From the Pastor's Pen

Friends,

The early months of this year have brought many challenges—illness and injury, unpredictable winter weather, and a nation still grappling with deep divisions. As we navigate these struggles, it often feels as though the world is pulling us in every direction. It's easy to feel worn out, exhausted, and discouraged. The constant noise of political strife, social unrest, and personal trials can overwhelm us, leaving us longing for peace and rest. It is my prayer that the season of Lent will help to answer some of that longing for us this year.

Lent is a season that acknowledges our weariness and struggles—something we desperately need. But it is also a season of renewal and transformation—a time to invite God's healing and power into our lives, which we also desperately need. This holy season calls us to a higher purpose—one that moves beyond the divisions and weariness of this world. We are invited to live into the higher calling that Christ has set before us. We are called not to be defined by the divisions that surround us or the exhaustion within us, but to be shaped by God's love, which unites us in a deeper and more lasting way.

This Lent, I'm inviting all of us to turn toward one another—to find strength in our shared worship, study, and fellowship. Together, let's grow in communion with one another and with God. In the pages of this newsletter, you'll find various opportunities for this—along with examples of how we are already building this holy community. As we gather around the table—whether the communion table, the lunch table, or the tables of study and fellowship—let us remember that these are not just places where we sit, but sacred spaces where we encounter Christ's love in one another. At these tables, we are nourished, healed, and renewed. These are the spaces where we learn to listen, to love, and to serve. These tables shape us to be the hands and feet of Jesus in the world.

Our community, our nation, and our world need this. As we are transformed in these sacred spaces, we are called to carry that transformation into our homes, neighborhoods, and beyond. This Lent, may we be renewed in our calling—to love and serve the world with the same grace that God has shown us.

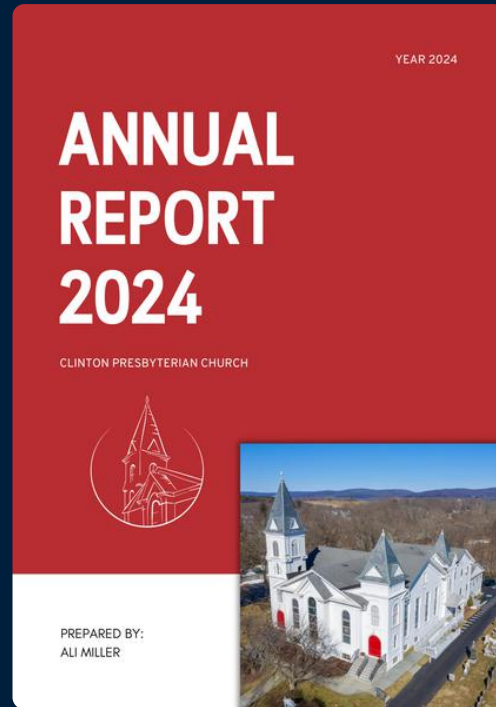

A big thank you to all the Scouts and adult leaders for joining us!

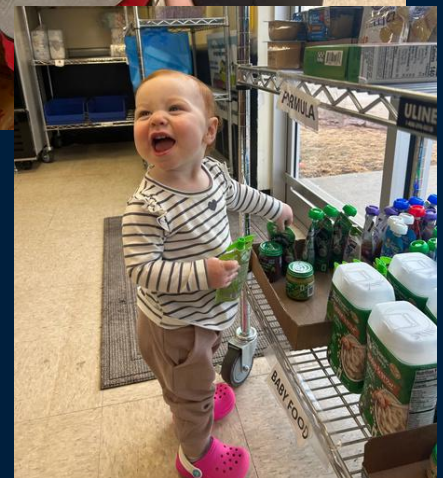
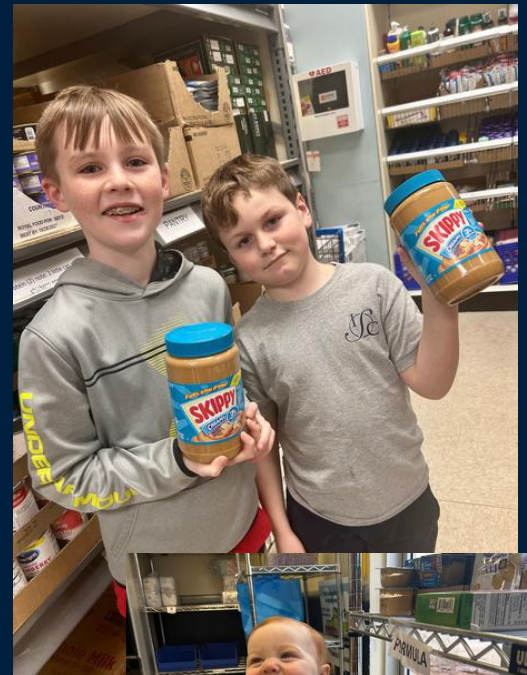
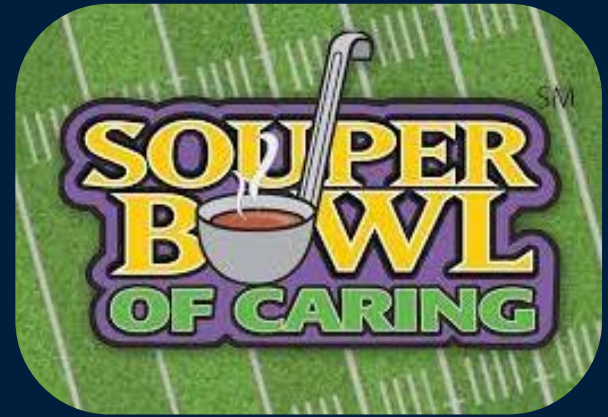


WORSHIP

Budget

After careful consideration, the Session has decided to proceed with the 2025 budget previously as presented to the congregation in October, holding it steady despite a larger-than-anticipated deficit. We are confident that this lean budget is aligned with the work we are called to do together.

To date, 81 pledges have been received, totalling \$292,151 vs our goal of \$320,000. We are deeply grateful for each one. This pledge goal represented a 5% increase over 2024 and was based on the ongoing generosity of our church family and addition of new members throughout the year. Our narrative budget provides more detail about our hopes for the year ahead. We welcome additional pledges at any time, trusting that the resources we need will continue to come in. 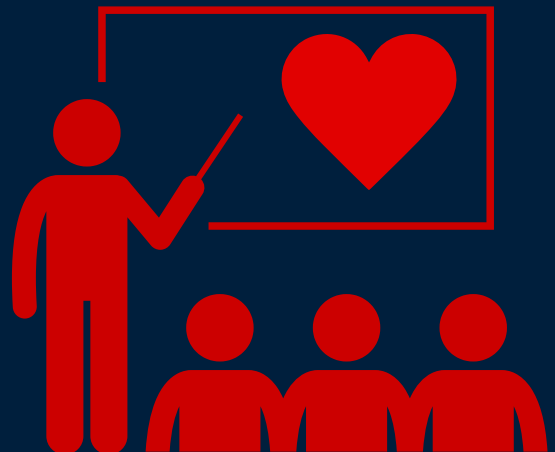

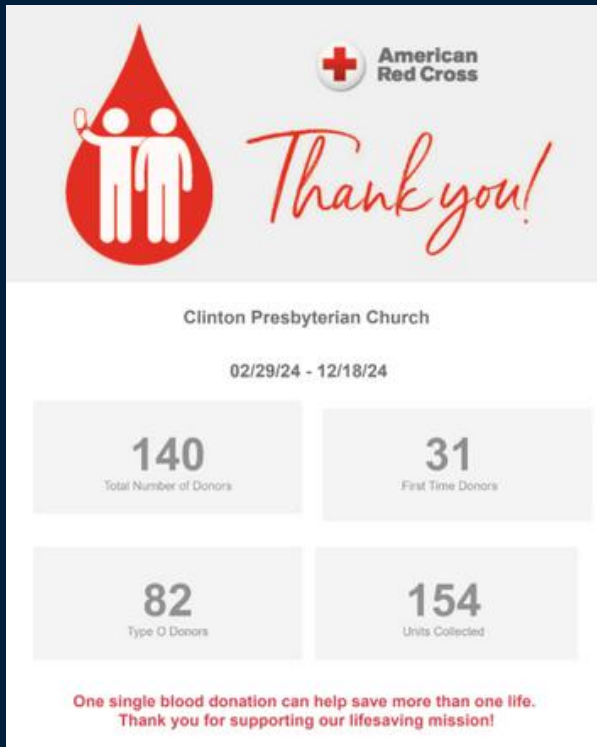

Family Promise

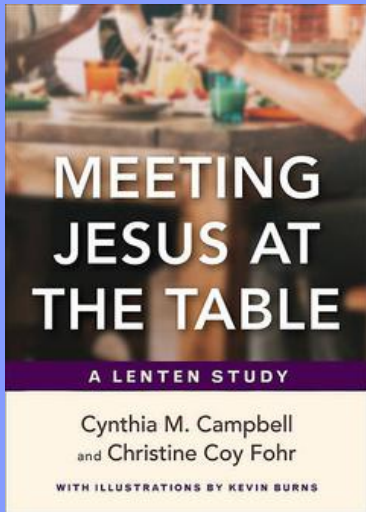
CPC was responsible for preparing meals and providing groceries for Family Promise at the end of February. CPC shoppers are always extra generous and included extra crayons and coloring books for the children
