From the Superintendent's Desk

Thank You! I want to say thank you to all AWLS employees for your work to make the start of the school year so successful.

You all have done a great job of providing a positive learning environment for our students. Thank you again for all of your hard work!

As we transition into the month of September there are many things going on in the District.

November Renewal Levy

The AWLS Board of Education placed a renewal levy on the ballot for the November 8 election. This 4.85-mill emergency levy was originally approved in 2003, and generates \$3-million dollars for the District's operational budget.

The levy was reapproved in 2008 (for a 5-year period) and then again in 2013 (for a 10-year period). If approved, the

proposed 2.28-mill renewal levy will continue to generate \$3-million dollars each year for the next 10 years.

Facilities Assessments

The Collaborative is working to complete the facilities assessments, and hopes to have this stage completed by the end of September. The District will then to start to engage stakeholders in conversations about what should be included in the facilities master plan for the District's future.

Strategic Plan

Building administrators will be working with the staff to review the first two goals of the strategic plan. In doing so, there will be oppor tunities for you to share your thoughts about actions needed to achieve those goals.

Quality Profile

The District will release the



2021-22 Quality Profile on September 15. The profile will highlight many of the positive learning experiences we provide to our students and their success in and out of the classroom. I encourage you to review this newly designed profile when it is released!

- 3. Keep them Safe
- 4. Help them Connect
- 5. Follow Up

BACK-TO-SCHOOL SAFETY TRAINING FOLLOW UP

Thank you for participating in the back to school safety training and drill on August 16. Safety is a top priority in the District and we appreciate the ongoing support of our staff, local law enforcement officers and first responders in helping to provide the safest working and learning environment possible.

Following the drill, District administration met with first responders to review the drill and the District's Emergency Response Plan. Collaboration with our local law enforcement will continue to ensure our buildings are as prepared as possible for any type of emergency.

The District has applied for a grant through the Ohio K-12 Safety Grant Program to make new safety equipment and resources available for each of our schools.

The grant process includes completing a Security and Vulnerability Assessment for each building. As such, you may see individuals in your building collecting this data.

Thanks again, for helping the District maintain safe and secure school facilities. Watch for more safety drills and training opportunities throughout the school year.

UPDATE:

FACILITIES MASTER PLANNING

The District continues to work with The Collaborative, a local architecture and facilities planning agency to develop a new facilities master plan.

This fall, Collaborative representatives and District Operations team members and Administrators are visiting each of the District's properties and buildings. We expect this assessment to be complete by the end of the month.

The District will then work with stakeholders to review the report and other data and begin to develop a plan for the future of our District facilities.

This planning process last happened during the 2015-16 school year. A facilities master plan is used to guide the long-term maintenance and management of the District's buildings and properties to ensure they meet our changing needs.
