BECTIVE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

John Bolger Club President 2024/2025

It is an honour to be the President of Bective Rangers FC for the season 2024/2025.

It gives me great pleasure to welcome all of you to Donnybrook and whether this is your first visit, or you are a frequent visitor, I hope that it will not be your last.

Bective Rangers has a long history, most of which has been spent here in Donnybrook, and this is our 143rd season of rugby. We are very proud of our history and although some would say that our best rugby days are behind us, our members and frequent visitors would argue that we are still making a large contribution to rugby both on and off the pitch in Leinster, Ireland and further afield.

That said, our achievements last season did not reach the heights that we had hoped and did not reach the heights of the previous season. Although our First XV failed in their bid for three Leinster League Division 1A titles in a row (and as such did not reach the All-Ireland League Play-Offs), our Second XV won the Leinster 2nds Division 1A title for the fourth year in a row. Our First XV made it to the Junior All Ireland Cup Final, and our Third XV also made it to their cup final.

While we may look at last season as a disappointment, we are looking forward to the 24/25 season with a renewed optimism, with a whole new coaching team in place for our First and Second XVs. I would like to wish our new Head Coach Ben Manion the very best of luck for the forthcoming season as he aims to build upon the foundations put in place by our outgoing Head Coach Bernard Jackman. Alongside Ben, I would like to welcome our new Forwards Coach Peter O'Donnell. Both Ben and Peter bring vast coaching experience across multiple levels of the game in Ireland

and abroad. I would like to extend a particular welcome back to the club to our new Backs Coach Rory O'Loughlin, who before a long professional playing career for Ireland, Leinster and Exeter Chiefs, began his rugby journey in Donnybrook playing mini rugby for Bective!

I also congratulate Tiarnan McCloskey on his election as First XV Captain for the club; a great appointment who we all know will lead the team by example on the pitch throughout the season.

Also, one final new face is Dave McAllister who will be working closely with Ben and the rest of the coaching staff in his role as U20's Coach.

Of course, it takes many others to ensure that our various rugby teams can take to the pitch every weekend, and I would like to thank all of the coaches, managers, kit managers, physios and of course players at all levels in the club that make this a reality throughout the season.

A very important section of the club is our Mini's and Youths section. My former Bective team mate Richie Maybury and the rest of his team of parents (including many other former team mates) put a huge amount of work to get over 300 boys and girls from ages 5 to 18 training and playing rugby week in week out. This achievement alone is a phenomenal tribute to the volunteerism that exists in a club such as Bective.

Off the pitch our Strategic Plan 2023-2028 was officially launched in the clubhouse during the summer of 2024. The plan has six main components; Rugby Ambition, Clubhouse & Facilities, Branding & Communications, Community, Finance & Sponsorship and Governance. Although this is a five-year plan,

BECTIVE LEGENDS LOUIS MAGEE



On 1 August of this year Louis Magee was awarded the singular honour of being appointed a trustee of the IRFU. It represents the pinnacle of Louis' achievements in the game and is testament to his standing in Irish rugby.

The Magee name is synonymous with Bective. Louis' grandfather, also Louis, was renowned within the game in Ireland when rugby was in its infancy as a popular sport. He captained Ireland to Triple Crown success in 1899, gained 27 caps and played for the Lions in South Africa in 1896. He was also captain and president of Bective. Club members and visitors to our clubhouse can learn of the esteem in which he was held by reading the magnificent illuminated address presented to him by the

club in the season 1898/1899, a practice unique to the time and awarded only to those of exceptional ability in their field of endeavour.

His son Brendan and Louis' father, known to all as Major Magee, was a legendary figure in the club from the 1950s to the 1990s. His service in the British Army during WW2 earned him his military rank and he also looked the part; tweed suits, moustache and walking cane. Also known for his sharp tongue and honest appraisal of people and performances, he was our esteemed club President in 1979/1980.

Louis was enlisted to the cause in Donnybrook at an early age on leaving Marian College, eschewing the option

of playing with UCD. His dedication to Bective was unquestioned and from his very first game he gave his all and continues to do so.

The list of Louis' achievements and his contribution to Bective and to rugby is long: Club Captain on two occasions, including Centenary year 1981, Leinster Interpro, Club President, Leinster President, member of the IRFU Executive, IRFU President, Club Trustee and IRFU Trustee. He served on the Bective Executive as well as being



a coach and a Director of Rugby. No task was too small for Louis, he was willing to help at any level and sought to serve, not for self-aggrandisement but in order to improve things, to raise standards. His leadership was matched by his attributes as an out and out team player.

Admired and respected in rugby circles at home and abroad, Louis never forgets his club; the Rangers being his home and closest to his heart. Recognition from his fellow members in the form of Honorary Life Membership was graciously accepted by Louis at this year's AGM. For him, it is an honour he treasures above all others.

Louis is a family man, supported always by Susan, Peter, David, Louis junior and Clara. His grandchildren are already signed up to Bective, ensuring the illustrious name of Magee continues into a fifth generation.

Bective Rangers Football Club has been rebuilding on two fronts for a good while. On the Rugby front the First XV and the management team have been working hard to get back to the All-Ireland League (AIL) and have gotten close on a few occasions. IM MEMORIAM JOHN "SOCCER WALSHE"

John "Soccer Walshe" was his Bective nickname and he died in the Dublin bombings on 17th May 1974.

Esmonde Kelly and I previously met John through a group of friends outside Bective who were collectively playing 7 a-side soccer.

After one of these matches John asked Esmonde and I if we would like to play

a game of rugby (we had never played before) in a business houses match for Cadbury's versus Philips Electrical.

The match was played in Cadbury's grounds in Coolock. The most memorable part of the match was a wrecking ball of a player – Steve Harte, who at the time was a noted prop for Palmerston RFC.

After the match we agreed with John to join Bective in November 1971. We played a number of games on the junior team captained by John and have fond memories of John both during and after matches.

John at this time was very career oriented and enjoyed being in personnel management in Cadbury's and had just got engaged, which left him less involved with Bective at that time. He was 27 years old.

John's tragic death that day on Talbot St (outside Guiney's store) came as a terrible shock to the Bective community and to the Kealy family in particular. A number of years after the event, in conversation with Ben Kealy Snr, we learned that Ben, who worked in personnel management in Tayto Ireland, adjacent to Cadbury's in Coolock, was travelling in his car, only a few cars behind John's on Talbot St. that day. John's car got through the lights at the junction of Gardiner St. while Ben was stopped at the lights behind him. John drove straight into the bomb site and lost his life, while Ben was spared serious injury and worse.

Esmonde and I visited the site of the explosion on Friday 17th May 2024 – 50 years on – at the time that it happened, at 5.30pm. Esmonde laid a Bective scarf at the memorial monument at the bottom of Talbot St.





The success of the event wouldn't have been the same without the incredible work of Mark and Sharon, our dynamic duo behind the bar,




