

## Our Work

#### **Alberta Youth Leaders for Environmental Education**

The Alberta Youth Leaders for Environmental Education (AYLEE) program engaged 66 youth leaders representing 20 urban and rural Alberta schools. AYLEE members were able to connect with like-minded youth; learn about the environment, energy, and climate change; and collaborate on projects that advance environmental education and climate action. 19 youth attended the first in-person gathering since the pandemic at the University of Calgary and again in October during their Fall Summit in Lacombe, AB, to begin action planning for the new school year and discuss topics such as leadership and advocacy.

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## **AYLEE Receives an Emerald Award**

On June 1, 2022, AYLEE was recognized for its achievements at the 31st Annual Emerald Awards under the following category - Youth - Recognizing people, 25 years of age and under, who have made meaningful contributions and have taken positive action to improve the environmental health of their community.

Receiving the Emerald Award with AYLEE has been one of my proudest achievements. It felt like the pinnacle of AYLEE, like a cumulative recognition of all of AYLEE's success since it began.

AYLEE won this award because it ultimately supports and connects youth to change-making opportunities. Many youth are ambitious to drive change but lack direction for their efforts. AYLEE has been supportive enough to channel these ambitions into meaningful projects while still maintaining the youth's voice behind it all. This was exemplified in our revision of the 2016 AYLEE student's White Paper on Education Recommendations to the Alberta Government.

I think the success of our collective effort on this project was a major motivation to continue on to more ambitious things. This included our series of community workshops, led by youth trying to engage different perspectives on environmental education and facilitate a more universal knowledge of the importance of environmental education. The initiative and student-led nature of our projects like these are what I think led to winning the award since it demonstrates that youth are capable of channelling their ambition in major ways rather than just holding sentiment without action.



Winning the emerald award has tremendously impacted me, as it has validated my faith in youth accomplishment. Seeing everyday students from regular schools all over Alberta made me realize that all youth can achieve their ambitions. #### **EcoSchools in Alberta**

As the service delivery partner for EcoSchools Canada, ACEE supported **101** schools across the province that engaged in Eco Action projects. The certification program nurtures environmental learning and climate action and is free to all publicly funded Alberta Schools.

#### Workshops and Conventions

ACEE staff designed unique professional learning opportunities for educators and delivered presentations at ATA conventions, conferences, and professional development learning days. During the convention season, February to March 2022, teachers received information and resources on climate education, climate justice, climate solutions, EcoSchools, energy, green careers, Indigeneity, outdoor learning, and youth leadership. Workshops allow teachers to connect and collaborate with other passionate educators and youth across Alberta.

1,399 teachers supported at conventions

66 workshops delivered

#### **Summer Institute with Climate Generation**

In partnership with Climate Generation, ACEE was the Canadian Lead for the 2022 Summer Institute Find[ing] Our Collective Strength,' a three-day virtual professional development course designed for education faculty members, current and future teachers, and non-formal educators. The institute focused on five key areas:

- Climate Observations and Data
- Climate Change Communication
- Equity and Justice
- Power of Education
- Overcoming barriers to teaching



80% felt "very confident" about teaching about the causes of climate change after attending the institute. 100% felt they can mitigate and address barriers that previously prevented them from teaching about climate change. 100% felt hopeful, and 80% felt joyful at the end of the Institute.

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





