

#### THE BORDERPLEX REGION


- THE LABOR FORCE INCREASED BY 1,265 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

- EL PASO, TX MSA UNEMPLOYMENT WAS AT 4.5%, WITH A TOTAL OF 17,629 UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS

The three Super Sectors with the **GREATEST** employment for the El Paso MSA in October 2024 were:


- 1. Trade, Transportation, and Utilities

- 3. Information


These three Super Sectors represented 9% of the total nonfarm employment.



#### **EMPLOYMENT in October 2024**














#### Industry Sectors that lost jobs










#### Occupation by Gender

Population 16+ years




- In both El Paso County and Texas, occupations such as Natural resources, construction & maintenance, and Production, transportation & material moving are predominantly male.
