Worsbrough Bridge Athletic are rewriting the record books and turning heads across the Northern Counties East League First Division after storming to their eighth consecutive victory with a commanding 4-0 win over bottom side Winterton Rangers on Wednesday night.

The Briggers, now sitting third in the table, were ruthless in the second half as Josh Brown, Harrison Marvin, and a brace from Jake Squires sealed another emphatic win. The result extends a club-record winning streak that began after a shaky start to the season, when they lost their opening two fixtures to current top-two sides Harrogate Railway and Dearne & District.

Since then, Worsbrough have been unstoppable,

their latest triumph following a gritty 2-1 win at Club Thorne Colliery last weekend that originally set the new benchmark for consecutive victories since the club became a founding NCEL member in 1982.

The top of the table remains tight. Harrogate Railway's 3-1 win over Dearne & District on Tuesday night blew the title race wide open. Dearne remain top, but just three points separate the top three, with Worsbrough now firmly in the mix. Wakefield, meanwhile, lost ground after being held to a goalless draw by Club Thorne.

Elsewhere, Hallam FC's remarkable unbeaten league run came to a crashing halt after 287 days. Despite taking a second half lead through Brodie Litchfield and playing with ten men for over an hour, they fell 3-1

in a dramatic clash, ending a streak that stretched back to November 2024.

Stocksbridge Park Steels continue to search for their first win of the season. They were denied again on Tuesday after a late, controversial penalty saw them draw 2-2 at Bamber Bridge. Their FA Cup journey also ended at the weekend with a narrow 1-0 defeat at Dunston UTS.

There was better news for Penistone Church, who bounced back from three straight defeats with back-to-back wins - 1-0 at Thackley and 2-0 over Bottesford Town - lifting them to second in the NCEL Premier Division.

Sheffield FC also continued their steady rise, following up a goalless derby draw at Wombwell Town with a thrilling 3-2 win over Rossington Main to climb to fifth.

Church Aim for Crowd History!

Penistone Church are aiming to make history next month as they launch an ambitious bid to attract over 1,000 fans to their home clash with Golcar United — a milestone that would mark the club’s first-ever four-figure attendance in their 119-year history.

The Macron NCEL Premier Division side have announced plans for a “1,000 Fans Fun Day” at the Parker Roofing Memorial Ground on Saturday 18 October, and they’re calling on the local community to help them smash their all-time attendance record.

The day kicks off at midday with junior matches, followed by the men’s first team fixture at 3pm, and entertainment continuing into the evening from 6pm. In a move to make the event accessible to all, the club has declared it a “Pay



What You Want” fixture — allowing fans to choose their own admission price.

Alongside the football, supporters can enjoy local market stalls, food vendors, and a fully stocked bar open from noon, making it a full day of sport and celebration.

Founded in 1906, Penistone Church now

boasts over 35 teams across men’s, women’s, boys’ and girls’ football, ranging from age five to over 45. The club is also preparing to mark its 120th anniversary next year with a series of special events, including more fun days and even European ties.

Exciting news about ground redevelopment plans is also expected to

be revealed during the event, as the club continues to grow both on and off the pitch.

With momentum building and the community rallying behind them, Penistone Church are hoping to turn a regular league fixture into a landmark moment — and write a new chapter in their proud history.

Titans Crush Tykes

Rotherham Titans delivered a ruthless performance to dis-mantle Leeds Tykes 52-12 in a fiery National 1 derby at Clifton Lane. The South Yorkshire side ran in eight tries to two, maintaining their unbeaten start to the season with a second consecutive bonus-point win.

The match began with high intensity, as fly-half Rob Povey opened the scoring early. Leeds responded through winger Sam Taylor, briefly edging ahead before Rotherham regained control with tries from Morgan Veness and Curran Maguire.

The second half saw the Titans shift gears, dominating territory and possession. John Okafor capitalised on a Leeds

error to score, followed by Lloyd Hayes’ opportunistic ruck-side finish. Replacement hooker Luke Cole added to the tally before Isaac Shaw’s dazzling solo run and Will Metcalfe’s 80-metre sprint sealed the emphatic win.

Despite a late consolation try from Leeds captain Adam Brown, the visitors were outclassed in all departments. Titans head coach Harvey Biljon praised his squad’s discipline and defensive effort, noting the shared responsibility across the team.

With 14 tries in two games, Rotherham look a formidable force early in the campaign. They now turn their attention to next week’s clash away at Clifton, aiming to extend their perfect start.

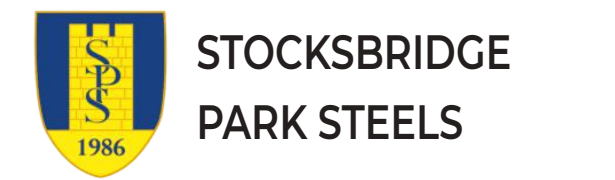

This was not when Stocksbridge wanted to return to Dunston. The UTS Stadium holds amazing memories for the Steels of that play-off final in May, but facing them so soon meant the narrative was already written. Dunston, after failing in the previous season's play-off final, felt destined for promotion last season. They had built to it for years but were denied by the in-form Stocksbridge side that won on penalties. They wanted revenge.

In the first half, this match was certainly more entertaining than the nerve packed play-off final. Dunston had a big opportunity with Josh Donaldson's header being well saved by Ben Towns-end.

At the other end, Luke Rawson blasted over the bar when moving into the box. It was a more open game than the one back in May, perhaps

because both teams were freed of the nerves that went into that one.

The biggest chance of the first half went to Jude Swailes who got the ball on the edge of the six-yard box. Thankfully, the centre-back had a shot like a centre-back and it went well wide.

So the first half was an entertaining, open affair despite the fact neither team was able to score. The second half was the exact opposite. It was a dull affair with both teams cancelling each other out. It seemed like even from the 60th minute, fans were discussing the replay that'd be on Wednesday night at Bracken Moor.

Stocksbridge did have a chance to change that though. James Morris found space on the right wing and his cross was perfect for Jack Watson in the middle. But whether it was the work of the

defence making it difficult or the pitch, he didn't get a clean connection and the defence was able to clear.

And then just like last week, heartbreak at the end was coming. Josh Donaldson took advantage of a poor attempt at an offside trap and got down the right wing. He switched it to Wil Shaw who blasted home, and with a heavy deflection the ball had found its way in. Dunston had revenge for their play-off final defeat.

It left existential questions for Stocksbridge who had to wonder what needs to change. This may be the FA Cup, but they are still looking for their first win and the fear is they soon get cut off at the bottom of the table. We'll see if those changes will work.

delivered a battling performance to earn a 2-2 draw away at Bamber Bridge, in a match that swung dramatically from end to end.

The visitors started with intent, showing signs of recovery from their weekend defeat to Dunston. Their early confidence was evident in sharp passing and attacking movement. A slick one-touch move gave Kurtis Turner space for a long-range strike that flew just over, while Elliot Owen missed a golden opportunity with a free header that sailed above the bar.

But as has been the story of the season, a brief lapse allowed Bamber Bridge to take control. A neat passage of play around the edge of the box saw Love Island star Jamie Allen peel away from his marker and fire a precise shot in off the far post to give the hosts the lead.

Stocksbridge responded with renewed energy after the break. Sustained pressure led to an equaliser when a deflected cross from the left fell perfectly for Tomas Poole, who made no mistake from close range. Just two minutes later, the Steels were ahead. James Morris surged forward on the counter, and with no defender closing him down, he picked out the top corner with a superb finish.

Buoyed by the turnaround, Stocksbridge pushed for a third. Oliwier Grzelak nearly capitalised on a defensive error, but Bamber Bridge keeper Aidan Dowling raced out to make a vital block.

The hosts fought back and were rewarded when substitute Kofi Moore caused chaos in the box. A shot was deemed to have struck Jaz Goundry's arm on the line, earning him a red card. Ewan Bange converted the penalty to level the score.

Down to ten men, Stocksbridge dug deep to resist late pressure and secure a valuable point—one that could have been more, but still reflects their resilience and growing belief.

Walker Wonderstrikes as Consett Crush Hallam

Pontefract Collieries produced a stirring second-half comeback to defeat ten-man Hallam FC 3–1 at Ingfield, the home of Ossett United, in a match that had everything—goals, controversy, and a dramatic end to Hallam’s 287-day unbeaten league run.

The game began with Hallam looking sharp and confident. Within the opening

minutes, Brodie Litchfield forced a save at the near post, and Benni Ndlovu came agonisingly close to opening the scoring with a thunderous strike that smashed against the crossbar. The visitors looked the more likely to break the deadlock early on.

But the match’s complexion changed dramatically in the 26th minute. Hallam midfielder Janni Lipka was shown a straight red card for a reckless high boot that caught



Bailey Thompson in the ribs, forcing the Colls striker off injured. The dismissal left Hallam with ten men and a mountain to climb, though they didn’t back down.

Despite the setback, Hallam stunned the home crowd just after the break. Lloyd Allinson made a superb save to deny Ndlovu, but Litchfield was quickest to react, smashing home the rebound to give the visitors a surprise lead.

Pontefract, however, responded with urgency and belief. Joe Lumsden, introduced as a first-half substitute, made an instant impact. In the 67th minute, he pounced on a spilled long-range effort from Hallam keeper Hugo Warhurst to level the scores. The

goal lifted the home support and shifted momentum firmly in the Colls’ favour.

Just minutes later, Frankie Sinfield was bundled over inside the box, and Jack Boyle stepped up to calmly slot the penalty into the corner, putting Pontefract ahead for the first time.

Hallam’s frustration grew when they were denied a penalty of their own. Danny South appeared to be fouled from behind in the area, but the referee waved play on. That moment proved costly, as Pontefract sealed the win five minutes from time. Lumsden showed great composure to stroke home his second of the match, slowly rolling the ball past Warhurst and into the bottom

corner.

The result marked a significant turnaround for Pontefract, who had gone four games without a win. Manager Jimmy Williams praised his side’s resilience and character: “Once we got the equaliser, there was only going to be one winner. Joe was outstanding—he could’ve had four.”

Lumsden, returning from a serious injury, was named Player of the Match for his clinical finishing and tireless work up front. His brace not only secured the three points but also lifted the Colls to ninth in the Northern Premier League Division One East standings.

For Hallam, the defeat was a bitter pill to swallow. It was their first league loss since a 4–2 defeat to Handsworth last November, and it drops them to 14th in the table. Manager Craig Denton will be hoping his side can regroup quickly as they return to Sandygate on Saturday to face Blyth Spartans after three consecutive away fixtures.

The match, played in front of a vocal crowd of 221, was a showcase of lower-league football at its most dramatic—full of passion, grit, and turning points. With rain pouring down in the final stages, the Colls celebrated wildly at the

final whistle, knowing they had not only claimed a vital win but also ended one of the longest unbeaten runs in the division.

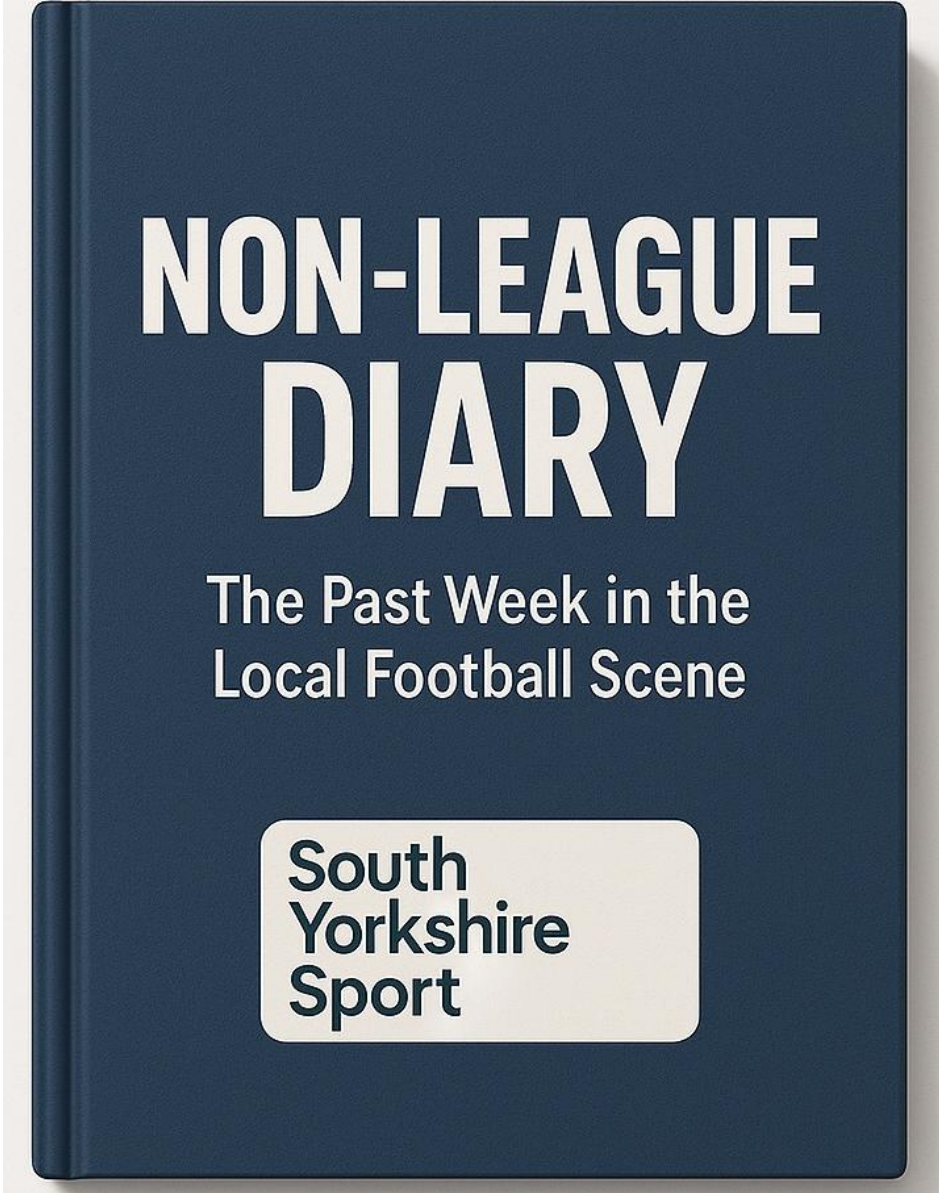

Derby Dominance: Sheffield Power Past Tigers

Sheffield RUFC claimed local bragging rights with a commanding 29–9 victory over fierce rivals Sheffield Tigers in a bruising derby encounter that lived up to its reputation for physicality and drama.

Having made the journey “up the hill” to Tigers’ home turf, the match was a classic South Yorkshire arm wrestle in the early stages, but Sheffield’s superior discipline in attack and clinical finishing saw them pull away in the second half to secure a bonus-point win.

There was just one change to the Sheffield starting XV from the previous week, with Matt Adcock unavailable and Aaron Lonsdale stepping onto the bench. That left Sheffield with four front-row forwards among the replacements — a tactical decision that would prove useful in a forward-dominated contest.

Sheffield kicked off playing downhill but into a stiff breeze. They immediately applied pressure, earning

two early penalties to gain territory. Tigers looked to relieve the pressure with a penalty of their own, but an off-the-ball incident saw the decision reversed and Tigers’ No. 8 Tom Calladine sent to the sin bin.

Sheffield capitalised almost immediately. A powerful scrum drive was illegally collapsed by the Tigers, and the referee awarded a penalty try, giving the visitors a 7–0 lead after just eight minutes.

Tigers responded with a penalty from full-back Harvey Saunders, reducing the deficit to 7–3. Another Sheffield infringement allowed Saunders to slot a second penalty midway through the half, bringing the score to 7–6 and keeping the hosts in touch.

Despite their discipline issues, Sheffield continued to threaten. A poor clearing kick from Tigers landed in the hands of Chris Hooper, who launched one of his trademark counter-attacks. After a slick series of passes, the ball found its way back to Hooper, who

darted over the line for a well-worked try. The conversion was missed, but Sheffield extended their lead to 12–6.

Tigers had a chance to narrow the gap before the break, but Saunders’ third penalty attempt drifted wide. The half ended with Sheffield holding a narrow but deserved lead.

Tigers started the second half brightly,

capitalising on a Sheffield error to win a penalty. Saunders made no mistake this time, cutting the lead to 12–9 just two minutes after the restart.

But Sheffield responded in style. A break through the Tigers’ defence by Jack Dawson set up Elliot Fisher, who weaved through several defenders to score under the posts. Fisher converted his own try to restore a ten-point cushion at 19–9.

From there, Sheffield began to dominate. A promising Tigers attack was halted by a forward pass, and from the resulting free kick, Zak Poole broke down the left flank. The ball was recycled quickly, and flanker Felix Crapper finished the move with a try out wide. The conversion was missed, but Sheffield were now firmly in control at 24–9.

With time running out, Sheffield con-

tinued to press. A Tigers lineout was ruled not straight, and from the ensuing scrum, Sheffield launched another attack. Poole, who had been a constant threat, finished off the move with a try in the corner — Sheffield’s fifth of the afternoon. The conversion was again off target, but the scoreline now read 29–9, and the result was beyond doubt.

The final minutes saw no further scoring, and the referee brought proceedings to a close with Sheffield securing a well-earned derby win.

This was a performance full of grit, power, and moments of real quality from Sheffield. Despite some early discipline issues, they showed composure in key moments and punished Tigers’ mistakes ruthlessly.

The forwards laid the platform, dominating the set-piece and breakdown, while the

backs took their chances with clinical precision. Chris Hooper’s first-half try was a standout moment, and Elliot Fisher’s solo effort in the second half underlined Sheffield’s attacking threat.

Felix Crapper and Zak Poole were both influential in the second half, while the defensive effort across the team ensured Tigers never got a foothold in the game.

For Tigers, it was a frustrating afternoon. They showed flashes of promise and kept the game close for long periods, but ultimately lacked the cutting edge to match Sheffield’s firepower.

With this win, Sheffield not only claim local bragging rights but also send a strong message to the rest of the league. Their ability to grind out results in tough conditions, combined with their attacking flair, makes them a serious contender this season.
