graduation in 1964, Don taught at Green River Schools in Wyoming as the band and choir director. Then, in 1966, he accepted a position in Los Alamos Public Schools, where he taught, was the band director, district Music Coordinator and Activities Director for nearly 30 years. He was the high school's assistant principal from 1992-93 and was their Activities Director from 1986-1993, also serving as the band director during that time. In 1988, Don was named the Los Alamos Teacher of the Year and was inducted into the New Mexico Music Educators Association Hall of Fame in 1995. Don was the Executive Director of the NMMEA from 2003 through 2018. Don served on both the NMAA Activities Council and the NMAA Commission for 15 years, while also serving as the Master of Ceremonies for the NMAA State Choir and State Band Concert Band Contests for a decade.

"It means quite a lot," Don said of the honor. "I have worked with the NMAA for many years and to receive a Hall of Fame award is one of the highlights of my career."

"It's so hard to find people who are dedicated to service and serving others and he did that for so many years," said his son Chuck Gerheart. "It's refreshing to see somebody that is that selfless about helping others."

On top of his commitment to the kids, Don is the editor of "The New Mexico Musician," the official magazine of the NMMEA. He also served as the financial administrator for the North Central New Mexico Music Educators from 2001-2007. He has always volunteered to work and be a part of a variety of community events as a way of giving back. "Music has been my life," the Hall of Famer summed up.







District Tournaments –The Evolution and Decline

District tournaments used to be almost as important as state tournaments because there was only one class! Only the champion and runner-up at the district tournament advanced to state. District tournaments were held at one site and from 16 to 25 teams in a district would compete for the two coveted spots. The crowds were great at the eight sites throughout New Mexico, where tournaments were held. Tournaments were played in two or three days and most had a consolation bracket.

Although the first state tournament was not played until 1921, the district numbers were essentially set up in 1915 at the state teachers' convention. The districts were set out for the Lyceum competition, broken down by area in the state. Union and Colfax County made up District 1, Santa Fe, San Miguel, Taos, Rio Arriba, and Mora Counties were District 2. District 3 was primarily Bernalillo County, but also included the remote schools in Sandoval, Socorro, and Torrance Counties. The Southwest and Southern schools made up District 4 while District 5 Included Chaves, Lincoln, and Eddy Counties (there was no Lea County in 1915). District 6 included schools in Curry and Roosevelt Counties, while schools from Quay and Guadalupe Counties made up District 7. District 8 (as shown on the map) was not formed until 1933. as there were very few schools in the northwest. McKinley and San Juan schools were part of District 3 until 1933.


When state tournaments were set up in 1921, they used the term "sectional" instead of district until 1930, when "District Tournament" was coined. The eight districts were set up similarly to the 1915 teachers' convention designation.

The districts continued with this set-up, with minor changes in boundaries, until 1950.

The District 1 Tournament was usually played in Raton. Las Vegas or Santa Fe hosted District 2 and up to 25 teams participated. District 3 was always in Albuquerque, usually played at the UNM gym. District 4 was hosted by Deming, Lordsburg or Silver City, but usually Las Cruces was the host. Roswell was the usual host of District 5, while Clovis or Portales hosted District 6. Tucumcari was always the host of District 7 and Gallup or Farmington was the host for District 8.

A one-site tournament allowed players, coaches, and students an excellent opportunity to meet and visit folks from other schools. This was an excellent time for teachers in one area to get together to discuss educational topics. Only one day of school was missed (Friday) and nearly all schools would dismiss school for part of that day. The schools participating usually represented their towns as well as their schools. Stores in these towns often closed on Friday and Saturday for the District Tournament, as everyone in town went to the games anyway. Only Albuquerque and Santa Fe had more than one school in the tournament. Sometimes, the host city would feed the players and coaches (a team consisted of 10 players and one coach) in a school cafeteria. A few times during the depression, teams would bring sleeping bags and spend the night in the gym.

Since there were so many games played in two or three days, some of the first round games or consolation games were played where the gym was divided in two and side baskets were used. I recall getting a spot on the bleachers at Cahoon Armory in Roswell where I could watch two games at once.



In early tournaments, teams were not seeded. A bracket was set up for the number of teams entered and the schools were drawn from a hat. Often the best two teams met in the first or second round. The first seeding was in the early thirties. A couple of districts seeded four teams, but they were not given byes and had to play as many as four games just to reach the finals.

Some early district formats were very interesting. There were double elimination tournaments. One such tournament in Raton found the eventual runner-up, Newton, playing six games on Saturday! Another format called for the teams that lost in the first round to drop to the bottom bracket and still play for the championship. Capitan lost to Carlsbad in 1928, yet came back to beat Carlsbad in the final and win the tournament. In 1931, St. Michael's was a powerhouse and everyone expected the Horsemen to win the district easily. The other teams were playing for 2nd place and a trip to state. But both Las Vegas High and Santa Fe High played to lose in the first round. Cerrillos beat the Cardinals from Las Vegas and McCurdy beat Santa Fe as both of the losing teams guarded their own basket and scored points for the opponent. This type of bracket was dropped forever in New Mexico.

In 1932, District 1 tried a different method. Four sub-district tournaments were played a week before the district tournament, with two teams advancing from each sub-district. This proved to be ineffective, as the district went back to the regular district in the next year. A few districts tried sub-districts after the split into classes, but it always came back to the single district tournament.

District tournaments were played in three days. First and second round, as well as consolation games were on Thursday and

Friday. Semi-finals and finals were played on Saturday. All teams stayed until the presentations were made after the final game. Trophies were presented and the all-tournament team was announced. Pictures were taken by the newspaper staff.

New Mexico had one class and eight districts throughout the 1930's and 1940's. with about 135 schools. (By contrast, there are five classes, 154 schools and 30 districts in 2019.) By 1950, Districts 2 and 5, had grown so large that the Districts were split. District 9 emerged from a spilt of District 2 in Santa Fe. Lea County schools became district 10. The state tournament now had 20 teams. Tucumcari had to win five games on their home floor to be the state champion in 1950.

The districts were split again in 1951, resulting in 15 districts. The champion and runner-up in each district went to one of the four regional tournaments. Champions and runners-up in regional went to state, reducing the teams in the state tournament to eight. Still, the district tournaments were played in one location and were completed in two or three days.

The year 1954 brought classes to New Mexico. The B districts had more teams and tournaments were usually held in a gym of a Class A team. The larger schools started with only two districts, but increased to four districts in 1955.

In 1956, a big change in the way the tournament was formatted occurred in District 4-A. The regular season champion was seeded to the semi-finals. This started the tradition that regular season success was rewarded. By 1966, all districts seeded at least four teams. Some #1 teams got a berth in the finals; the majority did not. Today, almost every regular season champion is seeded to the final.

Around 1970, some of the larger districts started playing tournament games at the home of the highest seed. This eliminated the one-site tournament but rewarded a team's season success.

Slowly through the years, more districts have gone to this format. By 2018, all districts were using the highest seed format.

In 1973, Title IX had brought girls' basketball back to New Mexico. For the first six years, the districts were different from the boys' districts, but by 1980, they were essentially the same.

Four classes became five in 2001, and then went to six in 2011. The classes were reduced to five for 2018-2019.

In 2006, NMAA made a major change in the state tournament format. For the three larger classes, 16 teams were seeded and all first round games were played at the higher seed. Class 5A had 22 teams, Class 4A had 19 teams, and Class 3A had 20 teams. This meant that 48 teams out of 79 (61%) made it to state, compared to Class 1A and 2A (16 out of 83 - 19%). For the smaller classes, the eight teams that survived the old format were seeded at state. By 2015, all classes had 16 teams in the state tournament.

After the 2006 change, the district tournament did not really matter, other than wins and losses. Yes, the district tournament champion had to be included in the state tournament, but the runner-up did not. The 16 teams were picked by a qualified and ethical committee, but could pick a team that lost in the first round of district or could select ALL teams from one district. The thing that was lost was that a team that had not been successful in the regular season, but learned and improved through the educational process, was not rewarded for a strong district tournament finish. Another thing, because there are so many first round sites in the state tournament, it is not possible for statisticians to maintain accurate records for the state tournament.

The future: Will district tournaments survive? I certainly don't know. They have already lost their firepower! I love the current format of the state tournament, but I do miss the old fashioned district tournament at one site.

MELROSE BRINGS HOME FOURTH BOYS BASKETBALL TITLE



BOYS CLASS A

The Melrose High School Buffaloes defeated the Maxwell Bears 50-37 to become the 2018 Class 1A State Basketball Champions. Melrose (29-3) shot 32% overall for the game, led by senior Jordan Jasso, who put 19 points on the board for the Buffaloes. Melrose opened the first quarter with an 8-point run before Maxwell (28-2) started their own streak of seven points. The first quarter ended tied 11-11.

Maxwell's leading scorer, Carl Gonzales, put in 18 of the Bears' points in the game. Gonzales was the only scorer in double digits for the Bears. The second quarter was a low scoring eight minutes, as Melrose took a 19-16 lead into the locker room.

In the third quarter, Melrose took a commanding lead as Blake Devaney put 10 of his 12 points on the board for Melrose. The Buffaloes wrapped up the third quarter with an 8-point lead, 35-27.

The Bears would get as close as five points, but ultimately fell short, surrendering the blue to the Buffaloes, 50-37. The Buffaloes brought home their 4th State Championship in the program's history.

The 2A State Basketball Championship trophy was awarded to Fort Sumner/House (24-6) in a nail-biting 56-53 victory over the Menaul Panthers (26-6). The Foxes brought home their first ever blue trophy shooting 37% as a team.





Dickerman led the Wolverines with 20 points, followed by Baylee Sours with 14. As a team, Texico shot 44 percent from the field in the win. Tohatchi's Kalian Mitchell led all scorers 28 points on 9-of-18 from the floor and 9-of-10 from the free throw line. The Cougars also shot 44 percent from the field and 38 percent from behind the 3-point



PORTALES CLAIMS 4A GIRLS BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The Portales Rams (28-2) capped off a stellar season with a 50-39 win in the 2018 Class 4A Girls' State Basketball Championships over the Moriarty Fighting Pintos (27-5). This was the eighth title for the Rams and the first since the 2014 season.

Portales was led by Taylee Rippee who led all scorers with 23 points and 10 rebounds. Teammate Zamorye Cox added 11 points in the win. As a team, the Rams shot 26 percent from the floor in the game.

Alyssa Adams guided the Fighting Pintos with 21 points on 7-of-18 shooting from the floor. The Fighting Pintos shot 33 percent as a team and 91 percent from the charity stripe.

Both teams started the game slowly, as Portales held a one-point lead at 13-12. Moriarty, however, came out in the second quarter poised to take the lead, outscoring Portales 12-9, holding a halftime lead at 24-22.

The Rams held Moriarty to just nine points in the third quarter but never took the lead back until late in the quarter at 35-33. The fourth quarter, however, was a much different story.

Portales jumped out to a 43-35 lead, following an 8-2 run to start the quarter. They would eventually take a 10-point lead at 47-37 with just under two minutes to play in the game. The Rams would add three free throws in the final minute to put the game out of reach, as Portales captured the 2018 4A Girls' State Basketball Championship, 50-39 over Moriarty.

LOS LUNAS BACK ON TOP IN 5A GIRLS BASKETBALL

The 2018 5A Girls' State Championship was captured by the Los Lunas Tigers (29-2) in their defeat of the Bloomfield Bobcats (26-6), with a final score of 48-43. Los Lunas, shooting 41% from the floor, was led in scoring by Senior Mica Jenrette who posted 16 points for the Tigers.

The parity of the #1 and #2 seeds was clear in the first quarter, where the difference in the score was never greater than two. Bloomfield's leading scorer Alyssa Quintana, the only Bobcat with double digit points, made her first appearance in the second quarter. Putting only seven points on board in the 2nd, Los Lunas fell behind 19-21.

The third quarter left Bloomfield in the lead 39-37. The largest difference in score during the fourth quarter was five points as the Bobcats tried to maintain their lead. Ultimately, Los Lunas came out on top, trading their 2017 Runner-Up finish for the 2018 Champion trophy, with a final of 48-43.

The 2018 6A Girls' State Basketball Championship game pitted No. 1 Cibola (26-3) versus No. 2 Hobbs (30-2), with the Eagles coming out on top in overtime, 64-55. For Hobbs, it was the second state basketball title in school history for the girls and the first since 2003.

Hobbs had four players in double figures in the game, led by Ayanna Smith and Kiara Knight, each with 18 points. The Eagles shot 34 percent from the floor as a team. Kayla Martinez of Cibola led all scorers with 22, while collecting 10 boards, as teammate Amaya Brown dropped in 16 points and pulled down 17 rebounds. The Cougars shot 37 percent from the field in the game.

In the first quarter, Cibola opened with an 8-point scoring run before Hobbs' first score. The second quarter was more balanced, with the score never differing by more than five points. Coming out of the locker room, Cibola had an 8-point run before finishing the third ahead of Hobbs 36-29.

The Cougars maintained the lead throughout the first half of the fourth quarter before Hobbs took their first lead of the game at 45-44 with 3:25 to go. A 4-0 run by the Cougars gave them a 48-45 lead but the Eagles tied the game at 48-48, following a deep 3-point bucket by Amaya Lewis.

Then, with just four seconds left on the clock and down by two at 53-51, Kiara Knight hit two free throws for Hobbs to force the game to overtime.

In overtime, it was all Hobbs, as the Eagles outscored the Cougars 11-2, capturing the 2018 6A Girls' Basketball Championship, 64-55.
