THE HISTORY



On July 31, 1996, by virtue of NAPOLCOM Resolution No. 96-058, the Logistics Support Command became the Philippine National Police Logistics Support Service mandated to provide logistical support and services to all units of the PNP.

Currently, the Logistics Support Service has seven divisions: Administrative and Resource Management Division; Procurement Division; Supply Storage and Distribution Division; Transportation and Maintenance Division; Property Disposal and Management Division; and Operations Management Division.

Part of our way forward, is the proposal for the restructuring and expansion of LSS to further enhance its capability.

This Unit is also mandated to perform the following:

1. Conduct procurement, storage, inventory, distribution and disposal of PNP supplies and equipment;
2. Undertake maintenance of PNP vehicles, armaments and other equipment;
3. Provide transportation services in support to operational as well as administrative activities of the PNP;
4. Undertake effective management control through accounting and monitoring of PNP supplies and equipment;
5. Conduct disposal of PNP equipment and properties which are Beyond Economical Repair (BER); and
6. Conduct other special logistics related courses for the PNP personnel.

the **DIRECTOR**



In 1987, his Dream to be of service to his country led him to the hallowed grounds of the Philippine Military Academy in Fort Del Pilar, Baguio City. In February 1992, he graduated belonging to PMA Tanglaw-Diwa Class of 1992 and started his career as a police officer in the Philippine National Police. True to his sworn duties, he exhibited fortitude as a young officer and a gentleman. During his earlier assignments in the Special Action Force from the year 1992 to 1995, he was lucky enough to have trained with the best in the PNP on almost all trainings thereat. During the SAF stint and various deployments in Central and Western Mindanao, he was awarded various military

In 2013, he went back to PRO4A having been appointed as the Chief, Regional Comptrollership Division until early 2015.

The outstanding management qualities and remarkable perseverance he manifested earned him due recognition giving him more significant responsibility of managing logistics concerns, finance, and procurement matters having been designated as the Chief at the various divisions of the Directorate for Logistics such as Logistics Resource and Management Division and Supply Management Division from 2016 to 2019.

These assignments led him to become the Executive Officer of the Directorate for Logistics in 2020, supervising the said directorate to ensure that its mission of ensuring provision of resources for PNP organization is effectively and efficiently attained. In just a year of being the Ex-O, DL and seeing his potentials as a true leader, a logistician by heart, an opportunity knocks with a surprise. He proudly accepted the helm as the Director of the Logistics Support Service on January 15, 2021 reminding its personnel of his endeavors for the unit and imply T.E.C.S. LEADING *the* WAY

JANUARY 25, 2021 (MONDAY)
FIRST LSS COMMAND CONFERENCE
“PROGRESSING BEYOND AND BETTER”

The first command conference was a very important marker in the course of the new Director – PBGEN MARIO A REYES. It is his fundamental skill in enabling the entire work force to function and perform productively, professionally, efficiently, and with purpose.

On January 25, 2021, PBGEN REYES laid up well-defined orders to the Division Chiefs of the Unit and be inculcated to all LSS personnel.

On procurement, the personnel of Procurement Division must adhere to the guidelines and procedures set forth in the PNP Memorandum Circular No. 2020-024.

Under human resource, the Administrative and Resource Management Division must regularly coordinate with the Civil Service Commission for the concern and welfare of non-uniformed personnel, and National Police Commission for uniformed personnel.

At the core of the Unit’s fundamental function, D, LSS directed the Supply Storage and Distribution Division to ensure the efficient issuance of mobility assets, as well as other equipment. SSDD was likewise charge to the continues comprehensive warehouse management system were items are properly marked according to category and stored in observance of “first in, first out” policy.

On managing the fleet, PBGEN REYES showed full support to the Transportation and Maintenance Division in which he requested to prioritize the safety and well-being of those rendering duties at the LSS Motor Pool especially in this time that the transportation services of the LSS is on the frontline.

On inventory, D, LSS ensured that the accounting, monitoring, and inventory of PNP supplies, properties, and equipment. He remarked that the accounted unserviceable firearms will be demilitarized until every single beyond economic repair (BER) firearm is disposed in accordance with PNP policies.

With his stint as the Director, LSS, PBGEN MARIO A REYES demonstrated the true essence of leadership and led the Unit to fulfill its endeavors for the betterment of the Philippine National Police and the community, from January 15 to April 16, 2021.

1. Procurement

In adherence to the Republic Act 9184 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations, this Unit effectively executed its procurement process. With this, the success on the acquisition of PNP items is detailed as follows:

Moreover, this Unit diligently processed the payment of various PNP procured items amounting to **Php1,439,383,837.42**. With this, it is ensured that PNP procures only high-quality products at a reasonable bid amount.

2. Storage and Distribution

The role of the Unit is to provide a steady source of PNP supplies and equipment. With the desire of PBGEN REYES to promptly address the logistical needs of different PNP Units, LSS distributed the following:

To step up our fight against the Covid-19 pandemic, this Unit was able to distribute a total of **307,903 Personal Protective Equipment** to PNP frontliners and different PNP units such as surgical gloves, face masks and shields, protective suits, disinfectants, shoe and head covers, general drug testing kits, thermal scanners, hand sprayers, and medicines.

Instrumental in sustaining the operational functions of different Crame-based units, LSS, through the Central Gas Station, dispensed a total of **303,844 liters of XCS gasoline**, **459,121 liters of diesel**, and **12,499 liters of unleaded gasoline**.

The registration and insurance of PNP issued vehicles is basically essential as these vehicles are intended for the day-to-day operation of PNP units. Covering the period, LSS was able to **register 408 units of PNP mobility assets in the amount of Php1,720,743.00** at the **Land Transportation Office (LTO)** and **applied 1,250 units of PNP vehicles for insurance at the Government Service Insurance System (GSIS)** in the amount of **Php5,459,759.16**.

3. Accounting and Monitoring

As a jumpstart to have all PNP supplies and equipment be inventoried, LSS conducted an accounting and monitoring of all PNP assets as liquidated.

Moreover, through the compassion of PBGEN REYES to his fellow policemen, this Unit recorded **987** verifications of property accountability and property clearances for PNP personnel separated from the service.

4. Transportation and Maintenance

Transportation as one of the core processes of the Unit is basically essential to the attainment of its mission. With this, PBGEN REYES visualizes to promote the effectiveness and roadworthiness of the transportation services of LSS.

As a result, this Unit rendered **701** transportation out of the 342 requests for General Dispatch Vehicles (GDVs) in support to the frontline and backline services of the PNP, and transported **9,021** PNP personnel and their dependents, health workers, other essential workers, government officials and other external stakeholders.



On maintenance, this Unit conducted **100** Technical Inspection with corresponding Technical Inspection Reports and completed **105** repairs/preventive maintenance on various types of GDVs.



5. Disposal Management

The NHQ Disposal Committee is chaired by PMGEN ANGELITO A CASIMIRO, Director for Logistics has LSS as its Secretariat. In order to fulfill this function, PBGEN REYES ensured that all Beyond Economical Repair (BER) property, plant and equipment are properly disposed to avoid further deterioration, decongest the disposal area, and provide benefits to the PNP through the generation of possible gains that may be obtained therefrom.

For the period covered, LSS, thru the Property Disposal Management Division, was able to dispose various BER properties of the PNP through public auction on February 9, 2021.

Likewise, LSS facilitated the demilitarization of the **1,033** units BER PNP firearms and **6,338** units BER Confiscated, Captured, Surrendered, Deposited, Abandoned and Forfeited- Turned PNP Property Firearms (CCSDAF-TPPF) on April 26, 2021.

6. Administrative and Resource Management

Personnel, logistics, and finances are considered as the main factors of a successful organization. Out of these factors, it is obvious that personnel are the most important among all because everything else depends on how well a task or work is done.

With the increase in the number of LSS personnel, PBGEN REYES initiated to boost the morale and welfare of his personnel through positive reinforcements such as

appropriate awards to deserving personnel, personal greetings to birthday celebrators, basic essentials to deployed personnel for RSSF/MRF and those who are serving in the frontlines, competency and skills development training for personnel, and other simple gestures in celebration of various activities such as Valentine’s Day and the like.

Now that the world is more globalized than ever, it is imperative for the PNP to be equipped with appropriate supplies and equipment, which is the reason why planning and procurement is deemed essential as directed by the Director for the Logistics Support Service, our Unit ensures that all accepted PNP procured items are properly stored in our warehouses and likewise distributed and issued to its end-users in a timely manner.



INSPECTION & ACCEPTANCE

The reputation and success of the Philippine National Police (PNP) largely depends upon the quality of services provided to the community and its capability to function well by acquiring the needed goods. Thus, common procedures must be taken to avoid and deal with various risks and challenges that may arise therefrom.

The PNP organized and activated a Committee named as National Committee on Inspection and Acceptance (NCIA) chaired by the Director, LSS whose function is to ensure that the bidding documents



are strictly observed and for the procured items to be compliant to either national or international standards. Most importantly, the NCIA secures our PNP personnel’s safety by ensuring that the procured items conforms and complies with NAPOLCOM specification during the functional test and evaluation (FTE) as the FTE report will be deliberated by the NCIA prior recommendation for final acceptance by the Head of our Procuring Entity.

CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR

The relationship between the Philippine National Police (PNP) and the suppliers is built on a solid foundation of value because both parties develop and nurture frequent communication to better understand the very essence of procurement.

As the Contract Administrator, PBGEN REYES supervises the various activities on the implementation of the contract such as request for delivery time extensions, progress/partial payments, final payment, and contract closeout to ensure compliance with NHQ and LSS Bids and Awards Committees' regulations, directives, policies, procedures and statutes.

To distinctly uphold trustworthiness among all, PBGEN REYES ensures timely payment of all accepted items.

As a best practice, he also initiates engagement with the suppliers to build strong partnerships, easier communication, and collaboration to improve the PNP's services to them and vice versa. With such course of action, the issues and concerns in any contract are addressed properly within the bounds of procurement law to prevent delays on PNP procurement, informing the suppliers on actions to be taken, such as updating of their warranty security, etc., prior to the acceptance of items and eventual payment.



INVENTORY

The Logistics Support Service remains steadfast in ensuring the accurate inventory of all its firearms classified as Beyond Economical Repair (BER), which is a preparatory for the eventual disposal of these BER firearms in accordance with the procedures set forth by the rules. This way, uniformity and consistency in the observance of audit procedures in the disposal of government properties is followed and complied with. In effect, as disposal is one of the primary functions of the Office, this endeavor will contribute immeasurably to the improvement of logistics services in the PNP, adhering with the guidelines and procedures set forth where transparency is highlighted.

With the sheer determination and will of PBGEN REYES, the Inventory Team inspected, accounted, and inventoried the following items.

STEWARDS OF THE EARTH

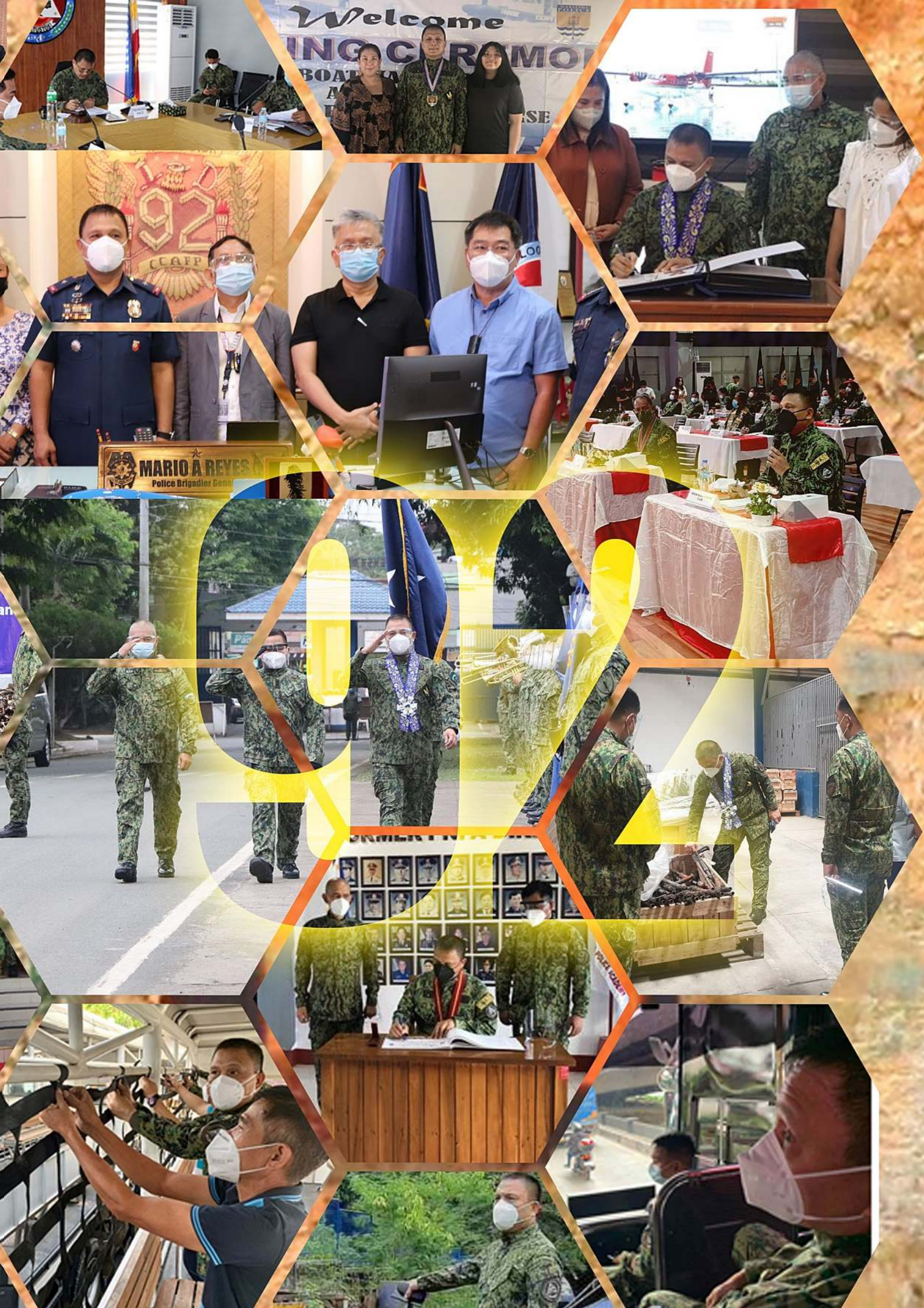

This wireless digital scanner will serve as an aid for the TMD mechanics in enhancing capabilities and ensuring the road worthiness of all GDVs. Of all the technological advances in the automotive sector over the decades, one of the most beneficial is the use of car diagnostic tools that quickly and accurately point to problem areas in a car's engine or elsewhere.

(Demilitarization and Disposal of BER Firearms)

For more several decades now, a large number of CCSDAF Firearms and BER Firearms have been on stock at the FEO Storage facility and the LSS Warehouse in Bicutan, respectively. This resulted in an overcrowded storage facility with obsolete and deteriorated firearms, unavailable to accommodate other equipment.

In line with the CPNP’s instruction to demilitarize, the Firearms Explosives Ammunition Disposal Committee (FEADC) was created. It is tasked to undertake the demilitarization/destruction of Beyond Economical Repair (BER) Firearms and BER Captured, Confiscated, Surrendered, Deposited, Abandoned, and Forfeited Firearms -Turned PNP Property Firearms (CCSDAF-TPPF).

The Logistics Support Service (LSS), as the Office Primary Responsible (OPR) in the demilitarization processes, led the activities to implement the demilitarization and disposal activities.

The Health Protocol

With this, PBGEN REYES extended his support to his personnel who were tested positive for Covid -19 by providing them basic health essentials such as Vitamin C, oral antiseptic, electric kettle, fruits and other goods at the different quarantine facilities that will help boost their immune system, to include as well the personnel rendering their everyday duties.

Medical Supplies Management

With the country’s continues battle to curb the Covid-19 pandemic, the number of positive cases rises each and everyday recording thousands based on the data being reported by the Department of Health. Due to the current situation, the Inter-Agency Task Force on Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) has no other choice but to implement an Enhance Community Quarantine in the NCR Plus Bubble, where the greatest number of Covid-19 positive cases came from.



As such, the CPNP himself, PGEN DEBOLD M SINAS, directed all PNP units and its personnel to take extra measures and strategies to address the upsurge of Covid-19 cases. Knowing the responsibility in his hands of providing medical supplies to the PNP frontliners, those rendering duties in spite of the pandemic and being the Director of LSS, PBGEN REYES personally visited and inspected the LSS warehouse (Crame-based), as part of his usual routines, to ensure that the Unit is always ready and prepared with all supplies being available when the need for it arises. For the period, a total of **307,903 Personal Protective Equipment** worth **Php5,032,998.00** was already distributed to different PNP units.

PNP Libreng Sakay

“This is the PNP’s way of reaching out to citizens by providing mobility and other extended services to authorized persons (APOR) so that they could attend to their work with convenience even while the ECQ is in effect,” – PGEN DEBOLD M SINAS stated on March 30, 2021.



The PNP “Libreng Sakay,” under the management of LSS, is traversing seven regular routes from Edsa-Crame to Meycauayan and San Jose del Monte City, Bulacan in the north; Zapote to Bacoor, Cavite in the south; and Rodriguez, Antipolo City and Taytay, Rizal in the east. The said program has been observing the minimum health protocol for transportation as enforced by the IATF-IED such as the 50 percent seating capacity and temperature scanning to every passenger. Part of the initiative is the provision of free face masks, bottled water, and Covid-19 awareness leaflets to the commuters.

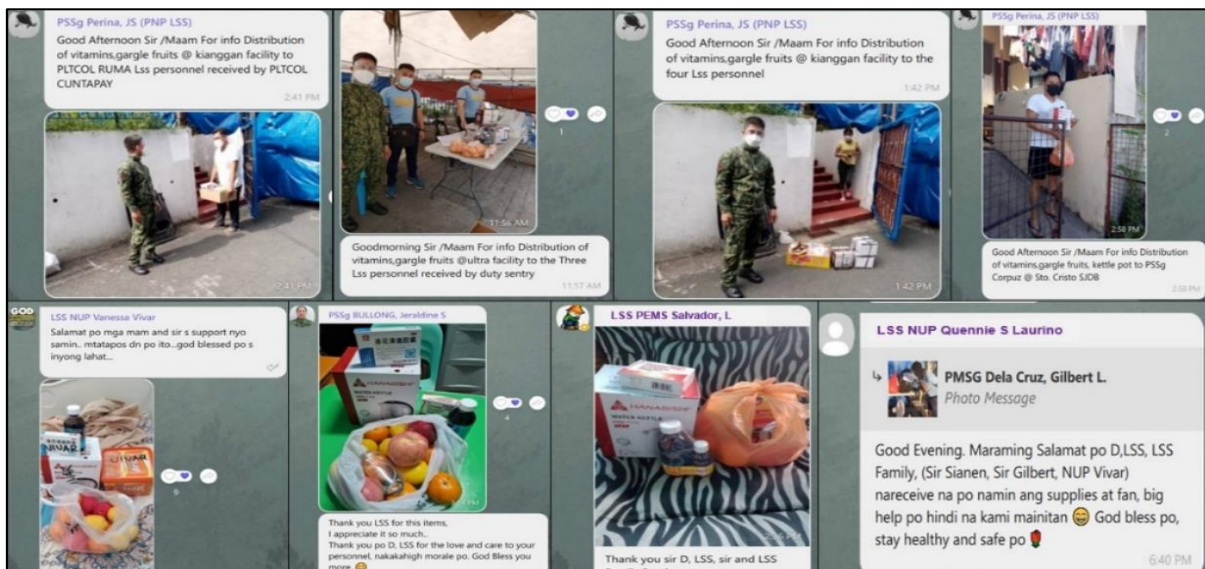
INFLUENCE & COMPASSION
