The staff at Adams House promote dignity and independence for all the residents and do everything they can to help them feel welcome and comfortable as they live life to the fullest.




"Black Cat" Helen Price Acrylic on Canvas







"I love my wee art class"




"Old Boat" Irene Wylie Acrylic on Canvas


Heart for Art at The Oasis Garelochhead



Staff do everything they can to help residents retain and regain skills and interests and make life as fullfiling as it can be.






The Heart for Art service was established at St. Margaret's in February 2022.

The Elms knowledgable and caring staff take great care to promote every resident's wellbeing, respecting their dignity, choice and rights at all times.






"Landscape" Tony Connell Acrylic on canvas


"Lighthouse" John Currie Acrylic on Canvas
