THE BEGINNING

Lions International was founded in 1917, to help restore a world which had been devastated by World War One. The Chippewa Lake Lions Club was founded in 1958 to promote the objectives of The International Association of Lions Clubs: "to serve communities locally and globally, giving hope and impacting lives through humanitarian service projects and grants."

TODAY

Lions International boasts 1.4 million members and 49,000 clubs around the world. The Chippewa Lake Lions Club has been a community resource for 66 years, with over 40 local members. It is now a 501(C)3 charitable organization (the Foundation), which allows supporters to obtain charitable deductions for their donations. We reach out to help community organizations and individuals with the funds we raise.

Over the years, the Lions have continued to host fund raisers such as the Mother's Day Plant Sale, Christmas wreaths and candle sales, license plate covers, etc. After initiating an incredible major fund raiser: "The Polar Bear Plunge", the Lions Club Foundation was able to give over \$400,000 back to the community in the last ten years. This event more than tripled the funds we are able to distribute to the community.

Our fund raising is graciously supported by local businesses who sponsor events, and individuals who open their hearts to help us raise money through these events. The 15th Annual "Polar Bear Plunge" will take place in February of 2025, and it remains the major annual event for fundraising. Of course, the Lions are widely known for the annual **FREE** July 4 Parade, which attracts thousands of families and friends. It remains one of the largest and oldest parades in the area and is our way of saying **THANKS** to the community.

YOU CAN'T GO IT ALONE

Our Club has learned that people need support in many ways. Our outreach has been made stronger by partnerships developed over the years with other organizations, which can expand our ability to serve diverse needs and connect people with specialized resources effortlessly. The Society

The Society for Handicapped Citizens of Medina County Inc., was founded in 1953 by a group of parents who wanted services in their communities for their children with special needs. At that time, the only option was to place these children in an institution. Rebranded as "The Society", they have evolved over seven decades as advocates for and with individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Today, The Society provides access to education, recreation (Camp Paradise), as well as a variety of housing and support services. Clients have a universe of opportunities to live their best lives, their way, in their communities! Read on to find out more!



We provide day services at our "Links" in four counties – Medina, Wayne, Ashland & Huron. Individuals spend the day with our team increasing social skills, learning life skills (cooking is a fan favorite), volunteering and engaging in the community." If there is a museum, event, fair, carnival, etc. in Ohio, we find it and head out! From "free to fee" we are on the lookout and have had so many wonderful opportunities to learn, grow and have fun!

We are lucky to have wonderful park systems and other public sites to visit at no cost. However, to fully engage in the community, additional funding IS required. The individuals we serve are supported by Medicaid and there isn't much money to engage in the communities in which they live. The financial support we receive from the Chippewa Lake Lions Club & Foundation has been instrumental in allowing the individuals we serve to have well rounded and enjoyable lives.

We had services in two other locations before purchasing our present building on Lake Rd. in Chippewa Lake in 2010. Within the small communities of The Village of Chippewa Lake and neighboring Gloria Glens, we established relationships with the Village Councils as well as volunteer organizations within the communities.

We share worthy projects with these Villages, which support our purpose statement and goals. Every month when there is a 5th Sunday on the calendar, our members "Gather to Scatter". We take on a project in the community and provide labor and supplies to complete needed projects.

The Lions Club offered a unique opportunity to participate as a partner in the Annual Polar Bear Plunge. Our Team has worked on all elements of fund raising and execution of this fun filled event for many years. As a result of the growing success of the event, CrossPointe Community Church has been able to use their donations to reinvest in our communities. The funding we receive each year from the Polar Bear Event helps with the monthly free meal that we offer to the community, Thanksgiving boxes, Grief Recovery and Divorce Care programs. THE POLAR BEAR PLUNGE FUNDRAISER
