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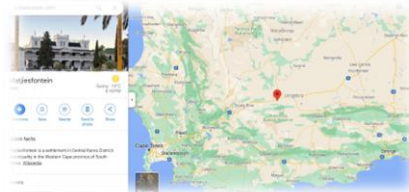
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Looking for a winter weekend getaway?

The village is situated off the N1 in the Karoo, a two-hour drive from Cape Town, en route to Johannesburg, and near the turnoff to Sutherland. The village boasts breathtaking views and a serene atmosphere with plenty to explore. It is the ideal choice for a memorable winter holiday.

The railway line, Station Masters office, signal room, and Marie Rawdon Museum are located to the east.

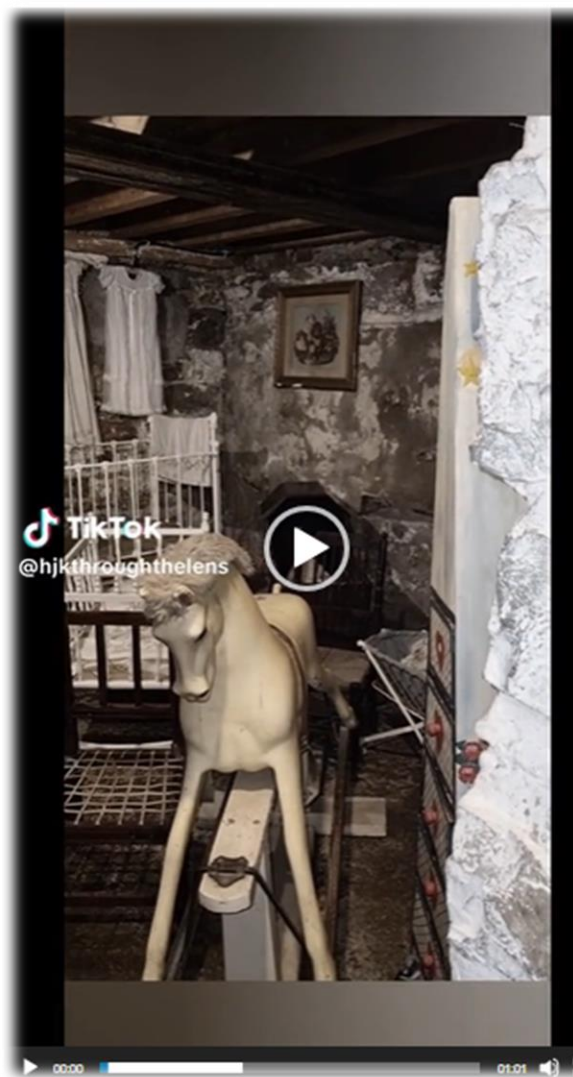

### The Marie Rawdon Museum

The museum is situated in the railway station building and covers the basement and ground floor. David Rawdon, the Laird of Matjiesfontein, was a frequent collector of Victorian artifacts. From personal and household items to antique war souvenirs, he collected a variety of objects. The museum is known as one of the most comprehensive privately owned museums and Matjiesfontein's second oldest.
