

SNAP! Photography 2025

“What does the word landscape mean to you? Many of us immediately envision a wide, horizontal vista—lush fields, blooming flowers, dramatic treelines, or mountains that seem to bridge earth and sky. Yet landscape is far more expansive. It can describe the urban skylines that dominate our daily routines as much as it can the quiet pockets of untouched nature. It can also exist beyond geography, speaking to the political, cultural, and social terrains that shape our lives.”

This year the Amistad Center for Art & Culture presents *Landscape*. Teenage artists-in-residence from the Greater Hartford area and surrounding towns participated in the Amistad Center’s *Snap! Photography*. Within this program Joel Cintron, the Teaching Artist and Curator of this year’s exhibition, challenged students with the idea of what a landscape means to them, breaking away from the typical image of a landscape. He encouraged the artists-in-residence to think deeper about their environments which you will see presented in the works on display for the exhibition.

ARADHANA began her photography career in the year 2024 with a twice-handed-me-down iPhone 8 while living with family in Malaysia.


In 2025, she entered a photograph taken with this phone to the Scholastic Art Awards, and was awarded a Silver Key in the state of Connecticut.




