


Thank you to everyone who has supported me, our team, and our mission.

Our Mission



Chelan County Mountain Rescue is dedicated to saving lives through search, rescue, emergency medical care and mountain safety education in Chelan County, Washington and surrounding areas.

WHY WE EXIST

The Chelan County Sheriff's Office is the agency responsible for coordinating backcountry rescues within the county.

Many search and rescue incidents are handled by Chelan County Volunteer Search and Rescue (CCVSAR). However, the resources and specialized training required for conducting technical rock and ice rescues along with emergency medical care, and navigating challenging terrain year-round often exceed the capacity of these groups.

Chelan County Mountain Rescue bridges this gap, offering expertise for technical rescues beyond the capabilities of the Sheriff's staff and local ground SAR teams.

WHY WE DO IT

Travel in the mountains comes with risk, and sometimes things go wrong, even when you've done everything right. What happens if there's no one to call? Our members know how important it is to have rescue services available, and so we pay it forward.

As experienced climbers, backcountry skiers, mountain travelers, and medical professionals, our team recreates in our region and we care about the safety of our community and each other.

We are dedicated to being a reliable resource when things go wrong. We help those who may be having their most difficult day in the mountains.



CCMR'S SMALL BUT CAPABLE TEAM HANDLES A LARGE SERVICE AREA


Our service area is big! From The Enchantments, to Stevens Pass, to WA Pass, CCMR covers some of the most sought after northwest areas for outdoor recreation.

How We Train

DEDICATION IN TRAINING, EXCELLENCE IN RESCUE

Each year, CCMR volunteers invest hundreds of hours honing skills to ensure fast and competent rescues in Chelan County's rugged terrain. Our members train year-round-meeting monthly for team exercises and dedicating weekends to advanced training.

In 2024, we completed 23 training activities, covering medical skills, winter and avalanche rescue and terrain management, low and high-angle rigging, gear anchors, helicopter operations, and more. Additionally, we completed the Mountain Rescue Association winter accreditation, reinforcing our commitment to the highest standards in training and ensuring we are prepared with the latest rescue techniques.

To operate effectively in alpine environments no matter the season or conditions, continuous training is essential. Our rigorous training ensures we're always ready to respond when it matters most.


Missions & Incidents



Our Impact in 2024

In 2024 we saw a decline in overall callouts, largely due to an increase in responses by CCVSAR. Despite this, our mission hours (the time our team was deployed in the field) increased over the prior year. As usual, the Stuart/Enchantments zone was by far our busiest area. 70% of our incidents in 2024 originated from this area.

COLCHUCK LAKE SPINAL INJURY

Date and Time: Aug 24, 1:14AM Number of Team Members: 12

WHAT HAPPENED

In the early hours on a Saturday in August, CCMR was notified of an SOS being activated via cell phone. The SOS reported two hikers had fallen and sustained significant injuries: One subject with a possible head and spinal injury, and a second with a possible hip injury.

CCMR sent in a team of two during the night to assess the situation. It was determined the injuries to the first hiker were extensive and the team requested a helicopter hoist. Weather conditions prevented this, so CCMR requested additional responders to help with a carryout. After hours of moving the patient down the trail, the weather cleared enough to finally hoist via helicopter. The patients were extracted via Army helicopter, and CCMR hiked out.

AFTER ACTION REVIEW

This mission highlighted CCMR's adaptability in the face of uncertainty. When weather delayed the helicopter rescue, responders began a ground evacuation to keep the patient moving toward safety. As conditions improved, the team quickly transitioned to an air extraction, ensuring the patient received timely medical care.







CUTTHROAT PEAK RAPPEL ACCIDENT

Date and Time: Apr 28, 9:47PM Number of Team Members: 8

WHAT HAPPENED

What Happened: Two climbers both in need of a rescue due to a rappelling accident. One climber with a broken leg and the other climber stranded on a cliff with out a rope.

Due to the remote location and distance from our team the Navy was requested to attempt a hoist but weather prevented it. CCMR teams were able to ascend to the climbers and move them to a location where the Navy was able to hoist the injured climber the next morning.

AFTER ACTION REVIEW

CCMR's field teams had to travel a significant distance to WA Pass and reach climbers in a remote area in poor conditions. The mission was a success both because of effective communication with the Navy and other SAR partners, combined with our teams ability to climb quickly in technical rock, ice, and snow terrain.

2024 FINANCIALS
