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

PRIDE HE SAID-SHE SAID, QUIPS AND QUALMS

THE MAYOR'S OFFICE

According to an announcement from Chicago **Mayor Brandon Johnson**'s office that was issued several weeks ago, the Pride parade this year, is capped off at 150 entries.

Johnson's office said the change was made after the city "engaged in a collaborative effort with the Mayor's Advisory Council on LGBTQ+ Affairs, Chicago Pride Parade organizers, the business community, residents, and multiple City agencies."

WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

The plan to reduce the size of the parade came after the city's Department of

Transportation and Chicago Police raised safety and logistical concerns. Organizers said at that time that priority entries will be given to LGBTQ+ organizations, groups, businesses and those with LGBTQ Employee Resource Groups.

In addition to the number of entries being reduced, the parade this year will be stepping off an hour earlier, at 11am, instead of noon. The parade route will also be shortened by at least six to seven blocks.

The parade is expected to attract more than a million people through Uptown, Lakeview and Lincoln Park neighborhoods, the same week as Fourth of July and the weekend before NASCAR's Chicago Street Race.

VEGAN OR NOT!

"Of course safety is the most important, but if they're still going to get a million people out here, that's still a million people.

It doesn't matter if it's an extra 45 minutes or not," said **Michael Hornick**, owner of The Chicago Diner near Roscoe and Halsted.

THE PARADE ORGANIZERS AGREE TO DISAGREE

Statement from PRIDEChicago, organizers of the parade said "We understand there will be some disappointed groups that will not march with us this year; we extend a heartfelt thank you for your support and understanding. The Pride Parade has always been about celebrating LGBTQ+ pride, unity, and solidarity, and this year will be no different. As we prepare for this milestone event, we remain committed to prioritizing LGBTQ+ organizations, LGBTQ+owned businesses, and businesses with LGBTO **Employee Resource Groups."**

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PRODUCERS OF CHICAGO'S PRIDE FEST

While some people are disappointed, others say they're ready for the celebration. Despite the changes, the executive director of the Northalsted Business Alliance Kevin Barbeau said "they're excited for the parade this summer."

THE ALDERMAN'S OFFICE

Alderman Bennett Lawson (44th Ward) issued the following statement: We continue to have conversations with the Chicago Police Department, city partners, local organizations, and the parade organizers on this year's Pride Parade. We are all committed to ensuring a safe and successful event for the community in June, and look forward to sharing more updates soon."

EQUALITY ILLINOIS

The head of one of Chicago's largest LGBTQ+ groups, Equality Illinois, said that he found the city's decision to downsize the parade "deeply upsetting" during a time when many in the LGBTQ+ community feel under attack politically. "This is going to be the fewest number of floats that we know of in decades." said **Brian Johnson**, CEO of Equality Illinois. "At a time when our community and our allies have worked so hard to make Illinois the beacon of queer dignity in the Midwest, and maybe in the country, this is not the right time to cut back on such a signature event."

THE MAYOR'S LGBTQ+ ADVISORY COUNCIL

The head of the Mayor's Advisory Council on LGBTQ+

Affairs, **Jin-Soo Huh** said LGBTQ+ community members were left out of early discussions making changes to the summer event, which has been held in Chicago for over 50 years to commemorate the 1969 Stonewall uprising in New York City.


"Pride Parade organizers shouldn't have been put in this position to make these cuts, changes in the route, the city should have engaged the community in making this decision," Huh said. "The primary organizers agreed to these changes, noting that time became a factor because they have to make sure they give new entries ample notice for them to prepare." The advisory council and parade organizers agreed to the compromise of 150 entries, which is a nearly 25% decrease compared with last year, in part because there wasn't much time before the parade steps off,.

BACK TO THE MIDDLE AND AROUND AGAIN

Organizers said they were less concerned with changes to the time and parade route and just wished they had been included in discussions before city officials began proposing those changes.



"That decision was made about our community without us at the table," Huh said. "Pride for us isn't just a parade for the LGBTQ+ community. It's a celebration of our community, standing up to suppression methods that told us that we do not belong in celebration of being free to live our truths and being visible. And so it's not just an event to manage."



This year marks the 30th anniversary of the festival which will be highlighted with performances by DJ Dan Slater, DJ **Abel** and **Trixie Mattel** and is a highlight of the city's calendar, featuring a colorful parade, live music and drag performances. Pensacola Pride draws tens of thousands of visitors and is one of the largest and most unique pride experiences in the country.

Another not to be missed event in Pensacola is their annual LGBTQ+ film festival called **Stamped**. Stamped Film Festival was spearheaded in 2012 by **Sara Latshaw** to create a more accepting, safe, and educated community. The film festival board and organization has continued to grow over the years with increased attendance at the annual film festival and by hosting other outreach activities. Stamped showcases the artistic contribution of LGBTQ+ film and filmmakers from all over the world. In 2015, the festival re-branded itself from Pensacola LGBTQ+ Film Fest to 'Stamped Film Festival', a name paying homage to the days when Memorial Day Weekend LGBTQ tourists stamped their money to demonstrate their significant impact on the local economy.

For cat lovers, I highly recommend a visit to the Coastal Cat Café to play with and/or adopt one of their beautiful feline friends. The café is opened a few months ago, and reservations are recommended to visit. About 20 cats roam freely between two rooms where they interact with visitors who are encouraged to give them some of their favorite treats. Unfortunately, my hotel didn't allow animals otherwise I may have added a new member to my family. Almost 50 cats have been adopted by café visitors.



Foodies searching for authentic Gulf Coast flavors, should head to Flounder's Chowder House, a beloved local institution since 1979. Located on the scenic Pensacola Beach Boardwalk, this laid-back eatery specializes in fresh seafood dishes, including their famous chowder and signature crab cakes. Relax on the outdoor patio, feel the gentle sea breeze, and savor the flavors of the Gulf as you dine overlooking the pristine white sands and emerald waters of Pensacola Beach. I ordered the legendary Bushwacker, a milkshake-style cocktail created in Pensacola, to accompany my entrée which consisted of blackened red snapper with sauteed asparagus. The snapper was cooked to perfection and was accompanied by a delicious sauce.

End your visit to Pensacola with a sunset dolphin cruise with Frisky Mermaid Boat Tours. My particular excursion was led by an all-female crew and was wonderful despite only getting to see a few dorsal fins. The tour lasts for about two hours and the friendly crew try their best to seek out as many beautiful dolphins as possible, although sometimes they can be hard to find. Nature can be unpredictable.

Pensacola offers a wealth of experiences for visitors to discover. From vibrant markets and culinary delights to historic landmarks and natural wonders, this charming city has something for everyone. Whether you're exploring its rich cultural heritage or simply basking in the beauty of its coastal landscapes, Pensacola is sure to leave a lasting impression on all who visit.



FILTER OUT THOSE DISTRACTIONS AND FIND YOU!

FOMO (Fear Of Missing Out) is real. Everything from technology, to the news, to ways we relate to each other and, of course, FOMO, serve as distractions. Distractions reduce our ability to attend to what is important in our lives, how we do our jobs, and how we live day to day.

Regardless of how confident we are in our ability to manage distractions and multi-task, we are vulnerable to the pull of distracting possibilities and what we "should be doing and accomplishing" according to the media and others who have absorbed the pressure of our world of technological comparisons to each other. In some brief way, hopefully this article will mobilize you to manage some of the distractions; that is, filter them out and help you find you.

Is a productive day at work one where you served as a juggler? Juggling tasks and people without taking a breath may feel productive, but has any of this really helped you produce work that is higher level and done more expertly and in tune with your best skill set? Is the barrage of people and assignments distractions to what real productivity could look like? Would a few quiet moments just cause you to be mediocre at what you do? Distractions and disruptions can mean you have to do more in less time, experience more feelings of job insecurity and frustration and just more feelings of stress. If it seems like you are working harder to accomplish less, that might just be the case.

Have you ever started a work project or a paper for school and your phone dings to alert you to a text or some other notification and after you

pause to look at it and return to your project/paper somehow you don't feel like what you were working on is coming along as well or at the same pace? That is a perfect example of how a mindless distraction, something we do every day, collides with doing things well and doing things in a focused and manageable way. Perhaps you have used these distractions to avoid doing things and maybe the tasks at hand don't even get done as you watch your last Youtube video of people falling 3 hours.

Well, Now what? Here are a few tips for reducing distractions and feeling less disrupted.

Set a goal for what you want to get done each day. Personally or professionally, having a daily goal is one way to help focus you. With a goal in mind, distractions and disruptions will be less appealing and it may feel like it is more important to avoid them. You may have to silence your phone.

Close your office door or study away from home. You will see that, although this feels uncomfortable at first, you will begin to see that the change in your environment and extra quiet time makes you more efficient and may even improve your quality of work.

Pick a time to stop looking at social media and email when at home. Even gaining a half hour of time away from constantly looking at your email, texts and social media postings will give you downtime you didn't even know you had lost. You may have more time to relate to others, attend to pets, read a book, meditate, etc.

HALT+B means: Never let yourself get Hungry, Angry, Lonely, Tired or Bored. Each of these or any combination of these can cause feelings that make distractions and disruptions because you are struggling to focus.

In order to stay focused, you have to take a break that is scheduled and then get right back to the focus. It is almost like blinking your eyes when you need to rest them. A reasonably timed break, may be just enough to keep you in good focus over time.

These ideas are simple, and they won't be easy. We are so used to being distracted that we accept it as a way of life.

BAD Rachael, Jorge and TRAX! **YOU are BANNED!** I only wish I could have been around to see Vince's reaction if he read last month's column, So, shade doesn't get better than this! **PRICELESS!** We left there and had a great time at **Buzzed** by Zea, where the owner Lee served us some "special of the house" lavender martini's that were shaken and delicious!

The Big Bash at Millennium Park on June 2nd was fun, but mostly because of the audience. It was great to see thousands of people who truly loved house music. The DJ's were OK but some of them weren't even from Chicago.

The high point of the party was when **New York** DJ **Tony Touch**, played the ORIGINAL Version of "Move Your Body." I don't think it mattered who played it. I enjoyed the dancers on stage with Tony. My friend **BRAVEMONK**, who is from **Chicago** and a legendary Hip Hop and House dancer brought on his dance troop. After Tony Touch, **Farley Jackmaster Funk** came out and stole the show.

He brought on stage some children saying they are the future, and having them sway, and do their own form of Jacking. What surprised me about Farley was the fact that when he played "Love Can't Turn Around" he sang part of it, and it sounded very good. The legendary vocalist Darryl Pandy, had passed away years back, so it was appropriate, though it would have been nice if he was mentioned. Farley brought on **Rhyme Fest** who was the only live vocalist to perform at the concert, with his hype man.



The Jack Master ended his set with a surprise visit from **Mayor Brandon Johnson**. I do have one good thing to say about our Mayor, Johnson supports HOUSE MUSIC! Now if we could only "Jack" away the city-wide problem of CRIME!



One would assume with digital media having replaced, or attempted to replace vinyl, record stores would be scarce. On the contrary, not only have many record stores survived the digital and Covid era, a new generation of record stores and other sales outlets such as Discogs, eBay and social media platforms, have emerged and have contributed to the resurgence of vinyl. I've created a list based on internet searches and social media platforms, record stores and music outlets, as well as online sellers in Chicago and suburbs. I'll be visiting and reviewing these vinyl enthusiasts for boiMAGazine.

Recently, I ventured out to Gilberts, IL to meet with owner, **Clark** at **Old Lady Records**. Clark, a former firefighter and paramedic for 15 years was hurt on the job and unable to perform work related protocol, and has developed a passion for vinyl, specializing in hard to find classics of all formats. Clark has three locations and stores over thirty thousand pieces of vinyl and other musical collectibles such as 8-tracks, VHS, cassettes, and memorabilia.



In 2023, owner Clark purchased the WRXT archives which included vinyl, reel to reel interviews with such recording artists as John

Lennon, Frank Zappa, Pete Townsend, Billy Corgan, and the list goes on.

The collection also includes a large amount of broadcast carts which include vocal drops from every known band/musician, to grace **WXRT** studios. I took time to sort through bins and baskets filled with classics. Clark carries a wide assortment of vinyl at 180 grams, UK first pressings, International releases not distributed in the U.S., **Beatles** and **Monkees** memorabilia, and many sealed/mint copies of hard to find classics.



There are many great finds. I've noticed on Facebook Marketplace, sellers have taken to 'bundling' to maximize sales. For example, purchase 50 records at a cost of 50.00. The bundle will always include well known artists such as **Zeppelin**, **Floyd**, **Styx**, **Supertramp**, etc in where these records will be in very good condition.

Obviously this entices anyone, including myself. The remainder of the 'bundling' package' includes other well known titles from **Steely Dan, America, Doobie Brothers, Linda Ronstadt** etc, also referred to as **Yacht Rock**. Bundling has proven to be a good marketable-concept. Additionally, buyers have dropped in on Clark from other states to stock up on vinyl, to be resold at their stores. There are \$1 bins and up. Be prepared to spend time diggin' for vinyl.

Pink Floyd released the "Ummagumma" LP in 1969 (UK). The original UK pressing, includes a record cover of **GiGi**, a sexual slang during the 60's in England. The term "Ummagumma" was also considered a sexual slang during the 60's, though Pink Floyd denied it.

For this reason, the original "Ummagumma" record with GiGi on the cover, did not make it into the United States, making this a collectible. While I've read this LP sells in the thousands, it can be bought in the U.S. on eBay or Discogs, for less, or buy it from Clark for \$100.00. Dear Constantly Comparing in Chicago,



SEXBOT TECHTRENDS by Jack Santo


INTIMATE TECHNOLOGY

Looking ahead, the ongoing advancements in AI technology suggest that sex robots may become more sophisticated.

The integration of more sensitive Al could lead to robots that better understand and respond to human emotions and preferences.

However, achieving the level of complexity required for genuine human-like interactions is a considerable challenge that remains to be overcome.

The evolution of sexbot technology reflects a blend of significant advancements and ongoing challenges. As Al continues to advance, we may see further improvements in the realism and capabilities of these robots, but the vision of fully autonomous, emotionally intelligent sexbots akin to those in science fiction remains in the realm of future possibilities. Combined with the currently high cost of owning sexbots and the potential legislative actions preventing sexbot brothels, the widespread presence of sexbots in every home or on every corner should be not an immediate concern for anti-robot campaigners. This suggests that, in the immediate future, sexbots may remain a niche market rather than a ubiquitous aspect of everyday life.



With this context in mind, let's now explore the demographics of current and prospective sexbot users, delving into the psychological and social implications that accompany the use of robots for physical and emotional intimacy.

The landscape of sexbot usage and interest is complex and varied, encompassing a range of demographics, motivations, and societal perceptions. Drawing along with data from a 2013 YouGov poll.

Let's take a look at the multifaceted nature of sexbot interaction.

Some self-identified men, particularly younger ones, show a more pronounced interest in sexbots. Though the demographics show primarily CIS men, there is some interest among the LGTBQI+ community as well. Heterosexual self-identified women, while currently a minority in this domain, are also showing growing interest. This trend indicates a gender and sexual identity divergence in the appeal of sexbots.



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Older individuals, particularly those who have lost a partner; are older and disabled live with an older disabled partner; or are reluctant to reenter the dating scene, are increasingly considering sex robots as an option.



According to representative surveys, such as those conducted by YouGov, public interest in sex robots has increased over time. Starting from 2013, when about 9% of the population indicated a willingness to have sex with a robot, the percentage rose to about 20-30% in 2020. In surveys conducted by Simon Dubé's team, which might have self-

selection biases, they found approximately 50% of male and 30–40% of self-identified female respondents would be interested in or willing to try a sex robot.

Contrary to popular belief that loneliness is the main driver, the interest in sexbots appears more aligned with sexual exploration, diversity, and the desire to enact fantasies or spice up relationships. In Dubé's research, a smaller group indicated interest due to difficulty in accessing partners. Other motivations include older adults seeking companionship after losing a partner and individuals preferring non-human intimacy.

Interest in sexbots is more correlated with individuals' attitudes towards sexuality (erotophilia, erotophobia) rather than their attitudes towards technology. More liberal individuals, especially women, might be more open to the idea of sexbots compared to more conservative counterparts.

Media representations often focus on a stereotypical portrayal of femininity in sexbots, which may not accurately reflect the diversity of consumer interests. The actual requests received by manufacturers from customers, including men, and women, are highly diverse and often seek representations of alternative human eroticism.

The high customization level of sex robots, suggesting their potential to cater to a wide range of preferences and needs. The interest in sexbots spans genders, ages, and personal circumstances, driven by diverse factors such as exploration, companionship, and education.

These insights reflect an evolving landscape of human interest and engagement with sexbots, challenging traditional notions of intimacy and pushing the boundaries of technological interaction in human sexuality.

Sexbots represent a paradigm shift in how we perceive intimacy and companionship. While they offer an avenue for sexual exploration and the fulfillment of desires that might be unmet in human relationships (stop; think about that; let's say that again: sexbots offer an avenue for sexual exploration and the fulfillment of desires that might be unmet in human relationships), they also raise profound questions about the nature of the human connection.

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
