BUILDING COMMUNITY THROUGH THE MAGIC OF THEATER

at Grays Harbor College

"Theater has the power to teach, to heal, to connect us to ourselves and our community," explains Dr. Andrew Gaines, Ph.D. "It's both my joy and my passion."

That passion has taken Gaines to stages and lecture halls around the world as an actor, director, educator and healer. In the fall of 2018, it brought him to **Grays Harbor College** to head up the Department of Theater Arts and Communication.

With a rich background in community engagement, Gaines has thought a great deal about the significant role theater plays in Grays Harbor. "To me, one of the things that is so amazing about theater is to watch people work together to summon their creative powers and build a reality," he says. "It's magic! And we could all use a little more magic in our lives."

The community participated in that magic this spring when Gaines directed the **Grays Harbor College** production of *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum.* Blending Steven Sondheim's music with a hilarious, gender-bending cast of sparkling local talent, the production hit its mark, delighting audiences.

Gaines has been thrilled to see the enthusiasm Grays Harbor holds for theater and speculates that part of that enthusiasm arises from the power of theater to change lives. Through the medium of stories, both the performers and the audience exercise their imaginations to safely explore the range of human experience. "They create something bigger than themselves," he explains. "That can be inspiring and rejuvenating, even cathartic."

The community will again have the opportunity to join in the fun with the Grays Harbor College 2019-2020 theater offerings. The season will include a fall production of the comedy *You Can't Take It with You*, followed by the musical *Oliver* in the winter. Auditions for both plays will be open to the public, with auditions for *You Can't Take It with You* scheduled for September 25 and 26, 2019.


In the long term, Gaines hopes to help develop more community outreach, to demonstrate how theater can offer unique benefits to participants in a way that other services cannot. He envisions a service-oriented course in which students learn to use theater to work with under-served populations, such as building inter-generational connections in senior centers or working with disadvantaged youth.

One thing is certain. Whether in the classroom or on the stage, Dr. Gaines will continue to inspire actors, change lives and help all of us summon the magic that we need to find hope in a world that seems to find hope in short supply.

'THE GARAGE' NURTURES MUSICIANS



Walking into The Garage: Music and Art Center for the first time is a unique experience. One of the first things you notice is a stage surrounded by guitars, basses, keyboards and drums. The walls are decorated with paintings, etchings, and photographs from Grays Harbor artists. A children's art station is set up with rocks for painting and pictures to color. A retail section to one side offers guitar strings, drum sticks, and clarinet reeds. From the practice rooms escape the faint sounds of piano and guitar lessons and practice sessions. There is almost always music in the air as community members perform, rehearse, record, take lessons, or just sit and enjoy a cup of coffee.

The Garage is a volunteer-run nonprofit community Arts center music venue, art gallery, rehearsal and lesson space, and music store.

It is a creation of the 98520 Music and Arts District Initiative, a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization. The nonprofit's mission: "to promote and facilitate the education, creation, development, display, performance and consumption of various art forms in Grays Harbor County". Their goal is to provide access and opportunity for artists and musicians to learn, share, and grow.

The space contains practice rooms, art stations, a stage, and more than one hundred musical instruments and accessories available for free community use. Free community jam sessions and open mics regularly adorn the calendar, although, according to Assistant Director Kelly Durham, "We have impromptu jam sessions all the time. I'm constantly amazed by all of the talent we have out here!"The all-ages events held at The Garage bring together musicians of all skill levels to share their art in a comfortable, low-pressure setting. The stage is regularly booked by bands and individual musicians for ticketed all-ages concerts and benefit events as well. Most shows start at 7:00pm.

The Garage also hosts many youth programs, including Youth Orchestra Unbound, Poco Voce Children's Choir, Kindermusik, and the Homeschool Orchestra programs. Most recently,

The Garage teamed up with another nonprofit, The Bridge Music Project, to host grant-funded songwriting workshops for youth age fourteen to twenty one. Their goal is to empower and help guide youth through music. Participants with The Bridge get the experience of writing their own songs, recording with a professional audio engineer, and performing their new creations for a live audience. Bobby Williams, Executive Director for The Bridge Music Project says, "Working with The Garage has been such a meaningful experience. It was the perfect team up because of what is at the core of both of our organizations; empowerment through music."

The Garage: Music and Arts Center is located in the Shoppes at Riverside at 1017 S Boone Street in Aberdeen. They are open Monday through Saturday from 12:00pm to 7:00pm, although the doors usually stay open until everyone is done making music or the last bus leaves.



















COSMOPOLIS

- Johnny is gathering molten glass in the furnace on the blowpipe. The furnace must be at least 2000° and is never turned off.
- ► Johnny is rolling the glass on the marver to form a cylinder shape.





- ▲ Johnny dips the glass into crushed colored glass to add color.
- Darlene blows into the pipe while Johnny rolls it to shape the glass. The processes of gathering, shaping, and blowing glass are repeated many times until the desired size and shape is reached.



MASTER GLASS ARTISTS IN OUR OWN BACKYARD

Back in 300 BC

the Syrians invented the blowpipe which led to the invention of glass blowing.
During the Roman Empire, glass masters experimented with new techniques, laying the foundation for methods still used in glass blowing today. Italy continues to be famous for its beautiful glass designs. Which leads me to Johnny Camp, who owns Opal Glass with his wife, Darlene.

Johnny studied glass blowing for 7 years under Michael Nouvot, who had worked at the prestigious Venini factory in Italy making Murano glass. While working for Nouvot, Johnny and Darlene starting constructing their own glass making equipment on their own time with the dream to eventually have their own studio.

Fourteen years ago, Johnny and Darlene opened Opal Art Glass in Cosmopolis. The quality and beauty of their work has created worldwide demand and their glass creations are in galleries across America. We hope you enjoy this pictorial essay of the complex process Johnny and Darlene use in creating their art glass.



THE MEDICINE IN

Depression ... Anxiety ... More depression ... More Anxiety ... It's everywhere!

It floods my family medicine office on a daily basis as distraught patients fight the anguish of their own minds deceiving them. Living their lives in "survival mode". It buries my desk at the end of the day as I sort through the jumble of completed depression and anxiety screening forms. They're full of questions that don't even come close to scratching the surface of the turmoil that mental illness has on the lives of those completing them. It's even in my own head, like an unwelcome parasite that consumes far more of my energy than it deserves.

I became an osteopathic physician in part due to my strong belief in the connection between the mind, spirit and physical health. When our physical health suffers, as does our mental and emotional well-being. During times of emotional struggle we often turn

to the arts for comfort and relief from our feelings of unease. We've all seen movies that touched our hearts because the characters seemed to know us personally, heard songs that seemed to be written just for us in that exact moment in our life, or read a poem or story that expresses emotions identical to our own but likely articulated much more elegantly than we could ever take credit for.

Art has become

Art has become a very effective medicine that is accessible without requiring a prescription or insurance preauthorization. Studies have

demonstrated that incorporating the arts into medical treatment can help to control pain, decrease anxiety, improve immune response and even improve cardiovascular health. Music is the most studied form of art therapy, but visual arts such as drawing can help patients to better understand and make sense of their diagnoses. Expressive writing about experiences perceived by patients as traumatic improves mental and physical health, decreases doctor's visits and improves immune system function (Stuckey HL, Nobel J. The connection between art, healing, and public health: a review of current literature. Am J Public Health. 2010;100(2):254-263).

I would like to challenge my readers to explore the art around them this summer! Here in the beautiful Pacific Northwest we have access to a myriad of experiences that can help us feel healthier, stronger and happier.







DISCOVERING TUNBLED



Priving down the State Route
105 on the way to Tokeland or
Raymond, have you noticed
a huge cement mixer with
"Elements Glass Art" emblazoned
on its side? What on earth does a
cement mixer and art glass have
to do with each other anyway?







The photographer's driveway is 'paved' with tumbled glass.

Michelle Lester, co-owner of Elements Glass Art, explains that tumbling glass for a few days in the mixer acts like the ocean on sea glass, softening all the edges. The local community supplies Michelle with the glass she uses for her products by bringing their empty bottles and jars, depositing to the barrels next to the mixer.

Tumbled glass is mostly used for landscaping, such as walking paths, driveways (see mine), flowerbeds, and in aquariums. Michelle also creates tumbled glass mosaics that look lovely with the light coming in through a window.

Michelle Lester came to be a glass artist rather circuitously. She was born and raised in Yakima. She got her degree at Central Washington U. in biology and worked on the amphibian team for the I-90 Expansion







Project, and as a natural science educator for the Yakima Arboretum. In 2014, she became interested in glass and in that year became a full-time glass artist. When the Yakima River was rerouted through her property, she moved to her favorite vacation spot, North Cove.
