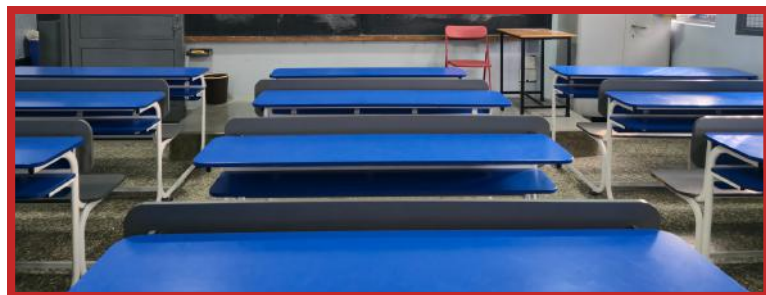


DIGITAL LEARNING SMART SCREENS
