I am writing to report that our annual national NFSPS convention was a success, whether you attended in person or virtually via Zoom. The NFSPS annual Convention was held this year in Albuquerque, New Mexico, July 23-28, 2025. The theme of this year's Convention was

"Enchanting Words."

We were treated to 5 days of outstanding poetry and the opportunity to meet and share poetry with fellow poets from across the country. It was one of the most exciting and fun gatherings ever for those who were there in person or who joined through our virtual network.

This convention had the first ever Form Slam, where every poem had to be a form submitted prior to the event and was vetted by a form judge. Each competitor will be published in an anthology published by Buster Bodhi Press. First Place was Lydia Gates, Second Place was Christopher Clauss, and Third Place was Julie Cummings.

We were inspired by the renowned Naomi Shihab Nye, who delivered the keynote address on Sunday evening. We also had a chance to see and hear the BlackBerry Peach National Championship Poetry Slam, the winner of which will represent the United States at the World Poetry Slam Championship next year. Black Chakra was named the 2025 champion with Nate Lovell a close second. This was a memorable experience and an exciting opportunity to see 48 of the country's finest performance poets at their best.

Whether you chose to attend in person or online, there were so many opportunities to engage with esteemed poets, read your poems, participate in insightful panel discussions, and hear the award-winning poems from over 50 categories in the 2025 contests.

The 2025 NFSPS Convention Committee, headed up by Susan Chambers, together with our cordial and energetic New Mexico State Poetry Society, with special thanks to Shirley Blackwell and President Bernadette Perez, was an event to remember, whether you were there in person at the convention or a part of the action from the comfort of your own home on Zoom.

I look forward to next year's Convention which will be hosted by the Sunflower Poets of Kansas. With their heartland spirit and poetic passion, we are sure it will be another extraordinary event. Hope to see you there.

SCAM AND PHISHING EMAILS ARE NOT FROM NFSPS

The National Federation of State Poetry Societies (NFSPS) is committed to protecting the privacy and trust of our members and community. Unfortunately, like many organizations, our name is sometimes used in scam or phishing attempts by cybercriminals trying to deceive people into giving away personal information, money, or access to their devices.

These scam emails are *not* from NFSPS. We never solicit sensitive information via unsolicited emails, and we will never ask for money, account credentials, or urgent action in this manner.

We do ask for continued sponsorship of annual contests and membership dues. If you suspect the request is a scam, please email admin@nfsps.net or President@nfsps.net and ask for clarification. Do not reply to the email.

What Do Scam or Phishing Emails Look Like?

Phishing emails often appear convincing. They may include the NFSPS name or mimic a real officer's name or email address, but there are always red flags to watch out for:

Common Warning Signs:

Urgent or threatening language

- ("Your account will be suspended," "Act now to avoid charges.")
- Requests for sensitive information (Bank account numbers, passwords, Social Security numbers.)
- Unusual attachments or links
 These may lead to malicious websites or download harmful files.
- Email address doesn't match the organization Look carefully—scammers often use addresses that seem close to official ones but include extra characters or odd domains (e.g., nfsps-support@randomdomain.com). Official communication from NFSPS comes from NFSPS.net email addresses. (Check Strophes for current email addresses.)
- Generic greetings
- ("Dear user," instead of your name.)
- Spelling and grammar errors
 Many scam messages have awkward or unprofessional language.

✓ How to Protect Yourself

- Always double-check the sender's email address If something feels off, it probably is.
- Do not click suspicious links or download attachments Especially if you weren't expecting an email.
- Verify any unexpected request with us directly If you receive an odd message that *looks* like it's from NFSPS, forward it to us at admin@nfsps.net and ask.
- Update your passwords regularly
 And don't reuse the same password across multiple sites.
- Use spam filters and security software
 These can help catch common phishing attempts.

Official Communication from NFSPS

All official emails from NFSPS will:

- Come from a clearly identifiable NFSPS email address
- Be professionally written and specific
- Never ask you to send sensitive information via email
- Provide direct contact information if action is required

If you're ever unsure, don't engage with the email. Instead, contact NFSPS directly at admin@nfsps.net

BLACKBERRY PEACH SPOKEN WORD 2025 POETRY CONTEST WINNERS

The winners of this year's BLACKBERRY PEACH SPOKEN AND WRITTEN WORD POETRY COMPETITION were chosen by this year's contest judge, Junious "Jay" Ward from Charlotte, NC The winners were announced by the Contest Chair, Benjamin Gardea. First place winner Meliza Banales, from Hawthorn, CA. Second place went to Christian Perfas aka Soul Stuf from Reseda, CA. Third place was awarded to Jennifer Hambrick of Worthington, Ohio. They were followed by 4 Finalists: Dana Hammer from Anaheim,

CA Connie Patton from Fresno, CA and Soul Kismet from New Orleans, LA. Poets were asked to pick their 4 best poems and submit them in Written and Spoken (audio) form to be eligible for the prizes.

All of the 7 finalists will be included in a video to be produced and placed on YouTube, and have their poems published in a book, published by NFSPS titled Blackberry Peach Written and Spoken Word Poetry Prizes 2025. 2025 BLACKBERRY PEACH NATIONAL POETRY SLAM RESULTS

After two nights of preliminary rounds and an incredible final stage, the BlackBerry Peach National Poetry Slam crowned its national champion. Black Chakra (Maryland) won our first-place prize of \$2000. Nate Lovell (California) won second place and \$1000, True Kwene (Massachusetts) garnered third place, winning \$500 and Skyelyn Riggs-Davis (Arizona) earned fourth place, winning \$250.

Each poet in the competition competed in a preliminary bout on Wednesday night and another on Thursday night. Each prelim saw every poet perform two poems each night with the top twelve poets advancing to the Final Stage on Saturday night. Final Stage was comprised of three rounds of poems, with 4 poets eliminated each succeeding round.

Taking place on Friday was our Youth Mini-Festival, where we witnessed young writers be brave in getting on the mic to share their poems and stories in a room full of adults.

The Youth Mini-Festival, organized by Youth Festival Chair Caleb "The Negro Artist" Rainey of Iowa, featured workshops by topnotch poets. Damien Flores, Manuel Gonzalez, and Katrina Kaye (all of Albuquerque) led sessions covering different aspects of writing creation, composition, and performing. While all of the youth were engaged and excited, the Spirit of Poetry Award went to Jun Silva (New Mexico) and first place for the youth slam went to Sam Brown (Arizona). NFSPS Chancellor & BlackBerry Peach Director Kelsey Bigelow also addressed the youth attending the festival. ~Kelsey Bigelow, Performance Poetry Advocate



This year's Spring Workshop in Cheyenne, WY, featured poet and educator Kristin Abraham. Abraham led an insightful session, guiding attendees through contemplating poetic influences, recurring themes in their work, and considering what craft forms they frequent in their poems. She also delved into exploring caesuras in poetry. CHRIS ABANI NAMED JUDGE FOR THE 2025 STEVENS POETRY BOOK MANUSCRIPT COMPETITION



Chris Abani is a novelist, poet, essayist, screenwriter and playwright. Born in Nigeria to an Igbo father and English mother, he grew up in Afikpo, Nigeria, received a BA in English from Imo State University, Nigeria, an MA in English, Gender and Culture from Birkbeck College, University of London and

a PhD in Literature and Creative Writing from the University of Southern California. He has resided in the United States since 2001.

He is the recipient of the PEN USA Freedom-to-Write Award, the Prince Claus Award, a Lannan Literary Fellowship, a California Book Award, a Hurston/Wright Legacy Award, a PEN Beyond the Margins Award, the PEN Hemingway Book Prize and a Guggenheim Award.

His fiction includes *The Secret History of Las Vegas* (Penguin 2014), *Song For Night* (Akashic, 2007), *The Virgin of Flames* (Penguin, 2007), *Becoming Abigail* (Akashic, 2006), *GraceLand* (FSG, 2004), and *Masters of the Board* (Delta, 1985). His poetry collections are *Sanctificum* (Copper Canyon Press, 2010), *There Are No Names for Red* (Red Hen Press, 2010), *Feed Me The Sun - Collected Long Poems* (Peepal Tree Press, 2010) *Hands*

Washing Water (Copper Canyon, 2006), Dog Woman (Red Hen, 2004), Daphne's Lot (Red Hen, 2003) and Kalakuta Republic (Saqi, 2001).

His work has been translated into French, Italian, Spanish, German, Swedish, Romanian, Hebrew, Macedonian, Ukrainian, Portuguese, Dutch, Bosnian and Serbian.

Through his TED Talks, public speaking and essays Abani is known as an international voice on humanitarianism, art, ethics, and our shared political responsibility. His critical and personal essays have been featured in books on art and photography, as well as *Witness, Parkett, The New York Times, O Magazine*, and *Bomb*.

His many research interests include African Poetics, World Literature, 20th Century Anglophone Literature, African Presences in Medieval and Renaissance Culture, The Living Architecture of Cities, West African Music, Postcolonial and Transnational Theory, Robotics and Consciousness, Yoruba and Igbo Philosophy and Religion.

He is Board of Trustees Professor of English at Northwestern University.

STEVENS MANUSCRIPT GENERAL GUIDELINES


- Open to all poets writing in English, except for previous Stevens Competition winners. Friends, colleagues, and students of Chris Abani are asked to postpone entering until a future year.
- Original work by a single author. May contain previously published poems, but should not be a compilation of entire previously published chapbooks.
- No author identification anywhere in manuscript; no information that could disclose your identity. Do <u>not</u> include a bio note, acknowledgments, or blurbs. (The winner will be required to provide an acknowledgments page before the manuscript is published.)
- No content that is hate-mongering or abusive of any social, racial, ethnic, religious, or gender group. No gratuitous use of obscene or profane language.
- Include title page, table of contents, and 48 to 80 pages of poetry, counting any section title pages but not counting front matter. Notes on poems, if any, should be included in the count.
- Single-space your manuscript. Use a readable-size, conventional font such as 12-point Times New Roman. No illustrations, color type, or fancy fonts. If you write in long lines or complex formats, be aware that the winning book will be published in a 6" x 9" format, which may not allow them to be preserved.
- Number the pages of the manuscript. Begin each poem on a new page. Poems may be two or more pages in length, but do not put more than one poem on a page.
- Simultaneous and multiple submissions permitted. Notify us immediately if your manuscript is accepted elsewhere.
- No revisions after submission. (The winner will work with the NFSPS book editor to correct any typographical errors and to make any mutually acceptable minor changes.)
- Do <u>not</u> contact the judge. Entries from any persons found to have contacted the judge will be ineligible for the award.

THEY GATHER AROUND ME, THE ANIMALS by Kunjana Parashar, 2024 Barbara Stevens Manuscript Winner

The brilliance of Kunjana Parashar's *They Gather Around Me, the Animals* gleams through the lens of the majesty of the animals that were here, are here, and may well be disappearing, in poems jubilant and elegiac at once. Parashar's approach to language and form evolves through the

course of the book, from the devotional to the surreal, from contrapuntal to pantoum, concrete poems to erasures, poems written in both the presence and the absence of the animals that are their subjects, and written in a diction which opens the lexicon to the language of the ecological imagination. "i see pictures of blue-green hexacorals / patching a floor of zoanthids like a zardozi dream / & i say listen, i love you too," she writes. Parashar's speaker is "never not listening," and never not watching, and she listens to and watches the actual world, not the world as sifted through a screen. Thus, she knows that "[w]hales slap on the coast like fingers on guitars." That "[n]ow that the birds are gone, we hang our cuckoo clocks upside down." That rain falls "like a bag of teeth on tin roofs." That in the absence of birds, "[w]e break our binoculars in grief." That in the absence of howls, in a poem without dogs, "we lost our vowel sounds." How the lyric itself, the music of our consonants and vowels, is contingent upon the voices of animals. ~ Diane Seuss author of *frank: sonnets* and *Modern Poetry*
