Coming to Lawndale in June 2016 as the Community Development Director, I worked closely with the public overseeing areas of planning and land-use for close to 6 years before being hired as City Manager in February 2022.

My almost six years in the Community Development Department gave me a direct understanding and insight into the great people that live, work, and play in Lawndale. Deep rooted

Business License Renewal

As we close in on the end of another year, the City of Lawndale would like to remind all Lawndale business owners that business licenses expire on December 31, 2024. Business license renewal fees are due on or before January 1, 2025. Please be aware beginning February 1, 2025, each subsequent month in which the license renewal fee is unpaid, a penalty of twenty-five percent (25%) of the value of the license, or ten dollars, whichever is greater, to a maximum of 200%, shall be added to the balance (LMC 5.07.030).

Renewal notices will be sent out via e-mail to all Lawndale business owners in mid-December; renewal payments can be made online, by mail, or in person at city hall. Online payments can be made with a credit card by logging into the business license portal at www.lawndalecity.org/payportal.

If you choose to mail your payment, simply complete your renewal statement by making any corrections and sign and date the form. Please make personal checks, money orders or cashier's checks payable to "City of Lawndale" and write the business license account number on the check. Payments can be mailed to City of Lawndale, Attn: Finance Department, 14717 Burin Avenue, Lawndale, CA 90260.

If hand delivering your payment, cash, credit or debit cards, personal checks, cashier's checks and money orders will be accepted.

Seniors, Take Advantage of the **Lawndale Special Transit!**



The Lawndale Special Transit Program is a door-to-door service which operates Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and provides FREE transportation to Lawndale seniors at least 60 years of age. All rides must originate within the geographical boundaries of Lawndale, and all riders must live within City of Lawndale geographical boundaries. Rides are available for essential appointments such as medical, dental, laboratory, pharmacy or grocery shopping. Transportation is available for other purposes such as visits to the beauty salon, bank, post office, barber or others; however, medical and dental transportation takes precedent over all others. The Special Transit's medical service area includes rides to the incorporated cities of Lawndale, Hawthorne, Gardena, Torrance, Manhattan Beach and Redondo Beach. The designated transportation boundaries are as follows:

- Imperial Highway Northern Boundary
- Torrance Boulevard Southern Boundary
- Western Avenue Eastern Boundary
- Sepulveda Boulevard Western Boundary

To make a reservation for a ride, please call our 24-hour voicemail at (310) 973-3287 no less than 48 hours in advance and leave a message if the call is not answered. Calls will be prioritized on a first come, first served basis. Medical and dental appointments take priority over all others and will be scheduled first.

Capital Improvement Program Update

The Public Works Department is pleased to provide you with this quarterly update of the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The program covers street, concrete, and traffic improvements (including sidewalk, curb and gutter), parks, and city facilities improvements. Projects are currently under construction or are in the planning and design phases.







Current Projects

Public Works and City Hall Facility Needs Project

This project is part of the American Rescue Plan Act offering a valuable opportunity for local agencies to enhance their infrastructure development. The Public Works and City Hall Facilities are upgrading the interior of their buildings which involves enhancing various aspects to improve functionality, aesthetics, and overall user experience. Key elements include renovating flooring, updating lighting, modernizing kitchens and restrooms, and refreshing paint/wall finishes. These upgrades will increase the building's value, improve energy efficiency, and create a more inviting environment for occupants and visitors. These improvements contribute to better safety standards and accessibility, ultimately fostering a more productive and appealing space.

ADA Transition Plan

The ADA Transition Plan project aims to enhance accessibility for individuals with disabilities throughout the city. This comprehensive initiative involves evaluating existing facilities, public spaces, and transportation systems to identify barriers and compliance issues with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The plan will outline specific strategies for making necessary improvements, prioritizing projects based on urgency and available funding. Community engagement will be a key component, especially input from residents with disabilities. Ultimately, the project seeks to create a more inclusive environment, promoting equal access to city services and facilities for all citizens.

Lawndale Security Improvement Project

The security camera project at the Public Works, Sheriff's Service Center, City Hall and Municipal Services Department facilities aims to enhance safety and security by installing a comprehensive surveillance system. This initiative will involve assessing current security needs, selecting appropriate camera technology, and determining optimal placement for maximum coverage. The project will focus on key areas such as entrances, parking lots, and high-traffic zones. Additionally, it will include features like remote monitoring and data storage to ensure efficient management and response to incidents. By improving surveillance capabilities, the project seeks to deter unauthorized access, enhance safety for employees and visitors, and provide valuable evidence in case of security incidents.

Joint City/School District Parks Irrigation Systems Assessment, **Design and Implementation Project**

The irrigation project at Rogers-Anderson, Jane Addams, and William Green parks aims to improve water management and enhance the health of landscaping and recreational areas. This initiative will involve designing and installing a modern irrigation system that efficiently distributes water to various plantings, ensuring optimal growth while conserving resources. Key components will include installing drip lines, sprinklers, and moisture sensors to automate watering schedules based on weather conditions. The project also focuses on minimizing water waste and promoting sustainability. Ultimately, the improved irrigation system will contribute to a vibrant, well-maintained park environment, benefiting both visitors and local wildlife.

Completed Projects

FY 2023/24 Annual Striping Project

The residential striping project enhanced roadway safety and accessibility in Lawndale neighborhoods. This initiative involved repainting and adding new lane markings and crosswalks to clearly define traffic patterns and improve pedestrian visibility. By focusing on high-traffic areas and school zones, the project seeks to reduce accidents and promote safer driving and walking environments. Additionally, the project incorporated community feedback to address specific local needs. Ultimately, the updated striping contributed to a more organized and safe residential area, fostering a better quality of life for residents.

FY 2022/23 Residential Street Rehabilitation Project

The City's annual street improvement program provides continual preventative maintenance to extend the life of Lawndale streets. The annual street improvement project consists of rehabilitation and reconstruction of City streets.



The scope of work for this project included pavement improvements, street striping, street reconstruction, repairing damaged sidewalks, driveways, cross gutters, and curbs and gutters. The improvements occurred on the following street segments:

- 173rd Street (Firmona Avenue to Grevillea Avenue)
- 171st Street (Grevillea Avenue to Hawthorne Boulevard)
- 167th Street (Hawthorne Boulevard to end west of Firmona Ave.)
- 166th Street (Hawthorne Boulevard to Prairie Avenue)
- 165th Street (Firmona Avenue to Grevillea Avenue)
- 163rd Street (Grevillea Avenue to Freeman Avenue)
- 154th Street (Condon Avenue to Mansel Avenue)
- 147th Street (Condon Avenue to Grevillea Avenue)
- Firmona Avenue (Marine Avenue to 147th Street)
- Kingsdale Avenue (Marine Avenue to 147th Street)
- Grevillea Avenue (145th Street to Rosecrans Avenue)
- Digouts at 14909 and 15443 Grevillea Avenue
- Digouts at 15811 and 15818 Osage Avenue
- Digouts at 14917 Burin Avenue

The project was funded through Senate Bill (SB1), Measure M, Prop C, Priority Legislative Budget Projects (PLBP) Grant Funds, and General Funds. The project was completed on September 6, 2024.

Prop A Bus Pad Project

The City received Prop A Local Transit (Metro) Funds which were used to install concrete bus pads and make improvements to sidewalk, curb and gutter within 25 feet of existing bus stops. The project aims to enhance the overall efficiency, safety, and durability of the public transportation system within the City of Lawndale. The bus stops serve Metro, Gardena Transit, Torrance Transit, Beach Cities Transit and Lawndale. Concrete bus pads extend the life of the pavement to prevent rutting in asphalt from the frequent stop and go of large buses. Bus pads also serve as stable platforms for buses and provide a range of benefits such as stability, reducing the risk of accidents and ensuring a secure surface for vehicles, as well as durability as concrete pads reduce long-term costs associated with the maintenance of bus

Concrete bus pad installation and concrete improvements occurred at the following locations:

- North side of Redondo Beach Boulevard west of Prairie Avenue
- North side of Redondo Beach Boulevard east of Freeman Avenue
- North side of Artesia Boulevard east of Inglewood Avenue
- South side of Rosecrans Avenue west of Firmona Avenue
- West side of Prairie Avenue north of 147th Street
- West side of Prairie Avenue north of 154th Street
- South side of Marine Avenue east of Firmona Avenue
- South side of Marine Avenue east of Freeman Avenue
- North side of Marine Avenue east of Freeman Avenue
- North side of Marine Avenue west of Firmona Avenue West side of Hawthorne Boulevard north of
- Manhattan Beach Boulevard
- North side of Artesia Boulevard east of Firmona Avenue

The project was fully funded using Metro Prop A funds and was completed on April 12, 2024.

Parks, Civic Center, and Sheriff Station Parking Lot Rehabilitation Project

The Parks, Civic Center, and Sheriff's Service Center Parking Lot Rehabilitation Project had an aim to address the deteriorating condition of the existing parking lots and ensure the safety and accessibility of the infrastructures for residents and visitors. Due to continuous usage and natural wear and tear, the parking lot facilities began to exhibit signs of deterioration such as cracks, potholes, uneven surfaces, and faded markings.

The scope of work included surface repairs using slurry seal and grind and overlay methods, parking lot striping, and replacement of curb, gutter, sidewalk and curb ramps. The following parking lots were addressed with this project:

- Civic Center Parking Lot
- Sheriff Station Parking Lot
- Jane Addams Park Parking Lot
- Rogers-Anderson Park Parking Lot
- William-Green Park Parking Lot

The project was funded with American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds and was completed on July 12, 2024.

Christmas Tree Recycling

Beginning December 26th through January 31st, holiday trees up to 7 feet in length will be collected curbside for single family homes and next to the dumpster at multi-family properties on the regularly scheduled trash collection days. Please remove all stands and ornaments before putting trees out for collection. If a tree is larger than 7 feet, please cut it in half for an easy and safe collection. Beginning on February 1st, trees will be collected as a bulky item and it will count toward the properties six bulky item collections that are allowed at no





Used Motor Oil & Filter Collection Program

Do you change the motor oil from your car, truck, motorcycle, boat, or lawn mower? Did you know that recycling used motor oil conserves energy and natural resources. Oil can be re-refined for reuse as motor oil or as fuel for ships. Oil filters, which are up to 80% steel, can also be recycled into useful products. It's up to you to make sure used oil and oil filters are properly discarded. Republic Services provides a free pickup service for residents to discard their non-contaminated used motor oil and filters. The Public Works Department provides supplies such as oil collection containers for the used oil and filters, funnels, and shop rags to make changing your own motor oil easy. Public Works is located at 4722 Manhattan Beach Blvd.

Do your part to keep Lawndale clean! - BULKY ITEM PICKUP SERVICE

Guidelines and Instructions

- Single family homes get 6 free pickups per year. Multi-family residents get one bulky item pickup per year per unit.
- Republic Services will pick up 6 items at a time at no extra cost.
- Place items where trash and recycling are picked up.
- Items placed on private property will not be collected.
- Lawndale Municipal Code states that materials cannot be placed for collection earlier than 3 pm the day before the scheduled collection.



Prohibited Items

- Construction Materials: wood, concrete, bricks, dirt, wall-to-wall
- Auto parts: Car seats, batteries, doors, fenders, motors, gas tanks,
- Items that cannot be safely handled by two persons: Spas, hot tubs, pianos, pool tables.
- Household Hazardous Waste.

Single family and multi-family dwellings that exceed the number of pickups or place more than 6 items out per pickup, or do not schedule their pickup in advance with Republic Services, will be charged a fee of \$27.72 for each additional item collected (rate subject to change in 2025).

To schedule a bulky item pickup, simply call Republic Services at least 24 hours in advance of your regular trash collection day at (800) 299-4898.

Municipal Services Department News

The Municipal Services Department is located at 14616 Grevillea Avenue. Office hours for the Code Enforcement and Animal Control divisions are Monday through Thursday from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Staff is also available seven days a week by calling (310) 973-3220 between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

City of Lawndale brings in Southwest Patrol to provide an extra level of safety and protection for the community.

Last year the Lawndale City Council, in response to growing concerns from residents and business owners about public safety and quality of life issues, made the decision to bring in armed security guards to assist the Sheriff's Department with addressing concerns regarding the homeless, graffiti and public safety.



Southwest Patrol is a

private security company that has a statewide presence in providing security to government agencies, school districts, private residences, and all other places in which additional security are needed. The City currently employes one armed guard for seven days a week coverage between the hours of 8:00 am until 4:30 pm, as well as five nights a week coverage between the hours of 6:00 pm until 2:00 am.

The primary aim for the security guards is to patrol all City owned facilities and buildings, as well as parks, and neighborhood streets and to provide an extra set of "eyes and ears" on community streets. The Southwest guards primary focus is to address homeless individuals that attempt to sleep or camp on City streets and sidewalks. Homeless individuals that are contacted by Southwest Patrol guards are always advised of services that are available for unhoused individuals. If services are declined, then the homeless individual is advised that

they are not allowed to stay on sidewalks or in the public right of way and are encouraged to move along.

Southwest Patrol has also been active in helping to reduce the number of unlicensed street vendors selling food on Lawndale streets. While the City does allow vendors to operate, they are required to have a valid business license from the City of Lawndale, and they must also meet all health and safety requirements.

Due to their extended hours, Southwest Patrol guards have been outstanding in preventing food trucks and food vendors from selling products without proper licensing, after regular Lawndale business hours. The City of Lawndale is grateful for the presence of Southwest Patrol and look forward to a continued partnership with them for many years.

Neighborhood Watch Meetings Open for All Residents



This year the City of Lawndale staff, in partnership with Los Angeles Sheriffs Department deputies, began hosting Neighborhood Watch meetings. Neighborhood Watch began several decades ago when community members wanted to play a larger role in assisting law enforcement with crime prevention and community policing. Over the years, the Neighborhood Watch program has evolved into a 100,000 person strong voice for citizens nationwide to meet with their local law enforcement personnel and speak safely about crime concerns, policing policies and other issues concerning residents.

On Wednesday, November 20, the City hosted its fifth Neighborhood Watch meeting of the year and we are happy to say that the turnout has been very reassuring. Many residents who are concerned about their safety in Lawndale have attended the neighborhood watch meetings, in which brief presentations on safety and crime avoidance measures are given by deputies. All meetings also have a question-and-answer portion at which time residents are free to ask deputies specific questions about safety issues, crime trends, home safety techniques, and other topics related to law enforcement and crime reduction.

Refreshments are always provided at these events and the entire community is invited to attend. Please join us for the next Neighborhood Watch Meeting.

At-Home Composting

What is composting? Composting is the act of recycling organic matter, including food waste, leaves, grass clippings, coffee grounds, and shredded newspapers, into a valuable fertilizer that can enrich your soil and plants. It's a natural process that every gardener should practice because it keeps your garden healthy and helps reduce waste!





Did you know? The City of Lawndale is providing Backyard Composting Bins for residents that want to create their own compost. These compost bins, like the one pictured to the left, are FREE for Lawndale residents. Proof of residency is required and there is a limit of one (1) bin per household as supplies are limited.

Did you also know? The City of Lawndale is also providing residents with Food Waste Bins. As a result of the passing of Senate Bill 1383 the City has received grant funds to purchase food waste bins that can help decrease the amount of organic material in the landfills. These food waste bins are FREE for Lawndale residents. Proof of residency is required and there is a limit of one (1) bin per household as supplies are limited.



Beginning on January 15, 2025, residents are encouraged to pick up a Backyard Composting Bin and/or a Food Waste Bin by visiting the Public Works Department between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00 pm Monday through Thursday.
