





Letter from CEO

As I reflect on the past year, I take great pride in our progress and outcomes. 2024 was particularly special as we celebrated our 30th anniversary. The National Center on Charitable Statistics reveals that approximately 30% of nonprofits fail to exist after 10 years; therefore, it is no small feat that we are celebrating 30 years of life-changing work. As we celebrate our accomplishments, I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge the passing of our founder and chief visionary, Alan Kirshner. His vision of combining college access, workforce development, and social and cultural capital continues to be key ingredients in our secret sauce.

Since our founding in 1994, we have been dedicated to transforming lives through education, and our impact continues to grow. Over the past three decades, we have empowered over a thousand students, forged meaningful partnerships, and championed initiatives that drive lasting change in our communities. Over the past year, we have achieved significant milestones that underscore our dedication to these values. This includes the Class of 2024 earning a record-breaking nearly 18 million dollars in scholarships. 100% of our seniors matriculated to college, 100% were accepted into at least one of their top five choice colleges, and nearly 75% are attending a selective or competitive college or university. I am most proud of the fact that our students are not only matriculating to college with lower amounts of student loan debt since the launch of our Wealth Building Initiative (over 50% have less than \$35,000 projected student loan debt at graduation), but our students are graduating. Partnership for the Future's graduation rate is 7x the national average of 11% for first-generation, lowincome students.

As the President and CEO of Partnership for the Future, I will continue my unwavering commitment to bridging the opportunity gap for our students, and we remain fiercely intentional in our commitment to ensuring our students can thrive in college and in life. Thank you to our volunteers, partners, donors, and staff for your dedication to this important work. Together, we can create a future where education serves as a powerful catalyst for ensuring all students have the opportunity to dream big and the doors of opportunity are opened for generations to come.




FIRST-GENERATION **COLLEGE STUDENTS**





AVERAGE FAMILY INCOME

Gender








