Updated Trash and Recycling

Disposal Rates Effective January 1, 2025, disposal rates at the York County Resource Recovery Facility are increasing \$4.00/ton. The York County Disposal Plan mandates that all municipal-like waste be disposed of at the York Incinerator. As a result of the increase, Penn Waste will need to increase its quarterly rate per home by \$1.04 per quarterly billing. Therefore, effective January 1, 2025, the new quarterly rate for Springettsbury Township residential customers will be \$98.40.

2025 Bid Price - \$90.26/qtr.

2023, 2024 & 2025 York County Solid Waste Authority total increases - \$3.14/qtr.

Township Administrative Fee - \$5.00/qtr.

Sewer Payment Options

Springettsbury Township provides multiple options for residents and property owners to make sewer bill payments, including by mail, in person, over the phone, ACH direct withdraw or online credit card/electronic check payment. The Township encourages all residents to make payment early to ensure it is received by the due date. Payments are posted on the date payment is received, not by the postmark date. Failure to receive sewer bills is not considered a reason for non-payment and does not extend the due date.

CAMP SECURITY PARK MASTER PLANNING PROJECT



Springettsbury Township is currently undertaking the development of a master plan for the Camp Security Park area. This includes the current Camp Security neighborhood park as well as the overall 162 acres of land owned by the Township, including the site of the former Revolutionary War POW camp. The overall property has been the subject of extensive historical research and archaeological excavations. It is believed that the area includes the last POW camp site of the Revolutionary War.

The Township received a matching grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) to create a master plan for Camp Security Park. The DCNR funding stipulates an overall planning process for how a master plan should be developed, its key components, and the need for a robust community engagement component.

The park master planning is expected to be completed mid-2025 and is intended to be a strategic roadmap for the implementation of proposed improvements.



PARKS RULES

It is expected that all users of Township facilities will conduct themselves and their activities in such a way as will not obstruct or interfere with the use and enjoyment of the facilities by others. Respect for, courtesy to, and cooperation with other users will be the norm, and any failure to demonstrate these qualities may result in denial of use of the facilities.

Springettsbury Township Parks will be subject to the following rules and regulations:

- Springettsbury Township Park will open at 7 a.m. and close at 11 p.m. All other parks will operate from dawn to dusk. There shall be no trespassing on park property during closed hours.
- 2. Smoking shall be prohibited at all times on any park property.
- 3. The Township Manager, the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, the Chief of Police or the Director of Parks and Recreation may close the park(s) if hazardous conditions exist that endanger life or property. There shall be no trespassing on park property during such times.
- 4. There shall be no littering.
- 5. Vandalism and negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property is prohibited. Possession or use of a mineral or metal detector, magnetometer, side scan sonar, other metal detecting device or sub-bottom profiler is prohibited. All natural, cultural, and archaeological resources are protected and may not be removed or disturbed.
- 6. Open fires or hot charcoals shall only be permitted in Township park grills. Grills are not to be left unattended and shall be thoroughly extinguished upon departure.
- 7. Picnic tables are not to be removed from the picnic shelters.
- 8. The solicitation, selling, or the distribution of any items or services unrelated to Township sponsored activities is prohibited.
- 9. Posting of signs of any kind is prohibited.
- 10. Alcoholic beverages and controlled substances are strictly prohibited.
- 11. Use of explosives or explosive devices, fireworks, sparklers, hot air-balloons, rockets, remote control air planes or vehicles, air guns, bows, slingshots or any similar items for non-Park and Recreation sponsored events is prohibited. It shall be lawful for any person to discharge a firearm within the Township, except if discharged in violation of all local, state and federal laws, rules and regulations, including but not limited to

- the Air Rifles Law, Game Commission Rules and Regulations and the Game Law.
- 12. Injury or killing of wild or domestic animals is prohibited.
- 13. All dogs must be currently licensed and vaccinated. Dogs shall not be permitted on any playground, sports fields or in the amphitheater area. Dogs must be leashed at all times and the leash must not be longer than six feet (6'). Limit two (2) dogs per adult. Waste must be collected immediately. Dog owners are responsible for injuries inflicted by their dog to others. Aggressive dogs are not permitted.
- No hitting of golf balls.
- Use of any amplification devices and microphones is prohibited unless activity is sponsored by the Township.
- Motorized vehicles except those expressly authorized are prohibited except in designated parking areas.
- 17. Facilities and equipment can only be used for the purpose intended
- Use of electrical outlets is restricted to Township only equipment or Townshipsponsored events.
- 19. Skateboarding, In-line skating and bicycling are prohibited in all picnic shelters, on the tennis courts and Amphitheater area including the stage, terrace seating area and designated access points.
- It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in any abusive, loud, vulgar or otherwise disorderly conduct.
- Parking areas are for park users only. All vehicles shall be parked within the designated spaces provided.
- Tents, canopies or any other like structure are prohibited unless used for a Township sponsored event.
- 23. Smoking shall be prohibited at all times on any park property.



Guidelines for Driveway Snow Removal

PennDOT and the Township encourage residents to not shovel snow onto roads that have already been plowed. Snow should not be shoveled onto any roadway as this can increase the potential for crashes, and property owners can be held liable for any resulting crashes.

- Snow should be shoveled or plowed to the right side of the driveway as you
 are facing the roadway. By piling snow away from the oncoming direction
 of the snowplows, the snow will not be pushed back onto the driveway.
- Eliminate snow piles at the property entrance whenever possible. High accumulations of snow can obstruct the vision of motorists, posing a safety hazard.
- Do not push snow onto roadways at any time. This creates a hazardous condition for all vehicles.
- State law requires citizens to use and maintain their property in ways
 that avoid creating hazardous road conditions for others, including not
 obstructing highway lanes and drainage facilities with snow and ice. Fines
 can be as high as several hundred dollars.

PennDOT offers the following guidelines for shoveling or plowing snow:



Prepare Your Mailboxes and Fire Hydrants for Winter

Snow thrown from plows can damage your mailbox if not properly prepared and secured for the winter. The Township will not be held responsible for snow damage to mailboxes; however, the Township is responsible if a mailbox is struck by a plow or driver. Here are a few tips to help reduce mailbox damage:

- Mailboxes should be placed as far from the edge of the roadway as possible but still be within reach of your mail carrier's vehicle.
- Make sure the post is in good condition and the box is securely fastened to the post.
- Place reflective tape on the mailbox to help snowplow drivers see them at night.
- When removing snow from around the mailbox, throw snow behind it and not to the sides of it.
- If damage was experienced in the past, reconsider the positioning and structure before winter begins.

The Township is not responsible for clearing snow away from fire hydrants. If a fire hydrant is on your property, it is your responsibility to keep it accessible. Remember, it could be your house that could have a fire emergency. Seconds count!

2024 - 25 Springettsbury Residential Trash & Recycling Collection Program

Services Offered

- 1-3 ea. 32-gallon trash bag or trash can per week plus recycling pick-up. Cost per quarter = \$98.40.
- 1-96 gallon toter equal to 3-32-gallon trash bags or trash cans per week plus recycling pick-up. Cost per quarter = \$98.40.
- Extra waste bags may be purchased at the Township Municipal Building or by calling Penn Waste at 717-767-4456. The fee per bag is \$5.00.

*The quarterly rate increase is part of the 2023-2027 Penn Waste contract and includes an additional \$1.04 due to an increase required by York County Solid Waste Authority.

Acceptable Large Items

Residents should contact Penn Waste, 717-767-4456 to schedule the large item collection at least one day prior to the normal collection day.

- Appliances
- Carpet 48" maximum length rolled and tied
- Furniture
- · Mattresses and box springs
- Car tires only (must be off rims)
- · Discarded lawnmowers must have gasoline and motor oil removed
- Plumbing fixtures toilets, sinks, bathtubs, etc.

- Construction Material or Debris To include: Drywall; Brick; Block; Treated Lumber; Roofing Shingles; Ceiling Tiles; Concrete; Doors; Windows. Small quantities of select materials may be accepted at the Resource Recovery Center. Fees may be applied. Call before visiting – 717-845-1066.

CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP:

Penn Waste will pick-up Christmas trees on your regular trash day, the week of January 6, 2025.

Holiday Collection Schedule

Penn Waste observes New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. When your collection day is on or after a holiday, collections will be delayed by one day. Example: Memorial Day falls on a Monday. Collection schedule this week is Tuesday through Saturday. Thanksgiving falls on a Thursday. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday collections will not change. Thursday and Friday collections will move to Friday and Saturday. **EXCEPTION:** If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is no change in service prior to or after the holiday.

What to do with Unacceptable Items?

- Used Oil from vehicles can often be disposed of at auto shops or agencies selling auto supplies.
- Unacceptable metal items can often be disposed of through various Metal Recyclers or Scrap Metal facilities in the area.
- Plastic Bags from all stores can be recycled at many local grocery stores.
- Truck and tractor tires can be taken to a tire distributor to be disposed of or recycled. Contact business in advance, a fee may be required.
- Additional information can be found by visiting York County Solid Waste Authority's website, www.ycswa.com or contacting Penn Waste, www.pennwaste.com 717-767-4456.
- It is always recommended to call a facility first to see what their policies are regarding accepting materials.

Recycling Acceptable Items

Place ONLY these items in your Recycling Bin Metal: Aluminum and steel food & beverage cans Glass: Clear, brown, blue and green glass food & beverage containers

Plastic: #1, #2, and #5 ONLY

Paper & Cardboard:

- Corrugated cardboard boxes
- Newspapers
- Cartons for Juice, Milk, Soy Milk, Soup/Broth, Wine, Egg Substitutes and Cream

- Remove all packaging materials (Styrofoam, peanuts, bubble wrap, plastic liners)
- · Flatten ALL boxes, and
- Bundle all cardboard that does not fit into the recycling bin
- Cover loose paper with heavier items to prevent it from blowing away. If the weather forecast calls for high winds or wet weather, keep your paper recyclables until the next week. Wet paper products are difficult to process.
- · Rinse thoroughly to remove all contaminants.
- Please dispose of any liquids in items before placing in recycling bins

Please have your waste, recycling and large item available for collection at curbside by 6:00 a.m. on your collection day, but no earlier than 4:00 p.m. the day prior to pick up. Empty containers must be removed within 24 hours after collection. No items may be placed at curbsides that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people. Additional trash bags are NOT considered a bulk item.

DID YOU KNOW?

Continental Paper Grading (CPG) accepts magazines, junk mail, catalogs, cereal boxes, and books for paper recycling. Drop off these materials at CPG 3350 Concord Road, York

Monday - Friday from 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.

Recycling **Unacceptable Items**

- Needles & Medical Waste DO NOT place used needles or any other medical waste with recycling! This is a serious health hazard to everyone.
- Diapers (acceptable as trash)
- Aerosol cans (acceptable as trash)
- · Windows, mirrors, ceramics, drinking glasses, light bulbs or broken glass (acceptable as trash)
- Shredded paper (acceptable as
- · Aluminum foil (acceptable as trash)
- · Food soiled or wet materials including paper, cardboard (acceptable as trash)
- · Styrofoam, packing peanuts, bubble wrap (acceptable as trash)
- Plastic bags (acceptable as trash)
- Tissues and other paper products (acceptable as trash)
- Paperboard products such as toilet paper/paper towel rolls, cereal boxes, tissue boxes (acceptable as trash)
- Pool chemicals (Hazardous Waste)
- Hose (acceptable as trash)
- Rechargeable Batteries

Yard waste will be collected in four (4) foot lengths once per week (beginning the first week of March and concluding the first week of December): bundled; placed in a biodegradable Kraft or other paper bag; placed in maximum 32-gallon container with a Township approved brush identification sticker. Brush stickers can be obtained at the Township Municipal Building for \$.50 each.

REMINDERS: Please do not combine yard waste and recycling materials. Do not use the 96-gallon toters provided by Penn Waste for yard waste. Yard Waste containers should be no larger than a 32-gallon container.

Remember: The Covered Devices Recycling Act (Act 108) prohibits residents and businesses from placing electronics waste at the curb or in their trash. Covered devices include: desktop computers, laptops, monitors, computer peripherals (keyboard, mouse, printer and speakers), televisions and e-readers that browse the internet.

ELECTRONICS COLLECTION TIMES AND LOCATION

The York County Solid Waste Authority (YCSWA) has a FREE Residential Electronics Recycling Program open to York County residents. Collection of electronics is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to noon at the Small Load Drop-off Facility at the York County Resource Recover Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road.
