

The Grace Gibson (Audio) Difference

Do you remember the days of listening to serials on the radio?...and how often they were chock-full of clicks, pops and surface noise (somewhat reminiscent of an audio version of an old Charlie Chaplin movie with all those 'jerky' movements)?

The vast majority of the radio shows that we offer to the general public were originally released on a combination of 16 inch, 10 inch and finally 12 inch discs. The original 16 inch ones were made out of bakelite and beside weighing 'a tonne', they were inherently quite noisy and were easily scratched if not handled with 'kid-gloves' (which of course most radio presenters did not do!) thus the clicks, crackles and other noises that all went to air back in the day.



We decided that the average person would not find this amount of extraneous noise acceptable, especially if they were being asked to shell out good money to obtain their own personal copies.

Fortunately technology has intervened, and it is now possible to significantly reduce the amount of such 'surface noise' from our releases. There are a few audio processors that can achieve some degree of improvement. But most fall down in the overall picture as they not only get rid of much of the surface noise, but they also often remove the higher pitched tones from the overall sound recording.

There is however a world-leading bit of audio processing kit which can easily distinguish the difference between a 'crackle & pop' and the sound of a match being struck or a hand-clap: it is called CEDAR Cambridge and it easily proved itself to be THE best in its field. It was also quite amazingly expensive! But we believed that for us to retail our radio serials with integrity demanded that we invest in this technology.

Even before we start this process, we wash all discs in an ultra-sonic 'bath' to clean out the years of dust and grime that imbeds itself in the grooves of the original discs. From there, we record in the serial in real time often using 'preservation level' recording techniques that satisfy the requirements of the National Film & Sound Archive (and other such international bodies). Once digitised, we 'clean up' each episode before putting the whole serial through CEDAR Cambridge processing.

We then convert these full-blown audio files into various levels of compression to allow them to fit onto a single (sometimes double) CD, or for release on a USB flash drive 'stick' or as a download.

And finally, we have each show forensically listened to in full, with notations made of any skips or errors that we may have overlooked to make sure we're putting out the best quality product we can.

It is a time-consuming process, but all the above contributes to what we like to call *'The Grace Gibson (Audio) Difference'*.
