1. Proyek wastafel yang terbuat dari batu alam di Kecamatan Gandus, Palembang yang dilaksanakan oleh Rotary Club Palembang. Di tempat ini dikenal sebagai Bayt Al-Qur'an atau Al-Qur'an Raksasa dan merupakan tempat ziarah rohani.
2. Proyek pertanian padi dilaksanakan oleh RC Cilacap. Dikoordinasi oleh PDG Eva Kurniaty sejak tahun 2014 untuk para petani Kampung Gagak dan Kampung Laut, adalah proyek Global Grant. Pada tahun ini Global Grant ke 5, akan diberikan kepada petani di Desa Klaces, Cilacap.
3. Perayaan World Polio Day 2022 dirayakan sangat meriah di Jakarta oleh District End Polio Chair, PP Soni Sontani dan dihadiri oleh Menteri Kesehatan, Bapak Budi Gunadi Sadikin, WHO dan UNICEF, memberikan talkshow mengenai virus Polio dan kesehatan masyarakat di Indonesia. Di Yogyakarta juga dirayakan dengan memberikan bingkisan makanan kepada masyarakat yang kurang beruntung. Perayaan ini juga dirayakan di Lampung, Palembang dan Medan.
4. Pada bulan Februari, club-club area Medan merayakan hari ulang tahun Rotary ke 118 di Taman Bodhi Asri untuk menghibur para orang tua lanjut usia. Area Yogyakarta turut merayakan di Gedung RRI Yogyakarta, dengan mengadakan lomba melukis dan pelayanan kesehatan. Hari Kedua diadakan di Titik Nol Yogyakarta dengan mengundang beberapa yayasan anak anak panti asuhan, menghibur dan memberikan tas sekolah dan alat2 tulis.
5. Proyek "Semesta Mencegah Stunting" sebagai kakak asuh yang diselenggarakan oleh BKKBN (Badan Kependudukan dan Keluarga Berencana Nasional), diwakili oleh Bapak dr. Hasto Wardoyo, Tribun Network, BPIB (Badan Pembinaan Ideologi Pancasila), TNI AD, DPR RI komisi 9, ROTARY (RID3410), PSMTI (Paguyuban Sosial Marga Tionghoa Indonesia) dengan program Cukup Dua Telur.

Speech Governor Rionardi Charles Wong, RY22-23, Rotary International District 3410. Rotary Club of Jakarta Sunter Centennial.

Dear Rotary Friends,

Greetings of peace and prosperity,

Praise and gratitude be to the Almighty God. In the upcoming weeks, the Rotary year "IMAGINE ROTARY" will come to an end. As the District Governor, I have visited 54 clubs in the Western Region of Indonesia and witnessed humanitarian projects.

Here are some highlights:

1. The Rotary Club of Palembang implemented a project called "Wash basin made of natural stone" in the Gandus District, Palembang. This place, known as Bayt Al-Qur'an or the Giant Qur'an, serves as a spiritual pilgrimage site.
2. The RC Cilacap carried out a rice farming project coordinated by PDG Eva Kurniaty since 2014 for the farmers of Kampung Gagak and Kampung Laut. It is a Global Grant project. This year, the 5th Global Grant will be given to farmers in Klaces Village, Cilacap.
3. The World Polio Day 2022 celebration was joyously held in Jakarta, organized by the District End Polio Chair, PP Soni Sontani. The event was attended by the Minister of Health, Mr. Budi Gunadi Sadikin, WHO, and UNICEF, who delivered a talk show on the Polio virus and public health in Indonesia. Similar celebrations also took place in Yogyakarta, Lampung, Palembang, and Medan, where food packages were distributed to less fortunate communities.
4. In February, the Medan area clubs celebrated the 118th Rotary anniversary at Taman Bodhi Asri to entertain the elderly. The Yogyakarta area also celebrated at the RRI Yogyakarta Building, organizing a painting competition and providing healthcare services. On the second day, the event took place at Titik Nol Yogyakarta, where several foundations and orphanages were invited. The event aimed to entertain and provide school bags and stationery.
5. The project "Semesta Mencegah Stunting" ("Universe Prevents Stunting") was held as a foster sibling program organized by BKKBN (National Population and Family Planning Agency). It was represented by Dr. Hasto Wardoyo, Tribun Network, BPIB (Ideology Pancasila Development Agency), TNI AD, DPR RI Commission 9, ROTARY (RID3410), and PSMTI (Indonesian Chinese Social Community Association) with the program "Cukup Dua Telur" ("Two Eggs are Enough").

The initial plan for Discon 2023 was to hold a joint reunion with Districts 3410 and 3420, but unfortunately, it couldn't proceed. District 3410 chose Jakarta as the venue with the theme "ROCK JAKARTA," while District 3420 selected Lombok as the location.

The District Conference is an opportunity for all Rotarians to meet, connect, strengthen bonds, and meet representatives such as Rotary International President Jennifer Jones and PDG David Anderson from District 9790, Australia. We absorb various inspirations from guest speakers, enhance our knowledge about Rotary, and gain experiences from friends who have successfully undertaken significant projects that benefit society. We share stories of success through the spirit of service.

It is my sincere hope that after this District Conference concludes, all participants will benefit greatly, be inspired by the spirit of service, and create beautiful and memorable memories. I express my gratitude to my fellow Rotarian friends, the Chairman and the Committee of the District Conference, sponsors, speakers, participants, and everyone who has supported the success of Discon 2023.

Selamat pagi.

Good morning – or as we say in Australia “G’day”

I’d like to begin by acknowledging

- DG Rio and his spouse Luci
- District Governor Elect Ditte Sukardi and spouse President Ade Sukardi,
- District Governor Nominee and Conference Chair, Daniel Iman Sujardi and Hilda Solihin. Daniel and I have been communicating quite a bit via What’s App over the past few weeks.
- DGND Sanny Suharli and Elizabeth Irenawati Suryapranata

I also acknowledge all past officers of Rotary International especially those of D 3410 and, before then D 3400. I don’t wish to single anyone out but in looking at your District website and the images of your past Governors, I was reminded that PDG Rudi Balmater and I were Training Leaders together at the International Assembly in January 2017

I would also like to acknowledge the presence and attendance of, what we call in Australia, the G-train of D 3420: DG Lina Soeratman, DGE Romy, DGN Suzanna, and DGND Dyah Anggraeni and their respective spouses. I would also like to acknowledge all of you, Rotarians and partners from across District 3410 as well as from Rotary Clubs in Singapore, Taiwan and the Rotary Clubs of Semarang and Surabaya in D 3420. I want to hear a big shout for all Rotarians and spouses from our visiting, non-D 3410 Clubs.

I would also like to acknowledge a Rotarian I first met when he was a keynote speaker at the District 9455 Conference held in Perth, Western Australia, in February 2017 and two years later, at the Victorian Multi-District Conference held in Melbourne – your very own member of the Rotary Club of Jakarta Sentral, twice Club President, John Soe. John, great to see you again after those two occasions in Australia. You are a wonderful ambassador for our number one priority – the eradication of polio.

Who here is attending their first District Conference? Would you please stand - and let’s acknowledge them and welcome them.

Eva, thank you for your kind words in your introduction. I know we have at least a couple of things in common. One of them is that we have, obviously, both served our Districts as a

District Governor. The second is that we both have a great friend in common: PRID Raffy Garcia. Raffy and I both served as Governors in 2011-12 when President Kalyan Bannerjee asked us the *Reach Within to Embrace Humanity'*

This is the same weekend as the D 3310 Conference being held in Phuket, Thailand. Tippy and I had represented PRIP Ian Riseley and Juliet at the D 3310 Conference in May 2018, in Kota Kinabalu. A month ago, I saw the list of apparent registrants for this year's D 3310 Conference and two names stuck out in the list: my own and Eva's. Fortunately for you all – I hope – we are both here with you in Jakarta at the Holiday Inn Kemayoran for your own District Conference when *Rotary Rocks Jakarta*.

DG Rio, I bring you greetings from my own D 9790 Governor, David McPherson, who extends his best wishes to you for a successful Conference over the next couple of days. District Conferences are always a highlight for the year. They are an opportunity to connect with fellow Rotarians and others, both formally and informally, rekindle old or create new friendships, acknowledge the achievements of Clubs and Rotarians, learn about and be inspired by what other Clubs are doing in their communities and with their projects and generally have a great time.

Following a change of government in Australia – and there was one twelve months ago – one of the first countries a new Australian Prime Minister will visit is Indonesia. You are the largest island country in the world; Australia is the largest island continent in the world. Indonesia is also the most populous island country in the world and the largest democracy in the Islamic world.

Australia is also an island because it is unconnected to any other body of land, but it is more commonly considered a continental landmass. Of the seven continents, Australia is the smallest but if considered an island, it is the largest in the world. We are also one of only a handful of the world's continuing democracies over the past 120 years.

Your own island of Sumatra is the sixth largest island in the world – and home to many of your District's Clubs – whilst Borneo/Kalimantan, an island you share with Malaysia and Brunei, is the third largest island in the world – but home to only one Club in your District.

Both our countries are in the G20 Group of Countries, Australia being the 13th and Indonesia, the 16th largest economies in the world by GDP. Indonesia is also Australia's second closest neighbor – and a very, very important one and the history of our deep relationship goes back well beyond the last 70 years since the creation of the Indonesian Republic.

Australia's original inhabitants, the Australian aboriginal population, is acknowledged as the oldest continuing civilization on our planet. We can trace that continuing civilization to 60,000

years ago. The arrival of Europeans in this part of the world is a very recent event in that timeline of events. If we count a generation as 25 years, Australia, as we know it today, is 10 generations old. Our First Nations people have called Australia home for 2400 generations.

Long before the Dutch colonized this archipelago and the British colonized Australia, the ancestors of our current First Nations people moved through these islands to settle on what is now the island continent. This was at a time when there were land bridges which almost physically joined our two countries.

We also know from archaeological records, including cave paintings and indigenous rock wall art in the north west of Australia, that fishermen from Java and other Indonesian islands traveled across the open sea to fish off the northwest coast of Australia long before the arrival of Europeans.

There is also a long and deep relationship with the Makassar of Sulawesi as our First Nations people and the Makassar seafarers traded sea cucumbers, exchanged ideas and language, inter-married and lived among each other from the 1500s or possibly earlier, according to some historians.

Rotary is about connections. We haven't been connecting for as long as our predecessors, the Makassans, the Javans, the First Nations people of Australia but we, Rotary, have been making connections for 118 years now. Long before both the United Nations and the League of Nations – international bodies formed post conflict preserve and maintain peace, develop friendly relations amongst nations and achieve international cooperation. Sound familiar? It's what we have been doing as an organization since we became Rotary International.

What differentiates us from those international, intergovernmental bodies is that our connections are between people – Rotarians, partners and others who share their time to build peace, respect, goodwill and understanding and, in doing so, improve the lives of others.

At the International Assembly, held online in February last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, then RIPE Jennifer said:

“When the right connections are made, the world aligns and our stories merge. Our differences dissolve and the only limit to our impact is the barrier of our imagination.”

The first time I met and heard Jennifer speak was when I was a Governor Elect at the 2011 International Assembly in San Diego, California. Utilizing her talents as a public speaker and as a media owner, she told a story about the climb that she and husband Nick did of Mt Kilimanjaro in Tanzania, now over twenty years ago.

Jennifer kept us spellbound with her story: the physical and mental difficulties of the climb, the hazards, learning of the death of a young guide in another climbing party and a young British climber suffering a cardiac arrest. Do you throw in the towel or do you overcome your fears and continue the journey?

Jennifer was speaking to us as incoming governors. She was sharing her story about climbing great heights because Rotary tools provide the opportunity to reach various summits or leadership positions.

But it's also about telling *the* story, telling *our* story of who we are and what we do.

This is what she said:

"And when we do that, shouldn't we be shouting about it from the top of every mountain? I urge you to tell the stories in your clubs and districts about what helped bring Rotary to life as a global network of professional and business volunteers. Rotary is a brand that unites the world, we simply have to climb the mountain and shout just a little bit louder."

It's now 12 years since I listened to that address from Jennifer at the International Assembly. But the message is the same then as it is now – although, maybe, we have got better, become savvier about telling our stories and how we go about that.

There was a time when we did service quietly. We got the job in our communities. We felt good about what we did but we didn't understand them. Only over the past decade has it been one of our key strategies to tell our stories publicly so that like minded people want to join us. Each and every one of us has an amazing Rotary moment and it is something we should all share. As our President has said: "it has to be taken to the next step and the way we have changed people's lives has to be shared"

Telling your Rotary story is a great way to keep our members engaged. Telling your "People of Action" stories in a meaningful, coordinated way builds the public's understanding of **who you are and what you do**. It highlights the impact we make in our communities and around the world.

Through this campaign, every Rotary club — large and small, new and old — can easily and effectively tell its story and describe its impact on the community. Clubs can craft their own *People of Action* stories through campaign materials including ads and powerful digital images. As more clubs share their stories, we'll highlight the collective impact of Rotary around the world. And we all have one of these — your mobile device: a powerful tool in your ability to tell your story.

Your own District website is doing just that. It's telling your story. Rotarians and visitors find out about your Club projects in Child and Maternal Health, Disease Prevention and Treatment and Water, Sanitation and Hygiene. We find out about your Global Grants through the Rotary Foundation – grants such as those which transformed swamp areas into productive farming land in central Java and, more recently during the pandemic, 144,000 face-shields for hospitals in Indonesia from Clubs and Districts in Japan and Korea.

So, when someone asks you about Rotary, I am sure that you can respond positively as you can show that your District has embraced telling the Rotary story, how you have made a difference, how you have changed lives.

As a Rotarian, you are a Rotary brand ambassador. Rotary is counting on you to help us deliver our story with energy, enthusiasm and credibility. Rotary wants you to tell your stories of being people of action in your community, on your personal and on your club's social media accounts. And thank you for all that you have already done in doing this – and will continue to do. This Conference provides great opportunities to share the Rotary story via your social media presence. Let's flood social media over these next few days and tell the story of this District Conference.

We have all been asked to join Rotary through our membership of a Rotary Club. The types of Rotary Clubs that we can form or join are now very different to when I joined. By creating new style Rotary Clubs, we can become a more diverse and inclusive organization. We can now join e-Clubs whose membership can stretch across many national borders. Likewise, we can form and belong to cause-based Clubs or alumni-based Clubs where the members could be former Rotary or Rotary Foundation program alumni. Rotaract used to be a separate organization and structure. Now it's another type of Rotary club – with age parameters, equally as valuable and important as any other type of Rotary Club. We can join passport and satellite Clubs. The newest Club in my own District, chartered just six weeks ago, has an all-female membership – and not just from District 9790.

Worldwide, we have 1.17m men, women and gender diverse people belonging to that increasing diversity of types of Rotary clubs. Just prior to the pandemic, our worldwide membership stood at 1.19m. For decades, membership of Rotary remained at around 1.2 million members despite the number of Clubs growing annually. As at 30 June 2022, our membership stood at 1.16m. So, for whatever variety of reasons, we dropped 300,000 members. Maybe we got 'zoomed out'. Maybe some used the pandemic as an excuse to leave. But we have seen an increase in membership this Rotary year. The 30 June every year is a key date as members decide whether to continue into the next Rotary year and become liable for their annual dues.

To me, the most telling fact in these numbers is the changing nature of our gender diversity. Five years ago, 76.8% of our membership reported as male and 22.9% reported as female. Today, those percentages stand at 75.2% male and 26.4% female. In raw numbers, Rotary has seen a decline of 33,890 male members and an increase of 35,840 female members. Slow change, yes, but nonetheless a change in the right direction towards more gender equity.

Another noticeable change has been in age. Five years ago, the number of members under 49 stood at 214,400 or 18% of our membership. Today, that number is 271,760 or 23.2% of our membership reports themselves as under 49. Evolutionary change, yes, but certainly not revolutionary change.

The pace, though, of both needs to quicken substantially in order to reflect the communities are Clubs are located in.

Gender equity or, more specifically, a better gender balance has always been strong in this part of the Rotary world. Across the two Districts in Indonesia, 52.33% of membership is female [42.7% in District 3410]. In Thailand, it is 44.5%. In The Philippines it is almost 36%. Here are three countries with large numbers of Clubs and Rotarians. Coming off a small base of just seven Clubs and 369 Rotarians, Myanmar has a female membership of 59.6%. That's worth recognising.

Embracing diversity, equity, and inclusion will allow us to do more meaningful work while engaging with people who know they'll be valued for the qualities that make them unique.

Indonesia itself is a diverse country. The world's fourth largest country by population, Indonesia can count about 1,300 different ethnicities. You have a diverse range of languages, cultures and religions. Added to this is the fact that more than half the Malays in Malaysia can count, as their ancestry, diverse groups from the Indonesia archipelago.

The island on which we find ourselves at this Conference, Java is the most populous island on our planet. It is home to 56% of the Indonesian population and the Javanese people are the largest ethnic group in your country.

District 3410 covers the whole of Sumatra (the world's sixth largest island) with Clubs from Medan to Lampung, Batam just across the strait from Singapore, Balikpapan, and across Western and Central Java. In itself, D 3410 is a large and diverse District.

Rotary is a place that should celebrate diversity. Rotary is a place that should fully represent our communities. Rotary should offer all members, regardless of who they are or where they come from, an equal opportunity to thrive.

Assalamualaikum warahmatullahi wabarakatuh, Salam sejahtera,

Dalam pembicaraan kami pada pagi hari ini, kita akan membahas tentang poliomiелitis, sebuah penyakit yang disebabkan oleh virus polio. Poliomiелitis dapat menginfeksi semua umur, tetapi terutama menyerang anak-anak. Penyakit ini dapat ditularkan melalui makanan atau minuman yang terkontaminasi dengan virus polio, biasanya melalui jalur orofekal.

Gejala awal poliomiелitis mirip dengan flu, seperti demam dan kelelahan. Namun, yang membedakan penyakit ini adalah potensi komplikasinya. Sekitar 1 dari setiap 200 infeksi polio mengakibatkan kelumpuhan permanen. Ketika virus polio menyerang sel saraf di sumsum tulang belakang yang mengontrol pergerakan otot, kelumpuhan dapat terjadi dan bersifat tak dapat pulih (irreversibel).

Dalam kasus yang parah, sekitar 5-10% dari individu yang mengalami kelumpuhan akibat polio dapat mengalami kematian. Sayangnya, saat ini belum ada pengobatan spesifik yang bisa mengobati penyakit ini sepenuhnya.

Namun, ada langkah-langkah pencegahan yang dapat dilakukan. Imunisasi menjadi kunci utama dalam pencegahan poliomiелitis. Imunisasi menggunakan dua jenis vaksin, yaitu Oral Polio Vaccine (OPV) yang diberikan dalam bentuk tetes dan Inactivated Polio Vaccine (IPV) yang diberikan melalui suntikan. Dalam imunisasi rutin, dianjurkan untuk memberikan 4 dosis OPV dan 2 dosis IPV.

Melalui pemahaman yang lebih dalam tentang poliomiелitis, penyebabnya, gejalanya, dan tindakan pencegahan yang dapat diambil, kita dapat meningkatkan kesadaran dan upaya dalam melawan penyakit ini serta melindungi kesehariannya.
















Pembicara Inspiratif Rtn. Prita Gani: Pengembangan Generasi Muda

Rotary International District 3410 (RID3410) menyelenggarakan Konferensi di Hotel Holiday Inn, Kemayoran, Jakarta. Acara tahunan yang penting bagi para pemimpin RID3410 wilayah Indonesia bagian barat.

Rotarian Prita Gani (Prita), Public Image Director Rotary Club Jakarta Menteng, menyampaikan presentasi berjudul "Amplifying Impact: Public Relations in Humanitarian Organization."

Pada kesempatan ini, Prita yang juga selaku pendiri dan CEO London School of Public Relations (LSPR), membahas pentingnya humas (hubungan masyarakat) sebagai peran yang signifikan bagi Rotarian. Humas menjadi jembatan komunikasi efektif antara penerima bantuan, relawan, dan masyarakat secara umum.

Prita, yang saat ini juga menjabat sebagai Executive Board Member Delegate at Global Alliance for Public Relations Communication Management Asia-Pacific Region, menekankan perlunya pengurus senior di Rotary Club membimbing 'Next Gen Rotarians' agar mereka terus menjadi agen kebaikan, meneruskan manfaat baik, dan berdampak nyata bagi masyarakat.

Rotary Club memainkan peran penting dalam membantu masyarakat yang membutuhkan. Dalam menjalankan misinya, Humas Rotary Club memiliki peran yang signifikan dalam memperluas dan memperkuat dampak organisasi tersebut.

Dengan mendatangkan anggota baru, Rotary Club dapat memastikan keberlanjutan kegiatan dan program organisasi di masa depan. Regenerasi memungkinkan klub tetap aktif dan relevan dalam melayani masyarakat, ujar Prita.

Lebih dari 260 orang hadir dalam konferensi ini, terdiri dari pengurus dan anggota Rotary Club dari seluruh RID3410, Prita memberikan quotes menarik, "if you have to choose between being kind and being right, choose being kind and you will always be right." Prita juga mendorong lebih banyak upaya dan proyek kebaikan di masa mendatang.

Prita juga menyampaikan bahwa 'Next Gen Rotarians' seperti Ghina Amani Kemal Gani (Founder Raysha Foundation), Carys Mihardja (Founder Carys Centre), dan Tiffany Mihardja (Founder R Home) tengah sibuk dengan kegiatan dan proyek kebaikan masing-masing.

Ketiga pemimpin muda ini telah menerima penghargaan dalam bidangnya. Ghina meraih IBK Awards tahun 2021, Carys menerima penghargaan 'Diana Legacy Award 2021' dari Althorp House, dan Tiffany Mihardja mendapatkan UN Women Indonesia WEP'S Award sebagai 'The Winners SME Champions'. Prita juga menekankan kepada generasi senior Rotarians untuk memberikan kesempatan bagi generasi penerus dalam mempercepat berbagai upaya baik dari Rotary Club ke depan. Generasi muda yang bergabung dengan Rotary Club memiliki potensi membawa ide dan pandangan segar. Mereka dapat memberikan perspektif baru, keterampilan unik, dan gagasan inovatif untuk memperkaya program dan proyek klub.

Regenerasi memungkinkan klub tetap dinamis dan terus berkembang, menjaga kebaruan dan kreativitas dalam menjalankan misi Rotary Club, ujar Prita.

Prita menyatakan bahwa Rotary Club perlu menjalankan fungsi kehumasannya dengan sungguh-sungguh. Dia menjelaskan bahwa dalam organisasi kemanusiaan, tugas utama humas adalah untuk mengkomunikasikan pesan-pesan penting kepada publik. Mereka bertanggung jawab dalam menyampaikan informasi tentang program dan proyek yang sedang dilaksanakan, mempromosikan hasil-hasil yang telah dicapai, serta mengedukasi masyarakat mengenai isu-isu yang relevan.

Menurut Prita, peran penting humas dalam Rotary Club adalah tidak hanya membangun hubungan baik dengan berbagai pihak, tetapi juga menjaga dan memperkuat reputasi organisasi di benak masyarakat yang mendapatkan bantuan. Implementasi dari strategi Public Relations dalam berbagai kegiatan Rotary, seperti di Cilacap dan Rumpin, melibatkan memberikan informasi kepada berbagai pihak terkait seperti donor, pengguna, lurah, camat, bupati, dan walikota di berbagai daerah. Rotary Club juga terus melakukan kampanye kebaikan secara konsisten untuk mengedukasi masyarakat, termasuk kampanye digital terkait kesehatan, perempuan, kelapa sawit, dan sosialisasi 'digital safety' seperti kampanye #AnakIndonesiaAman Digital.

Prita menekankan bahwa humas juga memiliki peran dalam membangun citra organisasi yang kuat dan kredibel. Dalam konteks kemanusiaan, kepercayaan publik terhadap organisasi sangat penting. Humas Rotary perlu berusaha membangun dan menjaga hubungan yang baik dengan media massa, donor, pemerintah, dan para pemangku kepentingan lainnya. Humas perlu menyampaikan informasi secara transparan, menjawab pertanyaan, dan mengatasi berbagai masalah yang mungkin timbul. Dengan demikian, humas dapat membantu Rotary membangun kepercayaan yang kuat di mata publik, yang pada gilirannya akan mendorong partisipasi dan dukungan yang lebih besar.

Prita berpendapat bahwa dalam menghadapi tantangan global yang semakin kompleks, Rotary Club membutuhkan peran humas yang transparan, adaptif, kuat, dan efektif. Melalui keterlibatan aktif masyarakat dan ajakan untuk berpartisipasi dalam upaya kemanusiaan, Rotary Club dapat memperkuat dampak organisasinya, membangun kesadaran, dan menginspirasi perubahan positif. Humas juga dapat menjadi penghubung kolaborasi antara Rotary Club dengan pemerintah, LSM, dan sektor swasta. Kolaborasi semacam itu dapat memperkuat upaya kemanusiaan, meningkatkan akses terhadap sumber daya dan pengetahuan, serta menghasilkan solusi yang lebih holistik dan berkelanjutan.

Pada akhir sesinya, Prita kembali menekankan bahwa Rotary Club harus memiliki tekad yang kuat untuk terus tumbuh dan memberikan dampak positif bagi masyarakat. Melalui semangat pelayanan dan kolaborasi yang kuat, Rotary Club Jakarta Menteng siap menjalankan misi Rotary International dalam melayani masyarakat yang membutuhkan. Dengan memanfaatkan pengalaman dan keahlian anggotanya, bersama dengan Rotary International District 3410 berkomitmen untuk terus mengabdikan dan berkarya.

Greetings & good afternoon to everyone.

First and foremost of course yang sangat saya hormati, DG Rionardi C. Wong, thank you for having me here DG. And of course all my very proud to be here in front of all the PDGs of the district in Indonesia 3410, 3420 all here all of you ladies and gentlemen, PDGs, PPs, and fellow Rotarians thank you very much for having me share some time with you this afternoon, of course, I will not able to follow Ibu Prita, Selamat sore ibu.

I was asked by DG Rio to speak after Ibu Prita just to share as a representation of someone that perceives a little bit younger in rotary, but I see everyone is very younger.

I don't have a presentation, to be honest, I am here just to share a very brief story of why I decided to join the Rotary and become a Rotarian myself.

I grew up with Rotary, my father is Rotarian, and he has a past president. He is here with us this afternoon, thank you Pak PP Masli.

So my earliest memory as a boy as a child at home is knowing that was waiting for my father to come home every week at least once a week he will come home late because he has to attend the rotary meeting after office, so I am familiar with rotary clubs and of course, I become, I know most of his friends from his club and then of course of the district, I am also lucky that I was the grandson of the Rotarian as well, my late grandfather was a Rotarian, and so I heard a lot about rotary from him, I learn about rotary from him, my grandfather maybe someone of you know him, his name is PDG Soedarpo Sastrosatomo.

And so this is just a brief story, this is me and my grandfather (see the Layar)

So I am, I happen to be one of the grandsons of PDG Soedarpo, and my brothers and my cousins are very very close to my grandfather the late Pak Darpo. We learn a lot about life, and we learn a lot about what we need to do in life from him. And I think it is most important, that the most important learning that I got from Pak Darpo my grandfather was a transfer of values.

This is, I happen to be currently leading the Soedarpo Group of companies, his legacy is in business, and I, of course, I did also learn about business from him I learn about management also from him and Pak Masli, but not least importantly I learn about rotary from those two people, my father, and my grandfather.

So, I wanted to share the most important message that I received from my grandfather, and it is also what keeps us going as a company. He shared the vision, and he shared the most

important message about running the business but also living the life. And we have a motto in Soedarmo and Samudra Indonesia from Pak Darpo, the motto is called: Sabar, Tabah, Tekun, and Iman, in Bahasa Indonesia.

So I am telling you a little bit about Sabar, Tabah, Tekun, and Iman.

So we have this motto in our offices, all our offices just a very simple short message about the motto of the company, Sabar, Tabah, Tekun, Iman.

So my grandfather always told me that we need to be sabar. Sabar, it means to have the patience that there is always a process to achieve good things and great things and you cannot be successful in a second, so you need to work hard and go through the processes.

So anyway Sabar, Tabah, Tekun, and Iman are the motto of our company and the point is we need to have patience, we need to go through the good process, nothing is built in a day, and that is a spirit in our company.

And then Tabah means resilient. It's not enough just to be patient, to not do anything but also to face the challenges and be able to bounce back to resilience when facing challenges.

Tekun means that you need to work hard, need to be diligent, work harder than anyone else and not be lazy, and to relive the fight for what you need to achieve.

And most importantly Iman it means fate, that at the end of the day all your hard work, all your efforts, and all your successes, you must remember that none of them can be achieved actually without the blessings of God, so we need to be always thankful and we need to remind yourself that this is all do to the blessing of God.

So that's it short is the message about how we live our lives.

And then, one of my favorite understandings of Sabar, what sabar is, I learned in the Qur'an, there is first in the Qur'an that says that the only way to be able to have patience or sabar is to have enough knowledge (harus memiliki pengetahuan yang cukup) you would not be able to be patient if you don't have enough knowledge. So the understanding is that behind that for someone to be able to be patient is that we should not ever stop learning so it continues learning because we will never have enough knowledge, so that's why kalau orang Indonesia bilang sabar ada batasan atau ga ada batasnya so because knowledge is unlimited, patience is unlimited the moment you lose your patience that means you need to learn more, you cannot stop learning.

This is also the spirit behind what we think, not only to grow our business, we need to keep on learning, we need Indonesia to be very relevant to be able to be involved in education. So I

respect the major Ibu Prita with London School and is giving a lot of contributions to the education of the young future Indonesia, thank you Ibu Prita.

So in the organization working with Rotary, working with our businesses, we understand the importance of education, and we understand they will do a lot of things to improve education in Indonesia. And we hope that we can do more with Rotary.

So this one more question then comes up, how you can be patient (bagaimana bisa sabar) Sabar perlu pengetahuan yang cukup, we need to keep on learning and then what is the message in the Qur'an I learned, how can you gain knowledge? How can you gain more knowledge?

And I found that the answer is to do good (berbuat baik), that there actually in the first in the Qur'an that when someone has given power and knowledge is a reward for someone who does good in their life and God will give you more knowledge.

So this is my very short story of what the inspiration and motivation besides of course I am not gonna lie, but the support and motivation that I received from many of my seniors in Rotary, PDG, PP, and even most importantly DGND, I was recruited by PDG Budi Soehardi during his year and I get to thank you PDG Budi Soehardi.

Of course, DG Rionardi always also give a tremendous amount of support, and everyone, there gives me an offer that I cannot refuse to join Rotary, but of course, the spirit behind all is to be able to do good so that we can gain more knowledge so that we can live our lives in the best way as possible and for me is personally because my father was a Rotarian and my grandfather was a Rotarian, and they told me the messages for my life is to do it that way and of course, this is I found in Rotary that Doing Good In The World Is Made Possible Because Of Rotary Members Like You, so thank you very much to all Rotarians.

Speech RI Presiden Representative PDG David Anderson

Rotary Club of YEA, Victoria, Rotary International District 9790

G'day Rotarians - good morning to you all.

I like to think that Tippy and I live in the best part of Victoria. Our property adjoins the Goulburn River, the longest river in the state and a major tributary to the Murray River, Australia's longest.

In mid-2015, the bridge over the river, a kilometer from our home, was replaced. The previous wooden bridge was 60 years old. It had been resurfaced and strengthened over the years but the time had come for a new one to be built that would, perhaps, last 100 years. Over the course of the three weeks of removal and construction, I followed the progress of dismantling the old bridge, driving the pylons for the new one, pouring the concrete and installing the rails.

So, what has this got to do with Rotary? Ed Futa.

Those of you who have been in Rotary for at least 12 years will know the name Ed Futa. A Rotarian since 1979, Ed served as General Secretary of Rotary International for eleven years prior to his retirement on 30 June 2011.

At the New Orleans Convention in May 2011, six or so weeks before his retirement, Ed was invited to share his thoughts on that time in office as he served as General Secretary before our current General Secretary and CEO, John Hewko, succeeded him.

Ed began his reflections with a story about a construction worker who had just retired. The last job of his career was supervising a crew that rebuilt a bridge, just an ordinary bridge, over a river that ran through a city. The construction worker had helped take down the old bridge safely and, together with the rest of his team, he helped put the new bridge up.

The day the new bridge was opened, a news crew came out to film traffic, do a few interviews and report on the opening of the new bridge. And there was the construction worker, on his first day of retirement, sitting there on a bench by the side of the river, watching the cars and trucks go by, and looking pretty content. Somehow, he wound up getting interviewed, and this is what he said:

"There are lots of different jobs out there, and every one of them is important. This job was mine. I didn't build that bridge by myself, and I couldn't have built it by myself. But along with the guys on my crew, I took down an old bridge that wasn't safe and put up a bridge that was safe and strong and will last 100 years. When I look at that bridge, I don't think I did that. But I do think I was a part of that. I helped."

That's what we have all done since the day Paul Harris and his three business associates founded Rotary, 118 years ago. All of us have been a part of building its history. All of us have helped, in so many ways. Of all the achievements we are so proud of, there is not a single one that belongs to one person alone. One person might have had an idea but without the support and backing of their fellow Rotarians, it remains just an idea. Everything we do in Rotary, we do together, because that's what Rotary is. It's Rotarians helping others.

As Rotarians, we help. We lend a hand. We show people that we care. We build communities and bridge continents. As Rotarians we are a gift to the world because we make a difference. Rotary opens doors and, in doing so, connects the world. And we dream big. We imagine.

One man who imagined it was Clem Renouf. An Australian, he served as President of Rotary International in 1978-79. In early 1979, on a flight home from the Philippines, Renouf read a magazine story about the eradication of smallpox. He wondered, he imagined, if Rotary's new Health, Hunger and Humanities (3-H) Grants could be used to eliminate another disease. For the first time, these grants allowed Rotary projects to be taken on by more than just one club or district.

Renouf consulted with a friend, John Sever, who was a district governor in Maryland, USA, and chief of infectious diseases at the United States National Institutes of Health. After doing some research and having consulted with others in the field, Sever said that polio would be the best disease for Rotary to work on.

Accordingly, as Rotary International President, Clem then set his sights on polio eradication as a Rotary worldwide project. In November 1979, the RI Board agreed to set the eradication of polio as a primary goal of the 3-H program. But money was needed and Renouf asked all the clubs to contribute about \$15 per member, for service projects, and the appeal raised the surprising amount of \$7 million. It became the seed money for The Philippines trial in which 600,000 children were vaccinated against polio. And the success was real and measurable.

In 1985, we launched the PolioPlus program and it remains our number one strategic priority.

Without harnessing the power of our 1.4 million Rotarians and Rotaractors around the world, and all who have gone before, we could not have achieved what we have been able to over the past 118 years. We would not be able to stand on the threshold of making history with the eradication of polio without our own efforts and power. That we have come as far as we have in the past thirty-eight years is testament to the Rotarians the world over for their tenacity and dedication to achieving something that the experts said could never be done. Never lose sight of the fact that when Rotary International went to the World Health Organisation all those years ago asking them to come on board as a partner in the eradication of polio, the WHO declined saying it couldn't be done. Some years later, they came to us, having seen what Rotary

could do, wanting to be a partner in the eradication of polio. Now we can achieve what may once have been seen as impossible and with the support of all of our partners.

We've known for a while that we couldn't finish the job on our own but we can take the credit for leading the world towards eradication. Together, with the WHO, UNICEF, CDC, the Gates Foundation and governments around the world we are within reach of our goal of the eradication of polio. Rotary spearheaded the creation of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative which continues to pursue the worldwide eradication of polio.

We – and the world - have never been closer to finishing the job. Since September last year, there has been just one reported case of the Wild Polio Virus, just one. That was in Pakistan. The last yards are often the hardest – especially after a marathon – and, despite all the success over the last year, polio is yet to be eradicated. But, with our efforts and with your Club's efforts, it can be. And when it is eradicated, we as Rotarians can say, "we did that".

Our greatest strength when it comes to our number one priority is our tenacity. We will not be deterred by setbacks. We have persuaded governments around the world to increase their commitment to the eradication of the disease. We have persuaded families to allow their children to be vaccinated. We have advocated and created awareness of the need to rid the world of this disease so that no longer will a tree need to be cut down to make a crutch for a child to enable them to walk. When every child in the world walks tall and free, you as a Rotarian, can say "I helped".

Today, Rotary is in an especially enviable position. For only the second time in the history of the world, a deadly disease will be eradicated because of our work. And when that momentous time happens, the spotlight will be on us. We have to be ready. We have to be prepared. And we must be ready to leverage that success into even greater successes in the future. If we can eradicate polio, imagine what's next.

The last time a Rotary Convention was held in Australia was nine years ago. At the Convention, the then Prime Minister Tony Abbott committed the Australian Government to \$100m over four years to the Global Polio Eradication Initiative. It's been well spent, I am sure. Abbott acknowledged that he had heard Rotarians, that they had made their case loud and clear for increased Government funding. Then he added: "Please do not applaud the Australian government for what it does. Applaud yourselves for what you do."

When you watched President Jennifer's message to Conference yesterday, you may recall that she stood in front of a sign that read:

"Together, we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change — across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves."

Who are we? We are people of action?

Rotary's global awareness is outstanding: three out of four people surveyed are aware of Rotary. Among the world's leading social service organizations, we're in the top 3 in terms of awareness. And people know enough about us to know that we do good in the world. But not all. I arrived in the United States at Los Angeles International Airport a few years ago in my capacity as an International Assembly Training Leader. When asked by the United States Border Security official why I was coming to the United States, I replied that I was here to attend the Rotary International Assembly. A faint glimmer of recognition came across his face. He said to me: "Rotary? I've heard of them. Isn't it some sort of social club?"

Accordingly, we have our challenges:

- Most people have only a vague idea of exactly *how* we do good in the world.
- Only about 1 in 4 people actually know someone who is in Rotary

As we move closer to polio eradication: What are the new stories that will unite us, motivate us, and tell the rest of the world about our impact?

Where is the next generation of leadership coming from? We're in the midst of a huge demographic shift, but while the rising generations share our passion for community and for making a difference, they have plenty of other places and options to channel that passion—on their mobile devices *and* in the real world. But I am encouraged here by what I have seen over the past couple of days.

These are the questions we need to consider as we, as People of Action, adopt and implement our Action Plan.

I am sure you are all aware of the four priorities the Plan has – just four:

- Increase our impact;
- Expand our reach;
- Enhance participant engagement; and,
- Increase our ability to adapt.

I want to touch briefly on each of these priorities:

Firstly, increase our impact:

As a Club, identify a new project to increase your impact. And we're measuring our impact more deliberately because we know that current and potential partners, program participants, and, increasingly, donors want to see clear, tangible proof of our impact — especially for our humanitarian projects

Secondly, expand our reach:

Rotary now reflects our stronger-than-ever commitment to being an organization that values, respects, and welcomes everyone who interacts with us. We're committed to embracing and exemplifying diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) in everything we do at Rotary.

How can we engage people beyond traditional membership and embrace existing Rotary members outside the Club: Rotary Action Groups, Fellowships, Community Corps and the like

Thirdly, enhance participant engagement

Engage with your members. Learn what's important to them and how they want to grow and develop through Rotary. And make it clear that you're ready to listen. Be proactive. Ask members if they feel engaged enough and listened to and if Rotary is meeting their expectations.

Tear down the walls between "us" and "them" and think about "participants" — a word that encompasses all Rotary members and others who get involved in Rotary activities, like family members, partners, and alumni. And I see that on display in this District Conference.

Ask new members what programs or projects they would like the Club to do. Don't just tell them "this is what we do". Ask them what they want to do.

Fourthly, increase our ability to adapt.

Be bold. Your Club has the ability and the freedom to develop a model suited to its own circumstances, its own community, its own membership. Be flexible and accommodating.

The world is changing and Rotary is changing with it. We are encouraged to do things differently. But new approaches to our fundamental principles won't threaten our sense of who we are and what we do.

Who are we? We are People of Action.

Over the past decade, we have become so much better at telling ourselves about who we are and what we do. But how well do we do that outside of Rotary? Our Action Plan has helped us address the issue within Rotary and hopefully, through the actions of Clubs and their public image campaign, it is being addressed to the wider audience. We all know about our efforts to

eradicate polio but who outside of Rotary knows what we have done? Likewise, with the work of the Rotary Foundation, what do we as Rotarians really know about the Foundation? And who, outside of Rotary, has heard of The Rotary Foundation?

We should all know that when we as individuals or our Clubs make a contribution to The Rotary Foundation, Rotary members are helping make a difference in the lives of millions of people around the world, through our seven areas of focus.

Had Brian Peters, the D 9790 Governor in 2019-20 known this earlier, he would have joined Rotary a lot earlier.

Our accountability and transparency have earned The Rotary Foundation 14 straight years of four-star ratings — the highest possible — from independent evaluator Charity Navigator. 90 - 92% of Foundation funds are spent directly on programs. No high administrative costs dilute your gift.

The Foundation received the highest score from Charity Navigator for Leadership and Adaptability, for Financial Management and for Accountability and Transparency: 100/100 points on each criteria.

Here are just a few ways your generosity and what your efforts as a Rotarian are changing lives.

Eradicating polio

. To end polio for good, we need to reach every last child in Afghanistan and Pakistan and protect the progress made in polio-free parts of the world, including Indonesia and south-east Asia. We have seen the importance of vaccination for all children with the 1 reported case the cVDPV and 14 environmental samples in New York last year, 2 environmental samples in Canada (linked to the NY cases) and six environmental samples in the United Kingdom.

The detection of WPV type 1 in a 3 year-old child from Lilongwe, Malawi, last year was genetically linked to the WPV1 case detected in Pakistan's Sindh province in October 2019. This was the first WPV1 case from the continent of Africa in over five years.

Eradicating polio is an achievable goal that will be known as one of the greatest achievements in history but it can only be achieved if every child is vaccinated against the virus. Our contributions to the PolioPlus Fund help achieve that and thank you for your target this Rotary year of USD \$7375 towards achieving our goal – matched by the Gates Foundation that's almost \$22m.

Promoting peace and conflict resolution

Peace holds a unique status in Rotary. We approach peace not as an abstract concept, but as a living, dynamic expression of human development. As a humanitarian service organization, it is both a cornerstone of our mission and one of our seven areas of focus.

Rotary's most significant effort to promote peace is the [Rotary Peace Centers](#) program, established in 2002. Each year, the program trains some of the world's most dedicated and brightest professionals, preparing them to promote national and international cooperation and to resolve conflict. They include graduates of a two-year master's degree program and a professional certificate program at Rotary's partner universities, now including Makare University in Kampala, Uganda.

Rotary members themselves, what you do in your own communities, also address the underlying causes of conflict, including poverty, inequality, ethnic tension, lack of access to education, and unequal distribution of resources through all that we do in our own Clubs and communities.

Preventing disease

Disease results in misery, pain, and poverty for millions of people worldwide. That's why treating and preventing disease is so important to us. We lead efforts both large and small, setting up temporary clinics, blood donation centers, and training facilities in underserved communities struggling with outbreaks and health care access. Your own Stunting program presented earlier is one local way you are improving the lives of others.

Bigger projects

The Foundation SHARE program allows smaller clubs to do larger projects that they could never complete on their own. By banding together as Clubs and including DDF and the World Fund match into the budget, large, high impact and sustainable projects are possible.

The Rotary Club of Broadmeadows of 13 members in my own District has partnered with eight other Clubs in Australia and Singapore and with DDF committed from 5 Districts and the World Fund, as well as private contributions, a project worth USD \$88,000 was possible. The six existing inadequate pit toilets at a 930-student school in Gulf Province, PNG, would be replaced with 22 safe, clean, hygienic self-composting toilets – cleaner water, improved sanitation, better health outcomes especially for girls and training and skilling the local workforce. All made possible by Clubs joining together and accessing funds from the Rotary Foundation – your funds, our funds.

The members of these Clubs can proudly say "I helped" – I helped in delivering the mission of The Rotary Foundation and fulfilling its motto to 'do good in the world'.

A record of success

The Rotary Foundation has an unenviable record of success. What we have learnt from our End Polio Now campaign has been successfully applied to new health challenges. The infrastructure developed to facilitate both immunizations and eradication is now being used to fight and protect against other diseases as well. For example, the method now known as contact tracing was critical to containing the Ebola outbreak in Nigeria in 2014 and became one of the tools in the control of the COVID 19 pandemic before a vaccine was developed.

Through the Rotary Foundation Global Grants program, 2021-22 delivered 1197 projects valued at USD \$77m – all with long-term, viable and sustainable outcomes for the host community. 569 of those 1197 projects were in the area of Disease Prevention and Treatment. In their first full year of Global Grants for environmental projects being available, 33 projects were approved and financed – and this will only grow in number.

As of 23 April this year:

- 421 District Grants have been approved worth USD \$26.5m – Grants that Districts get to use and allocate as they see fit, locally and internationally
- 724 Global Grants worth USD\$ 44.7m, a figure that includes \$12.6m in World Funding
- 280 Disaster Response Grants worth \$13.1m

Disaster Response Grants and Fund

Rotary is not a first responder in the event of a natural disaster or emergency. We are not a relief organization but our Clubs will be there in the long-term, helping a community to recover. The Disaster Response Fund allows members to respond swiftly and effectively bringing hope to those affected by earthquake or hurricane, fire or flood. Or by war and armed conflict. Grant applications from Districts take no more than 48 hours for approval. There has been a real growth in the Disaster Response Fund over the past few years and in 2021-22 there were 228 grants approved worth USD \$7.9m.

From the figures I gave you a minute or so ago for Disaster response grants thus far this year, you can see how grants from this fund have been growing noticeably – us as Rotarians responding to natural and other disasters on a large scale that have impacted on numerous countries and with significant impact of individuals, families, livelihoods and communities.

Everywhere we look there appears to be natural disaster and induced, armed conflict: war or civil war. The two most significant natural disasters with the greatest impact have been the Pakistan floods and the Turkey/Syrian earthquake. Compounding these has been the ongoing

war in Ukraine. Such has been the scale of these disasters that the Rotary Foundation specifically opened two of them, Ukraine and Pakistan, to donors to direct their contributions and there was a focus for the Turkey/Syrian earthquake until 31 March.

Clubs and individuals contributing to this fund know that their contribution will be used almost immediately.

Many of us will never meet the child vaccinated against polio, the peace fellow who resolves a conflict within their community, a mother who successfully gives birth in a hospital in Goroka, Papua New Guinea, a student who can safely and hygienically wash their hands in a school in South Africa, a woman who receives a grant to start a business sewing in India or a hungry child in America who receives breakfast before the school day begins.

As Rotarians, we simply continue to do good in the world through the work of our Rotary Foundation and through our simple desire to make a difference.

Throughout the history of Rotary, the world as a whole has seen enormous changes – more so over a century than at any other time in the course of human history. Since the formation of the first Rotary Club 118 years ago, Rotary has witnessed two world wars, a great depression and a transport and a technological revolution which has markedly changed the ways we communicate and interact with each other.

Just this century, we have lived through the impact of 9/11 and its uncertain aftermath followed by the GFC – the global financial crisis – the impact of the 2004 Boxing Day tsunami in this part of the world, a global pandemic the likes of which haven't been seen for 100 years with the impact still being felt. All of them impacted on our great organization and we emerged from them still able to continue our growth around the world, continuing to do good in the world and to put service above self.

We will continue to face challenges in this ever-changing world and we have shown that we can always rise up to meet them and emerge stronger.

Thank you for your dedication to Rotary. Together, let's carry out Rotary's vision of a better world. Let's not just imagine a better world; let's show the world what it means to be People of Action.

As Rotarians, we put service above self. We don't desire nor should we engage in self-congratulation but we can accept the congratulations and the thanks and appreciation from others. May you all look back in pride throughout the year, on all that you and your Clubs have done and simply say, "I helped".





The FIVE Mass Extinctions

- **Ordovician–Silurian extinction events** (End Ordovician or O–S): 445–444 Ma, just prior to and at the Ordovician–Silurian transition. Two events occurred that **killed off 27% of all families, 57% of all genera and 85% of all species.**
 - **Late Devonian extinctions:** 372–359 Ma, occupying much of the Late Devonian up to the Devonian–Carboniferous transition ***eliminated about 19% of all families, 50% of all genera, and at least 70% of all species.***
 - **Permian–Triassic transition.** Earth's largest extinction **killed 57% of all families, 83% of all genera and 90% to 96% of all species^m (53% of marine families, 84% of marine genera, about 81% of all marine species.**
 - **Triassic–Jurassic transition.** **About 23% of all families, 48% of all genera (20% of marine families and 55% of marine genera) and 70% to 75% of all species became extinct.**
 - **Cretaceous–Paleogene (or K–Pg) extinction event.** ***About 17% of all families, 50% of all genera, and 75% of all species became extinct***

- A mass extinction event is when species vanish much faster than they are replaced. This is usually defined as about 75% of the world's species being lost in a short period of geological time.
 - The Main Causes of extinction are deforestation, over exploitation (hunting, overfishing), invasive species, climate change, and nitrogen pollution.
-

Holocene extinction , NOW

- Extinctions have occurred at over 1000 times the [background extinction rate](#) since 1900, and the rate is increasing.
 - The mass extinction is a result of [human activity](#).
 - Driven by [population growth](#) and [overconsumption](#) of the earth's natural resources.
 - Estimated 8 million species, 1 million plant and animal species are currently threatened with extinction.
 - In late 2021, [WWF](#) Germany suggested that over a million species could go extinct within a decade, make it **"largest mass extinction event since the end of the dinosaur age"**.
-

Extinction debt

- Is the future [extinction](#) of [species](#) due to events in the past. The phrases **dead clade walking** or **survival without recovery** express the same idea.
 - **Extinction debt** occurs because of time delays between impacts on a species, such as destruction of [habitat](#), and the species' ***ultimate disappearance***.
 - **Example,** Islands that lost habitat at the end of the last [ice age](#) 10,000 years ago still appear to be losing species as a result.
 - **Habitat fragmentation** describes the emergence of discontinuities (fragmentation) in an organism's preferred [environment](#) ([habitat](#)), causing [population fragmentation](#) and [ecosystem decay](#).
 - **Habitat destruction** (also termed **habitat loss** and **habitat reduction**) is the process by which a natural [habitat](#) becomes incapable of supporting its native species.





- In 2021, we have 3.1 million hectares of Mangrove left, accounted for 30% of the world total Mangrove.
 - A Mangrove tree removes 12.3 kg of CO₂ a year, or 308 kg (0.3 tonnes) over its life. A hectare of Mangrove tree will absorb 840 mt.
 - A Mangrove tree absorption of 308 kg means, **1,179.5 km of driving** in a standard car. A ton of carbon will be a result of 3829.5 km of driving.
 - *If you have a car, and the speedometer shows 50,000 km, then you have emitted **13 tonnes of carbon (CO₂)**.*

How big is our problem?

- According to BRGM, about 700,000 hectares of mangrove are deforested.
 - $700,000 \times 15,000 = 10,500,000$ trees to be replaced.
 - $12.3 \text{ kg} \times 10,500,000 = 13,650,000,000 \text{ kg of CO}_2$,
(13,650,000 Tonnes).

Closing Speech RI President Representative PDG David Anderson

Good afternoon

My life has been richly enhanced because I am a Rotarian. I know that being here over these few days has further enriched my life and my experience as a Rotarian.

If you recall from what I said yesterday morning, Tippy and I had the pleasure to represent then President Ian Riseley and Juliet at the D 3310 Conference in Kota Kinabalu five years ago this very weekend. Not only was Ian a great friend, Juliet and I had served together as Governors in 2011-12.

In one of his first interviews as Rotary International President, Ian was asked what was the best job in Rotary. I have an issue with the word job in Rotary. It's widely used within our organization but unless you are one of the staff of Rotary International, my view is that you don't have a job in Rotary. You are a volunteer and you have a role – be it in your Club or your District, your Zone or beyond. You can decide whether to nominate for a position, accept it if appointed or selected and how much time to devote to that role. It should not be, as it is for some, an all-consuming time.

But I digress.

In response to the question about what's the best job in Rotary, Ian replied, "Bar none, being the personal representative of the Rotary International President at a District Conference". And he was right – especially if you get to represent your own countryman at a District Conference.

I became a member of the Rotary Club of Yea in June 1994. In the decade or so before I became a member, in the time in my life when I was teaching in our national capital, every Monday lunch, the School's Finance Manager would go to the weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Canberra. I had heard of Rotary but wasn't really aware of what it was or what it did – either locally or internationally.

Upon 'retirement' from teaching after 12 years and returning home to Yea in 1992, I was invited to attend a meeting of the Rotary Club of Yea which had been formed in 1986. As I had been away from the community for over 20 years, it was a great opportunity to reconnect with people I had known and lost touch with – and meet many who had moved to my local community and were newer residents of the area.

After seven years as a member, it was "my turn" to become Club President in 2001-02. Then it was very much a case of you knew when you would be the Club President in the sequence in which you joined the club. It was expected that you would serve in that capacity. And when my turn came, it was an experience I enjoyed. We got a few things done – some continuing ones

and one or two new ones. One of the new programs we adopted was the Youth Exchange Program and we selected our first Outbound student.

Some of the District leadership team then suggested I take on a role at the District level – and I soon found that after just a couple of months on the District Youth Exchange Committee, I would become the Chair of that Committee in July 2003.

A month or so earlier, the Rotary International Convention was held in Brisbane. As the incoming District Youth Exchange Chair, it was thought that I should attend – and I did, especially as the District was paying some of my costs. After four days at the Convention, one of the most significant events in my time in Rotary occurred. I became a Rotarian. For nine years, I had been a member of the Rotary Club of Yea but by attending the Brisbane Convention – presided over by one of the great Rotary International President's, Bhichai Rattakul – I became a Rotarian.

As I have done many times, I have looked back and reflected on what it was in Brisbane in May 2003 that made me a Rotarian. One reason or influence was undoubtedly the Rotary International President himself, Bhichai Rattakul. This former Thai Prime Minister and Foreign Minister was a deeply humble man: respected, respectful and full of grace and humility. He had an incredible aura and presence about him every time he walked onto the stage. It was, as if you were the only one in the auditorium and he was speaking to you. He left a lasting impression on me and did so every time I heard him speak although age caught up on him and his Rotary appearances became more limited. He passed away in February last year at the age of 97.

Secondly, that Convention opened up the real power of Rotary and what it could do to improve the lives of others. Locally, Rotary in my community had given me that old fashioned and maybe quaint experience with my fellow Club members both at our weekly meetings but also at our local service projects: fellowship. Now, in Brisbane, I saw the power and the energy of Rotary and Rotarians at an international level and what that power could do for the good.

In Rotary, we might talk about me and I. My year as President, my Board and my year as Governor. Rotary, though, is not about one man or one woman. It is not about any individual Rotarian – be it the Rotary International President, a District Governor or a Club President. Some may think it is all about them but it is not. It is about all of us. Those of us who have been a Club President or a District Governor are custodians of the Club or the District for a year. There was a Club or District before your year began and, hopefully, there will be one at the end of the year – stronger than when you started the year. Make the most of your stewardship of that position – or any position in which you serve at whatever level you do serve.

Our most valuable asset are our members: the members of the 37,000 Rotary and Rotaract Clubs around the world. When the story of Rotary is written it is not about Rotary International Presidents or Board members or District Governors – or, heaven forbid Past District Governors. It is about all of us. It is about the Clubs in District 3410 and what their members are doing in serving humanity and going good in the world. It is about all of us who help – like that bridge engineer I mentioned earlier today – in so many ways.

Ron Burton was President of Rotary International in 2013-14. At the International Assembly in January 2013, attended by then Governor Elect Eva, Ron announced the theme for the year as “Engage Rotary, Change Lives”. I am sure Eva remembers it well. At the end of his theme address, Ron said:

“No matter how much you accomplish, no matter where this year of Rotary service takes you, I can promise you one thing: the life that changes the most will be your own.”

And he was right.




