# Nourish!


It's hard to accept the levels of food poverty experienced in this country:

- 16% of respondents to a recent survey were classified as food insecure
- The poorest 20% of households spend a higher proportion of their income on food and are thus more exposed to changes in food prices
- As at February 2021, there were over 2,300 food banks operating in the UK. They report increases in the number of food parcels distributed.

With rising food, fuel and energy costs it is easy to see how families and individuals can be left in the position of having to make tough choices. To many people it seems unfair

The Nourish Food Clubs work for food justice in our society and do so in a way in which the members maintain their dignity and have choice.

Members come to the Food Club because they are struggling to survive on what they have available. There is no referral process, no need to convince anyone, simply come and ask to join.

For f3 members are able to do a weekly shop, selecting a specific number of items from a range of goods in each section. This element of choice is an important part of giving people their dignity back. We are encouraged that two local Housing Associations recognise these issues and are now involving themselves in supporting the Food Clubs by paying the annual £5 membership for their tenants.

# Narrowgate Support Hub



As we write this edition of Clear Call the world watches on as Russia invades the Ukraine. Horrific images fill our screens and our hearts break at the stories of the relentless bombing of Mariupol and other cities.

It is far from a lovely world in which we live.

We are encouraged by the number of people in the United Kingdom who want to open their homes to refugees from Ukraine. This is a lovely response.

Having run the Narrowgate Night Shelter for so many years, Manchester City Mission has accumulated a huge amount of experience of working with asylum seekers, refugees and those escaping from the ravages of war. We thought it would be an expression of love to offer care, via the Narrowgate

One gentleman said "I don't know what I would do without you guys; you have done so much for me".

Support Hub, to any host families coming across difficulties.

Initially we can provide pastoral care through,

- A listening ear
- Prayer
- Signposting to appropriate services
- Access to our Food Clubs

As the process moves forward we would look to establish Support Groups as the refugees and their hosts deal with the effects of Post Migration Stress and isolation.

We would hope, as some hosts become more experienced with the process, that we can set up a Mentoring Scheme for them to provide support to newer hosts or those who may be struggling.

Despite the best efforts of our local authorities to eradicate homelessness. there are still many people in Greater Manchester who would, at best, describe their current accommodation as temporary or unsatisfactory. Barely a day goes by when the office phone doesn't ring with someone asking if we can help them, or someone they know, with accommodation.

Narrowaate Next Stage Housing effectively supports those who are experiencing, or at risk of experiencing, homelessness

When recommending someone to a landlord it would be very easy to skim over their faults, however, Cath's honesty with landlords has helped to build a great reputation for this work: so much so that landlords are recommending her to other landlords. It is always a moment for celebration when a landlord hands over keys to one of our clients knowing that someone we have supported can unload some of their stress and anxiety and start the next stage of their journey.
