- **Discovery Zone:** 21,690 pairs of hands engaged in dramatic play, iterative thinking and creative problem solving with hands-on STEM activities that rotated monthly
- Art Room: 9,127 children created in the alwaysopen, fully-stocked art space

Strong Families, Strong Neighborhoods

Supporting children by engaging the family & neighborhood network

- Whole Family Programs: Family engagement programming included family early literacy education, family nutrition classes and more
- School Engagement Nights: Launched family engagement nights for schools, introduced KPL Kids to over 85 people at the inaugural event



Developmental screenings and other family services offered at the library in partnership with local child development experts


- Meeting Families Where They Are: Conducted developmental screenings and provided access to community experts for 112 children






YMCA ACHIEVERS PROGRAM
